South Bend Cubs (30-24) at Dayton Dragons (17-39)

RH Cam Sanders (3-2, 2.09) vs. LH Connor Curlis (1-1, 2.79)

Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) meet the South Bend Cubs (affiliate of the Chicago Cubs) in the last game of a three-game series. 2019 Season Series: South Bend 4, Dayton 2. At Dayton: Dragons 1, Cubs 1. Streaks: The Dragons have lost nine of their last 11 games and 19 of their last 24 (includes suspended game).

Last Game: <u>Saturday</u>: South Bend 2, Dayton 1. In a game that featured three solo home runs accounting for all the scoring, South Bend broke a 1-1 tie in the sixth and held off a Dragons comeback effort. Michael Siani hit a home run in the fourth for the Dragons that tied the game at 1-1, but the Dragons had only one other hit on the night, an eighth inning single by Juan Martinez.

Team Notes

- Dragons pitchers have walked only 11 batters in 45 innings over five games on the current home stand, an average of 2.2 per game.
- Dragons pitchers have allowed just 10 runs in four games on the current home stand, excluding Thursday's game when they allowed nine.
 Dragons relievers have improved since May 1, posting an ERA of 3.59 (123 IP, 49 ER) and lowering their season ERA from 5.70 to 4.68. Dragons starting pitchers have a combined ERA of 5.20 on the year.
- The Dragons are 0-10 in day games and have been outscored 88-27.
- The Dragons finished the month of May with a team batting average of .209 (31 games), narrowly breaking the club record for lowest batting average in a month set in April of 2016 (.2087 to .2086; records by month go back to 2005). In the month, they ranked 16th (last) in the league in runs scored, batting average, doubles, walks, total bases, on-base percentage, slugging percentage, and stolen bases. They were 5th in home runs with 21. The team ERA in May was 4.47 (13th in the league during the month). The Dragons team record in May was 9-22. Note: The suspended game on May 21 is recorded as an April 14 game.
- Over the last seven days, the Dragons are batting .205 to rank 15th in the MWL, and they are 14th in runs scored. They have hit seven home runs to rank tied for second in the league. They are 8th in team ERA (3.98). Their 16 walks allowed is second fewest.
- The Dragons have lost 12 games in which they held a lead of at least two runs at some point during the game, and they have lost seven games after leading by at least three runs. They have lost two games in which they led by four runs, and one game after a five-run lead.
- In the seven games when the Dragons lost despite leading by at least three runs, they scored a combined total of one run in 43 innings
 after building their largest lead.
- Dragons relievers have successfully converted 11 save opportunities this season and have been charged with eight blown saves.

Individual Notes

- Morgan Lofstrom over his last seven games is batting .450 (9 for 20), 1 HR, 5 RBI.
- Pabel Manzanero is batting .365 (19 for 52) over his last 14 games.
- Michael Siani over his last seven games is 8 for 24 (.333) with two home runs, two doubles, one triple, and three singles.
- Reliever Matt Pidich over his last five games: 10 IP, 0 ER, 6 H, 5 BB, 9 SO.

Team Leaders in May: Among the nine Dragons players with at least 50 at-bats in May, Pabel Manzanero led the team with a .304 batting average. He hit two home runs with 12 RBI. Brian Rey led the team in home runs with four and his .832 OPS led the club. Morgan Lofstrom had only 39 at-bats in May but batted .308 with an .880 OPS. On the mound, Matt Pidich had an ERA of 2.08 in 17.1 innings.

*Pabel Manzanero hit three home runs in a game on April 23 to become the fourth player in Dragons history to do so. He joins Wily Mo Pena (2001), Juan Francisco (2007), and Byron Wiley (2009).

*Five members of the Dragons are rated among the Reds top 30 prospects (*Baseball America*). They are OF Michael Siani (#8); OF Mariel Bautista (#16); RHP Lyon Richardson (#17); RHP James Marinan (#19); and 3B Juan Martinez (#22). Additionally, SS Miguel Hernandez is ranked #25 by Fangraphs.com.

Dragons Manager/Coaches:

Luis Bolívar returns for his third season as Dragons manager after serving as the Dayton hitting coach in 2014-16. Bolívar played for the Dragons in 2003-'04, representing the club in the Midwest League All-Star Game in 2004. Bolívar played professionally for nine seasons from 2002-2010, spending all but the final year of his career in the Reds organization. He spent all or parts of four seasons at the Triple-A level, but never played in the big leagues. Bolívar resides in the Dayton suburb of Vandalia with his wife and four children. Following his playing career, he served as a coach at Vandalia-Butler High School. Bolívar was selected as the "Best Manager Prospect" in *Baseball America*'s 2017 Best Tools survey of Midwest League managers.

Pitching coach <u>Seth Etherton</u> returns to the Dragons for his second season in 2019, his fourth year as a coach in the Reds organization. Etherton spent the 2016-17 seasons with the Billings Mustangs. Etherton pitched in the Major Leagues in parts of four seasons with the Angels, Reds, A's, and Royals. He was the Angels first round draft pick in 1998 out of the University of Southern California. Etherton pitched in one game for the Dragons on a Major League rehab assignment in 2002.

Hitting coach <u>Mike Devereaux</u> joins the Dragons in 2019, his second year as a coach in the Reds organization. He served as the hitting coach for Double-A Pensacola in 2018. Previously, he was a coach for six years in the Rockies organization after two years in the Orioles system. Devereaux spent 12 years in the Major Leagues with the Orioles, Dodgers, Braves, White Sox, and Rangers. He was the MVP of the 1995 NLCS with Atlanta. In 1992 with Baltimore, he hit 24 home runs and drove in 107 runs, finishing seventh in the AL MVP voting.

Bench coach <u>Kevin Mahar</u> returns to the Dragons for his third season and sixth year as a coach in the Reds organization. He spent the 2013-14 seasons at Billings and 2015 at Advanced-A Daytona. He worked in private business in 2016. Mahar played college baseball at Indiana University and reached the Major Leagues with the Texas Rangers in 2007.
