Dayton Dragons (27-41, 58-78) at Bowling Green Hot Rods (41-27, 88-49)

LH Packy Naughton (5-10, 4.17) vs. LH Resly Linares (7-3, 3.21)

Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) meet the Bowling Green Hot Rods (affiliate of the Tampa Bay Rays) in the second game of a three-game series. This is the final series of the regular season for both teams.

Season Series: Bowling Green 12, Dayton 4. At Bowling Green: Hot Rods 5, Dragons 2. **Current Series:** Dayton 1, Bowling Green 0.

Last Game: Saturday: Dayton 7, Bowling Green 6. The Dragons battled back from a 4-1 deficit in the seventh inning and earned the win in the first game of the series. Reshard Munroe's three-run home run with two outs in the seventh tied the game, and Munroe delivered a sacrifice fly in the top of the ninth to break a 6-6 tie and give the Dragons the lead for good. The Dragons worked out of a tough jam in the bottom of the ninth when Bowling Green put runners at first and second with no outs, down by a run. John Ghyzel recorded the first two outs in the inning and Andy Cox came in to get the final out and notch the save. Bowling Green stranded 15 base runners, going 4 for 22 with men in scoring position. The Dragons by contrast had only five at-bats with men in scoring position, going 1 for 5. Andy Sugilio had two hits and an RBI for the Dragons.

Playoff Chase: The Dragons were officially eliminated from 2018 post-season contention on Wednesday.

2018 Team Notes

- The Dragons stole six bases in Friday night's game to match their season high. Their 11 steals in the series vs. West Michigan was their highest total for a series in this season.
- Twenty of the Dragons 41 Second Half losses have come by one run.
- The Dragons have allowed three runs or less in 28 of their 68 second half games. Their second half ERA is 4.11 (5.31 in the first half).
- The Dragons have committed just 63 errors in their last 79 games.
- The Dragons finished the First Half with a record of 31-37, in sixth place in the East Division.
- The Dragons threatened to tie the franchise record for most home wins in a half (25) in the First Half, but came up short. They entered their final series, a four-game series with Bowling Green, with 22 home wins in the first half, but they were swept in the series.
- Meanwhile, the Dragons broke the club record for fewest road wins in a half. The club record was 10 road wins, and the Dragons finished with nine. The Dragons played three fewer road games in the first half than the scheduled number of 35 due to three postponements at Great Lakes in April.

- **Hendrik Clementina** (DH) and **John Ghyzel** (RH Relief Pitcher) were selected to the Midwest League Full-Season All-Star Team (only 13 players selected among all 16 teams).
- **Alejo Lopez** over his last 42 games since July 15: 55 for 153, .359, to raise his average from .247 to .322. Lopez's .359 average since July 15 ranks first in the Midwest League; third among players on the 30 teams at the Single-A classification (Midwest League and South Atlantic League) and 10th among all full-season Minor League players (120 teams).
- **Jose Garcia** has hit safely in 16 straight games, going 24 for 74, .324, to raise his average from .231 to .245. Garcia was selected as Midwest League Batter of the Week for the week of August 13-19.
- **Andy Sugilio** over his last 24 games: 31 for 92, .337, 2 HR, to raise his average from .255 to .276.
- **J.D. Williams** over his last 19 games: 21 for 64, .328, to raise his average from .203 to .261.
- **Jeter Downs** over his last eight games: 10 for 31, .323.
- **Reshard Munroe** over his last eight games: 8 for 26, .308.
- **Dauri Moreta** over his last five appearances: 12 IP, 6 H, 1 R, 0 R, 0 BB, 13 SO, 0.00 ERA.

Dragons Manager/Coaches:

Fastest of the Fast: On July 26, Dayton pitcher Hunter Greene threw a fastball against Fort Wayne's Luis Campusano for a called third strike that registered at 102 mph on the TrackMan monitor at Fifth Third Field, breaking the stadium record for fastest pitch. Greene, Aroldis Chapman, and Aneurys Zabala had previously thrown pitches that were clocked at 101 mph.

The Dragons MVP Program

The Dragons expanded elementary school MVP Program reaches five counties and more than 1,100 classrooms. Schools in Montgomery, Greene, Clark, Miami and Warren counties are part of the program that includes 1,116 fourth and fifth grade classrooms in 183 schools over 48 school districts. About 34,000 children will participate. The program is in its 13th year in 2018. The Dragons MVP Program presented by Bob Evans Farms is also made possible by the generous support of CollegeAdvantage, Sinclair College, WDTN-TV and Dayton's CW. Due to the support of the participating sponsors, the program is completely free of charge to the schools.
