**AUGUST 27<sup>th</sup> PAWTUCKET (63-68) at BUFFALO (61-68) 7:05 pm**

**Pawtucket Red Sox RHP William Cuevas (9-7, 3.44) vs. Buffalo Bisons RHP Zach Stewart (2-0, 4.26)**

***One Week to Go*** - The Pawtucket Red Sox begin the final full week of the season (the regular-season ends next Monday afternoon at McCoy Stadium) when they play the finale of this 4-game series in Buffalo - and their 8-game roadtrip - tonight at 7:05 pm at Coca-Cola Field in downtown Buffalo. The PawSox - winners of 11 of their last 18 games - have won the last two games of this wrap-around weekend series against the Bisons (AAA-Toronto) by 8-5 and 8-3 scores over the weekend after dropping the opener on Friday, 13-4. The Sox have split each of their last two series - both 4-game sets vs. Durham from August 16-19 and at Rochester from August 21-23. They have a chance tonight to capture this series outright with a victory over the Bisons. The PawSox are 15-20-6 in their 41 series this season (15 wins, 20 losses, and 6 splits) pending tonight.

***Three's Company*** - This series has proven to be a battle for 3<sup>rd</sup>-place in the IL North as the clubs came into play on Friday in a virtual tie for the third spot in the division. Buffalo took over sole possession of 3<sup>rd</sup> with their victory on Friday but the PawSox have bounced back over the Bisons with their two wins over the weekend. With a victory tonight the Sox would own a 2-game cushion with 7 games to go. A Buffalo win would pull the Bisons to within a pct. point of the PawSox. As of now, the Sox will play 139 games this season (one game cancelled back in April) while Buffalo is slated for 138 games (they have had two games cancelled due to weather issues in April).

***Red Sox Rehabbers on the Horizon*** - Three key members of the Boston Red Sox, all currently on the Red Sox disabled list, are expected to begin injury rehab assignments with the PawSox this week. Pitcher **Steven Wright**, who has been on the DL since June 23 with left knee inflammation (related to his knee surgery a year ago May), is slated to start in Pawtucket tomorrow (Tuesday) when the PawSox host Lehigh Valley at 7:05 pm at McCoy Stadium. Wright is 2-1 with a 3.38 ERA in 10 games (4 starts) for Boston this season (from May 15 - June 22) and is 0-0 with a 4.30 ERA in 4 games (2 starts) during a rehab assignment with the PawSox from April 20 - May 11.

Wright is expected to throw tomorrow to rehabbing Red Sox catcher **Christian Vazquez** who has been on the Sox DL since July 8 with a fractured right pinky finger suffered on a head-first slide while stealing 2<sup>nd</sup> base on July 7 in Kansas City. Vazquez, who is scheduled to catch in Portland tonight (with Red Sox rehabbing LHP Eduardo Rodriguez on the mound), was hitting .213 in 60 games (59 as catcher) for Boston with 3 HR & 14 RBI. He was coming off a fine June, however, when he batted .298 during the month.

On Wednesday the Red Sox are expected to send 3B **Rafael Devers** to Pawtucket to play at McCoy on Wednesday & Thursday nights vs. the IronPigs and then possibly continue with the club on Friday evening at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre. Devers has had three stints on Boston's disabled list this season with this most recent coming on August 16 when he was placed on the DL with a recurring left hamstring strain. Rafael has also been on the DL from July 11-21 with left shoulder inflammation and from July 29 - August 8 with the left hamstring strain. In 102 games for the Red Sox this season (100 at 3<sup>rd</sup> base) he is batting .242 with 22 doubles, 16 HR & 55 RBI. He also rehabbed for one game with (short-A) Lowell on August 6 and went 1-for-4 with a 2-run HR in that game and then rejoined the Red Sox on August 8 for six games before going back on the DL.

***Close Encounters*** - Pawtucket leads Buffalo in the season-series by a 10 games to 9 margin with the finale on tap for tonight. The Bisons have out-scored the Sox, 86-85 in the tight season-series.

***The Road Home*** – After splitting their 4-game series in Rochester last week, Pawtucket has now won 2 of 3 here in Buffalo so they are 4-3 on this 8-game trip. The PawSox will be back at McCoy tomorrow (Tuesday) night to begin a 3-game series and homestand vs. the IL North division champion Lehigh Valley IronPigs who clinched their first IL North title with a win over Scranton/WB this weekend in Allentown. The PawSox and IronPigs will play Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday nights (all at 7:05 pm) at McCoy.

***Homestands Dwindling*** – The PawSox have just that 3-game homestand (Tuesday - Thursday vs. Lehigh Valley) and a 2-game homestand to end the regular-season this coming Sunday, September 2 (6:15 pm) and Monday, September 3 (1:35 pm) vs. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre remaining at McCoy this season.

***Pitching in for Offense*** – Back in early-August, Pawtucket took over the International League lead in Team Pitching when they surpassed Rochester. The PawSox had remained on top of the league until the last weekend in August when the Red Wings moved back ahead. The PawSox are currently 2<sup>nd</sup> with their 3.47 ERA behind Rochester at 3.42. Pawtucket has also gone on a big upswing this month offensively and they are now all the way up to 7<sup>th</sup> in the IL with their Team Batting average of .252 (a season-high).

***Battling for a Batting Title*** – PawSox outfielder Rusney Castillo has pulled away a bit in the International League batting race as he looks to become the first Pawtucket player to win the IL Batting Title in 37 years...since Wade Boggs hit .335 in 1981. Rusney, who is hitting .322 on the season, now has a 12 point lead in the race over Joey Meneses of Lehigh Valley who is at .310. Castillo (148) also leads the league in Hits over Meneses (142). Rusney is bidding to join some select company and become the 6<sup>th</sup> player to win the IL Batting Championship following...Juan Beniquez (.298 in 1973), Jim Rice (.337 in 1974), Wayne Harer (.350 in 1977 – the highest batting average in PawSox history), Garry Hancock (.325 in 1979), and Boggs (.335 in 1981).

***August Moon*** – Pawtucket has posted some fine numbers in August with five games to go in the month. The Sox are batting .292 in the first 24 games this month (246-for-842) with 17 HR & 113 runs scored. The PawSox hit .233 in April, .227 in May, .258 in June, and .251 in July. Sox pitchers in August are 15-9 with a 3.14 ERA (73 ER in 209.1 IP).

***Night Owls*** – The PawSox are 5-games under .500 this year but they are over .500 at night posting a 48-47 record in night games this season compared to 15-21 in day games. The Sox have just one day game remaining...Labor Day Monday vs. Scranton/WB (1:35 pm) in the season-finale.

***More Hits and More Runs*** – The PawSox have out-hit their opponents on the season by a wide margin (1106 hits to 1062) and have been out-scored by the opposition by just 2 runs total on the year (Sox have scored 512 runs and allowed 514 runs).

***Road Getting Smoother*** – The PawSox have won 8 of their last 11 road games since August 9 and are now 29-37 on the road – they had the worst away mark in the league until this recent road surge. They had dropped 15 of their previous 20 on the road between June 26 – August 8. The Sox have won 10 of their last 18 games at home dating back to July 14. Pawtucket was a season-high 5-games over .500 on August 4 and they are now 34-31 at McCoy.

***What Have You Done for Me Lately*** – The PawSox are 15-10 since August 1 after going 3-11 in their previous 14 games between July 17-31. Included during that stretch was a season-high 6-game losing streak from July 17-22. Their recent 4-game winning streak (August 9-12) marked the first time they had been able to win more than two in a row since a 3-game winning streak from July 14-16.

***The 2018 Season-Series vs. Buffalo*** – The PawSox lead the Bisons, 10 games to 9 in the 2018 season-series with tonight's final meeting on tap. Pawtucket finished 5-4 at home vs. the Bisons and they are 5-5 here in Buffalo. The Bisons took 2 of 3 in Pawtucket during the first full week of the season from April 9-11, but the PawSox returned the favor by winning 2 of 3 in Buffalo at the end of the month from April 27-29. Buffalo out-last-ed the PawSox on April 9, 4-3 in 12-innings in the first extra inning game at McCoy with new rules. The Sox evened things with a 3-1 victory the next night, but the Bisons captured the series outright with a 14-8 slugfest victory in the finale on the afternoon of April 11. Just over two weeks later, the PawSox went to Buffalo and won 2 of 3. That series again began with a Sox extra inning victory (9-8 in 10-innings on April 27) followed by a 6-3 Pawtucket win the next day. The Bisons avoided the sweep with a 2-0 triumph in the finale on April 29. In mid-May the clubs played an abbreviated 2-game series that began with a 6-5, 10-inning victory for the PawSox on May 14 and ended with a 5-4 Bisons win on May 16 to knot the season-series at 4-4. In between was the May 15 rainout that caused a June 19 doubleheader in Pawtucket...Buffalo won opener, 4-0 but Sox took nightcap, 6-0. The next night the PawSox rolled to a 10-2 victory to take the season-series lead and then last Thursday (June 21) the Sox won the series outright with a 4-1 victory in Buffalo's last regular-season game at McCoy this year. In their last series between June 25-28 at Coca-Cola Field, Pawtucket used a 2-run HR from Adam Lind in the 8<sup>th</sup>-inning to rally past the Bisons, 3-2 in the series-opener in Buffalo but the Bisons won the next two nights by 3-1 scores before capturing the series outright with an 8-1 victory in the series-finale on the afternoon of June 28. Buffalo rolled in the opener of this series on Friday, 13-4 but the Sox have bounced back to win, 8-5 and 8-3 over the weekend.

***Stats vs. the Bisons This Season*** – Pawtucket is hitting .252 in the 19 games vs. Buffalo this season (162-for-842) with 18 HR while PawSox pitchers are 10-9 with a 3.77 ERA vs. the Bisons (63 ER in 167 IP).

**Success vs. the Bisons Lately** – Pawtucket and Buffalo have had some tight season-series in recent years including the PawSox 10-9 record this season. The PawSox finished 9-9 vs. the Bisons last season (going 6-5 in Pawtucket but 3-4 in Buffalo). The PawSox were 10-8 vs. the Bisons in 2016, but the Sox finished 8-9 vs. Buffalo in 2015. The 2015 season marked the only time the Sox have lost a season-series to the Bisons since 2008 when they went 6-10.

**Always a Battle vs. Buffalo** - The all-time series (this is the 21<sup>st</sup> year) between Pawtucket and Buffalo has gone back and forth in recent times and the PawSox come into play tonight with a 174-167 advantage. These two rivals have battled for almost 21 years now since Buffalo returned to the IL in 1998. The PawSox are 95-77 at home (including 0-1 at Fenway Park) vs. the Bisons but 79-90 in Buffalo since '98. Buffalo was a Cleveland affiliate from 1998 – 2008, a New York Mets affiliate from 2009-2012, and currently a Toronto Blue Jays affiliate for the 6<sup>th</sup> straight year.

**Low Point** – The PawSox (now at 63-68) were a season-low 10-games below .500 on July 31 and August 2 (49-59) for the first time in almost three years since they ended the 2015 season with a 59-85 record.

**One is a Lonely Number** – The Sox posted back-to-back 3-2 victories at Indianapolis on August 10 & 11. Pawtucket had lost 10 of their prior dozen 1-run decisions between July 6 – August 8. They were 16-9 in 1-run games on July 4 which was the best winning pct. in the league, but they are now 20-20 in 1-run games this season.

**Sad Endings** - The PawSox have lost a game in the opponent's final at-bat 10 times since July 17. Pawtucket had suffered just 5 losses in the final at-bat of a game previously during their first 92 games of the season. Furthermore, the PawSox have dropped 10 road games since July 17 and 8 of those 10 defeats occurred during the opposition's last AB of the game. During this span the Sox have lost games in the bottom of the 11<sup>th</sup>-inning, bottom of the 9<sup>th</sup>, bottom of the 8<sup>th</sup>, bottom of the 9<sup>th</sup>, bottom of the 10<sup>th</sup>, top of the 10<sup>th</sup>, bottom of the 13<sup>th</sup>, bottom of the 12<sup>th</sup>, top of the 9<sup>th</sup>, and bottom of the 8<sup>th</sup>. Overall this season, the Sox have lost 15 games during the opposition's last AB while winning 11 times during their own last AB (6 walk-offs).

**Left at the Altar** – The PawSox lead the league with 955 runners left on base this season for an average of 7.3 LOB per game. The club-record is 1121 LOB in 2005 in 144 games (or an average of 7.8 per game).

**Series Business** – The PawSox are 15-20-6 in their 41 series this season (15 wins, 20 losses, and 6 splits). They have posted four 3-game sweeps this season along with a 2-game sweep and a 1-game sweep (in Rochester on July 4). The PawSox have been swept in a series four times this season (suffering three 3-game sweeps and a 2-game sweep).

**North Face** – The PawSox will finish the season facing only IL North rivals... Pawtucket is 37-44 vs. their IL North rivals. They finished 13-11 vs. the IL West and 13-13 vs. the IL South.

**Bye to July** - The PawSox concluded July with a 10-16 record in which they battled in a wave of close games. Pawtucket finished the month 2-9 in one-run games, 1-4 in extra innings, and lost 7 games in the opponents' final at-bat in July. It marked their third consecutive losing month...they went 11-10 in April, but then 13-17 in May, 14-15 in June, and 10-16 in July. The Sox batted .251 in July with 15 HR in 26 games while posting a 3.54 ERA.

**Last Tune in June** – The PawSox – due to a 5-game losing skid to end the month of June – finished with a losing record in June at 14-15. They hit .258 with 27 HR in 29 games during the month along with a 3.41 ERA.

**A Hectic May** - The PawSox finished an extremely busy May with a 13-17 record for the month. The topsy-turvy travel month included four different homestands and four different roadtrips. Pitchers posted a 3.60 ERA in May while batters hit .227 with 22 HR and 97 runs in 30 May games (for an average of 3.2 runs per game). The Sox played 30 games in 31 days in May with just one scheduled off-day (May 17) during the entire month.

**April Comes up a Winner** – The PawSox posted a winning April for the 6<sup>th</sup> time in the last 8 years as they finished the month with an 11-10 record and in 2<sup>nd</sup>-place in the IL North (-2 GB of front-running Syracuse at the time). Pawtucket has had just one losing month of April since 2010 and that came last year (10-12). The Sox hit .233 in April with 16 HR in 21 games while pitchers were 11-10 with a 3.51 ERA along with a league-leading 230 strikeouts in 190 innings.

**Throwing Strikes** – Pawtucket pitchers are 2<sup>nd</sup> in the International League with 1151 strikeouts. Durham leads with 1197 SO. Sox hurlers have posted strikeout games of 20 (April 9), 18 (April 20 & July 8), 15 (three times), 14 (three times), 13 (five times), 12 (eight times), 11 (six times), and 10 (16 times) this season.

**Defensive** – Last year the PawSox led the International League with a .987 fielding pct. while making a league-low 64 errors on the season (both new franchise-records). This season the Sox are 12<sup>th</sup> in the league with a .979 fielding pct. (96 errors in 4584 total chances).

**Blanketed** – The PawSox have been shutout 13 times this season (8-13)...Rochester (11-14) has been blanked the most in the league. Pawtucket was blanked 9 times total in 2017. They went 18-9 in shutout games last year.

**A Look Back Before We Go Forth** – Pawtucket finished 67-75 last year and in 4<sup>th</sup>-place in the IL North for the second straight season. They dropped to a season-low 9-games under .500 on August 26 at 62-71. On July 18, 2017 the PawSox were a season-best 6-games over .500 at 50-44. Pawtucket finished 34-36 in games played at McCoy Stadium last season. Thus they finished with just their second losing season at McCoy in the last 8 years. The Sox went 33-39 on the road.

### SEPTEMBER 3

### LAST GAME CELEBRATION

**1:35 pm vs. Scranton/WB**

Fans will be in for a special treat on Labor Day Monday, September 3<sup>rd</sup> when the PawSox play their final home game of the season at 1:35 pm vs. the Yankees of Scranton/Wilkes-Barre. Fans will want to stick around after the game for the traditional Last Game Celebration that is done only here at McCoy Stadium. In addition, the PawSox have added some unique surprises to this exciting day that fans won't want to miss.

**PAWSOX PLAYER MOVES** – None today, but there should be moves tomorrow that would add RHP Steven Wright and C Christian Vazquez on injury rehab assignments from Boston and then on Wednesday 3B Rafael Devers is expected to begin his rehab assignment with the PawSox.

The PawSox have been involved in 57 player moves since July 22. The Sox are at the roster limit with 25 active players. Pawtucket has used 56 different players this season (27 position players & 29 pitchers) – Vazquez will make that number 57 and Devers would be 58 which will be three more than the amount they employed last year (28 pitchers & 27 position players). The club-record is 70 players used in both 1995 and 2006.

More on the expected rehabbers...

Wright, who underwent cartilage restoration surgery on his left knee on May 8, 2017, has spent time in Pawtucket in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, and again in 2018. He is 23-15 with a 3.90 ERA in 65 games (44 starts) in the big leagues all with Boston (142 ER in 327.2 IP). Steven was named to the 2016 American League All-Star Team and finished that year with a 13-6 record and a 3.33 ERA in 24 starts for the Red Sox. His ERA was 10<sup>th</sup> best in the American League and his 4 complete games ranked tied for 3<sup>rd</sup> in all of Major League Baseball. Originally a member of the Cleveland Indians organization, he spent his first four years in the minor leagues as a traditional pitcher before converting to a knuckleball pitcher at the beginning of the 2011 season.

Vazquez had a terrific 2017 season with Boston batting .290 in 99 games with 5 HR & 32 RBI. He has thrown out 40% of runners attempting to steal in his Major League career (50 CS in 126 attempts) which puts him among the leading catchers in MLB since 1987 (minimum 200 games). Christian missed the entire 2015 season recovering from Tommy John surgery performed on his right elbow. He split time between Pawtucket (.270 in 42 games) and Boston (.227 in 57 games) during his comeback season of 2016.

Devers, who at the age of 21 is one of the youngest players in all of Minor League Baseball, was indeed the youngest active player in the majors when he made his big league debut on July 25 of last season in Seattle. That promotion came after a quick and successful 9-game stint with the PawSox when he hit .400 with 2 HR after joining the PawSox that July 14<sup>th</sup>. He made an immediate impact with Boston belting 8 homers in his first 20 Major League games to become the first player ever to do so before turning 21-years-old. Devers was selected as a league All-Star in each of his first four pro seasons from 2014-2017 before earning the call-up to Boston.

Infielder **Tzu-Wei Lin** became the first player promoted from Pawtucket to Boston this season (not including rehabbing players) on April 10 before rejoining Pawtucket on May 8, returning to Boston on June 23, back with Pawtucket (July 2), again in Boston (July 12), back with the PawSox (July 25), to Boston again on July 29, and back with Pawtucket on August 1. **Marcus Walden** was #2 following his quick recall on April 12 and then another recall on May 2 (he came off the PawSox DL on July 25). **Bobby Poyner** became the third call-up on May 4 – he later returned to Pawtucket, went back to Boston (May 15), back again with the PawSox, to Boston (June 2), returned to Pawtucket (June 7), back to Boston (July 14), and now with the PawSox (July 22). 1B/OF **Sam Travis** became the fourth call-up on June 2, returned to the the PawSox on June 12, back to Boston on July 13 and now back to Pawtucket on July 16. RHP **Brandon Workman** was next on June 5 and spent almost two months with the Red Sox before being optioned on July 26, recalled on July 31, optioned on August 12 (added Aug. 14), and then recalled again on August 18. LHP **Jalen Beeks** followed on June 6 (returned to Pawtucket on June 8, recalled to Boston on July 10, back with the PawSox on July 11, and traded to Tampa Bay on July 25). RHP **Justin Haley** was the next call-up to Boston on June 8, was optioned on June 19, recalled to Boston again on June 26, and optioned back to Pawtucket on July 2. LHP **Robby Scott** was promoted to Boston on June 19 but was optioned to Pawtucket on June 23 before another promotion to Boston on July 11, and now optioned to Pawtucket on July 16. RHP **William Cuevas** was promoted to Boston on July 2, optioned back on July 4, recalled again on July 8, optioned on July 10, recalled as the Red Sox 26<sup>th</sup> man for their August 11 doubleheader, and optioned on August 12 (added on August 15). Reliever **Ryan Brasier** was selected to Boston on July 8. On August 3 catcher **Dan Butler** was selected to the Red Sox roster and was added to the PawSox roster on August 16. On August 4 INF **Tony Renda** became the 12<sup>th</sup> different player promoted from Pawtucket to Boston (and the next night he scored the winning run in the bottom of the 10<sup>th</sup>-inning as a pinch runner to cap the Red Sox 4-game sweep of the Yankees at Fenway). Renda returned to Pawtucket on August 9.

The PawSox have employed 9 different Red Sox players on a rehab assignment already this season...LHP Drew Pomeranz (twice but now back with Boston), RHP Steven Wright (twice but back in Boston), LHP Bobby Poyner (optioned to Pawtucket, recalled again to Boston, and now back with the PawSox), INF Xander Bogaerts (returned to Boston), RHP Tyler Thornburg (three times but now in Boston), INF/OF Brock Holt (back with Boston), 2B Dustin Pedroia (back with the Red Sox), RHP Austin Maddox (returned to Boston but remains on Red Sox DL), and RHP Hector Velazquez (returned to Boston).

It was another busy player movement year in 2017. The PawSox were involved in 221 player transactions during the 2017 season. Pawtucket employed 55 different players last season (28 pitchers & 27 position players). They had 18 different players promoted to Boston during the 2017 season (not including rehabbing players).
