Tonight's Game: The San Jose Giants look to avoid a sweep when they conclude their three-game series at Modesto (Mariners affiliate) this evening. The Nuts have claimed the first two games of the series by the scores of 7-1 and 10-3. Casey Meisner (2-3, 4.47 ERA) is San Jose's scheduled starting pitcher tonight.

The Giants: San Jose enters tonight's contest having lost six of their last seven games. The Giants are only 5-13 in August after posting a 16-13 July record. Last night's defeat clinched San Jose's fourth consecutive series loss and dropped the Giants (56-71) to a season-high 15 games below .500 overall.

Playoff Race: The Giants (56-71) are two games behind Stockton (58-69) in the race for the second-best overall record in the North Division. Including tonight, San Jose has 12 games remaining in the regular season. If Visalia wins the second half (currently lead division by 6 1/2 games), the team with the second-best overall record in the North Division will qualify for the playoffs. Within the division, the Giants have eight games left versus Stockton, three against Visalia and one game versus Modesto. San Jose last reached the playoffs in 2016.

Familiar Foe: Tonight marks the 31st and final meeting of the season between San Jose and Modesto. The Giants are 15-15 versus the Nuts this year with this evening's game deciding the season series winner. San Jose has lost their last four games against Modesto after winning four straight in the head-to-head matchup.

Recent Struggles: Over their last seven games (1-6 record), the Giants are batting only .227 as a team and own a 5.95 ERA.

Losing Season: The Giants have clinched their fourth consecutive season (2016-19) with a sub-.500 record. It's the first time in San Jose Giants team history (1988-2019) that the club has had four consecutive losing seasons. The San Jose franchise last had a stretch of at least four straight sub-.500 seasons from 1981-87 (seven consecutive losing seasons – San Jose Missions 1981, San Jose Expos 1982, San Jose Bees 1983-87).

Hot Hitter: Sandro Fabian is batting .356 (16-for-45) over his last 11 games. Fabian is hitting .303 with five home runs and 33 RBI's in 40 games for San Jose this season. The 21-year old outfielder boasts a .426 batting average with runners in scoring position. Fabian hit only .200 in 112 games with the SJ Giants last season.

Phillips Wins Weekly Award: Aaron Phillips was named California League Pitcher of the Week on Monday. In two starts last week, Phillips tossed 14 2/3 innings with only one earned run allowed, one walk and 15 strikeouts (2-0 record). Phillips twirled a one-hit shutout last Sunday against Inland Empire, retiring 27 of 28 batters faced in the outing. It marked the first nine-inning shutout thrown by a San Jose Giants pitcher since Eric Surkamp on May 16, 2010 (vs. Bakersfield). The weekly award was Phillips' second of the season.

Hector Borg At The Helm: Hector Borg was named manager of the San Jose Giants on July 17 replacing Bill Hayes, who resigned four days earlier. Borg, 34, had been serving as the fundamentals coach for the Giants' Dominican Summer League team this season prior to his appointment in San Jose. Last year, Borg was the manager for the Salem-Keizer Volcanoes (Giants Short-Season affiliate). He also managed the Giants' Arizona Rookie League team in 2017. Borg played three seasons in the San Francisco farm system from 2004-06. San Jose is 15-17 since Borg took over as manager. See page 6 for more info on Borg.

Tonight's Start: 24-year old right-hander is slated to make his ninth start and 14th overall appearance with the San Jose Giants in tonight's game at Modesto.

San Jose Notes: Is 2-3 with a 4.47 ERA for San Jose ... Has pitched 52 1/3 innings with 29 walks, 45 strikeouts and a .276 opponents batting average (.281 vs. right, .269 vs. left) ... Has not allowed a run in three of his eight starts ... Originally joined the Giants on May 9.

Last Time Out: Most recent outing came as a starter on August 16 at Inland Empire ... Pitched 4 1/3 innings with five runs (all earned) allowed ... Five walks and seven strikeouts were both season-high totals ... Suffered the loss (Giants lost game 7-5).

Triple-A: Has had two stints with Triple-A Sacramento during the second half ... Was 2-1 with a 4.57 ERA in four appearances (three starts) for the River Cats ... Pitched a season-high six innings with two runs allowed in his July 31 start at San Antonio.

Inside The Numbers: Is 1-2 with a 4.24 ERA as a starter for San Jose (8 GS) ... Has limited the opposition to a .207 batting average with runners in scoring position ... Making only his second start with the Giants since July 4 ... Has a 5.59 ERA across three levels this season ... Has allowed 18 home runs in 93 1/3 innings.

Fourth Organization: Signed a minor league deal with the San Francisco Giants on May 9 ... Was released by the St. Louis Cardinals organization on May 4 ... Has pitched in the New York Mets (2013-15), Oakland Athletics (2015-17), St. Louis Cardinals (2018-19) and San Francisco Giants (2019) organizations ... Is in his seventh professional season.

2019 With Springfield: Began the year with Cardinals Double-A affiliate Springfield ... Was 0-2 with a 9.78 ERA in six games (four starts) before his release ... Allowed 10 home runs in 19 1/3 innings pitched ... Had a .367 opponents batting average.

Cal League Experience: Has previously pitched in the California League with the Stockton Ports (A's affiliate) during the 2015, 2016 and 2017 seasons ... Made 51 appearances (38 starts) with Stockton combining for a 10-20 record and a 4.26 ERA.

Two-Time All-Star: Has made two All-Star teams during his professional career ... Was a 2015 South Atlantic League All-Star with the Savannah Sand Gnats ... Also earned midseason California League All-Star honors with Stockton in 2017.

Traded Twice: Has been traded twice in his career ... Was traded from the Mets to the Athletics on July 27, 2015 in exchange for pitcher Tyler Clippard ... Was traded again on March 31, 2018 from the Athletics to the Cardinals in exchange for pitcher Josh Lucas.

Draft Day: Originally a third round selection of the Mets (84th overall pick) in 2013 out of Cypress Woods High School (Cypress, TX).
