51^s vs. Isotopes: The Las Vegas 51^s professional baseball team, Triple-A affiliate of the New York Mets, will face the Albuquerque Isotopes, Triple-A affiliate of the Colorado Rockies, this afternoon in the finale of the three-game series in Pacific Coast League action at Isotopes Park (13,500)...Las Vegas is 0-2 in the series...the 51^s will continue the seven-game road trip and travel to El Paso, Texas to face the Chihuahuas, Triple-A affiliate of the San Diego Padres, in a four-game series from Friday-Monday, April 13-16...Las Vegas will then return to Cashman Field on Tuesday, April 17 to open a seven-game homestand against Fresno.

Albuquerque defeats Las Vegas 17-11 in game two of the series: The Isotopes defeated the 51^s 17-11 last night in game two of the three-game series and the seven-game road trip before a crowd of 6,977 at Isotopes Park.

Las Vegas offense: The 51^s recorded 16 hits and five players recorded multiple-hit games. Second baseman **Ty Kelly** was 4-for-5, double, triple, two home runs, 3 RBI, three runs scored; first baseman **Dominic Smith** was 3-for-5, two doubles, HR, 2 RBI, two runs scored; third baseman **David Thompson** was 3-for-4, walk, double, two runs scored and LF **Zach Borenstein** was 2-for-4, HR, 2 RBI.

Albuquerque offense: The Isotopes recorded 15 hits and built a 17-9 lead after five innings. Left fielder **Drew Weeks** was 3-for-5, walk, 2 HR, 3 RBI, three runs scored; center fielder **Raimel Tapia** was 2-for-5, walk, HR, 4 RBI, two runs scored and second baseman **Derrik Gibson** was 2-for-4, walk, two doubles, 2 RBI, three runs scored.

Las Vegas pitching: Right-hander **A.J. Griffin** suffered the loss. He pitched 2.1 innings and allowed 9 hits, 9 runs, walked 3 and struck out 1 on 64 pitches (35 strikes).

51^s Bullpen: Left-hander **David Roseboom** pitched 1.2 innings and allowed 4 hits and 5 runs. Left-hander **Kelly Secrist** pitched 2 innings and allowed 3 runs. Right-hander **Tim Peterson** (1.0 IP/0 R) and left-hander **Matt den Dekker** (1.0 IP/0 R) pitched the final two IP.

El Paso defeats Las Vegas 8-5 in game four of the series (Sunday, April 8): The Chihuahuas defeated the 51^s 8-5 in game four of the season-opening five-game homestand before a **Little League Day #1** crowd of 5,323 at Cashman Field.

Las Vegas offense: The 51^s recorded 10 hits and scored all five runs via the home run. Catcher **Jose Lobaton** (1-for-4) hit a two-run homer in the fourth inning and infielder **Ty Kelly** (2-for-5) hit a three-run homer in the seventh inning. Second baseman **Gavin Cecchini** was 2-for-3, two doubles, run scored.

El Paso offense: The Chihuahuas recorded 12 hits and rallied for six runs over the final two at bats in the come-from-behind victory. Right fielder **Nick Schulz** was 3-for-5, double, 3 RBI, run scored; first baseman **Allen Craig** was 2-for-5, 2 RBI, run scored and catcher **Stephen McGee** was 1-for-3, two walks, two-run homer in the eighth inning.

Las Vegas pitching: Left-hander **P.J. Conlon** pitched 6 solid innings in the no decision. He allowed 4 hits, 1 run, walked 1 and struck out 9 on 86 pitches (55 strikes).

El Paso defeats Las Vegas 14-0 in series finale (Monday, April 9): The Chihuahuas defeated the 51^s 14-0 in the finale of the season-opening five-game homestand before a **Smith's Value Menu Monday** crowd of 2,949 at Cashman Field. Las Vegas was 1-4 on the first homestand of 2018.

Las Vegas offense: The 51^s recorded 5 hits and were shutout for the first time this season. Second baseman **Gavin Cecchini** was 2-for-3 and center fielder **Matt den Dekker**, shortstop **Ty Kelly** and right fielder **Bryce Brentz** were each 1-for-4.

El Paso offense: The Chihuahuas recorded 17 hits and six players recorded multiple-hit games. Third baseman **Diego Goris** was 3-for-5, HR, 3 RBI, three runs scored; left fielder **Franchy Cordero** was 3-for-6, double; first baseman **Brett Nicholas** was 2-for-4, walk, double, HR, 2 RBI, three runs scored and SS **Javy Guerra** was 2-for-5, double, 2 RBI.

Albuquerque defeats Las Vegas 7-3 in series opener (Tuesday, April 10): The Isotopes defeated the 51^s 7-3 in the opener of the three-game series and seven-game road trip before a crowd of 9,104 at Isotopes Park.

Las Vegas offense: The 51^s recorded 6 hits and scored all three runs in the first inning. Left fielder **Zach Borenstein** was 2-for-4 with a two-run homer in the first inning; third baseman **Phillip Evans** was 2-for-3, walk, double, RBI, run scored and second baseman **Gavin Cecchini** was 1-for-3, walk, double.

Albuquerque offense: The Isotopes recorded 13 hits and rallied from a 3-0 deficit and scored five runs in the sixth inning to take a 7-3 lead. Shortstop **Daniel Castro** was 2-for-4, two doubles, two runs scored; first baseman **Jordan Patterson** and right fielder **Noel Cuevas** were each 2-for-4, run scored and second baseman **Derrik Gibson** (1-for-4) hit a three-run homer in the sixth inning.

Las Vegas pitching: Right-hander **Drew Gagnon** pitched 5 innings in the no decision. He allowed 5 hits, 2 runs, issued no walks and struck out 6 on 88 pitches (56 strikes).

51^s BRIEFINGS – Las Vegas, losers of five straight games, is 0-2 vs. Albuquerque in the three-game series...the series against the Isotopes, Triple-A affiliate of the Colorado Rockies, will conclude this afternoon...the 51^s will then continue the seven-game road trip and travel to El Paso, Texas to face the Chihuahuas, Triple-A affiliate of the San Diego Padres, in a four-game series from Friday-Monday, April 13-16....Las Vegas and El Paso will meet 12 times from April 5-23...the 2018 season will feature 140 games...following the first road trip of the 2018 season, Las Vegas will return to Cashman Field on Tuesday, April 17 to open a seven-game homestand against the Fresno Grizzlies, Triple-A affiliate of the 2017 World Series champion Houston Astros...the April 17th game will mark the first of eight games as Las Vegas Reyes de Plata (“Silver Kings”)...the four-game series against the Grizzlies will conclude on Friday, April 20.

36 SEASONS IN THE SILVER STATE - The 51^s are playing in their 36th Pacific Coast League season in the Silver State...the Las Vegas 51^s have the proud distinction of being the longest enduring franchise in the history of professional sports in the state of Nevada...Las Vegas Triple-A baseball was born on April 10, 1983 before a crowd of 10,622 at Cashman Field (Las Vegas defeated Salt Lake City, 11-8).

CASHMAN FIELD FINALE: The 2018 season will mark the Las Vegas franchise final campaign at Cashman Field.

We are confident this location, which is easily accessed from all regions of the valley via the 215 Beltway, will help grow our fan base and introduce new generations to America’s favorite past time. We can’t wait to put down roots in Downtown Summerlin, a destination that already has a reputation for best in fun, family-oriented entertainment.”

Langer is in his 19th season behind the mike...he is a 10-time recipient of the Nevada Sportscaster of the Year award (2003, 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015) presented by the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association...also worked a total of 30 Montreal Expos games during the 2003 and 2004 seasons...in 2006, Langer was hired for additional major league duty by the Baltimore Orioles and broadcast 10 games on a fill-in basis during the course of the season...has also broadcast selected Los Angeles Dodgers Spring Training games in March of 2006 and in Arizona in March of 2008 and with the Toronto Blue Jays in 2009 and 2010 and Chicago White Sox in 2012-18...also broadcast the action for the 2016 Triple-A All-Star Game Radio Network from Charlotte, North Carolina...in 2017, Langer also completed his sixth season as the radio “play-by-play voice” for the UNLV Football team.

ROBERT J. BLUM BROADCAST BOOTH AT CASHMAN FIELD:

The “51s Home Radio Booth” was renamed the “**Robert J. Blum Broadcast Booth**” prior to the 2013 season to honor the 51s Special Assistant to the General Manager...“The Blummer” passed away on July 22, 2012 at the age of 91...also served as the play-by-play voice for Stars/51^s baseball in selected seasons from 1985-2005 & 2008-10...his company, Robert J. Blum Productions, also produced Las Vegas Triple-A professional baseball games broadcast on radio and television for several seasons.

51^s Manager Tony DeFrancesco: He was named the 24th manager (January 9, 2018) in the history of the Las Vegas franchise (1983 - present, 35 seasons). **Career Summary:** He has compiled 33 seasons overall in professional baseball, including 23 seasons as manager (over .500 seasons in 18 of 23 years)...has compiled an overall managerial record over 24 seasons (**current**) of 1,598-1,397 (.534) in the Oakland A's (1994-2010) and Houston Astros (2011-17) organizations...has also compiled an impressive Pacific Coast League managerial career record over 15 seasons (**current**) of 1,076-873 (.552) as a Triple-A skipper from 2003-07, 2009-17...was a member of the Houston Astros organization for the past seven seasons (2011-17) and was the manager for Triple-A Oklahoma City for four seasons (2011-14) and Triple-A Fresno for three seasons (2015-17)...was the manager of the PCL squad at the 2017 Triple-A All-Star Game...was also the manager for seven seasons at Triple-A Sacramento (Oakland A's) from 2003-07, 2009-10...the PCL tenure includes four championships (2003, 2004, 2007, 2015), two Triple-A National Championships (2007, 2015) and eight division titles...was named the 2003 PCL Manager of the Year and the 2015 Minor League Manager of the Year by *Baseball America*...the four PCL titles is tied with Hall of Famer **Del Crandall** for the most championships in league history. Crandall's championships with Albuquerque were in 1978, 1979, 1981, 1982...**in 2018, he enters his first season in the New York Mets organization and first campaign as manager of Triple-A Las Vegas...also enters his 15th season as manager in the PCL**...DeFrancesco first joined the Oakland A's organization as a minor league manager prior to the 1994 season...began his managerial career in '94 with Rookie-level Athletics of the Arizona League...then was manager for Single-A Southern Oregon of the Northwest League (1995-96); Single-A Visalia of the California League (1997-98) and Double-A Midland of the Texas League (1999-2002)...his nine-year record (1994-2002) was 522-524 (.499)...in 2003, he managed in his first season at Triple-A Sacramento and guided the River Cats to the PCL championship...in 2008, he earned his first full-time Major League coaching job, as third base coach for the A's, before returning to Sacramento to manage in 2009...then moved to the Astros organization following the 2010 campaign to manage Triple-A Oklahoma City in 2011...in 2012, he was elevated

from Oklahoma City to Houston and was named the Astros interim manager on August 19, replacing **Brad Mills** who was fired...managed the final 41 games of the season and on August 24, he earned his first Major League victory, defeating the New York Mets, 3-1, at Citi Field. He compiled an overall record of 16-25 (.390) and with the Astros switching to the American League for 2013, DeFrancesco was the final manager to lead the Astros as a National League franchise.

Professional Playing Career: He was selected by the Boston Red Sox in the ninth round of the June 1984 First-Year Player Draft...played in a total of nine seasons in the minor leagues as a catcher in the Boston and Cincinnati organizations...reached Triple-A with both organizations (Pawtucket in 1986 and Nashville in 1988, 1990-91)...appeared in 567 career games and batted .232 (381-for-1,640) with 60 doubles, 17 home runs and 167 RBI...the Suffern, New York native attended Suffern High School and then played two seasons for Seton Hall University (1982 & 1984).

51^s Coaching Staff: **Joel Chimelis** enters his 15th season overall as a coach in professional baseball and his first season in the Mets organization as the hitting coach for Triple-A Las Vegas. **Minor League Coaching Career:** He spent 12 seasons in the Houston Astros organization and was the hitting coach for Double-A Corpus Christi of the Texas League for two seasons (2012, 2017)...prior to 2017, he spent 11 years in Houston's system, starting at Single-A Tri-City of the New York-Penn League (2006-10) and working his way to Single-A Lexington of the South Atlantic League (2011) and Corpus Christi (2012) before spending four years at Single-A Quad Cities of the Midwest League (2013-16)...before joining the Astros, he spent two years (2004-05) on the coaching staff of the Single-A Savannah Sand Gnats of the South Atlantic League in the Montreal Expos/Washington Nationals organization...during the 2014 offseason, he served as hitting coach for the Puerto Rican Winter League champion Cangrejeros de Santurce.

Professional Playing Career: He was selected by Oakland in the 11th round of June 1988 First-Year Player Draft...was traded to the San Francisco Giants in 1991 and spent the 1996 season in the New York Mets organization (Triple-A Norfolk)...reached the Triple-A level in the Giants system, playing for Phoenix from 1992-95, and was called up to the Majors during the '95 season...during his 14-year minor league career as an infielder (1988-96, 1999-2002), he also enjoyed stints in Mexico, Puerto Rico, Taiwan, Korea and Canada...attended Howard Junior College in Big Spring, Texas and played for the University of Texas in 1988...was named to the 1988 NCAA Central Region team with the Longhorns.

Glenn Abbott enters his eighth season overall in the Mets organization and his first season as the pitching coach at Triple-A Las Vegas. **Minor League Coaching Career:** He spent the previous six seasons as pitching coach for Double-A Binghamton of the Eastern League (2012-17)...in 2017, Binghamton compiled a record of 85-54 (.612) and advanced to the EL playoffs...also served as pitching coach for Single-A Savannah of the South Atlantic League in 2011...was a member of the San Diego Padres system before joining the Mets...served as pitching coach for Double-A San Antonio of the Texas League in 2007 and 2010...served in the same role with Triple-A Portland of the Pacific Coast League in 2008 and 2009 and with Double-A Mobile of the Southern League in 2006...was also pitching coach in the Texas Rangers system from 2003-05...spent a total of 13 seasons as a coach in Oakland's organization from 1990-2002...made his coaching debut with the Mets in 1985 with Single-A Little Falls of the New York-Penn League and stayed with the organization through the 1989 season. **Major League Playing Career:** Played 11 seasons in the Major Leagues with Oakland (1973-76), Seattle (1977-81, 1983) and Detroit (1983-84)...the right-hander appeared in 248 career games (206 starts and 37 complete games) and posted a 62-83 record with a 4.39 ERA...struck out 484 batters in 1,286.0 innings pitched...on September 28, 1975, he appeared in the first four-pitcher, no-hitter in major league history, combining with **Vida Blue**, **Paul Linblad** and **Rollie Fingers** against the California Angels on the final day of the regular season...was selected by Oakland in the eighth round of the June 1969 First-Year Player Draft...attended North Little Rock High School and the State College of Arkansas (Conway, AR).

Jeremy Accardo enters his second season in the New York Mets organization and his first season as the bullpen coach with Triple-A Las Vegas...in 2017, he served as the pitching coach for Rookie-level Gulf Coast League Mets...spent eight seasons in the Major Leagues with San Francisco (2005-06), Toronto (2006-10), Baltimore (2011), Cleveland (2012) and Oakland (2012)...appeared in 262 career games and posted a 10-20 record with a 4.30 ERA with 38 saves (285.0 IP/205 SO)...was originally signed by San Francisco as a non-drafted free agent in 2003 after playing college ball at Illinois State University and earned his degree in 2016...was a member of Triple-A Las Vegas for two seasons (Toronto, 2009-10) and is the franchise leader with 37 career saves.
