## Omaha Storm Chasers (20-23) vs. Oklahoma City Dodgers (14-27)

**Today's Game:** The OKC Dodgers and Omaha Storm Chasers close out their five-game series with an 11:05 a.m. game at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark. The series is tied, 2-2, as the teams meet for the final time this season in Oklahoma City. With a victory today, the Dodgers can secure their first series win of the 2019 season.

**Last Game:** Omaha scored runs in seven different innings and hit three home runs on the way to an 11-1 win against the Dodgers Sunday afternoon at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark. The Storm Chasers built an 8-0 lead in the top of the seventh inning before the Dodgers got on the scoreboard in the bottom of the inning with a solo home run by Connor Joe. The Storm Chasers had quickly taken the lead in the first inning when Humberto Arteaga opened the game with a leadoff home run. Erick Mejia hit a RBI single in the third inning before Samir Dueñez drove in two more runs with a double for a 4-0 advantage. Arteaga hit his second home run of the game in the fourth inning, knocking a two-run shot out to the Budwesier Deck in left field for a 6-0 Omaha lead. Jecksson Flores hit into a fielder's choice in the sixth inning to bring home Omaha's seventh run. Omaha loaded the bases in the seventh and scored a run on a wild pitch by Adam McCreery to take an 8-0 lead. Joe led off the bottom of the seventh inning with a towering home run off the LED board in left field to get the Dodgers on the scoreboard. A RBI triple by Erick Mejia in the eighth extended Omaha's lead to 9-1 before Andrew Susac added a two-run homer out to right field in the top of the ninth. Dodgers starting pitcher Brock Stewart (0-4) was charged with the loss, while Brian Flynn (2-2) got the win for Omaha, pitching 5.2 innings.

**Today's Probable Pitcher:** Rob Zastryzny (0-2) takes to the mound for his eighth start of the season and second against the Storm Chasers... He most recently started May 14 in Round Rock, allowing six runs on nine hits over five innings during a no decision. The Express hit two home runs, including a grand slam by Drew Ferguson...Zastryzny has racked up 25 strikeouts over his last three games (17.1 IP), reaching at least nine strikeouts twice. On May 4 in New Orleans, he tied his career high with 10 K's over 5.1 innings. He enters today with a 4.9 strikeout-to-walk ratio (44 K/9 BB)...Zastryzny spent the first six seasons of his career in the Chicago Cubs organization before being released near the end of Spring Training and signing with the Dodgers in late March...He played the majority of 2018 with Iowa (33 games) and made six appearances with Chicago. Working almost exclusively out of the bullpen, Zastryzny went 3-2 with a 3.86 ERA for Iowa over 56.0 IP...Zastryzny was selected by the Cubs in the second round of the 2013 MLB Draft from the University of Missouri...In his last meeting with Omaha April 9, he held the Storm Chasers scoreless and to two hits over 5.0 innings two walks and six strikeouts, as he made both his team and season debut. Between his time with OKC and Iowa, Zastryzny is 1-1 with a 2.36 ERA against Omaha over seven games and the Storm Chasers have batted just .184 against him.

**Against the Storm Chasers:** 2019: 4-5 2018: 8-8 All-time: 161-151 At OKC: 84-74  
The Dodgers are already meeting Omaha for their third series of the 2019 season and second in OKC...Six of the teams' nine matchups have been decided by one or two runs...Omaha won a three-game series at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark April 16-18. The teams split a weather-shortened two-game series at Werner Park April 9-10...So far in the 2019 series with the Storm Chasers, OKC's Edwin Rios has 14 hits, nine RBI, eight runs scored, three home runs and four doubles. Last season against Omaha, he batted .410 in 16 games, leading the Dodgers with 25 hits, including a team-best eight doubles, 10 RBI, nine runs scored and two home runs...OKC has only won one season series against Omaha over the last eight seasons (11-3 in 2016) and is 1-5-2 in the season series since 2011.

**Dinger Details:** The Dodgers' lone run Sunday came via Connor Joe's first home run of the season in the seventh inning. The Dodgers have now hit 25 home runs over their last 15 games and have hit at least one home run in nine of their last 10 games (16 HR), including six games with two or more dingers. Ironically, the lone game during the stretch that the Dodgers were held without a homer was May 14 at Round Rock when OKC scored 15 runs, including 11 in one inning...Before the recent power surge, the Dodgers had smacked only 16 home runs in their first 26 games...On the other hand, the Dodgers have allowed at least one homer in seven straight games, with the opponent going yard 13 times. Five of the homers have been hit with a runner on base, and seven have occurred with two outs in an inning.

**Perking Up:** Cameron Perkins went 2-for-4 Sunday and has now hit safely in five straight games, and in 10 of his last 11 games, going 18-for-46 (.391) with six doubles, two homers, seven RBI and seven runs scored. During the five-game hitting streak he's 9-for-21, and he's tallied three straight multi-hit games for the first time since a run of four straight April 14-18, 2018 with Tacoma, going 7-for-13...After going 0-for-3 on May 1, Perkins' batting average stood at .197, but he's raised it by 83 points since then...He paces the Dodgers with 12 doubles so far this season and 14 of his 30 total hits this season have gone for extra bases.

**Speed Bump:** Yesterday marked the first time in five games the Dodgers were held to fewer than five runs. Entering Sunday, OKC had scored 36 runs over its previous four games combined...Although the Dodgers were held to just one run yesterday, OKC's offense is ramping up this month, scoring 91 runs and hitting 25 homers through the first 18 games of May. The Dodgers' 88 runs and 16 homers through April ranked last in the 16-team PCL...The team went 0-for-6 with runners in scoring position yesterday after batting .420 with RISP over the previous four games.

**On Strike:** The Dodgers struck out 10 more batters yesterday for the team's 19th double-digit strikeout game of the season. The Dodgers lead the PCL American Conference with 397 strikeouts over 347.0 innings this season. The Dodgers rank third overall in the PCL, trailing Sacramento (420) and Tacoma (401), but those teams have pitched 32.2 and 36.1 more innings than the Dodgers, respectively...Yesterday also marked the 10th game this season the Dodgers had 10 or more strikeouts, yet the opposition had 10 or more hits as well. When opponents don't strike out, they are batting .398 (386x969) overall and .419 (192x458) over the last 18 games.

**Shaggy 2 Dope:** JT Chargois pitched a perfect ninth inning Friday night on just nine pitches and struck out two of the three batters he faced. He's been scored upon just twice in 12 outings this season and once over his last 11 games. In his last 10 outings, he's allowed just two runs in 14.1 innings. Opponents are 11-for-51 (.216) during the stretch with 19 strikeouts.

**May Showers:** The Dodgers have allowed a combined 28 runs over the last three games and have allowed 10 or more runs six times in May and nine times overall this season, surpassing their total for the entire 2018 season (eight). OKC's 192 hits allowed and 130 runs allowed in May are both second-most in all of the Minors, only behind fellow-PCL team Reno (200 hits; 149 runs). The team's ERA this month currently stands at 6.99, and since rejoining the PCL in 1998, OKC's highest monthly ERA on record is 6.83 in May 2007...Including each of the last three days, starting pitchers have lasted less than 5.0 innings in 12 of 18 games this month. The starters have combined for just 75.1 innings for an average of less than 4.1 IP per game and have an aggregate ERA of 7.53...OKC now has a 6.92 ERA at home (22 games), which is second-highest in the Minors.

- Last Game:
• Allowed six runs and nine hits over 5.0 innings May 14 at Round Rock in no decision...did not issue a walk and notched six strikeouts.
• Started off by retiring all six batters between the first and second innings on a total of 22 pitches.
• Gave up back-to-back doubles to begin the third inning, but kept Round Rock at one run after having a runner at second base and none out....struck out three of the next four batters.
• Surrendered four runs and six hits in the fourth inning...Express started with three straight singles before a grand slam by Drew Ferguson.
• Allowed a solo homer to Kyle Tucker with two outs in the fifth inning.
• Round Rock went 6-for-9 in the fourth inning, but 3-for-16 over the other four frames.
• Left the game trailing, 6-4, before the Dodgers erupted for 11 runs in the seventh inning.

- Against Omaha:
• Today is his second meeting against the Storm Chasers this season and eighth meeting of his career.
• Made OKC team debut at Omaha on April 9...threw 5.0 scoreless innings; marked longest scoreless start since Aug. 7, 2016 while pitching for Iowa vs. OKC (6.0 IP)...allowed two hits - both singles - with two walks and six strikeouts...held Omaha 0-for-5 with runners on base and 0-for-3 with RISP; did not have a runner advance to third base...right-handed batters went 1-for-13...retired 10 of 11 batters during a stretch between the first and fourth innings.
• Between his time with OKC and Iowa (2015-18), owns a 1-1 record with a 2.36 ERA over 26.2 innings...allowed seven earned runs and four home runs with five walks and 33 strikeouts...Omaha has batted just .184 against him (18x98).
• Struck out a career-high 10 batters in his first career start against Omaha on July 6, 2016...7.0 IP, 6 H, 3 ER, 2 HR, BB, 10 K in a no-decision.
• Worked 5.0 perfect innings on Aug. 1, 2016 at Werner Park...struck out eight of the 15 batters faced...all seven balls put in play were groundouts...picked up in the win in the I-Cubs' 13-0 rout.

- 2019:
• Released by the Cubs on March 25 and signed as a minor league free agent by the Dodgers two days later.
• Began his time with OKC with 7.0 scoreless innings with four hits, but over last 29.1 innings, has allowed 27 runs (23 ER) and 39 hits, including eight home runs.
• Currently owns a 4.9 strikeout-to-walk ratio (44 K/9 BB)...averaging 10.9 strikeouts per nine innings and 2.2 walks per nine innings...has not issued a walk in three of seven starts.
• Impressed during his team debut April 9 at Omaha, throwing 5.0 scoreless innings...longest scoreless start since Aug. 7, 2016 while pitching for Iowa vs. OKC (6.0 IP)...allowed two hits - both singles - with two walks and six strikeouts...held Omaha 0-for-5 with runners on base and 0-for-3 with RISP; did not have a runner advance to third base...right-handed batters went 1-for-13 overall.
• On April 15 at Iowa, went 2-for-3 with two RBI, including a go-ahead RBI double in the fourth inning and RBI single in the fifth inning...first career multi-hit and multi-RBI game...entered the contest 5-for-49 with two RBI over his entire pro career.
• Allowed eight runs (five earned) over 5.1 innings April 20 vs. Iowa...marked just the third time in 82 career starts he allowed at least eight runs and was the most since Aug. 14, 2015 while with Double-A Tennessee at Chattanooga (9).
• Allowed five runs and a career-high 11 hits over 4.2 innings April 27 at San Antonio...scored upon in four of five innings...just the second time in his career the opponent collected 10 or more hits.
• Tied his career high with 10 strikeouts May 4 at New Orleans, previously achieved July 6, 2016 with the Iowa Cubs against the Omaha Storm Chasers (7.0 IP)...struck out the side in both the first and fifth innings...eight were swinging third strikes and two were called third strikes.
• Tossed 7.0 strong innings May 9 at home against Nashville in a no decision; still stands as the longest start by an OKC pitcher this season...allowed three runs (two earned) and four hits, with one walk and nine strikeouts...longest outing since July 6, 2016 vs. Omaha while playing for the Iowa Cubs...allowed a two-run homer to Patrick Wisdom with two outs in the fourth inning...following the homer, retired 10 of the final 11 batters faced...held Nashville 1-for-9 with runners on base...did not have a runner reach scoring position after the first inning.

- 2018:
• Made just one start in 2018 after starting 78 out of 90 career minor league appearances prior to the season...spent majority of the season with Iowa, but was recalled three times and made six appearances for the Chicago Cubs.
• In his first season of mainly relief work, did not allow an earned in 26 out of 39 appearances, including four separate instances of four-game scoreless streaks with Iowa and one streak of three straight scoreless trips with Chicago.
• Had significant reverse splits with Iowa...right-handed batters hit just .215/.304/.309 with two homers in 149 AB, but lefties hit .254/.357/.458 with three homers in 59 AB.
• Designated for assignment by the Cubs Sept. 1 and outrighted off the 40-man roster Sept. 3.

- Career:
• Selected by the Cubs in the second round of the 2013 MLB Draft out of the University of Missouri.
• Born in Edmonton, Alberta, but grew up in Corpus Christi, Texas.
• Entering his seventh professional season, all previously within the Cubs organization...made a total of 18 ML appearances and posted a 4.41 ERA and 2-0 record over 34.2 innings with 16 walks and 31 strikeouts...even 22-22 record in 446.0 minor league innings with 123 appearances (79 starts), 165 walks, and 397 strikeouts.
• Recalled by Chicago four times throughout the 2017 season, where he tossed 13.0 innings of relief, posting a 8.31 ERA with 19 hits, two home runs, seven walks, and 11 strikeouts...followed a career-best 11-5 record in 2016 with a 2-4 record in 2017, having his innings and appearances cut in half after being bothered by a lat strain that sidelined him from May 16 to July 10.
• Made ML debut Aug. 19, 2016 at Colorado, working a scoreless inning...did not allow a run until his fourth career appearance after 7.1 IP with nine strikeouts over his first three outings.
• Was the first pitcher selected during Cubs President of Baseball Operations Theo Epstein's reign to make it to Majors.
• Made the 2016 Cubs NLCS roster against the Dodgers, but did not make an appearance and was left off the World Series roster in exchange for a newly healthy Kyle Schwarber...earned a World Series ring in 2016 with now-teammate Justin Grimm.
• Baseball America ranked him as a top 30 prospect in the Cubs system from 2015-2017, topping out at no. 14 in the latter.
• Earned Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week honors on August 8, 2016 for a 2-0 record in two straight scoreless starts, the first in Omaha then against Oklahoma City, allowing two hits over 11.0 innings with 13 strikeouts and one walk...included 5.0 perfect innings at Werner Park in Omaha.

- Signed with the Dodgers as a minor league free agent on Nov. 20, 2018.
- Played in the Rockies organization in 2018...spent the first month of the season with Triple-A Albuquerque, where he hit .407 with 11 RBI...contract selected by Colorado May 1 and appeared in 18 games with the Rockies, batting .174 with one home run and six RBI...optioned to Albuquerque June 5, where he remained the rest of the season...designated for assignment by Colorado July 21 and outrighted to Albuquerque July 26.

- Hit a three-run homer in first start of the season May 4 at New Orleans.
- Pitched 3.1 scoreless innings and ended up as the winning pitcher in the team's wild 13-12 comeback victory April 16 vs. Omaha...after each of the first three batters reached base (HBP, 2 BB), retired 11 of Omaha's final 13 batters...allowed just one hit while recording three strikeouts...prior to that game, had pitched in 24 games during his pro career, but only faced one batter since 2008...first OKC position player to be the team's winning pitcher since Adam Morrissey on Aug. 2, 2006 vs. Las Vegas.
- Played with the Lancaster Barnstormers of the independent Atlantic League...led the league and set a career high with 28 homers; fell one home run shy of the franchise record...also led the league with 91 RBI...slashed .282/.378/.511 over 126 games...ranked fifth in the league in both slugging and OPS (.890)
- Became the first player in Lancaster history to appear in every game.
- Also played for Tomateros de Culican of the Mexican Pacific Winter League...went 4-for-29 over nine games.
- Entering second stint with the Dodgers...also signed as a free agent June 29, 2017 and played in 49 games for Double-A Tulsa that season; hit .300 with seven home runs and 35 RBI in 49 games...batted .452 against left-handed pitching and .476 with runners in scoring position (20x42) with 29 RBI.
- Hit the third of three straight home runs for Tulsa on July 31, 2017 which earned one lucky fan \$10,000...Matt Beaty and Kyle Garlick preceded him with home runs.
- Played for Team Israel in the 2017 World Baseball Classic.
