## Las Vegas 51s (29-42) vs. Oklahoma City Dodgers (41-25)

**Today's Game:** The Oklahoma City Dodgers and Las Vegas 51s wrap up their series with an 11:05 a.m. Summer Field Trip Day game at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark. Today also concludes a stretch of 14 straight games against Pacific Conference opponents for the Dodgers. They are 8-5 during the stretch and are 4-2 during their current homestand.

**Last Game:** Las Vegas scored in five of the first six innings Monday night as the Dodgers allowed their highest run total in a home game during a 10-4 loss to the 51s at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark. The 51s scored quickly on Zach Borenstein's RBI double and Ty Kelly's RBI single in the first inning. RBI singles by Peter Alonso and Jeff McNeil boosted the 51s' lead to 4-0 in the third inning as they opened the frame with four straight hits. Later with the bases loaded, pitcher Cody Martin drew a walk to make it 5-0. In the bottom of the third inning, Kyle Garlick belted a two-run homer out to left field out of the stadium, scoring the first two runs of the night for the Dodgers. Alex Verdugo followed with a solo homer onto the Budweiser Deck in left field to cut Las Vegas' lead to 5-3. The 51s quickly got the runs back in the fourth inning on a RBI double by McNeil and sacrifice fly by Johnny Monell. Borenstein crushed a two-run home run out to right field in the fifth inning and Monell provided a RBI groundout in the sixth for a 10-3 Las Vegas advantage. A sacrifice fly by Edwin Rios brought home the fourth run of the night for the Dodgers in the eighth. OKC starting pitcher Justin DeFratus (2-4) allowed nine runs and 11 hits over 5.0 innings with four walks and five strikeouts in the loss. Martin (1-2) earned the win, setting a season high with 7.0 innings and notching eight strikeouts.

**Today's Probable Pitcher:** Tyler Pill (2-1) tries for a third win in as many starts as he takes the mound for the ninth time this season with OKC...He last started June 14 against Salt Lake in Bricktown, tossing five scoreless innings and holding the Bees to four hits with one walk and four strikeouts in the team's 4-1 victory. He limited Salt Lake 0-for-6 with runners on base and finished his outing by retiring 12 of the last 13 batters he faced...Since rejoining the Dodgers in late May, Pill has posted a 3.31 ERA and OKC has won all three of his starts...Pill started his season in the Arizona Diamondbacks organization with Triple-A Reno and was acquired by the Dodgers in a trade for cash considerations April 17...He signed with Arizona in January, and prior to that, spent his entire career in the New York Mets organization...Pill made his MLB debut last season with the Mets May 27, 2017 against Pittsburgh and made seven appearances (three starts) in the Majors (0-3, 5.32 ERA)...Pill was selected by the Mets in the fourth round of the 2011 MLB Draft out of Cal State Fullerton...Tonight is his first career appearance against the 51s — a team he made 37 appearances for over four seasons. He made 13 starts for Las Vegas in 2017, posting a 4-3 record and 3.47 ERA over 80.1 innings with 22 walks and 50 strikeouts.

**Against the 51s:** 2018: 2-1 2017: 2-2 All-time: 47-51 In OKC: 23-23  
The Dodgers and 51s are meeting for their lone series of the season...The teams split their 2017 set in Las Vegas, 2-2, with the 51s winning the first two games and the Dodgers taking the final two meetings. The teams played two extra-inning games during the set...Tim Locastro and Trayce Thompson led the Dodgers with five hits apiece, while Edwin Rios and O'Koyea Dickson each had three RBI in the series...The 51s last played in OKC in 2016, winning three of four games during the series...The Dodgers last won a series against the 51s in 2015, going 3-1 at Cashman Field...OKC outfielder Travis Tajerion spent the past three seasons with the 51s, appearing in 381 games while batting .274 with 69 homers and 237 RBI...Las Vegas manager Tony DeFrancesco guided the OKC RedHawks for four seasons (2011-14), and his teams went a combined 302-272. The RedHawks won the American Southern Division title in 2013, posting a league-best record of 82-62, including a franchise record 17 straight home wins July 26-Aug. 20 and the club's longest winning streak at 12 games from July 26-Aug. 3.

**Home Cooking:** Although last night's loss snapped a four-game winning streak, the Dodgers are 27-8 at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark this season. They own the best home winning percentage (.771) among full season teams in the Minors and have the most home wins...Of their 27 home wins, the Dodgers have trailed at some point in 13 games, and trailed in the eighth inning or later seven times. They have four comeback wins after trailing by three or more runs...The Dodgers have held an opponent to one or no runs in 10 of the 34 games...OKC is slashing .312/.373/.488 at home, scoring an average of 5.9 runs per game on an average of 10.7 hits. The team has scored eight-plus runs 11 times and collected 14 or more hits in eight games. OKC has also scored at least four runs in an inning 12 times...OKC has scored at least four runs in 14 of the last 15 home games and 15 of the last 17.

**Teach Me How to Dougie:** Alex Verdugo hit two doubles and homered Monday night to extend his season-best hitting streak to 13 games, going 25-for-56 (.446) with 10 RBI and six runs scored. He is now tied with Rocky Gale for the longest hit streak by a Dodger this season. It's Verdugo's second hitting streak this season to reach double digits, and he has now hit safely in 24 of his last 25 games, going 42-for-104 (.404) with 14 runs scored and 14 RBI...Verdugo paces the Dodgers with 63 hits despite playing in just 44 games, and his .350 average ranks fifth in the PCL...His 26 hits in June lead all of Triple-A...Entering today, Verdugo has notched five straight multi-hit games (11x19) and has collected a RBI in eight straight games. Each of his last seven hits have gone for extra bases, and he has homered in back-to-back games...Last night Verdugo became the third Dodger with three extra-base hits in a game this season, joining Donovan Solano and Edwin Rios.

**Dinger Details:** The Dodgers hit their first back-to-back home runs of the season last night when Kyle Garlick and Alex Verdugo both went deep in the third inning. The last time the team hit back-to-back jacks was also against the 51s, with Henry Ramos and Edwin Rios providing the pop in Las Vegas Aug. 6, 2017...Garlick leads the team with nine homers even though he's only played in 38 games with OKC this season. His 14 total home runs rank second among Dodgers minor leaguers.

**Mound Turnaround:** The 51s piled up 10 runs and 15 hits last night, marking the most runs and hits allowed in a home game by the Dodgers this season. Entering Monday, the pitching staff has allowed a total of six runs and 29 hits over the team's four-game winning streak. The starters had allowed one run and 12 hits over 20.0 IP before Justin DeFratus surrendered nine runs and 11 hits in 5.0 IP...The 51s went 5-for-17 with RISP after opponents had been 8-for-60 over the previous six games and 6-for-48 over the previous five.

**Around The Horn:** OKC has won six of the last nine games and eight of the last 12 games...Entering today, the Dodgers are 4-0 in series finales when they have a chance to win the series...The Dodgers lead the PCL with 156 strikeouts through their first 16 games of June, with an average 9.68 strikeouts per nine innings...Eighteen of the team's last 35 hits have gone for extra bases, including 14 doubles over the past three games...The Dodgers are 1-4 in games that start before noon and have lost five of their last seven day games.

# Today's Starting Pitcher

## Tyler Pill (2-1, 4.46)

Bats/Throws: Left/Right

Height/Weight: 6-1/199

Acquired by Dodgers: Trade with Arizona, April 17, 2018

**Last Game:** Did not yield a run over 5.0 innings against Salt Lake June 14 at home and earned the win in OKC's 4-1 victory...allowed four hits, with one walk and four strikeouts...gave up hits to two of the first three batters faced, but kept the Bees 2-for-15 for the remainder of his outing...four of the first six batters reached base, but then retired 12 of the final 13 batters faced...held the Bees 0-for-6 with runners on and 0-for-5 with RISP...did not have a runner reach third base...first win over Salt Lake in five career starts...threw 77 pitches (49 strikes).

**Against Las Vegas:** Today is his first career matchup against the 51s...spent the first seven seasons of his pro career in the Mets organization and spent parts of the 2014-17 seasons with Las Vegas...made a total of 37 appearances (36 starts) with the 51s and went 7-10 with a 5.57 ERA...last season made 13 starts and was 4-3 with a 3.47 ERA.

### 2018:

- Acquired by the Los Angeles Dodgers from Arizona April 17 in exchange for cash considerations.
- Made five starts for OKC April 20-May 12 and went 0-1 with a 3.27 ERA; allowed one or no runs in three of five outings...transferred to Tulsa May 18...returned to OKC May 30 after making two appearances with the Drillers...after a rough team debut for Tulsa May 21 vs. Arkansas, threw 5.0 scoreless innings May 25 at Corpus Christi (ND).
- Posted a 3.29 ERA over eight starts for OKC...turned in two quality starts...although he's allowed 14 runs in 38.1 innings with OKC, he's held opponents scoreless in 31 of 39 frames.
- Earned first win of the season June 7 at Sacramento...tied season high with 6.0 innings and allowed three runs on a season-high 10 hits...handed out two walks while striking out four...had at least two baserunners in five of six innings and never retired the side in order; however, retired the leadoff batter in five of six tires...of the 10 hits allowed, seven were singles and three were doubles...all three runs were batted in by Steven Duggar – a two-run double in the second inning and a RBI double in the fourth inning, each with two outs...River Cats went 5-for-15 with runners on, but held to 2-for-12 with RISP...had 11 groundouts against two flyouts...threw 97 pitches (63 strikes)...at the plate, went 2-for-3 with a RBI.
- Went 6.0 innings May 12 at Colorado Springs...allowed one run while scattering seven singles, with no walks and four strikeouts...did not figure in the decision in the team's 2-1 loss.
- Threw 4.0 scoreless innings against Iowa April 27 at home before reaching his pitch limit...did not figure in decision in OKC's 4-1 victory...gave up four hits, with no walks and three strikeouts...all four hits allowed were singles...held Iowa 1-for-7 with runners on and 0-for-2 with RISP...lefties went 0-for-10...at the plate, delivered a two-out RBI single in the fourth inning to cap a four-run rally...threw 50 pitches (36 strikes).
- Made team debut April 20 in Round Rock and did not receive a decision in OKC's 6-3 win...threw 3.0 scoreless innings while building up his workload...allowed just one hit, with two walks and two strikeouts...overall, retired eight of 11 batters faced, including six of the last seven...lone hit was a two-out single by Willie Calhoun in the first inning.
- Signed by the Arizona Diamondbacks to a minor league contract Jan. 16, 2018...compiled 4.0 innings over two relief appearances for Triple-A Reno...allowed seven runs and eight hits over 4.0 innings, including two home runs...opponents went 8-for-19...had three walks against three strikeouts.

### 2017:

- Pitched within the New York Mets organization, primarily at Triple-A Las Vegas...made his MLB debut May 27, 2017 against Pittsburgh...called upon to pitch the bottom of the 10th inning...pitched 0.2 innings in relief and allowed one run on one hit, one walk and one hit batter and took the loss.
- Recalled to New York three times throughout the season...made seven appearances, including three starts, for the Mets...went 0-3 with a 5.32 ERA...struck out 16 batters and issued 10 walks over 22.0 innings...in four relief appearances for the Mets, held opponents to a .158 average (3x19).
- Made first career Major League start May 30 vs. Milwaukee...held the Brewers to one run and six hits in 5.1 innings and left in line for the win, but the Brewers rallied to tie the game in the seventh inning.
- Did not allow an earned run in his first 29.1 innings of work of 2017 with Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Las Vegas...began the season with Binghamton and made two starts, allowing two unearned runs over 10.1 innings.
- Joined Las Vegas April 19 and made 13 starts throughout the season for the 51s while shuttling between Las Vegas and New York...went 4-3 with a 3.47 ERA and .267 BAA.
- Nine of 13 starts for Las Vegas were quality starts, including each of his first five outings...lasted at least 6.0 innings 10 times...had at three starts of at least 6.0 innings with no runs allowed (April 19 at Fresno, April 30 vs. Albuquerque and July 19 vs. Fresno).
- Underwent arthroscopic surgery on his right elbow in August and missed the remainder of the season.

### Career:

- Selected by the New York Mets in the fourth round of the 2011 MLB Draft out of Cal State Fullerton...was named to the 2009 Freshman All-American team by *Collegiate Baseball, Baseball America* and the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association...also named co-Big West Conference Pitcher of the Year in 2009...was a two-way player and also was an outfielder, batting .336 over his career...originally selected by Colorado in the 38th round of the 2008 MLB Draft out of Covina (Calif.) High School, but did not sign.
- Named an Eastern League Mid-Season All-Star with Binghamton in 2016.
- Finished third in strikeouts (120) and fifth in WHIP (1.16) in the Eastern League with Binghamton in 2014.
- Older brother, Brett, played in the San Francisco Giants organization from 2006-13, including stints in 2011-13 with the Major League club...also played at Cal State Fullerton.
- Career .358 hitter in the Minors, going 34-for-95 with seven doubles, one home run and 14 RBI.

- Went 4-for-4 with two doubles and three runs scored June 16 vs. Las Vegas.
- Joined OKC May 24 for his Triple-A debut and for his first game action of 2018 after starting the season in extended spring training where he was rehabbing an injury.
- Spent the entire 2017 season with Double-A Tulsa where he was named Texas League Player of the Year...slashed .326/.378/.505 with 31 doubles, one triple, 15 homers and 61 runs scored with 69 RBI...had 42 multi-hit games, including 12 with three or more hits...ended the season on a 13-game hitting streak, going 19-for-52 (.365).
- Led the Texas League in OPS (.883) and tied for the league lead with a .326 average and 31 doubles...ranked among Texas League leaders in slugging percentage (second), extra-base hits (T-second, 47), hits (third, 143), total bases (third, 221), OBP (fourth), RBI (fifth) and home runs (T-12th).
- Named a Mid-Season All-Star for the Drillers...selected as a MLB.com Organization All-Star...helped lead Tulsa to the Texas League Championship Series, hitting .357 with 15 hits (T-first in playoffs), three doubles (T-second), eight runs (third) and five RBI in 10 postseason games.
- Played in the 2017 Arizona Fall League and selected as a member of the Rising Stars team.
- Ranked among California League leaders with High-A Rancho Cucamonga in 2016 in hits (sixth, 145), doubles (sixth, 30) and RBI (third, 88)...named a Post-Season All-Star.
- Selected by the Los Angeles Dodgers in the 12th round of the MLB June Draft out of Belmont University where he was named an All-American by *Collegiate Baseball* — the first in Belmont history...named a semifinalist for the Dick Howser award, given to the National Player of the Year.
