# Memphis Redbirds (31-44) vs. Oklahoma City Dodgers (30-43)

Today's Game: The Oklahoma City Dodgers look to even their series against the Memphis Redbirds at 6:05 p.m. as the first iCelebración Cielo Azul! of the season wraps up at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark on a Chaparral Energy Family Sunday. Tonight's game is part of MiLB's Copa de la Diversión, and the Dodgers will take the field as Cielo Azul de Oklahoma City against the Memphis Música...Memphis leads the current series, 2-1.

Last Game: Memphis pitchers Jake Woodford and Dominic Leone held the Dodgers to two hits as the Redbirds shut out the Dodgers, 5-0, Saturday night at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark. Woodford (5-3) pitched seven scoreless innings. He held the Dodgers to one hit until Jake Peter singled with two outs in the seventh inning. Woodford issued three walks and recorded four strikeouts in the win. Leone followed on the mound and held the Dodgers without a hit or run over the final two innings, recording four strikeouts. Memphis took a quick lead in the first inning. Kramer Robertson and Edmundo Sosa started the game with back-to-back walks and both runners came around to score when John Nogowski hit a fly ball to deep center field for a double and a 2-0 lead. Joe Hudson homered in the fourth inning to extend the Redbirds' lead to 3-0. Yariel Gonzalez added a solo homer on the first pitch of the seventh inning to push Memphis' lead to 4-0. Back-to-back doubles by Adolis Garcia and Nogowski in the eighth inning gave the Redbirds a 5-0 advantage. Dodgers starting pitcher Rob Zastryzny (2-3) was charged with the loss, allowing three runs and seven hits over 6.0 innings with two walks and six strikeouts.

Today's Probable Pitcher: Daniel Corcino (4-2) returns from a stint on the Injured List seeking his team-leading fifth win of the season...Corcino last pitched June 5 against Sacramento, holding the River Cats to one run and five hits over 6.0 innings to tie his longest outing of the season. He issued one walk and recorded six strikeouts in no decision...He was placed on the IL June 7, retroactive to June 6, and activated June 20...Over his last two outings, Corcino has allowed just two runs and eight hits over 12.0 innings with 14 strikeouts...Corcino has held opponents to two earned runs or less in eight of his 10 games this season and to just one run five times, including in three of his last four outings... He spent most of 2018 with OKC, tying for the club lead in starts (19) and ranking second in innings (103.1) and strikeouts (102). The Dodgers went 12-7 in his starts although his personal record was only 3-3...He was originally signed as an amateur free agent with the Reds Jan. 11, 2008 and began his second career stint in the Dodgers organization after signing as a free agent May 11, 2017...Tonight is Corcino's second start of the season against the Redbirds. He pitched 6.0 innings May 31 at Memphis, holding the Redbirds to one run and three hits with two walks and a season-best eight K's, helping the Dodgers to a $6-2$ win. In five career starts against Memphis, Corcino is 2-0 with a 2.00 ERA and .180 BAA.

The Dodgers are meeting Memphis for the second time this season and first at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark...OKC swept a four-game road series May 30-June 2 at AutoZone Park. The Dodgers outscored the Redbirds, 32-13, and outhit them, 37-25, holding Memphis to a .192 average. It marked just the second time ever OKC swept a series in Memphis...Last season each team won its division and met in the American Conference Finals last September, with Memphis winning the series, 3-1, before going on to repeat as PCL champions and win the 2019 Triple-A National Championship...The Redbirds won the 2018 regular-season series, 10-6, snapping a streak of five consecutive season series victories for OKC. It was just the third time in the teams' 21-year history that Memphis won at least 10 games in one season against OKC, last accomplished in 2011 (11). With five wins in OKC, Memphis tied its mark for the most wins in one season at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark (2000, 2013).

Cielo Azul de Oklahoma City: MiLB's "Es Divertido Ser Un Fan $®^{\text {" campaign aims to celebrate each participating community's Hispanic and }}$ Latino fans and create a culturally relevant gameday experience through music, concessions and promotions...The name Cielo Azul - translated to "Blue Sky" - was derived from three key factors: Incorporating the color blue, a key component of the Dodgers; the vibrancy of Oklahoma's blue skies, and the breadth of the diversity of Hispanic/Latino culture that resides under them; and as a tribute to legendary Dodgers pitcher Fernando Valenzuela, who looked to the sky during his windup.

Taking Offense: The Dodgers were shut out last night for the sixth time this season, tying them for most in the PCL with Albuquerque and Salt Lake. It was also the first time this season the Dodgers were blanked at home. Last night marked the third time this season OKC collected two or fewer hits in a game, as the Dodgers were held to two singles by Shane Peterson and Jake Peter. It was just the third time all season the team did not collect an extra-base hit and only the second time in the last 67 games. The last instance was May 22 at New Orleans, when the team was held to one hit...Prior to last night, the Dodgers had scored a combined 75 runs and tallied 109 hits over their previous 10 games.
On Strike: Four Dodgers pitchers combined for 10 strikeouts last night to record OKC's 37th double-digit strikeout game of the season and 10th in the last 14 games. The Dodgers are tied for second in the PCL with 701 K's over 624.0 innings, trailing league-leader Sacramento (719 K's/661.2 IP) and tied with New Orleans, which has pitched 25.1 innings more than OKC...However, last night also marked the 18th game this season the Dodgers had 10 or more strikeouts, yet the opposition had 10 or more hits as well. When opponents don't strike out this season, they are batting . 394 overall and .399 over the last 50 games (since May 1).

Home-Less: With last night's loss, the Dodgers fell to 11-22 at home this season, including an 8-19 mark over the last 27 games at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark. The 11 home victories are tied for the second-fewest among the 120 full-season teams in the Minors...OKC has an overall - 72 run differential at home and - 68 over the last 27 games...OKC has allowed at least five runs in 23 of the last 28 home games. The team's current 6.21 ERA at home is fifth-highest in the Minors...Last season the Dodgers didn't lose their 22nd home game until July 29 (33-22).

I Came in Like a Rek-ing Ball: Zach Reks has hit safely 13 of his last 14 games, batting .387 (24×62) with nine multi-hit games, six homers and 20 RBI...Reks has also hit safely in 17 of his last 18 starts, going 30 -for- 81 (.370) with seven home runs, six doubles and 25 RBI...Reks leads all Dodgers minor leaguers with 18 total homers and 53 total RBI between OKC and Double-A Tulsa over 65 games.

Around the Horn: Catcher Will Smith has been recalled by the Los Angeles Dodgers. Smith went 2 -for- 5 with a two-run homer and double Friday and had homered in six of his last seven games...Over his last 14 outings, reliever Kevin Quackenbush has allowed one run and nine hits, with three walks and 24 strikeouts over 13.2 innings. He enters tonight with nine consecutive scoreless appearances, totaling 9.2 innings ( $6 \mathrm{H}, 2$ BB, 16 K )...Fellow bullpen mate Justin Grimm retired all four batters he faced last night and has turned in a scoreless outing in nine of his last 11 games. During that time he's held opponents to a .182 average ( $8 \times 44$ ) with 18 strikeouts in 13.0 IP...The Dodgers have allowed 12 homers over the last four games after giving up 12 homers over the first 15 games of June...The Dodgers are $2-12$ across Friday-Sunday home games, including 0-4 on Chaparral Energy Family Sundays

## ast Game:

- Previous start was June 5 at home against Sacramento...placed on the Injured List June 7-19.
- Allowed one run and five hits over 6.0 innings in a no decision...notched one walk against six strikeouts...threw a season-high 104 pitches ( 69 strikes).
- Only run scored in the first inning...over final five frames kept the River Cats scoreless and allowed just three hits.
- After the River Cats started the game 3-for-6, retired 14 of the final 17 batters faced...retired 12 of 14 batters over final four innings, allowing just a pair of singles
- Held Sacramento 1 -for-8 with runners on base and 1-for-5 with RISP


## Against Memphis:

Made five starts against the Redbirds between the 2018-19 seasons, going 2-0 with a 2.00 ERA...allowed a total of seven runs (six earned) and 12 hits over 27.0 innings...four walks against 27 strikeouts. Redbirds have been limited to a 180 batting average ( $18 \times 100$ ) with two home runs...four of six runs in career scored on one swing - a grand slam by Yairo Munoz May 10,2018 at home.

- Faced the Redbirds May 31 at Memphis and earned the win in the team's $6-2$ victory...piitched a season-high 6.0 innings and allowed one run and three hits, with two walks and a season-high eight strikeouts... only run scored two batters into his outing as a result of a leadoff triple by Tommy Edman and RBI groundout by Lane Thomas...Redbirds started 3 -for- 6 , but then went 0 -for- 15 over the remainder of his start. retired 15 of final 18 batters faced, including each of the last 10 faced...held right-handed batters 1 -for- 15 ...Redbirds went 0 -for- 7 with runners on and 0 -for- 5 with runners in scoring position.
- Most recent meeting in OKC was Aug. 9, 2019...pitched 7.0 masterful innings, but did not receive a decision in the team's $2-1$ loss...allowed one run and four hits, with no walks and a season-high nine strikeouts...only run scored on a solo home run by Edmundo Sosa leading off the fifth inning...retired 14 of the final 15 batters faced, with Sosa's home run the only exception.


## 2019:

- Team is $6-3$ in his starts, including wins in five of the last six... 11 of 24 runs allowed have scored with two outs.
- Over first three starts, notched 17 strikeouts against three walks across 14.0 IP...however, in the last seven games has 29 strikeouts against 18 walks over 37.0 IP.
- Seven of 22 earned runs (and 24 total runs) and nine of 44 hits this season occurred on April 17 when he made a start on three days' rest against Omaha out of necessity...in his nine outings on regular
rest has a 3.13 ERA (16 ER/46.0 IP) and .213 BAA ( $35 \times 164$ )
- Made season debut April 5 at home against San Antonio; allowed two runs and four hits over 5.0 innings...struck out a total of seven batters, including five of the first seven faced
- Earned first win of the season April 22 at home against lowa in the team's $8-5$ victory...allowed four runs over 5.0 innings, although only two runs were earned...all four runs scored in the first inning on tworun homers by lan Happ and Jim Adduci...following Adduci's home run, retired 12 of the final 15 batters faced...did not allow a hit over the final 11 batters faced....hit his first career home run in his first at-bat, sending a two-run homer into the Budweiser Deck in left field in the second inning to begin the team's comeback
- Earned second consecutive win with 5.1 solid innings April 28 at San Antonio...allowed one run and three hits, with two walks and three strikeouts...all three hits were singles...did not allow a hit over first three innings and did not allow a run over first five innings...retired eight of the first 10 batters faced and 12 of the first 15 batters faced.... held San Antonio 1 -for-10 with runners on base
- Left start on May 10 at home vs. Nashville in the third inning with back tightness and was laced on the Injured List May 13 (retroactive to May 11)...activated May 21.
- Made first start off the Injured List and picked up the win May 21 at New Orleans...allowed one run and three hits over 5.0 innings, with two walks and three strikeouts...also hit two batters...allowed only run on a RBI infield single by Monte Harrison in the third inning


## 2018:

Was part of OKC's Opening Day roster and spent most of the season with the club...tied for the team lead in starts (19) and ranked second in innings (103.1) and strikeouts (.217)...finished with a 3.40
ERA over 24 total appearances and held PCL opponents to a .217 batting average

- Team went $12-7$ in his starts, although his personal record was only $3-3$ with a 3.31 ERA...picked up just two wins over his last 18 starts...turned in eight starts of at least 5.0 innings with two or fewer runs allowed that resulted in a no decision picked up just two wins over inal 18 starts.
- Limited right-handed batters to a .185 average, .268 OBP and .276 SLG...dominated at home, posting a 2.20 ERA to go along with a .217 BAA and 55 strikeouts against 12 walks in 45.0 IP
- Fired 5.0 scoreless innings, allowing just one hit, with no walks and three strikeouts April 30 at Memphis...earned the win and combined with three relievers on a four-hit shutout in OKC's $6-0$ victory...retired

15 of 17 batters faced overall, including 13 of first 14 batters, with the only Redbird reaching on an error...did not allow a hit until Yairo Munoz's single with one out in the fifth inning.

- On May 28 at Nashville, notched 6.0 strong innings, allowing just one hit and two unearned runs, but did not figure in the decision in OKC's $3-2$ loss...was his longest outing since Sept. 12,2014 while with the Cincinnati Reds in a game at Milwaukee...only hit was by the very first batter faced; after that, the Sounds went 0 -for-18 with four walks.
- Over three starts between May 28-June 17, allowed one earned run over 16.0 innings (four runs overall), with opponents going 8 -for-53 (.151), including one extra-base hit...in August, had a $2-1$ record, 2.92 ERA, 10 walks and 35 strikeouts in six starts...included five straight starts from August 9 -August 30 of at least five innings and two or fewer runs.
- Contract selected by the Los Angeles Dodgers June 9...threw a 1-2-3 inning that night against Atlanta in his first Major League appearance since September 2014...made two appearances for LAD before being optioned to OKC June 13 ( 4.0 IP, 2 H, 2 R, ER, 3 BB, K)...earned his first career Major League save by finishing a $12-5$ win June 12 vs. Texas...designated for assignment by LAD July 4 after acquiring Dylan Floro in a trade with Cincinnati...outrighted to OKC July 8.
- Pitched 7.0 masterful innings at home Aug. 9 vs. Memphis, but did not receive a decision in the team's $2-1$ loss...allowed one run and four hits, with no walks and a season-high nine strikeouts...marked longest outing since Aug. 17, 2014 with Double-A Pensacola at Jacksonville and highest strikeout total since June 15, 2012, also with Pensacola vs. Mobile...also longest outing without a walk since June 24,2013 with Triple-A Louisville vs. Rochester ( 7.1 IP)....on August 14 at Omaha, pitched 7.0 shutout innings, giving up just two hits in a no decision.
- Kept Omaha off the board for 7.0 innings Aug. 14, but did not receive a decision for his efforts, as OKC lost, $1-0$, in 10 innings...allowed two singles, with three walks and four strikeouts...retired 10 straight batters during one stretch between the first and fourth innings....marked longest scoreless start since tossing 8.0 scoreless frames Aug. 7, 2014 with Double-A Pensacola vs. Jackson.
- Allowed one run and three hits over 6.0 strong innings Aug. 30 at lowa...after allowing a leadoff double in the second inning, retired 16 of the final 18 batters faced, including nine of the last 10.
- In lone playoff start during the first game of a doubleheader on Sept. 6 , kept Memphis scoreless for 5.0 innings and to four singles...left with a 1-0 lead, but the Redbirds rallied to win, $4-2$.
- Re-signed by the Dodgers a minor league free agent on Dec. 14.


## Career:

Originally signed by the Cincinnati Jan. 11, 2008...named a Midwest League Mid-Season All-Star in 2011 with Dayton and a Southern League Mid-Season All-Star with Pensacola in 2012.

- Made MLB debut Aug. 26, 2014 for Cincinnati against Chicago (NL)...compiled 18.2 innings in five appearances (three starts) with the Reds, all in 2014.
- Also spent parts of the 2015-16 seasons in the Dodgers organization after being claimed off waivers from Cincinnati April 17, 2015...outrighted off the 40-man roster one week later...placed on the DL

May 22 and did not pitch during the rest of the season.

- Delivered an excellent performance for Tulsa in the 2017 Texas League playoffs, leading the team with six appearances in 10 games...threw 6.0 scoreless innings as opponents went 2 -for- 18 with six strikeouts...recorded both of the team's two saves.
