Today's Game: After Monday's series opener was postponed due to unplayable field conditions stemming from recent rains at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark, the Oklahoma City Dodgers open a four-game series tonight against the Nashville Sounds at 7:05 p.m. The Dodgers are 27-9 in OKC this season and own the best home winning percentage among full-season teams in the Minors (.750).

Last Game: Omaha hit three home runs, including two during a five-run fifth inning, leading the way to an 8-0 win over the Dodgers Sunday afternoon at Werner Park. The Storm Chasers started the scoring in the second inning when Billy Burns hit a RBI double with two outs to give Omaha a 1-0 lead. Donnie Dewees added to the lead with a two-run homer in the fourth inning, making it 3-0. The home run barrage continued in the fifth inning, as seven straight Storm Chasers reached base at one point to take an 8-0 lead. Ryan O'Hearn hit a solo homer, and after Omaha loaded the bases, Humberto Arteaga cleared the bases with a grand slam. Former OKC Dodgers pitcher Trevor Oaks kept the Dodgers scoreless over six innings to earn the win. He allowed four hits – all singles – and only had one runner reach scoring position. Oaks (4-3) notched a season-high seven strikeouts and issued one walk. Omaha relievers Kevin Lenik and Jake Newberry covered the final three innings to finish Omaha's fifth shutout of the season. Dodgers starting pitcher Tyler Pill (2-2) allowed eight runs and 10 hits over 4.1 innings in the loss.

Today's Probable Pitcher: Brock Stewart (1-0) returns from his sixth stint with the Los Angeles Dodgers to make his seventh start for OKC... He most recently pitched June 19 for the Los Angeles Dodgers after being added as the team's 26th man for a road doubleheader against the Chicago Cubs. He was charged with the loss in Game 2, allowing a run and two hits in the 10th inning of the Cubs' 2-1 walk-off win... His last appearance with OKC was June 13 against Salt Lake in OKC, allowing two runs and four hits over 3.0 innings, with one walk and two strikeouts... While with OKC this season, Stewart owns a 1.18 WHIP and has held opponents to a .222 batting average, including 6-for-34 with runners on. The team is 4-2 in his starts... Stewart split last season between LAD and OKC while battling injury. With OKC, he went 0-1 with a 3.12 ERA over five starts with 25 K's and three walks... In 17 games (four starts) with LAD, Stewart posted a 3.41 ERA with 29 K's and 19 walks over 34.1 IP... Stewart advanced quickly through the Dodgers system in 2016, starting the season in High-A and ascending to the Majors to make his debut June 29 at Milwaukee. He was named the Dodgers' 2016 Branch Rickey Minor League Pitcher of the Year and to *Baseball America's* Minor League All-Star Team... Tonight is his second start of the season, and second career appearance, against the Sounds. He tossed three shutout innings May 17 against the Sounds in OKC, allowing three hits and two walks with two strikeouts.

Against the Sounds: 2018: 5-3 2017: 11-5 All-time: 181-147 At OKC: 95-68
The Dodgers and Sounds meet for their third series of the season and second in OKC... The Sounds and Dodgers split an abbreviated series at First Tennessee Park, 2-2, May 25-28, as the series finale was postponed to July 21 due to inclement weather. Each of the final three games were decided by one-run margins and the teams combined to score just 18 runs total in the series... The Dodgers won the first series of the season between the teams May 17-20 in Bricktown, 3-1. The Dodgers outscored the Sounds, 32-15, and outhit Nashville, 50-30, in the four-game set, batting .350 as a team. OKC's pitching staff racked up 47 strikeouts in the series... In 2017, the Dodgers won the season series, 11-5, posting at least 10 wins against the Sounds for the third straight year. OKC outscored the Sounds, 85-54, and Dodgers pitchers racked up 158 strikeouts in 16 meetings for an average of 9.9 per game... Since 2015, the Dodgers are 37-19 against the Sounds, including 19-9 at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark.

Home Cooking: Although the Dodgers have lost their last two home games, they own the best home winning percentage in the Minors (.750) among full-season teams with a 27-9 record at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark. They have the third-most home wins behind Low-A Bowling Green (28-10) and Double-A Corpus Christi (28-12)... Of their 27 home wins, the Dodgers have trailed at some point in 13 games, and trailed in the eighth inning or later seven times. They have four comeback wins after trailing by three or more runs... The Dodgers have held an opponent to one or no runs in 10 of the 36 games... OKC is slashing .309/.369/.483 at home, scoring an average of 5.8 runs per game on an average of 10.6 hits. The team has scored eight-plus runs 11 times and collected 14 or more hits in eight games. OKC has also scored at least four runs in an inning 12 times... OKC has scored at least four runs in 14 of the last 16 home games and 15 of the last 18.

O'd in Omaha: The Dodgers were shut out Sunday afternoon in Omaha, 8-0, marking their third shutout loss of the season, and all three have come on the road... Their eight-run margin of defeat was their largest of the season and largest since Aug. 20, 2017 when the Dodgers lost, 12-2, in Colorado Springs... On Sunday, the team tallied five singles on the day and only had one runner reach scoring position, with none after the first inning. No OKC runner advanced to third base in the game. It was the fourth time this season the team didn't produce an extra-base hit.

Along the Rios Grande: Edwin Rios picked up another hit Sunday to extend his current hitting streak to seven games — his longest hitting streak of the season. He has now hit safely in eight consecutive starts, going 12-for-29 (.414) with seven RBI and six runs scored... Rios has 25 hits through 20 games this month, which ranks second on the club. He paces the Dodgers with four homers and 14 runs scored this month and he ranks second on the team with 16 RBI in June.

Teach Me How to Dougie: Alex Verdugo was held without a hit Sunday for just the third time this month. He has still hit safely in 27 of his last 30 games, going 47-for-124 (.379) with 17 runs scored and 15 RBI. The 30-game stretch includes an 11-game and a 13-game hitting streak. His 13-game hitting streak June 3-18 is tied with Rocky Gale for the longest Dodger hitting streak this season... Verdugo paces the Dodgers with 68 hits despite playing in just 49 games, and his .340 average ranks seventh in the PCL... His 31 hits in June are tied for second in the league, trailing Fresno's Kyle Tucker (36)... Nine of his last 12 hits have gone for extra bases (seven doubles, two homers)... On Sunday, Verdugo struck out twice in one game for the first time since May 14 at Colorado Springs.

Give Me Some Mora: Angelo Mora went 1-for-3 Sunday, and he has reached base seven times in his last three games. He ranks tied for second in the PCL with a .493 OBP since rejoining OKC June 3... Mora has hit safely in 13 of 16 games with this month, batting .404 (23x57) with a team-best 17 RBI... In his first 14 games with OKC in April-May, Mora batted .189 with one walk. This month he's drawn 11 walks.

False Starts: The bullpen had to cover 3.2 innings Sunday, and through 21 games this month, relievers have thrown 99.2 innings compared to 89.1 innings thrown by starting pitchers. The starters have combined for a 5.34 ERA, .293 BAA and 1.65 WHIP in June.

Acquired by Dodgers: Selected in the sixth round of the 2014 MLB Draft

Last Game: Served as the 26th player for the Los Angeles Dodgers' doubleheader June 19 against the Chicago Cubs at Wrigley Field...appeared out of the bullpen in Game 2 and entered the game in the bottom of the 10th inning in a 1-1 tie...allowed a leadoff triple to Kris Bryant and intentionally walked Javy Baez before Albert Almora, Jr. hit a game-winning single...was first loss of the season at any level...threw seven pitches (four strikes)...returned to OKC the next day.

Against Nashville: Only career meeting occurred earlier this season on May 17 at home...threw 3.0 scoreless innings and allowed three hits and two walks...notched two strikeouts...two of three Nashville hits were doubles...held the Sounds 2-for-8 with runners on and 0-for-5 with RISP; left five runners on...Sounds put runners at second and third with one out in the second inning and escaped the jam by getting a fielder's choice at home plate and an inning-ending groundout...threw 63 pitches (34 strikes)...did not receive a decision in th team's 13-3 win.

2018:

- Has been recalled by the Los Angeles Dodgers six times this season and optioned back to OKC six times...tonight is his second appearance for OKC since May 17 vs. Nashville and just his third appearance with the team since April 25...team is 4-2 in his starts.
- Made a total of nine appearances for LAD, including two starts...has a 0-1 record and a 6.11 ERA.
- In PCL play, owns a 1.18 WHIP and opponents are batting .222...left-handed batters are 4-for-33...opponents are 6-for-34 with runners on and 2-for-18 with RISP.
- Tossed 5.2 solid innings April 18 at Round Rock, but had to settle for a no decision...allowed two runs and three hits, with one walk and three strikeouts...after allowing a single and walk with two outs in the first inning, proceeded to retire the next 14 consecutive hitters...Express didn't have another baserunner until a one-out single by Jose Cardona in the sixth inning...left game after a two-out RBI double by Scott Heineman, marking just the second hit in 17 at-bats this season an opponent collected a hit with a runner on base...Heineman later scored in the inning on a wild pitch...retired the leadoff batter all six times...Dodgers led, 4-2, after six innings and carried a 5-3 lead into the ninth before Round Rock rallied to tie.
- Earned first win of the season April 13 against New Orleans...allowed three runs and five hits over 5.2 innings...issued just one walk and struck out eight, which at the time stood as the highest strikeout total by an OKC pitcher this season...all three runs scored on a pair of home runs: solo shot by Isaac Galloway in the first inning and a two-run blast by Rafael Ortega...first time since Triple-A debut June 13, 2016 allowed more than one homer in a game with OKC...struck out five of the first seven batters faced...after Galloway's homer with one out in the first inning, proceeded to retire 12 of the next 14 hitters...held the Baby Cakes 1-for-9 with runners on and 1-for-6 with RISP...threw 84 pitches (58 strikes).
- Had a strong season debut April 7 at Iowa...threw 5.2 scoreless innings, allowing just two hits (both singles), with two walks and six strikeouts...did not have a runner reach scoring position...between the second and sixth innings, retired 11 of 12 batters, and going back to the first inning, had a stretch of 14 of 16 retired...both walks were issued to former OKC Dodger Mike Freeman; marked just the second time in 15 career starts with OKC with two walks allowed...held Iowa 2-for-18 overall and 0-for-5 with runners on...left the game in a scoreless tie...threw 82 pitches (55 strikes).

2017:

- Started the year on the LAD 10-day disabled list...eventually placed on the 60-day disabled list in late May with right shoulder tendinitis...returned to game action May 27 on rehab assignment with High-A Rancho Cucamonga...started three games for OKC during the rehab stint and pitched a total of 8.1 innings, giving up three earned runs while fanning 13 batters.
- In five total stints with OKC, went 0-1 with a 3.12 ERA (6 ER/17.1 IP) in five starts...struck out 25 against just three walks and limited opposing batters to a .279 average...notched 13 K's against no walks over first 8.1 innings (three starts).
- Recalled by the Dodgers initially June 18 and bounced between Los Angeles and OKC five times...in 17 games with the Los Angeles Dodgers (four starts), pitched 34.1 innings and posted 3.41 ERA...fanned 29 batters to 19 walks...opponents batted .226...made six straight scoreless relief appearances in June and July, totaling 13.0 innings...earned first career ML save June 20 vs. the New York Mets, finishing out a 12-0 win with 3.0 scoreless and hitless innings with four strikeouts...combined with Brandon McCarthy on a four-hit shutout.
- Totaled six minor league starts (four on rehab) between OKC and RC...pitched 17.2 innings to an 0-2 record and 4.08 ERA...fanned 26 batters to four walks.

Career:

- Advanced quickly through the Dodgers system, starting the 2016 season in High-A Rancho Cucamonga and eventually ascended to the Majors to make his MLB debut June 29 at Milwaukee (5.0 IP, 8 H, 5 ER, 2 BB, 7 K)...became the first Dodger since Hideo Nomo in 1995 to start the season in Single-A and a start a MLB game in the same season...had not pitched above High-A prior to 2016.
- Made 33 appearances (11 starts) for the Los Angeles Dodgers between the 2016-18 seasons...owns a 2-3 career ML record with a 4.84 ERA.
- In 20 career starts with the OKC Dodgers, has a 5-1 record and a 2.62 ERA...team is 13-7 in his starts...held PCL opponents to a .231 average...holds a 1.06 WHIP and has notched 103 strikeouts against just 18 walks in 92.2 innings (5.72 K/BB; 10.00 K/9)
- Named the Dodgers' 2016 Branch Rickey Minor League Pitcher of the Year and to *Baseball America's* Minor League All-Star Team...also garnered the MiLB award for Top Starting Pitcher...combined to go 9-4 with a 1.79 ERA, held opponents to a .200 average and posted a 0.88 WHIP over 21 starts at High-A Rancho Cucamonga, Double-A Tulsa and Triple-A OKC...struck out 129 batters against just 19 walks over 121.0 IP in the Minors...among all pitchers in the Minors, ranked fourth in WHIP, sixth in ERA and 15th in BAA.
- Named California League Pitcher of the Week April 17, 2016...won both outings and allowed one run and five hits over 11.0 innings...opponents went 5-for-37 with 11 strikeouts...named a Texas League All-Star with Tulsa in 2016, but did not participate due to his promotion to OKC June 10...at the time of his promotion to Triple-A, led the Texas League in ERA (1.12) and WHIP (0.83) and ranked second in strikeouts (72) and opponent batting average (.196).
- In 2016, became the first OKC pitcher since Robinson Tejeda in 2006 to record at least 10 strikeouts in consecutive starts (June 19 at NO and June 24 against RR).
- Selected by the Dodgers in the sixth round of the 2014 MLB Draft out of Illinois State University...played four seasons at Illinois State, primarily as a third baseman and as a relief pitcher...originally drafted in the 40th round in 2010 by the New York Mets from Normal West (Ill.) High School, but did not sign...son of Tampa Bay Rays pro scout Jeff Stewart, who previously was an amateur scout for San Diego and head coach at Illinois State.

- Had a game-winning, pinch-hit, two-run double in the ninth inning June 19 in Chicago to send the LA Dodgers to a 4-3 win over the Cubs.
- Appeared in a total of 32 games for the Los Angeles Dodgers...most recently optioned to OKC June 20...made the Los Angeles Dodgers 2018 Opening Day roster...has batted .238 with four doubles and eight RBI in 63 AB...started 14 games at third base and committed one error in 130.2 innings...went 6-for-16 as a pinch hitter with four RBI.
- Made MLB debut July 30, 2017 against San Francisco as a pinch-hitter and hit a walk-off two-run double to right field in the 11th inning off Albert Suarez...became the first Dodger player in franchise history to earn a walk-off RBI in his first career plate appearance, and according to Elias Sports Bureau, became the first player in 22 years to supply a walk-off RBI in his first Major League plate appearance, joining Tomas Perez who accomplished the feat with the Blue Jays on May 3, 1995.
- Played in 20 games over three stints with LAD in 2017, primarily off the bench; overall went 6-for-20 (.300) with one double, one run scored and two RBI.
- Made the Dodgers' 2017 postseason roster for the National League Division Series and National League Championship Series...appeared in one game and had one at-bat in the NLDS...saw action in four games in the NLCS; had three at-bats with no hits and a sacrifice fly.
- Batted .305 over 59 games with OKC in 2017...tallied 68 hits, including 16 doubles, one triple, seven home runs and 38 RBI...hit in a season-high 11 consecutive games with OKC, June 11-24, with a .413 average (19x46), four homers and 14 RBI...hit a walk-off three-run homer vs. Round Rock June 11 to cap a six-run ninth inning and give OKC a 10-7 win... appeared in games at catcher (32), third base (18), first base (6), second base (5) and shortstop (2).
- Selected to participate in the 2015 SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game... played in the Arizona Fall League in 2015 with the Glendale Desert Dogs.
- Selected by the Dodgers in the eighth round of the 2013 MLB Draft out of the University of Georgia...was a four-year starting shortstop for the Bulldogs and was teammates with current LAD pitcher Alex Wood...originally drafted by the New York Yankees in the 35th round in 2012, but elected to return for his senior season.
