Today's Game: The Oklahoma City Dodgers look to even their four-game series against the Round Rock Express when the teams meet for the second time at 7:05 p.m. at Dell Diamond. The Dodgers are 5-16 over the last 21 games and 3-13 over the last 16 games.

Last Game: Round Rock kept its recent roll at the plate going at the expense of Dodgers Thursday night, scoring eight runs on 13 hits in an 8-4 win at Dell Diamond. The Dodgers jumped out to an early lead in the first inning when Alex Verdugo sent a two-run home run to the left of the batter's eye in center field, giving OKC a 2-0 edge. The Express tallied three runs on six hits in the third inning to take the lead, which included a string of five consecutive hits. RBI singles by Drew Robinson, Andy Ibanez and Willie Calhoun put the Express in front at 3-2. Round Rock kept it going in the fourth inning when Hanser Alberto deposited a three-run homer out to left field. Jake Peter responded in the fifth inning with a two-run homer. The Express tacked on two more runs in the eighth inning. Juan Centeno hit a RBI double to deep left field, and Alberto followed with a RBI single to finish the scoring. Round Rock starting pitcher Tyler Wagner (1-3) earned his first win with the Express this season. He allowed four runs on seven hits, with no walks and a season-high six strikeouts. The bullpen duo of left-handers Brady Feigl and Jeffrey Springs kept the Dodgers scoreless over the final four innings while allowing two hits. Springs completed the final two frames to pick up his first save. OKC starting pitcher Daniel Corcino (2-2) allowed season highs with both six runs and eight hits in the loss.

Today's Probable Pitcher: Tyler Pill (2-3) makes his third start of the season against the Express tonight...He made his last start July 5 against the Express in OKC, allowing five runs (four earned) and eight hits over 6.0 innings. He issued two walks and recorded four strikeouts and was charged with the loss in OKC's 7-3 defeat. The Express tallied four runs and four hits in the second inning, but Pill limited Round Rock to one unearned run and four hits across his other five frames...Over his last three starts, Pill has posted a 9.42 ERA (15 ER/14.1 IP) and 2.02 WHIP, while opponents have batted .375...The Dodgers are 6-6 in his starts this season...Pill started his season in the Arizona Diamondbacks organization with Triple-A Reno and was acquired by the Dodgers in a trade for cash considerations April 17...He signed with Arizona in January, and prior to that, spent his entire career in the New York Mets organization...Pill made his MLB debut last season with the Mets May 27, 2017 against Pittsburgh and made seven appearances (three starts) in the Majors (0-3, 5.32 ERA)...Pill was selected by the Mets in the fourth round of the 2011 MLB Draft out of Cal State Fullerton...Tonight is his third start of the season and of his career against the Express. Thus far he is 0-1 and has allowed five runs (four earned) and nine hits over 9.0 innings of work.

Against the Express: 2018: 7-6 2017: 9-6 All-time: 121-98 At RR: 62-46

The Express and Dodgers are meeting again after playing each other in a five-game series in OKC prior to the All-Star Break. Rock Round took four of five games and outscored the Dodgers, 41-23, in the series. The Express opened the series by winning three consecutive games at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark for the first time since 2014 and won three straight in one series in OKC for the first time since 2011...Over the first seven meetings between the teams, the Express batted just .204 while scoring 23 runs. But over the five games at The Brick, the Express batted .356 (69x194) while scoring 41 times...The teams last met in Round Rock April 17-20, with the Dodgers winning the series, 3-1, which still stands as the Dodgers' only four-game road series win this season...The Dodgers won the 2017 head-to-head series, 9-6, and have won three straight season series against Round Rock.

Off the Rails: Since July 4, the Dodgers and Round Rock have met for six consecutive games. The Express has won five of the six meetings while batting .357 (82x230) and scoring 49 runs. Round Rock has notched at least 11 hits in all six games and has scored at least seven runs in four of the six meetings. During that time, the Express has notched a .422 batting average on balls in play, going 73-for-173 (.300 is considered the norm). Round Rock is 27-for-84 (.321) with runners in scoring position, averaging 14 at-bats per game with RISP...The 8-9 batters in the lineup have been especially troublesome, going 24-for-50 (.480) with 22 RBI. Nine-hole hitter Hanser Alberto has been transcendent, going 14-for-26 with three homers and 15 RBI. Prior to July 4, Alberto had hit one home run all season and collected 24 RBI...Dodgers starting pitchers have had a tough go with the Express, allowing 28 runs and 45 hits over 25.2 innings. The starters have allowed at least five runs in four of the six meetings...Of the 53.0 innings pitched, the pitching staff has turned in a 1-2-3 inning only 10 times (19 percent), and Round Rock has had at least two batters reach base via hit or walk in 31 innings (58 percent).

Summer Blues: Following a 5-3 win over Las Vegas on June 17, the Dodgers stood a season-best 17 games above .500 with a 41-24 record and had a 6.0-game lead in the American Northern Division standings. Since that day, they have gone 5-16 over the last 21 games, including 3-13 over the last 16 games. They trail Colorado Springs by 2.5 games in the division standings — the furthest they have been out of first place this season...The Dodgers have a -39 run differential during the 21-game span and four losses have come by six runs or more...Over the 21-game stretch, the pitching staff has a 5.96 ERA and 1.71 WHIP, with opponents batting .316...The starting rotation has given up 65 runs and 106 hits over 76.2 IP during the last 17 games, with eight starts of 4.0 or fewer innings.

Teach Me How to Dugie: Alex Verdugo hit a two-run homer in the first inning last night and has hit eight homers this season with OKC. In 2017, Verdugo hit six homers in 117 games with OKC...Over his last six games, Verdugo is 12-for-24 with four multi-hit outings and two homers. His .348 season batting average ranks second in the PCL, narrowly behind Salt Lake's David Fletcher (.350), who is currently with the Los Angeles Angels...Verdugo has 28 hits over his last 19 games and leads the team with 80 hits and 23 multi-hit games this season.

Adding Some Flavor: In his last five games, Kyle Garlick is 11-for-20 with four multi-hit games, three doubles, a homer and five runs scored...Over his last nine games, Garlick is 14-for-33 (.424) with five extra-base hits and five multi-hit games...In July, he paces the Dodgers with 11 hits over seven games with five runs scored.

Henry's Heating Up: Henry Ramos collected a hit in a third straight game last night and over his last 10 games, he is batting .406 (13x32) with five multi-hit games, three homers, seven RBI and five runs scored...Four of his eight homers this season have come in the last 12 games.

Around the Horn: OKC designated hitters this season have combined to bat .331 with 21 extra-base hits and 20 RBI over 41 games...Edwin Rios is 9-for-22 over his last seven games, and over the last two seasons, he has batted .412 (21x51) against Round Rock...Including last night, the Dodgers have lost six of their last seven games when scoring first (started 30-5).

Acquired by Dodgers: Trade with Arizona, April 17, 2018

Last Game: Took the loss July 5 at home against Round Rock in the team's 7-3 defeat...allowed five runs (four earned) and eight hits over 6.0 innings; tied his season high in innings and was longest start since June 7 at Sacramento...issued two walks and notched four strikeouts...four runs scored in the second inning, all with two outs: a two-run single by Nick Noonan followed by a two-run homer by Hanser Alberto...following Alberto's homer, retired 11 of the next 12 batters...did not surrender another run until the sixth, when a two-out fielding error by Breyvic Valera allowed a run to score...seven of eight hits allowed were singles...Express went 4-for-11 with runners on and 1-for-4 with RISP...threw 93 pitches (63 strikes).

Against Round Rock: Faced the Express twice this season...is 0-1 and allowed five runs (four earned) and nine hits over 9.0 innings...recorded four walks and six strikeouts...Express has batted .265 (9x34)...eight of nine hits have been singles...in addition to his last outing, made team debut April 20 in Round Rock and did not receive a decision in OKC's 6-3 win...threw 3.0 scoreless innings while building up his workload...allowed just one hit, with two walks and two strikeouts...overall, retired eight of 11 batters faced, including six of the last seven...had not previously faced Round Rock in his career prior to this season.

2018:

- Acquired by the Los Angeles Dodgers from Arizona April 17 in exchange for cash considerations.
- Made five starts for OKC April 20-May 12 and went 0-1 with a 3.27 ERA; allowed one or no runs in three of five outings...transferred to Tulsa May 18...returned to OKC May 30 after making two appearances with the Drillers...after a rough team debut for Tulsa May 21 vs. Arkansas, threw 5.0 scoreless innings May 25 at Corpus Christi (ND).
- Posted a 4.68 ERA over 12 starts for OKC...team is 6-6...turned in two quality starts...although he's allowed 31 runs in 57.2 innings with OKC, he's held opponents scoreless in 43 of 58 frames...had three innings with four or more runs allowed.
- Over last three starts has posted a 9.42 ERA (15 ER/14.1 IP) and 2.02 WHIP...opponents are batting .375 (24x64), although over the last two starts, 13 of 14 hits allowed have been singles.
- Did not yield a run over 5.0 innings against Salt Lake June 14 at home and earned the win in OKC's 4-1 victory...allowed four hits, with one walk and four strikeouts...gave up hits to two of the first three batters faced, but kept the Bees 2-for-15 for the remainder of his outing...four of the first six batters reached base, but then retired 12 of the final 13 batters faced...held the Bees 0-for-6 with runners on and 0-for-5 with RISP...did not have a runner reach third base...first win over Salt Lake in five career starts...threw 77 pitches (49 strikes).
- Earned first win of the season June 7 at Sacramento...tied season high with 6.0 innings and allowed three runs on a season-high 10 hits...handed out two walks while striking out four...had at least two baserunners in five of six innings and never retired the side in order; however, retired the leadoff batter in five of six times...of the 10 hits allowed, seven were singles and three were doubles...River Cats went 5-for-15 with runners on, but held to 2-for-12 with RISP...had 11 groundouts against two flyouts...at the plate, went 2-for-3 with a RBI.
- Went 6.0 innings May 12 at Colorado Springs...allowed one run while scattering seven singles, with no walks and four strikeouts...did not figure in the decision in the team's 2-1 loss.
- Threw 4.0 scoreless innings against Iowa April 27 at home before reaching his pitch limit...did not figure in decision in OKC's 4-1 victory...gave up four hits, with no walks and three strikeouts...all four hits allowed were singles...held Iowa 1-for-7 with runners on and 0-for-2 with RISP...lefties went 0-for-10...at the plate, delivered a two-out RBI single in the fourth inning.
- Made team debut April 20 in Round Rock and did not receive a decision in OKC's 6-3 win...threw 3.0 scoreless innings while building up his workload...allowed just one hit.
- Signed by the Arizona Diamondbacks to a minor league contract Jan. 16, 2018...compiled 4.0 innings over two relief appearances for Triple-A Reno...allowed seven runs and eight hits over 4.0 innings, including two home runs...opponents went 8-for-19...had three walks against three strikeouts.

2017:

- Pitched within the New York Mets organization, primarily at Triple-A Las Vegas...made his MLB debut May 27, 2017 against Pittsburgh...called upon to pitch the bottom of the 10th inning...pitched 0.2 innings in relief and allowed one run on one hit, one walk and one hit batter and took the loss.
- Recalled to New York three times throughout the season...made seven appearances, including three starts, for the Mets...went 0-3 with a 5.32 ERA...struck out 16 batters and issued 10 walks over 22.0 innings...in four relief appearances for the Mets, held opponents to a .158 average (3x19)...made first career Major League start May 30 vs. Milwaukee...held the Brewers to one run and six hits in 5.1 innings and left in line for the win, but the Brewers rallied to tie the game.
- Did not allow an earned run in his first 29.1 innings of work of 2017 with Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Las Vegas.
- Joined Las Vegas April 19 and made 13 starts throughout the season for the 51s while shuttling between Las Vegas and New York...went 4-3 with a 3.47 ERA and .267 BAA.
- Nine of 13 starts for Las Vegas were quality starts, including each of his first five outings...lasted at least 6.0 innings 10 times...had at three starts of at least 6.0 innings with no runs allowed (April 19 at Fresno, April 30 vs. Albuquerque and July 19 vs. Fresno).
- Underwent arthroscopic surgery on his right elbow in August and missed the remainder of the season.

Career:

- Selected by the New York Mets in the fourth round of the 2011 MLB Draft out of Cal State Fullerton...was named to the 2009 Freshman All-American team by *Collegiate Baseball, Baseball America* and the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association...also named co-Big West Conference Pitcher of the Year in 2009...was a two-way player and also was an outfielder, batting .336 over his career...originally selected by Colorado in the 38th round of the 2008 MLB Draft out of Covina (Calif.) High School, but did not sign.
- Named an Eastern League Mid-Season All-Star with Binghamton in 2016.
- Finished third in strikeouts (120) and fifth in WHIP (1.16) in the Eastern League with Binghamton in 2014.
- Older brother, Brett, played in the San Francisco Giants organization from 2006-13, including stints in 2011-13 with the Major League club...also played at Cal State Fullerton.
- Career .361 hitter in the Minors, going 35-for-97 with seven doubles, one home run and 14 RBI.

- Had a game-winning, pinch-hit, two-run double in the ninth inning June 19 in Chicago to send the LA Dodgers to a 4-3 win over the Cubs.
- Appeared in a total of 32 games for the Los Angeles Dodgers...most recently optioned to OKC June 20...made the Los Angeles Dodgers 2018 Opening Day roster...has batted .238 with four doubles and eight RBI in 63 AB...started 14 games at third base and committed one error in 130.2 innings...went 6-for-16 as a pinch hitter with four RBI.
- Made MLB debut July 30, 2017 against San Francisco as a pinch-hitter and hit a walk-off two-run double to right field in the 11th inning off Albert Suarez...became the first Dodger player in franchise history to earn a walk-off RBI in his first career plate appearance, and according to Elias Sports Bureau, became the first player in 22 years to supply a walk-off RBI in his first Major League plate appearance, joining Tomas Perez who accomplished the feat with the Blue Jays on May 3, 1995.
- Played in 20 games over three stints with LAD in 2017, primarily off the bench; overall went 6-for-20 (.300) with one double, one run scored and two RBI.
- Made the Dodgers' 2017 postseason roster for the National League Division Series and National League Championship Series...appeared in one game and had one at-bat in the NLDS...saw action in four games in the NLCS; had three at-bats with no hits and a sacrifice fly.
