Today's Game: The Oklahoma City Dodgers and New Orleans Baby Cakes conclude their five-game series at 7:05 p.m. on a \$2 Thursday at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark. The Dodgers lead the series, 3-1. They have won three straight games, as well as six of their last seven games. Tonight's game will be televised on YurView on Cox (Channel 1333) beginning five minutes before first pitch.

Last Game: Kyle Garlick hit a two-run walk-off homer in the bottom of the 10th inning Wednesday night to send the Dodgers to a 6-4 win against New Orleans at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark. The Dodgers and Baby Cakes extended into their second extra-inning contest in three games, playing to a 4-4 tie through nine innings. New Orleans loaded the bases in the top of the 10th inning with two outs, but Dodgers reliever Ariel Hernandez struck out Austin Nola to escape the jam and keep the game tied. Kyle Farmer started the bottom of the 10th inning on second and advanced to third on a sacrifice bunt by Connor Joe before Garlick drilled the game-winning homer to center field. The Baby Cakes took the first lead of the game, 1-0, in the second inning when Cristhian Adames hit a sacrifice fly. It stayed 1-0 until New Orleans scored three runs with two outs in the fifth inning. Magneuris Sierra hit a RBI single and Eric Campbell followed with a two-run double to make it 4-0. The Dodgers tied the game, 4-4, in the fifth inning, scoring four runs as four straight players reached base with two outs. Farmer lined a RBI double into left field. Joe followed with a two-run double to right field, and Garlick tied the game with a RBI knock into center field. Hernandez (2-2) was earned the win after keeping the 'Cakes scoreless in the top of the 10th. New Orleans reliever Jose Quijada (2-1) pitched the bottom of the 10th inning and was charged with the loss.

Today's Probable Pitcher: Logan Bawcom joins the OKC Dodgers from Double-A Tulsa to make his first start with OKC since 2016..Bawcom made 11 starts with Double-A Tulsa this season, going 4-5 with a 4.61 ERA, 35 strikeouts and 17 walks over 54.2 innings...In his most recent start with Tulsa July 14 at Northwest Arkansas, Bawcom picked up the win, allowing two runs and five hits over 5.0 IP. He did not issue a walk and recorded three strikeouts...Bawcom signed a minor league contract with the Los Angeles Dodgers May 16 after making three starts with the independent Sugar Land Skeeters to begin the season...He split the 2017 season between Triple-A El Paso (San Diego) and Triple-A Nashville (Oakland), going a combined 2-5 with a 3.31 ERA over 47 relief appearances...Bawcom made 31 appearances (12 starts) for OKC during the 2016 season. He posted a 6-5 record and a 1.92 ERA over 89.0 IP while holding opponents to a .216 average. In those 12 starts, Bawcom posted a 1.62 ERA with a 4-3 record...The 2018 season marks his third stint in the Dodgers organization. He was originally drafted by the Dodgers in the 17th round in 2010 from UT-Arlington. After being traded to Seattle during the 2012 season, he was acquired by the Dodgers from Seattle in the Triple-A portion of the Rule 5 Draft in December 2015...Tonight is Bawcom's 10th career appearance and second start against New Orleans (1-1, 1.11 ERA). He most recently pitched one inning of scoreless and hitless relief and was credited with the win against New Orleans Sept. 3, 2017 while with Nashville.

Against the Baby Cakes: 2018: 9-6 2017: 6-9 All-time: 178-153 At OKC: 95-71
Tonight is the final meeting of the season between the Dodgers and Baby Cakes. With last night's victory, the Dodgers clinched a win in the season series for the fourth time in the last five seasons...The teams recently met for their last series at The Shrine on Airline, June 29-July 3, with New Orleans winning the series, 3-2, and the Dodgers winning the final game of the set, 4-0...During the first series April 13-16 in OKC, the Dodgers swept the series, 4-0, and outscored the Baby Cakes, 29-18, and outhit New Orleans, 56-32, while closing the series with three straight walk-off wins...New Orleans won the 2017 series, 9-6, marking their first season series win against OKC since 2011 and just their second against OKC since 2006...During the 2018 season series between these teams, the home team is 11-4 so far. Four of the Dodgers' six home wins have been in walk-off fashion...Henry Ramos has batted .420 (21x50), with four homers, eight extra-base hits and 18 RBI.

Walk on the Wild Side: Wednesday marked the Dodgers' fifth walk-off victory of the season, but first since April 16. Four of the team's five walk-off wins have come at the expense of the Baby Cakes...Kyle Garlick hit the team's second walk-off homer of the season, joining Alex Verdugo, who belted a three-run homer in the 10th inning April 15 to sink New Orleans, 8-6...Yesterday was the team's 13th last at-bat win of 2018 as well as the second-largest come-from-behind victory of the season after falling behind, 4-0.

Teach Me How to Dugie: Alex Verdugo had Wednesday off, but hit safely in both games of Tuesday's doubleheader. He's currently on an 11-game hitting streak, going 18-for-40 (.450) with five multi-hit outings, two homers and six runs scored. He has 34 hits over his last 24 games...Verdugo paces the Dodgers with 86 hits in 63 games, and his .350 season batting average is tied for tops in the PCL with Salt Lake's David Fletcher, who is currently with the Los Angeles Angels...Verdugo has eight homers this season after hitting six homers in 117 games last season with the team. Five of his homers have come against New Orleans.

Getting Offensive: The Dodgers scored six runs last night and have scored at least five runs in eight of their last 10 games, including four games with seven or more runs scored. The Dodgers have batted .308 (108x351) during the 10-game stretch and scored 61 runs with 13 HR.

Along the Rios Grande: Over his last 13 games, Edwin Rios is batting .378 (17x45) with six multi-hit outings, nine runs scored and 12 RBI...Rios currently paces the Dodgers with 12 RBI and 10 runs scored in July. His 17 hits this month are tied for second-most among Dodgers players...After missing close to two months at the start of the season due to injury, Rios is slashing .311/.367/.466 over 45 games and he has picked up 17 multi-hit games.

Mound Turnaround?: Over the last five games, the Dodgers have posted a 2.20 ERA (11 ER/45.0 IP) and .209 BAA (33x158), including 8-for-48 with RISP. The team has not allowed a homer in a season-best five straight games...Prior to Sunday, the pitching staff had a 5.83 ERA and 1.72 WHIP, with opponents batting .313 over the previous 23 games.

Farm Fresh: Kyle Farmer picked up his fourth multi-hit outing in five games last night by going 2-for-5 with a RBI double. Over the five-game stretch he is 10-for-22 with five doubles, five RBI and four runs scored...Nine of his team-leading 18 hits this month have gone for extra bases.

Welcome Back: Since returning from the Disabled List last week, both Tim Locastro and Donovan Solano have had noticeable impacts. Solano is 8-for-18 with a pair of games with three-plus hits. Locastro has hit safely in all six games he's played in, going 8-for-24 with seven runs.

Last Game: Started for Double-A Tulsa in the Drillers' 12-8 triumph over Northwest Arkansas July 14 and earned the win...threw 5.0 innings and allowed two runs on five hits, with no walks with three strikeouts...only one hit went for extra bases (double)...retired nine of first 10 batters faced...ran into trouble in fourth inning, surrendering two runs after each of the first three batters singled...after a leadoff single in the fifth, induced two groundouts and a strikeout to end the frame...left game with a 3-2 lead...held NWA to 1-for-6 with runners in scoring position...collected eight groundouts and one flyout...threw 73 pitches, 49 strikes.

Against New Orleans: Amassed nine appearances (one start) throughout his career versus the Baby Cakes with Nashville (2017), Oklahoma City (2016) and Tacoma (2013-15)...has a career 1-1 record and 1.11 ERA (2 ER/16.2 IP) while recording 10 strikeouts and nine walks...in most recent appearance Sept. 3, 2017 with Nashville, pitched 1.0 inning of relief and was credited with the win; came in to pitch the eighth inning and allowed no runs or hits with one walk...made four appearances (one start) with OKC in 2016; surrendered three runs (one earned) over 9.0 innings, with six walks and six strikeouts; New Orleans went 7-for-29...in lone start against New Orleans in 2016 with Oklahoma City on Aug. 20 at the Shrine on Airline, was charged with the loss after allowing two runs, both unearned, over 5.0 innings with a season-high five walks and four punchouts.

2018:

- Transferred to OKC July 19 from Double-A Tulsa...made 11 starts and registered a 4-5 ledger and 4.61 ERA over 54.2 innings...ranked third on the team in innings and starts...Drillers went 5-6 in his starts, with wins in the last three straight...made five starts of at least 5.0 innings while allowing two or fewer runs...struck out 35 hitters and issued 17 walks...posted a .268 BAA and 1.39 WHIP...lefties batted .319 while right-handed hitters hit .243...held TL opponents to a .179 average with runners in scoring position.

- Named Pitcher of the Week July 1 with Tulsa...hurled 5.2 shutout innings at Midland June 30 to earn the victory...allowed two hits and two walks while striking out a season-high eight batters in the 4-0 Tulsa victory.

- Acquired by the Dodgers for a third time in his career after signing as a minor league free agent May 16, 2018.

- Made three starts with the Sugar Land Skeeters of the independent Atlantic League to begin the year...went 1-1 with a 6.75 ERA (10 ER) in 13.1 innings...notched 13 strikeouts against one walk.

2017:

- Started and spent the majority of the year with Triple-A El Paso...compiled a 2.70 ERA and a 1-3 ledger over 36 appearances and 53.1 innings...converted two of four save opportunities...fanned 54 against 25 walks...allowed just two runs over final 11 appearances with the Chihuahuas (14.1 IP)...released by the San Diego Padres Aug. 2.

- Signed by Oakland to a minor league contract Aug. 3...made 11 appearances for Triple-A Nashville and went 1-2 with a 5.19 ERA over 17.1 innings...fanned nine and issued six walks...hitters averaged .273 while posting a 1.38 WHIP...had one bad outing Aug. 29 vs. Omaha, but outside of that appearance, allowed five runs and 13 hits over 15.1 IP.

Career:

- Over nine Minor League seasons, compiled a 3.32 ERA and 34-35 record in 351 games (24 starts) and 569.0 innings...converted 89 saves in 109 chances...fanned 527 batters and issued 235 walks...posted a .240 BAA and 1.31 WHIP...23 of his 24 career starts have come in the Dodger organization.

- Began career in the Dodgers organization after being selected in the 17th round of the 2010 MLB Draft out of UT-Arlington...played two seasons at Midland Junior College (2008-09) where he earned first-team All-Conference honors and was named a NJCAA Distinguished All-American in 2009...transferred to UT-Arlington in 2009.

- Spent the majority of 2016 with the OKC Dodgers in a swingman role...made a total of 31 appearances, including 12 starts...overall went 6-5 with one save and a 1.92 ERA while holding opponents to a .216 average...in 12 starts, went 4-3 and had a 1.62 ERA.

- Traded to Seattle along with Leon Landry for RHP Brandon League July 30, 2012...played in Seattle's system through the 2015 season and was selected by the Dodgers in the Triple-A portion of the Rule 5 Draft Dec. 10, 2015.

- Named Tacoma's Pitcher of the Year in 2013 and led all Mariners minor leaguers with 21 saves...posted a 2.91 ERA...ranked fifth in the PCL in saves, fourth in games finished (39), and third among relievers in fewest baserunners per nine innings (11.22).

- Tied for eighth in the minor leagues with 26 saves in 2012, split between High-A Rancho Cucamonga, Double-A Chattanooga, and Double-A Jackson...had a composite 2.00 ERA and held opponents to a .182 average...struck out 75 over 63.0 IP.

- Led Dodgers minor leaguers and tied for 10th overall in the Minors with 27 combined saves with Low-A Great Lakes and Rancho Cucamonga in 2011...opponents batted just .207 struck out 87 over 64.0 IP.

- Notched three doubles July 13 at Round Rock (3x5).
- Had a game-winning, pinch-hit, two-run double in the ninth inning June 19 in Chicago to send the LA Dodgers to a 4-3 win over the Cubs.
- Appeared in a total of 32 games for the Los Angeles Dodgers...most recently optioned to OKC June 20...made the Los Angeles Dodgers 2018 Opening Day roster...has batted .238 with four doubles and eight RBI in 63 AB...started 14 games at third base and committed one error in 130.2 innings...went 6-for-16 as a pinch hitter with four RBI.
- Made MLB debut July 30, 2017 against San Francisco as a pinch-hitter and hit a walk-off two-run double to right field in the 11th inning off Albert Suarez...became the first Dodger player in franchise history to earn a walk-off RBI in his first career plate appearance, and according to Elias Sports Bureau, became the first player in 22 years to supply a walk-off RBI in his first Major League plate appearance, joining Tomas Perez who accomplished the feat with the Blue Jays on May 3, 1995.
- Played in 20 games over three stints with LAD in 2017, primarily off the bench; overall went 6-for-20 (.300) with one double, one run scored and two RBI.
- Made the Dodgers' 2017 postseason roster for the National League Division Series and National League Championship Series...appeared in one game and had one at-bat in the NLDS...saw action in four games in the NLCS; had three at-bats with no hits and a sacrifice fly.
- Batted .305 over 59 games with OKC in 2017...tallied 68 hits, including 16 doubles, one triple, seven home runs and 38 RBI...hit in a season-high 11 consecutive games with OKC, June 11-24, with a .413 average (19x46), four homers and 14 RBI...hit a walk-off three-run homer vs. Round Rock June 11 to cap a six-run ninth inning and give OKC a 10-7 win.
- Selected to participate in the 2015 SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game... played in the Arizona Fall League in 2015 with the Glendale Desert Dogs.
- Selected by the Dodgers in the eighth round of the 2013 MLB Draft out of the University of Georgia...was a four-year starting shortstop for the Bulldogs and was teammates with current LAD pitcher Alex Wood...originally drafted by the New York Yankees in the 35th round in 2012, but elected to return for his senior season.
