Lancaster JetHawks (27-30)

RHP Dustin May (2-3, 5.14 ERA) vs. RHP Matt Dennis (3-6, 6.28 ERA)

TODAY'S GAME: The Quakes begin a three-game series against the Lancaster JetHawks (Colorado Rockies Affiliate) on the road at The Hangar. This is the fourth of six total games between the two clubs over a seven day stretch, with the first three match-ups taking place at LoanMart Field in Rancho Cucamonga. Tuesday begins the third series played at The Hangar for Rancho during the first-half

VS LANCASTER: This is the tenth of 28 overall meetings between the two clubs and the seventh of 15 games at The Hangar. The Quakes last met with the JetHawks in a three-game series at LoanMart Field 6/1-6/3 and won two-of-three against the South Division opponents. Starting pitcher Dea Kremer was credited with the win in the first game of the series, as the Quakes shutout Lancaster 2-0. In game two of the set, Stetson Allie pitched a scoreless fifth inning of relief and secured his first victory of the season. After taking two-of-three from Lancaster, Rancho currently leads the season series five-games-to-four.

LAST TIME OUT: The Quakes put an end to a no-hit bid by Lancaster in the eighth inning on Sunday afternoon, but fell a run shy in the conclusion of the series, 3-2. In the eighth, Cody Thomas walked to begin the inning. Marte followed with a two-run home run on the first pitch of his at-bat, pushing the Quakes within a run at 3-2. Rancho would go on to leave the bases loaded in the eighth against new reliever Justin Lawrence. Starting pitcher Andrew Sopko allowed two of three Lancaster runs when Roberto Ramos hit a two-run home run to right field in the first inning. Sopko would settle in, allowing an additional run on a ground out in the fourth, but worked through the seventh inning for his fifth quality start of the season despite the loss. On the mound for Lancaster, David Hill made his California league debut and first overall appearance since June of 2016. After hitting Zack McKinstry and walking Rylan Bannon to open the game, Hill (1-0) went on to retire 15 straight across five hitless innings and received the win.

GROUNDING THE HAWKS: On the offensive end, Gavin Lux and Rylan Bannon have shown the most success against Lancaster pitching this season. Lux is batting .455 (15-for-333) with five doubles, three home runs and eleven RBI's to go along with a teamhigh OBP of .526. Bannon is batting .265 (9-for-34) with a team-high five home runs and a slugging percentage of .794

ONE RUN NO FUN: Rancho has struggled in one-run games this season going 5-13 in tightly contested contests. Rancho dropped a one-run contest in the series finale against Lancaster on Sunday (2-3), and of recent is 1-6 over the last seven games decided by a

CHASING THE TOP: The Quakes are rumbling at the right time, winners of seven of their last ten games with 13 games left to play in the first-half schedule. Rancho is currently in a three-way tie with Lancaster and Inland Empire for second place in the California League south division, a game back of first place Lake Elsinore.

CURRENT STREAKS: After just two hits for the Quakes offense on Sunday, Rancho saw a number of hitting streaks come to a close. Rylan Bannon ended an eight-game hitting streak going 0-for-1 with three walks but has still reached safely in nine straight games. Jeren Kendall was 0-for-4 putting an end to a six-game stretch. Gavin Lux has secured a hit in ten of his last twelve games with seven multi-hit games over the span. Cristian Santana has reached on a hit in ten of his last 14 games.

RECENT ROSTER MOVES: Thursday, RHP Parker Curry and LHP Michael Boyle were both promoted to Double-A Tulsa of the Texas League. RHP Nolan Long was transferred from Double-A Tulsa to Rancho Cucamonga. Long began the year with the Quakes and was 2-0 with a 1.23 ERA before earning the promotion on 4/24. RHP Marshall Kasowski and INF Zach McKinstry were transferred from Low-A Great Lakes of the Midwest League to Rancho Cucamonga.

MAY DAY: Dustin May (2-3) is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season for the Quakes and first start against the Jet-Hawks. May last pitched against Lake Elsinore on 5/30 at LoanMart Field, allowing four runs over five innings and striking out six in his second win of the season. May first joined the Quakes rotation on 5/3, going 2-3 over six total starts in the month of May (28 IP, 16 ER, 6 BB, 29 K's). The Justin, TX native was a third round pick by the Dodgers in 2016 out of Northwest H.S. (Justin, TX) and currently ranks as the number ten prospect in the system by MLBPipline.com.

OPPOSING PITCHER: Matt Dennis (3-6) is scheduled to make his 12th start of the year for the JetHawks and third this season against Rancho. Dennis last pitched against the Quakes in a start on 4/27, allowing five runs over four innings in a loss despite striking out a season-high ten Rancho hitters. Last time out, Dennis pitched a season-high seven innings against Inland Empire allowing four earned run in a no-decision. An Arlington Heights, IL native, Dennis was drafted by the Rockies in the 14th round of the 2016 draft out of Bradley University.

REHABBERS: The Quakes have had three different Dodgers join the club as apart of major league rehab assignment this season. Dodgers INF Justin Turner joined the Quakes along with INF Logan Forsythe in a weekend series vs. Visalia. Turner was 0-for-6 at the plate while Forsythe finished 1-for-10 with a double during their time in Rancho. Yasiel Puig joined the club on rehab assignment Tuesday (5/8) in Lake Elsinore. Puig was 0-for-4 at the plate and was removed from the game in the seventh inning.

FAMILIAR FACES ON THE FARM: A total of 16 former Quakes returned to Rancho Cucamonga to start the 2018 campaign, including 12 of the 14 original pitchers on the roster. Jordan Sheffield and Tony Gonsolin, ranked 17th and 23rd in the Dodgers' system, by MLBPipeline.com, return to the Quakes to help anchor the rotation. Former Quakes Dean Kremer, Issac Anderson and Andrew Sopko will also pitch out of the rotation. The bullpen began the year made up entirely of former Quakes, with Stetson Allie, Chris Matthewson, Parker Curry, Andrew Istler, Nolan Long, Ryan Moseley and Jason Richman making up the relief core. California League 2017 All-Star Ibandel Isabel, who mashed 28 home runs for last year's club, returned to the Quakes for a second year but was traded to the Cincinnati Reds. He was joined by returning infielder Omar Estevez and outfielder Logan Landon.

SAME SKIPPER, NEW STAFF: The skipper of the Quakes for a third consecutive year is Manager Drew Saylor, who has led the team to the Cal League Playoffs in each of the last two seasons. Saylor, whose team went 76-64 last season, is just the third manager in team history to lead the team for three seasons (Mike Basso 1996-1998, Bobby Meacham 2002-2004). The hitting coach is Justin Viele, a Fullerton native who enters his second year with the Dodgers. In 2017, the former Santa Clara Bronco was the hitting coach for the Ogden Raptors of the Pioneer League. Taking over pitching coach duties is Connor McGuiness who also enters his second year in the Dodgers' system. Last season, the Arlington, Virginia native worked in the same role for the Great Lakes Loons of the Midwest League, after spending three of the four previous years working for his alma mater, Emory University. The final member of Saylor's staff is assistant coach Petie Montero, another second-year member of the Dodgers' system, who coached in the DSL last year.

NINE & ON TIME: The Quakes are the only team in the California League that have yet to play an extra-inning game under the new MilB rules this season. As a result, Rancho has completed all games in under four hours with the longest contest clocking in at 3:49 vs. Inland Empire on April 14th. April 14th marked the closest the Quakes have come to playing extras, tied at 6-6 in the ninth inning, Rancho scored the game-winning run in the bottom half and secured their first walk-off win of the season.

BY THE NUMBERS

Gavin Lux's 12-game hitting streak was the longest by any Quake this season. Lux passed Rylan Bannon who held the previous season long streak of eleven games. Over the stretch (Apr 26-5/11), Lux was 23-for-51 at the plate with six-multi hit games during the streak.

Rylan Bannon homered in three consecutive games during the series with Lake Elsinore 5/28-5/31 becoming the first Quakes player to do so this season. Bannon is also the only player this year to hit three home runs in a single game, a feat he accomplished on April, 18th at The Hangar in Lancaster.

The Quakes RBI-Leader **Cristian Santana** has been one of the most effective hitters with runner in scoring position this season. 27 of his 36 RBI's have come with RISP and he is batting at a .267 clip over those situations. With the bases loaded, Santana's average sky rockets to .375 where he is 3-for-8 with 9 RBI's.
