TODAY'S GAME: The Quakes continue a three-game series at LoanMart Field, hosting the Inland Empire 66ers (Los Angeles Angels affiliate) as part of a short three-game homestand. This is the final home series in Rancho Cucamonga for the Quakes during the first-half schedule and the second series with the 66ers at LoanMart Field. Tonight's game will be followed with post-game fireworks, thanks to National CORE! First pitch is scheduled for 7:05 PM.

VS INLAND EMPIRE: This is the ninth of 30 overall meetings between the two clubs and the sixth of 16 games at LoanMart Field. The Quakes last met with the 66ers in a three-game series at San Manuel Stadium 5/25-5/27 and won two-of-three against the South Division opponents. Starting pitcher Dustin May was credited with the win in the first game of the series, as the Quakes beat Inland Empire 8-1. In game three of the set, Dean Kremer pitched six no-hit innings for the win as Rancho fell an out shy of tossing the second combined no-hitter in franchise history. Following a 7-1 loss for the Quakes on Friday, Rancho continues to lead the season series five-games-to-three.

LAST TIME OUT: Inland Empire used a five-run second inning to get out to a huge lead, taking the opening game of a three-game series over the Quakes on Friday night, winning 7-1 in front of more than 4,200 fans at LoanMart Field. Quakes' starter Isaac Anderson gave up a run in the first and five in the second before Rancho had much of a chance to get going offensively. Sixers right-fielder Jo Adell had three hits, including a solo homer to lead Inland Empire's 12-hit attack. Rancho got their lone run in the sixth, as Cristian Santana doubled and eventually scored on an Omar Estevez sac fly, making it 7-1. Starter Matt Ball pitched four scoreless frames, but didn't qualify for the win. Blake Smith (1-0) notched the victory, as he allowed just one run over 2.2 innings.

COLLISION ON THE 66: On the offensive end, Gavin Lux and Connor Wong have shown the most success against Inland Empire pitching this season. Lux is batting .333 (11-for-33) with two doubles, two home runs and nine RBI's to go along with an on-base percentage of .410. Wong is batting .250 (8-for-32) with a team-high four home runs and a slugging percentage of .688 against the 66ers.

BANNON'S BIG WEEK: Rylan Bannon was named California League Player of the week on Monday (6/4) following a strong offensive showing to close the month of May. Over the week, Bannon hit .458 with four HR's, eight RBI's and six runs scored. Bannon is the third Quakes player to receive league honors after Gavin Lux was named player of the week on 4/30 and Dustin May as pitcher of the week on 5/21.

ONE RUN NO FUN: Rancho has struggled in one-run games this season, going 5-13 in close matchups. Rancho dropped a one-run game in the series finale against Lancaster on Sunday (5/3), and of recent is 1-6 over the last seven games decided by a run.

CHASING THE TOP: The Quakes are rumbling at the right time, winners of seven of their last ten games, while taking the upper hand in each of the last four series played. With nine games left to play in the first-half schedule, Rancho is currently in a three-way tie with the 66ers and JetHawks for second place in the California League South Division, one game back of first-place Lake Elsinore.

CURRENT STREAKS: Logan Landon currently leads the club on a modest four-game hitting streak (6-for-13). Rylan Bannon has reached on a hit in 11 of his last 13 games but saw an 11-game on-base streak come to a close on Thursday, going 0-for-4.

RECENT ROSTER MOVES: Today, RHP Evy Ruibal and RHP Yeison Cespedes were transferred to Rancho Cucamonga from Extended Spring Training. LHP Jason Richman has been sent to Triple-A Oklahoma City of the Pacific Coast League. On Thursday, RHP Andrew Sopko was promoted to Double-A Tulsa of the Texas League. Filling Sopko's spot on the roster was RHP Parker Curry, who was placed on the Temporary Inactive List yesterday.

MOSELEY'S MOUND: Ryan Moseley (1-1) is scheduled to make his first start of the season for the Quakes and 23rd overall appearance on the mound. Moseley enters the starting rotation for the first time this season after Andrew Sopko was promoted to double-A Tulsa of the Texas League on 5/7. Moseley made three total starts in 2017 for the Quakes, spanning 13 total innings, allowing just one run and striking out seven. Out of the bullpen this year, Moseley has faced the 66ers twice and has allowed two runs over 2.2 innings. The Lubbock, TX native was an eighth round draft pick by the Orioles in 2016 and was traded to the Dodgers in February of 2017.

OPPOSING PITCHER: Jeremy Beasley (1-1) is scheduled to make his second start and fifth appearance of the year for the 66ers and first this season against Rancho. Beasley began the season with Low-A Burlington in the Midwest league and was promoted to Inland Empire on 5/17. Last time out, Beasley threw five innings in a start against Lake Elsinore and allowed four unearned runs in a loss to the Storm. A Lyons, GA native, Beasley was drafted in the 30th round by the Angels in the 2017 draft out of Clemson.

REHABBERS: The Quakes have had three different Dodgers join the club as apart of major league rehab assignment this season. Dodgers INF Justin Turner joined the Quakes along with INF Logan Forsythe in a weekend series vs. Visalia. Turner was 0-for-6 at the plate while Forsythe finished 1-for-10 with a double during their time in Rancho. Yasiel Puig joined the club on rehab assignment Tuesday (5/8) in Lake Elsinore. Puig was 0-for-4 at the plate and was removed from the game in the seventh inning.

FAMILIAR FACES ON THE FARM: A total of 16 former Quakes returned to Rancho Cucamonga to start the 2018 campaign, including 12 of the 14 original pitchers on the roster. Jordan Sheffield and Tony Gonsolin, ranked 17th and 23rd in the Dodgers' system, by MLB Pipeline.com, return to the Quakes to help anchor the rotation. Former Quakes Dean Kremer, Issac Anderson and Andrew Sopko will also pitch out of the rotation. The bullpen began the year made up entirely of former Quakes, with Stetson Allie, Chris Matthewson, Parker Curry, Andrew Istler, Nolan Long, Ryan Moseley and Jason Richman making up the relief core. California League 2017 All-Star Ibandel Isabel, who mashed 28 home runs for last year's club, returned to the Quakes for a second year but was traded to the Cincinnati Reds. He was joined by returning infielder Omar Estevez and outfielder Logan Landon.

SAME SKIPPER, NEW STAFF: The skipper of the Quakes for a third consecutive year is Manager Drew Saylor, who has led the team to the Cal League Playoffs in each of the last two seasons. Saylor, whose team went 76-64 last season, is just the third manager in team history to lead the team for three seasons (Mike Basso 1996-1998, Bobby Meacham 2002-2004). The hitting coach is Justin Viele, a Fullerton native who enters his second year with the Dodgers. In 2017, the former Santa Clara Bronco was the hitting coach for the Ogden Raptors of the Pioneer League. Taking over pitching coach duties is Connor McGuiness who also enters his second year in the Dodgers' system. Last season, the Arlington, Virginia native worked in the same role for the Great Lakes Loons of the Midwest League, after spending three of the four previous years working for his alma mater, Emory University. The final member of Saylor's staff is assistant coach Petie Montero, another second-year member of the Dodgers' system, who coached in the DSL last year.

NINE & ON TIME: The Quakes are the only team in the California League that have yet to play an extra-inning game under the new MiLB rules this season. As a result, Rancho has completed all games in under four hours with the longest contest clocking in at 3:49 vs. Inland Empire on April 14th. April 14th marked the closest the Quakes have come to playing extras, tied at 6-6 in the ninth inning, Rancho scored the game-winning run in the bottom half and secured their first walk-off win of the season.

BY THE NUMBERS

Gavin Lux's 12-game hitting streak was the longest by any Quake this season. Lux passed Rylan Bannon who held the previous season long streak of eleven games. Over the stretch (Apr 26-5/11), Lux was 23-for-51 at the plate with six-multi hit games during the streak.

Starting pitcher Dean Kremer currently leads the California League with 90 strikeouts over his first 13 starts of the season. Kremer set a career high with ten strikeouts in a start against Inland Empire on 5/27. The UNLV product totaled 46 strikeouts across 29.2 total innings pitched in the month of May.

The Quakes RBI-Leader Cristian Santana has been one of the most effective hitters with runner in scoring position this season. 27 of his 39 RBI's have come with RISP where he is batting at a .258 clip over those situations. With the bases loaded, Santana's average sky rockets to .375 where he is 3-for-8 with 9 RBI's.
