ABOUT LAST NIGHT...: The New Hampshire Fisher Cats (Toronto Blue Jays) completed the best road trip in franchise history with a 4-0 win over the Trenton Thunder (New York Yankees) Wednesday night at ARM & HAMMER Park, notching their sixth victory in seven games to start the 2018 season with a 6-1 record.

Vladimir Guerrero Jr. went two for five with an RBI single and a double (his fourth in seven games) while Bo Bichette extended his hitting streak to a team-high six games with a one for five performance. Cavan Biggio – son of Baseball Hall of Famer Craig Biggio – worked a pair of walks, stole a base and scored a run on the night of his 23rd birthday.

Biggio's first free pass in the second inning sparked a two-run stanza. Harold Ramirez drove him in with an RBI single and Ramirez later scored after an errant throw on a stolen base attempt granted him an additional 90 feet

#27 Blue Jays prospect (MLB.com) Jordan Romano (W, 1-0) was electric in the second Double-A start of his career. The Markham, Ontario native went seven shutout innings – the most innings pitched by a 'Cats starter this season – in which he scattered three hits and struck out seven with no walks allowed.

New Hampshire doubled their advantage with two runs in the seventh. Vlad Jr. and Lourdes Gurriel hit back-to-back run-scoring singles to push across a pair and put the Fisher Cats up 4-0.

Justin Shafer and Andrew Case each worked one inning of scoreless relief to secure the win.

WELCOME TO CLUB NEDD: THe Fisher Cats return home after an historic road trip to start the first homestand of the 2018 campaign.

Hartford comes to town for a three-game weekend series and Binghamton will arrive on the shores of the Merrimack for four games starting Monday night.

QUITE THE START: The 'Cats are off to their best start in franchise history. A win tonight would set a new mark; New Hampshire has never started a season 7-1.

SON(S) OF A...: A trio of big league progeny is on the Fisher Cats' Opening Day roster. #1 Blue Jays prospect and #3 overall prospect (MLB.com) Vladimir Guerrero, Jr. – son of 2018 Hall of Famer Vladimir Guerrero, Sr. – leads the way with #2 Blue Jays prospect and #13 overall (MLB.com) Bo Bichette alongside. Bichette is the youngest son of long-time big leaguer Dante Bichette. Cavan Biggio – son of Hall of Famer Craig Biggio – will see plenty of playing time on the right side of the infield.

VLAD TO THE BONE: Vlad Jr. is off to a productive start to his Double-A career. The #1 Blue Jays prospect (MLB.com) leads the league with nine runs batted in through the first seven games. He set a new personal best with six RBI in a game on April 9 in Trenton.

ON THE HILL: RHP Nick Tepesch is back on the mound for New Hampshire in what will be his second start as a Fisher Cat. He made his Eastern League debut on April 7 in Hartford, when he limited the Yard Goats to one run on three hits, walked one and struck out six. The 29-year old was acquired by the Blue Jays from the Minnesota Twins in July of 2017 with three seasons of big league experience under his belt. Initially drafted in the 14th round by the Texas Rangers in 2010, Tepesch made his debut in 2013 and has amassed a 4.71 ERA in 47 big league games, including 44 starts. The Kansas City, MO native played collegiately at Missouri.

RHP Jesus Tinoco gets the call for Hartford. He lost to the 'Cats in his last start on April 7, when he gave up three runs (two earned) on four hits in four innings of work. He walked three and struck out six. The 22-year old began his pro career with the Blue Jays in 2011 but went to the Rockies in the Troy Tulowitzki deal. Tinoco went 11-4 with a 4.67 ERA last year as a member of the Advanced-A Lancaster Jethawks n the hitter-friendly California League. He struck out 107 and walked 50. Tinoco hails from San Antonio de Maturin, VZ.
