WHAT! ARE THOSE GUYS BLIND

We've all said it. A bad call, a called strike that should have been a ball, you name it. At least once during the season we will not only question an umpire's eye site, but his knowledge of the rules and whether or not he should even be allowed on the field. But what does it take to become an umpire in professional baseball? More than you might think.

First, you have to attend one of two schools approved by Minor League Baseball. The school is four or five weeks long depending on which one you attend. Combined, the two schools usually enroll about 300 aspiring umpires. Of those 300 or so, about 50 will be selected to enter the minor leagues as an umpire. At the school, a prospective umpire learns not only the rules of the game, but how to conduct himself both on the field and off. He'll learn how to signal the calls, respond to arguments from the players, and where to place himself on the field during a play - we've all seen the first base umpire head out to right field to cover a fly ball, so who covers first? Most often the home plate umpire.

Once graduated, the top 15% or 20% are invited to the advanced course where they are evaluated by the instructors who make recommendations to the Rookie and short-season Class-A league presidents for possible candidates for them to hire.

If a candidate is hired, their journey to the major leagues begins. As their skills improve they move through the minor leagues to



Class A-Advanced, Double-A, and finally to Triple-A. On average it takes about 10 years to go from being hired to Triple-A. Yep, those umpiring our game all have about 10 years, or more, of experience.

Major league umpires fly first-class from game to game. Those in the minors drive, with the league now providing a rental car in the Advanced-A league (like the San Jose Giants) and a van for those in Double-A and Triple-A. They earn \$2,700.00 (AA) and \$3,500.00 (AAA) per month and a per diem of \$56.00 per day for gas and meals; the league pays for their two to a room motels, compared to the MLB umpires who make \$120,000.00 to \$350,000.00 per year with a \$350.00 per day per diem.

So, the next time you want to offer your glasses to the umpire, think again; they know more about the rules than we ever will, and everybody is entitled to a bad call once in a while.

Right-handed power arm Logan Webb attended dozens of Sacramento River Cats games as a kid. He grew up in the Sacramento suburb of Rocklin with season-ticket members as parents. He's now one step closer to taking the mound with the River Cats nameplate across his chest.

Webb, just 22 after being selected by the Giants out of Rocklin High School back in 2014, was added to San Francisco's 40-man roster in the offseason. The move was to protect his talented arm from the Rule-5 draft. It gave him the opportunity to spend spring training with the big-league club for the first time in his career.

His sixth professional season should begin in Richmond, Va., according to the new Director of Player Development Kyle Haines. With the Flying Squirrels in 2018, Webb made six starts totaling 30.2 innings before year's end. He broke camp in San Jose where he made 20 starts while keeping his ERA below two before being promoted to Double-A.

Webb's development was halted in the early half of the 2016 season while playing for the Class-A Augusta GreenJackets of the South Atlantic League. He was shut down with elbow soreness after just nine starts.

eventually leading to Tommy John surgery in June. But he returned healthy in 2017 with added life to his fastball.

Webb now features a mid-90s fastball, that occasionally ticks up to 98, and a "power" curveball as his plus pitches. In this context, power indicates his curveball hits velocities in the mid-80s, more in the range of a typical slider. As with most young starting pitchers in the minor-league system, it will be the grooming of a third pitch, in this case for Webb, a changeup, that will continue his success into the upper reaches of the minors as a starter or a bullpen threat.

RIVER CATS ROSTER



SHAUN ANDERSON

PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'4" | Weight: 225 | DOB: 2/14/95

Was a third-round pick by the Boston Red Sox in 2016 and pitched in their minor-league system until he was traded to the Giants on July 26, 2017 as part of the Eduardo Nunez deal. He broke camp in 2018 with the Double-A Richmond Flying Squirrels, posting a 3.45 ERA with 93 strikeouts in 94 innings before being called up to make his Triple-A debut in Sacramento. After a non-roster invite to major-league spring training this season, he'll begin the year as the Giants' fifth-ranked prospect according to MLB Pipeline.



TYLER BEEDE

PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'2" | Weight: 210 | DOB: 5/23/93

Beede, drafted in 2014's first round out of Vanderbilt University, made more starts than any other River Cats pitcher during his Triple-A debut season in 2017 and is the No. 24-ranked prospect in the system according to MLB Pipeline. He pitched six or more innings in 11 of his 19 starts, posting a 3.47 ERA in those outings. He struggled during the 2018 season with the River Cats and was sent to the bullpen for the remainder of the year, but made some mechanical adjustments in the offseason and will be back in the rotation for 2019.



TY BLACH

PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: L | Height: 6'1" | Weight: 205 | DOB: 10/20/90

Blach is back in a River Cats uniform after spending all of 2017 and 2018 with the San Francisco Giants. There, he pitched the third most innings on the club in 2017 and followed that up with 118.2 a year later. He owns a 4.36 ERA in nearly 300 major-league innings pitched while making almost half of his 85 appearances as a starter. Blach was a three-year starter at Creighton University in Omaha, Neb. and was selected by the Giants in the fifth round of the 2012 draft.



RAY BLACK

PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'3" | Weight: 230 | DOB: 6/26/90

After playing collegiately at the University of Pittsburgh, he was drafted by the Giants in the 7th round of 2011, though he missed the 2012 and 2013 seasons after undergoing shoulder surgery to repair a torn labrum. In 2014 while pitching for the San Jose Giants, he struck out nearly 45% of the batters he faced in 25 innings. In May of 2017 he had arthroscopic surgery on his throwing elbow, but returned healthy and made his major-league debut on July 8, 2018.

SAM COONROD

PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'2" | Weight: 215 | DOB: 9/22/92

Drafted in the fifth round in 2014, Coonrod hails from Carrollton, Ill. and played collegiately for Southern Illinois University. Following Tommy John surgery at the conclusion of 2017, Coonrod finished up his rehab in July of 2018 and returned to action pitching for the AZL Giants and the San Jose Giants, where during his brief time in San Jose he struck out 46.4% of the batters he faced in 6.1 innings. Prior to moving into the pen, Coonrod racked up more than 100 innings in three straight seasons from 2015 to 2017.



DEREK LAW

PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'3" | Weight: 225 | DOB: 9/14/90

Law split time in 2017 between San Francisco and Sacramento, enjoying a 2.48 ERA with 10 saves in 32.2 innings in Triple-A. But while in the majors, he struggled with a 5.06 ERA while averaging nearly three baserunners allowed per two innings. In 2016, however, Law pitched well for the Giants, posting a 2.13 ERA with 50 strikeouts and just nine walks in 55 innings. Law's 2018 campaign was again split between Sacramento and San Francisco, though 33 of his 40 games pitched were in Triple-A.



JOSE LOPEZ

PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'1" | Weight: 200 | DOB: 9/1/93

After pitching in the Cincinnati Reds' organization for four seasons, Lopez was designated for assignment on February 11, 2019 and claimed by the Giants a day later. Lopez, who played collegiately for Seton Hall and was drafted in the sixth round by the Reds in 2014, was born in the Dominican Republic but went to high school in Trenton, New Jersey. Lopez shined during the 2017 season, posting a 2.57 ERA in 147.0 innings split between Advanced-A Daytona and Double-A Pensacola.



TYLER ROGERS

PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'4" | Weight: 180 | DOB: 12/17/90

With 55 appearances, Rogers finished tied with San Jose Giants right-hander Dylan Rheault for most games by a pitcher in the Giants' system in 2017, then followed that up by leading the system with 51 in 2018. The right-handed submariner totalled 143.2 innings over that span, entirely with the Sacramento River Cats, while holding opposing hitters to a .236 average, just two home runs, and a 2.37 ERA in 2017. His 61.0% ground ball rate was one of the highest on the Giants' farm over these last two seasons.



ANDREW SUAREZ

PITCHER

Bat: L | Throw: L | Height: 6'0" | Weight: 195 | DOB: 9/11/92

Suarez entered 2018 ranked the 10th best prospect on the Giants after posting a career-high 155.2 innings in 2017, 10.1 more innings than any other Giants' minor leaguer. After being the opening-day starter for the River Cats, Suarez was called up to San Francisco where he made his major-league debut on April 11. The University of Miami product was sent back down for a brief stint but was eventually called up for good, making 29 starts totaling 160.1 innings with a 4.49 ERA.

PAT VENDITTE

PITCHER

Bat: L | Throw: S | Height: 6'2" | Weight: 215 | DOB: 9/22/92

One of the most unique baseball players in the game, Venditte is a switch-pitcher. He throws with either arm and carries a special glove that allows him to switch hands while on the mound. He's a 33-year veteran who made his major-league debut for the Oakland A's in 2015, though it was the New York Yankees who signed him in the 20th round of the 2008 draft. Venditte spent 2018 in the Los Angeles Dodgers' system where he tossed 14 big-league innings while pitching most of his games with the Triple-A Oklahoma City Dodgers.



ARAMIS GARCIA

CATCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'1" | Weight: 210 | DOB: 1/12/93

Drafted in the 2nd round of the 2014 draft out of Florida International University, Garcia was the top catching prospect in the Giants' farm system until they selected Georgia Tech's Joey Bart in 2018. Garcia, though, is certainly the closest to consistent major-league time as he's currently one of three backstops on San Francisco's 40-man roster. Garcia has been known mostly for his offensive prowess, but his skills behind the dish have improved from year to year, especially during the 2018 season in Double-A Richmond.



STEPHEN VOGT

CATCHER

Bat: L | Throw: R | Height: 6'0" | Weight: 210 | DOB: 11/1/84

Vogt is back with the River Cats for the third time, but first as a member of the Giants' organization. The catcher drafted out of Azusa Pacific University slashed .324/.398/.547 in 75 games for the River Cats back in 2013 and went on to become an American League All-Star with the A's from 2015 to 2016. He was designated for assignment by the A's in 2017 but was quickly picked up by Milwaukee, though he hit the injured list in August after a hard collision at the plate. He then spent most of 2018 rehabbing from a shoulder surgery that stemmed from the incident.



ABIATAL AVELINO

INFIELDER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'0" | Weight: 210 | DOB: 10/29/94

After signing out of the Dominican Republic at age 16 with the New York Yankees, Avelino was a ranked prospect in the Pinstripes' farm system for seven seasons. In 2015, he stole the fifth most bases in all of the minor leagues (54) while splitting time between Advanced-A and Double-A ball. On August 31, 2018, he was included in the trade that sent then Giants outfielder Andrew McCutchen to the Yankees. He enters the 2019 season on the Giants' 40-man roster and is ranked the No. 19 prospect in the organization by MLB Pipeline.



ZACH GREEN

INFIELDER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'2" | Weight: 225 | DOB: 3/7/94

Drafted out of Sacramento's Jesuit High School in 2012, Green played in the Philadelphia Phillies' farm system before electing free agency at the conclusion of the 2018 season. He had Tommy John surgery in August of 2016 and missed the rest of that season plus half of 2017. In 2018, he OPS'd nearly 1.000 with 17 home runs and 23 doubles in Double-A before being promoted to Triple-A Lehigh Valley where he completed the season. He signed with the Giants over the offseason and will get to play roughly ten miles from where he grew up in Carmichael.

RYDER JONES

INFIELDER

Bat: L | Throw: R | Height: 6'2" | Weight: 215 | DOB: 6/7/94

In 64 games for Sacramento in his Triple-A debut at age 22, Jones led the team in batting average (.299), on-base percentage (.390), and slugging percentage (.553) at the time of his call-up to San Francisco. He overcame a 1-for-21 slump to start his major-league career by slashing .240/.313/.427 in 83 August plate appearances. Jones, drafted out of Watauga High School (N.C.) in the second round of 2013's draft, then spent most of 2018 with the River Cats where he clubbed 22 doubles and 11 home runs in 116 games, though he did make five appearances in the snaisster



DONOVAN SOLANO

INFIELDER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 5'7" | Weight: 210 | DOB: 12/17/87

Originally a St. Louis Cardinals prospect who signed at age 17 out of Venezuela in 2005, Solano is now with his fifth different franchise. Solano, who signed a minor-league contract with the Giants in the offseason, spent 2018 in the Dodgers organization where he played in 81 games for the Triple-A Oklahoma City Dodgers. Though he hasn't played in a major-league game since 2016, Solano has 360 big-league games under his belt since making his debut back in 2012 with the Miami Marlins.



BREYVIC VALERA

INFIELDER

Bat: S | Throw: R | Height: 5'8" | Weight: 185 | DOB: 1/8/92

Acquired by the Giants from the Orioles during the offseason after spending time with three teams in 2018. He began the spring in St. Louis Cardinals camp but was designated for assignment at the end of March. The Venezuelan was sent to the Dodgers a few days later and began the season in Triple-A with the Oklahoma City Dodgers. He was called up to Los Angeles a handful of times, appearing in 20 games. Valera was sent to Baltimore as part of the Manny Machado deal on July 18. Valera can play a variety of positions, including second base, shortstop, third base, and corner outfield.



ANTHONY GARCIA OUTFIELDER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'0" | Weight: 180 | DOB: 1/4/92

Led the Nashville Sounds, at the time a Triple-A affiliate of the Oakland A's, in plate appearances (566), doubles (31), and home runs (25) during the 2018 season, but did not receive a September call-up from the A's. He elected free agency at the end of the year and signed a minor-league deal with the Giants on January 24, 2019. A product of Puerto Rico, Garcia was originally drafted by the St. Louis Cardinals in 2009 and remained in their system until signing with Oakland after the 2017 season.



MIKE GERBER

OUTFIELDER

Bat: L | Throw: R | Height: 5'10" | Weight: 195 | DOB: 7/8/92

A 15th-round pick by the Detroit Tigers in 2014, Gerber was a teammate of Ty Blach's for two years at Creighton University. He made his major-league debut as the extra man during a doubleheader on April 20, 2018, pinch-running for future hall-of-famer Miguel Cabrera. He was placed on waivers in December and claimed on the 10th by San Francisco. He was the Tigers' Minor League Player of the Year in 2015 after hitting .292 with 31 doubles, 10 triples, and 13 home runs playing for Class-A West Michigan.

HENRY RAMOS

OUTFIELDER

Bat: S | Throw: R | Height: 6'2" | Weight: 220 | DOB: 4/15/92

Brother of highly-ranked Giants prospect Heliot Ramos, Henry joins the River Cats after playing in the Dodgers' farm system for the last two seasons. Originally a draft pick of the Boston Red Sox in 2010, Ramos is a switch-hitting outfielder who can play all three positions. He clubbed 10 home runs and 22 doubles while slugging .465 in 102 games for the Oklahoma City Dodgers last year. He received a non-roster invite to spring training this season where he was able to roam the outfield during a game with his younger brother Heliot.



CHRIS SHAW

OUTFIELDER

Shaw's play during the first half of the 2017 season earned the Boston College product a promotion to Triple-A Sacramento on May 25, where he finished the season leading the River Cats in home runs (18) and doubles (25). He began the 2018 season with Sacramento and moved into the top-10 home run leaders in franchise history with 24 bombs before getting a September call-up to the majors on August 31. He appeared in 22 games with the Giants, batting .185 with one home run and two doubles.

Yastrzemski has played in 269 Triple-A games, including 94 in 2018 with the Bowie Baysox where he slashed .265/.359/.441.

Today's Starter: RHP Enderson Franco (0-0, No ERA) will take the hill for the River Cats in game five finale. Franco spent most of the season with the Double A Braves affiliate, Mississippi Braves. With the Braves, Franco compilled a 5-9 record with a 4.13 ERA. Franco was acquired by the Giants organization in the 2019 offseason during free agency. In 2017 Franco was selected to Venezuela's national team for the World Baseball Classic.

Offense is Rolling: The River Cats are among one of the top offensive teams in the PCL this year. Sacramento sports the second best team average at .301 as well as the second most runs scored at 31. The River Cats are ranked in the top five in every major hitting category, with the expection of stolen bases. They lead the league in triples with three through four games and have now scored 10 or more runs in back to back games, something Sacramento did not accomplish in 2018. The River Cats were 4-1 last season when scoring 10 or more runs and are 2-0 in 2019.

Home Grown Talent: INF Zach Green grew up in Carmichael, CA atteding Jesuit High School and has paced the River Cats offense this year batting an incredible .500 through four games this season. Green is in the top two in all offensive categories for Sacramento and leads the team in batting average, total bases, runs, RBI, and hits. Green also achieved the River Cats first multi-home run game, hitting both homers over 400 feet. Green will look to continue his hot streak in the series finale against the Rainiers.






Q&A with Kyle Haines, Farm Director with the San Francisco Giants, and Johnny Doskow, the radio broadcaster of the Sacramento River Cats.

Johnny: We are at Indian School Park talking with the farm director with the San Francisco Giants, Kyle Haines. Hainzy it has been an interesting year, and I tell you what it's going to be even more interesting the next couple weeks with the number of guys you have camp and all the decisions to be made. It has put some stress on you guys, but it is a good problem to have, right?

Kyle: Yeah, I mean this is probably the deepest the organization has been in a long time. A lot of quality players competing for a lot of opportunities for the Giants, at every level. I think our Major League roster is becoming deeper and deeper by the day, which then obviously pushes a lot of really good players into Sacramento that will be out there on the field for the River Cats this year.



Johnny: Okay, some exciting things happening in the minor leagues and of course those guys will be big leaguers. One guy we've been talking about is Tyler Beede. The talk of camp has been Tyler Beede, and I know you've been instrumental in just talking with the coaches about his development. What do you see from him?

Kyle: Yeah, I mean he has been absolutely fantastic, it's the guy I think that everybody has envisioned him growing into and he's grown into that. Everybody develops in their own timeline and I think now we are seeing Tyler take that massive step forward. He is still

fairly young and I think being a first round pick we put a lot of expectations on him to be really good right away, but Tyler has really found his niche. I think last year, when he looks back on it, it's going to be one of the biggest development

"This is probably the deepest the organization has been in a long time." years of his entire life, and how much he grew to be able to handle some of the adversity, but more importantly bounce up and get up off the ground after he'd been knocked down, It has been really exciting to see.

Johnny: That's great! I know with Farhan coming in everybody is trying to get their rhythm with Farhan. He obviously works very closely with the minor leagues and very closely with you. What have been your impressions of Farhan?

Kyle: Well, incredibly intelligent guy. I don't think there is anything that he does not miss. It is exciting to see him every single day just kind of have this relentless attitude of how he can improve anything he can in the organization with a huge emphasis on the major league roster. We see him every day active anyway he can to find value to the Giants to bring good players here and try to create the deepest organization and the deepest major league roster in all of baseball. I think that has been evident in how he has gone about his business here. He has stayed patient, but at the same time really jumped on some really nice claims on the waiver wire that really increases the depth of our 40 man roster. He really targeted guys with on base ability and then the multiposition athleticism to them

that could maybe help us in a variety of ways at the major league level.

Johnny: In the last 5 or 6 years, like many teams in baseball, the Giants have looked into the approach of the mental side of the game. You see it in baseball, what have you noticed about the change in baseball and specifically with the Giants as far as the mental side of the game?

Kyle: Yeah, I think it's an area everybody always talks about growing physically but in some regards these are young kids that are growing up into men, and a big part of that is the mental game and their ability to handle struggles on and off the field. They are going through a lot of emotions, their going through a lot of things. When someone was broken physically we do whatever we can to fix them, but when they are broken mentally we kind

of just turn a blind eye and say they are weak, you know? I think in all of us, in some degree, we have been knocked down and we have to pick ourselves up and move along. I think a big part of us is trying to create that atmosphere where we can create mentally strong major league players so it's not just talented major league players, as far as their physical ability, but also their mental ability.

Johnny: It is exciting that you get to see this thing from the ground up. Your first year as farm director, what has surprised you about this job? What, going in came unexpected to you with this job?

Kyle: It encompasses so many people, you look at 8 minor league teams, when you include the DSL that is 8 teams worth of staff members and 8 teams worth of players. Every one of them needs you fully tocused on their careers as best as you can, but at the same time seeing an overview of the entire organization and what is best for the organization. You're trying to teach every one of them as individuals, because if we treat them as the same we are doing them a disservice. You're dealing with 16 year old kids all the way up to 36 year old adults and their all in various degrees and everyone's their unique individual and fingerprint

and then when you talk about the staff the same regards they all come from different backgrounds, education backgrounds, etc. and just trying to figure out how they all tick and how I can be a resource to help make them, I don't want to say make them, but just help enable them to become the best person they can be.

Johnny: Well we are looking forward to seeing you in Sacramento this year, we will see you early on.

Kyle: I will be in an out all year. I am excited to catch up with each and every one of you. I never got the chance to play in Sacramento, so now I get to make up for lost time by trying to stop in as much as I can and say hi and build relationships there. I got a lot of friends in the Sacramento area that I always catch up with that always want to talk River Cats baseball. It's going to be an exciting time for me coming in and out of there all year.

Johnny: Well we are looking forward to it, thanks.

Kyle: I am looking forward to it as well, thanks.

A limited number of on-site disabled parking is available on a first-come, first-served basis in the VIP Green Lot. Additional disabled parking is available in the Orange Lot, which is just south of the stadium. Guests parking in all lots can catch a shuttle back to the dropoff zone in front of the stadium. A wheelchair-accessible van is also available which can transport guests in wheelchairs back to the dropoff zone. The cost to park in any disabled spot is \$10 (4+ carpool is free with Lasher Subaru Parking Pass.

DISABLED SEATING

Wheelchair and companion seating is offered on every level and in all price categories of the stadium. Every seating section is wheelchair-accessible and electric outlets are provided at many of the wheelchair seating areas for use in charging power wheelchairs and electronic communication devices.

EXIT AND RE-ENTRY

Guests may leave Raley Field at any time through any of the exit gates. Guests may reenter the stadium only after obtaining a reentry stamp from an attendant at any of the exit gates. Reentry for non-baseball events is subject to change.

FIELD ACCESS

In accordance with Pacific Coast League rules, only authorized personnel with proper credentials will be permitted on the field before, during, or after a game or event. Any unauthorized person who travels onto the field will be removed from Raley Field and subject to arrest and prosecution.

FIRST AID

The First Aid Station is located on the concourse at Section 112. If first aid assistance is needed, please go to the First Aid Station or contact the nearest Guest Services representative.

FOOD

Pacific Coast League rules state that guests are not allowed to bring any outside food items into Raley Field.

FOUL BALLS AND HOME RUN BALLS

Guests may keep any balls hit into the stands. Batted balls can be dangerous, so we ask that guests stay alert at all times, even when out of your seat. When attempting to catch a foul or home run ball please do not interfere with the game in progress, and be respectful of other guests. At no time should a foul or home run ball be thrown back on the field. Guests who fail to adhere to these rules face immediate ejection from Raley Field and will be subject to arrest and prosecution.

GUEST SERVICES OFFICE

The Guest Services Office is located on the Concourse Level at Section 112 and will be open when gates open to the event and closes approximately ½ hour after the event's conclusion. Guests will find a number of services including lost and found, child booster seats, taxi service, guest assistance, and reporting lost children.

ICE CHESTS AND COOLERS

Guests are not permitted to bring hard-sided ice chests or coolers into Raley Field. Soft-sided cooler bags to keep unopened bottled water, baby items, or other special needs cool during the event are permitted. Admission with these items are subject to the discretion of security or front office personnel, prohibited items should be discorded or may be returned to one's vehicle.

LOST AND FOUND

Items found in or around Raley Field during events should be turned in to the Guest Services Office located on the concourse at Section 112. All lost and found items will be stored for 30 days. After 30 days, Raley Field and the River Cats reserve the right to remit to charity or otherwise disposed of. Lost and found items can be picked up at the Administrative Office during the hours of 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. All calls and questions regarding the lost and found should be forwarded to the Guest Services Department at 1916 376-4700.

MERCHANDISE - ON DECK SHOP

The On Deck Shop is located at the Home Plate Entrance of the stadium and is open year-round. Current hours are Monday through Friday, 10:00 am -5:00 pm. On game days, the On Deck Shop closes to the public 90 minutes prior to gate time and reopens as soon as the main gates open for ticketed guests only. Hours are subject to change.
