Lou DiBella currently serves as President & Managing General Partner of the Richmond Flying Squirrels, overseeing all aspects of the Flying Squirrels operations in Richmond over the past seven years. That has included the creation of the Flying Squirrels' current ownership group, and formalizing the franchise's move to Richmond from Norwich, CT. Prior to the relocation of the franchise, DiBella served as President & Managing Partner of the Connecticut Defenders and the Norwich Navigators that preceded them. In that role, which he held from 2005-09, he fostered the relationship that continues presently between the Flying Squirrels the San Francisco Giants.

Although he led baseball's return to Richmond, DiBella's name continues to be synonymous with world championship boxing. He enjoyed an outstanding II-year run at HBO Sports, where he was the backbone of the division that vaulted HBO Boxing to signature programming status. HBO Pay Per View flourished under his leadership, televising many of the biggest prizefights in the history of the sport. DiBella recruited and signed a bevy of boxing stars for HBO, including such champions as Oscar De La Hoya, Roy Jones Jr., and Lennox Lewis. He also revolutionized the sport as creator of the critically acclaimed "Boxing After Dark" television series, providing underexposed fighters the opportunity to advance their careers on a national stage.

In May of 2000, he launched DiBella Entertainment (DBE), a full-service sports and entertainment company. DBE continues to be one of the most successful companies in boxing. DiBella has been lauded in the boxing community for fighting the contractual exploitation of boxers by promoters. DBE adheres to the following mission: to create a business model that shifts the balance of power from promoters to boxers; and establish a legacy of matchmaking excellence, both in an effort to improve the health of the boxing industry. Entertainment include current WBC Middleweight champion Sergio Gabriel Martinez, former middleweight world champions Jermain Taylor and Bernard Hopkins, former junior welterweight titleist Paulie Malignaggi, and WBC Welterweight champion Andre

In January 2005, DBE Jaunched DBE Productions. Through

that outlet in 2007, DBE Productions produced the documentary, "Magic Man," which depicted the life of Paulie Maliggnaggi and his rise in the world of boxing. In 2006, DiBella made his acting debut, depicting himself as a boxing promoter in Rocky Balboa. In 2008, he added the credit of Executive Producer to his list of accomplishments with the 2009 film Love Ranch, starring Academy Award winners Helen Mirren and Joe Pesci. In 2010, he was credited as Associate Producer of the critically acclaimed film The Fighter, starring Mark Wahlberg and Christian Bale. The film centers around the early life of 'Irish'' Micky Ward, who cemented his legacy with three legendary fights

The Squirrels regained their average attendance crown in 2013. The Lehigh Valley IronPigs claimed three consecutive overall minor league attendance titles under Domino's guidance (2010-2012).

Chuck Domino & Todd "Parney" Parnell



Todd "Parney" Parnell serves as the Vice President and Chief Operating Officer for the Richmond Flying Squirrels. In that role, he oversees all aspects of the Flying Squirrels' day-to-day operations

Thanks to Parney's continued passion and dedication to the Richmond region, the Flying Squirrels brand has become synonymous with community involvement. Under Parney's tutelage, the Squirrels were nominated for the 2016 John Henry Moss Community Service Award. It was the third time the Squirrels have been recognized as the award nominee. In their sixth season in Richmond, (2015) the Squirrels once again led the Eastern League in both overall and average attendance. It was the fourth time the Squirrels topped the overall and average attendance marks..

Parney is one of the most recognizable names and faces in Minor

Baseball. He was awarded his second Eastern League Executive of the Year Award, following the 2013 He had previously been honored in 2004 while the General Manager of the Altoona Curve. It marked the second EL Award for the Squirrels' front office (Chuck Domino - 2010).

After leading the Flying Squirrels to the 2010 Eastern attendance and the Squirrels saw an increase in average attendance during the 2011 regular season and were easily the top-draw during the 2011 EL postseason. For his efforts, and due to the team's success on the field and off, "Parney" was honored by Baseball America following the season with their top minor league award. He was named 2011 Baseball America Minor League

Executive of the Year. The Flying Squirrels now boast the distinction of having two recipients of the award in their front office, as Chuck Domino was also recognized with the award in 2003 while with the Reading Phillies. Parney followed up his award-winning season by guiding the franchise to their second overall Eastern League attendance crown in 2012.

With his leadership, the franchise completed a 1.5 million dollar renovation of The Diamond, where they opened Eastern League play in 2010. During their inaugural season, the club quickly established itself as a leader in the community, while smashing corporate and ticket sales expectations. With "Parney" at the helm, the Flying Squirrels led the Eastern League in both overall and average attendance, welcoming 463,842 (6,626) fans to The Diamond. Through innovative marketing and branding initiatives, the club posted record-breaking merchandise sales, and was awarded Logo of the Year for 2010 by Ballpark Digest.

Upon the completion of their inaugural season, the franchise was recognized as the Richmond Business of the Year by the Greater Richmond Chamber of Commerce (GRCC). "Parney" also currently serves the Richmond Chapter of the Cal Ripken Sr. Foundation Board of Trustees, as well as the Richmond Police Athletic League Board of Directors. Due to his flamboyant nature and wealth of experience in professional sports, "Parney" has also become one of the most popular speakers and guest lecturers in the region.

Prior to joining the effort to return baseball to Richmond, "Parney" served as the President of the Greenberg Sports Group (GSG), which provides management, consulting and marketing services to the sports industry across the country. GSG also manages the overall operations of Minor League Baseball's State College (PA) Spikes (Short-A/New York-Penn League) and Myrtle Beach (SC) Pelicans (A/Carolina League). "Parney" held the title of President for both

franchises.



marked Parnell's landmark 25th season in minor league baseball. In addition to his roles with both the State College and Myrtle Beach franchises, he spent seven seasons (2002-08) as the General Manager of the Double-A Eastern League's Altoona Curve, a position he relinquished in December, 2008, after the sale of the franchise from Curve Baseball LP to the family of Robert F. Lozinak.

During his time as the Curve's General Manager, the club set numerous single-game and season attendance records, continually re-invested private money into capital improvement projects at Blair County Ballpark, and helped the franchise gain national

stature as one of the most creative and innovative teams in professional sports. The Curve won the prestigious Larry MacPhail Promotional Award in 2004, the 2006 Baseball America Freitas Award as the top Double-A franchise and added the highest honor bestowed annually upon a Minor League Baseball club, the John H. Johnson President's Trophy, in 2006. Altoona became only the 11th franchise to receive all three major awards, and was the first team to accomplish the feat in less than three years.

Prior to joining the Curve, the North Carolina native was the Vice President and GM of the Single-A Kannapolis (NC) Intimidators (formerly the Piedmont Boll Weevils) in the South Atlantic League from 1997 to 2001. During his tenure in Kannapolis, the club set attendance records (either overall or average) in each of his first four seasons and made the playoffs in 1998 and 2000. For his efforts, Parnell was named the 1999 South Atlantic League General Manager of the Year.

The 2017 season of Flying Squirrels baseball can be heard locally on the flagship radio station for Flying Squirrels Baseball, Fox Sports 910 Richmond. Broadcasts will begin one half-hour before scheduled first pitch with "The Flying Squirrels Pregame Warmup." Flying Squirrels game broadcasts will also be heard worldwide online at Foxsportsrichmond.iheart.com and on the IHeart Radio app. Fox Sports 910 Richmond is the home to Wes McElroy and Dan Patrick in the mornings and Rich Eisen and Colin Cowherd in the afternoons.





Jay Burnham, 35, enters his fifth season in the Squirrels' broadcast booth and his 15th in Minor League Baseball. Prior to Richmond, he spent three seasons as Director of Broadcasting for the Trenton Thunder (Double-A New York Yankees). Burnham's 14 seasons in the game include stints with the Hagerstown Suns (A, San Francisco Giants), Pensacola Pelicans (Independent), Asheville Tourists (A-Colorado Rockies) and Thunder. A native of Shelburne Falls, MA, Burnham was the recipient of the prestigious 2011 Minor League Broadcaster of the Year award issued by Ballpark Digest, a renowned industry publication. This past season he was also recognized by Baseball America as the "Minor's Best Broadcasting Prospect".

The Elon University graduate has called play-by-play for over 1,500 professional baseball games, including two All-Star contests, in over 35 different stadiums throughout his career. Outside of baseball, Burnham has also joined VCU athletics, lending his distinctive voice for play-by-play on men's and women's basketball radio and television broadcasts. He also broadcasts in a freelance capacity for William & Mary football as well as Longwood University Men's Basketball and Dartmouth College Men's Basketball. A craft beer aficionado, Burnham currently resides in the North Side with his wife Cheyenne and two dogs Brooks and Addie.



Sam Ravech enters his first year with the Flying Squirrels and his first as a professional broadcaster .The Connecticut native graduated from Pepperdine University with a bachelor's degree in broadcast journalism and media production. Ravech was the lead play-by-play broadcaster for Pepperdine basketball and baseball all four years of college. Ravech also joined his father, Karl Ravech, and John Kruk in the broadcast booth for parts of the Little League World Series coverage on ESPN. When Sam isn't in the broadcast booth you can find him playing his guitar and listening to country music.



Since making a grand entrance into Richmond as the face of the Flying Squirrels in Feb. 2010, Nutzy has become one of the most recognizable figures in the region. Nuzty participates in countless community events, and visits hundreds of schools each year. The rigors of his schedule were nearly too much, even for the superhero squirrel, leading to the arrival of his partner Nutasha. The Flying Squirrels introduced Nutasha on Opening Day in 2016 and she became an instant star. The name Nutasha was selected through a "Name the Mascot" contest in conjunction with the Richmond Times-Dispatch in March of 2016. The name Nutasha was chosen out of hundreds of name suggestions for the newest member of the Squirrels family. Nutasha quickly gained notoriety and the duo have teamed up to cover hundreds of community appearances, events and outings across the region.

Flying Squirrels fans have enjoyed a variety of mascots since the team's inception in 2010. In addition to Nutzy and Nutasha, Parker the Rally Pig, Zinger the Acorn, Flingo the Flamingo, the Molly Maid Dancing Drag Queens, the Racing Peanuts, Victor the Villain and Captain RRRVA have joined in on the funn over the years.

Haines, 34, is the youngest skipper ever to lead the Squirrels franchise and succeeds 2016 manager Miguel Ojeda. Haines spent the previous two seasons as the manager of the Class-A Short-Season Salem-Keizer Volcanoes in the Northwest League. The Louisville, Ill., native piloted the Volcanoes to a 39-37 record in his first season in 2015 and a 32-42 record last year. He became the first former Volcanoes player to manage the club, having started his career with Salem-Keizer in 2004 as an infielder.

During his Giants minor league career, Haines played alongside the likes of Tim Lincecum, Sergio Romo, Pablo Sandoval, Jonathan Sanchez and Travis Ishikawa. The infielder was a member of four championship teams in the minor leagues (2004 Arizona Rookie League Giants, 2005 San Jose Giants, 2007 San Jose Giants, 2009 Akron Aeros). Haines notched the go-ahead RBI single in Game 5 of the 2007 California League Championship series for San Jose. In 2008, Haines enjoyed his best statistical season and made the All-Star Game in the Double-A Eastern League as a shortstop with the Connecticut Defenders.

Haines' older brother, Andy, was also a manager in affiliated baseball with the Marlins organization and currently works as the Minor League Hitting Coordinator for the Chicago Cubs. Kyle is the youngest of three siblings and attended Eastern Illinois University. He began his managing career immediately after his playing career ended, guiding the Frontier League (IND) Grays in 2014.



Kline returns to the Squirrels for a third season as pitching coach after guiding the club to a top-two finish in team ERA during his first two seasons. Kline's pitching staff turned in a franchise-best 3.12 ERA (1st in EL) in 2015 and a 3.48 ERA last year (2nd in EL). Under Kline's tutelage, Giants top pitching prospect Tyler Beede led the Eastern League in ERA last year (2.81), while also finishing second in the league in strikeouts (135). A total of seven pitchers on Kline's staff in 2016 concluded the year with Major League experience. Over his first two years with Richmond, Kline has helped develop a variety of Major League-caliber pitchers, including Josh Osich, Derek Law, Joe Biagini and Adalberto Mejia.

Kline joined the Squirrels in 2015 after spending the previous six seasons in the same roll with the Augusta GreenJackets. Kline finished off his long and established Major League career as a lefty reliever with the Giants in 2007. He appeared in 796 MLB games during his 11 year-career that began with the Cleveland Indians in 1997. Shortly after making his MLB debut, Kline was traded at the deadline by Cleveland to the Montreal Expos for Jeff Juden. The southpaw pitched parts of four seasons with Montreal, appearing in 269 games for the expos.

The 44 year-old Pennsylvania native was an 8th round selection by Cleveland in the 1993 draft out of the University of West Virginia. He set the single-season record for appearances (89) in 2001 while with the St. Louis Cardinals and led the National League in appearances three consecutive seasons (1999-2001). He helped guide the Cardinals to three playoff appearances and one World Series appearance (2004).

Nava enters his first season with the Squirrels and returns the role of hitting coach after spending last season as the manager of the San Jose Giants. The Venezuelan led the SJ Giants to a 68-72 record and a wild-card berth in the California League playoffs last year. Prior to 2016, Nava held the role of hitting coach for three seasons (2013-2015). He also served as San Jose's acting manager during the final month of the 2015 season, leading the Giants to the North Division championship. Nava is in his 10th year with the San Francisco Giants organization and seventh season as a hitting coach.

Nava will be reunited with his former pitching coach Steve Kline, as the pair spent several seasons together with the Augusta GreenJackets (Single-A affiliate). Nava managed the GreenJackets from 2011-2012 and piloted the 2011 Augusta team to the second half South Division title and reached the playoffs. His two-year managerial record was 139-138 (.502). He also served three years as the GreenJackets hitting coach from 2008-2010 and worked with a number of former Squirrels players including Charlie Culberson, Johnny Monell and Jackson Williams.

Nava played 16 seasons of professional baseball from 1990-2006, including stints in the Seattle Mariners (1990-94), Boston Red Sox (1995) and Chicago Cubs (1997) organizations. The former infielder advanced as high as Triple-A. Nava also played professionally in the Mexican League and independent Texas-Louisiana and Atlantic Leagues before retiring at the end of the 2006 season. He collected 303 hits, including 250 doubles and 110 home runs during his professional career across all levels. Nava was originally a 14th round selection of the Mariners in the 1990 draft out



Garrett joins the Flying Squirrels having spent the past seven seasons within the Giants organization (AZL 2010, Salem-Kiezer 2011), Augusta 2012-2013 and San Jose 2014-2016). He received a bachelor's degree in Kinesiology and Health Promotion-Athletic Training from the University of Wyoming in 2008 and a master's degree in Exercise and Sport Science from the University of Utah in 2010.



King begins his fourth season with the Giants' organization and first with Richmond. He spent one season (2016) with the San Jose Giants, and two seasons (2014-2015) with the Salem-Keizer Volcanoes. King previously spent a year and a half as the Athletic Performance Graduate Assistant at the University of Wisconsin-River Falls. King earned his B.A. in Exercise and Sports Science with a concentration in Physical Therapy from Hamline University in 2012, and an M.S. in Kinesiology from the University of Central Missouri in 2015. King holds his RSCC and CSCS certifications from the NSCA.

The 2016 season was full of memorable moments for the Flying Squirrels. Listed below are are the top 16 in 16.

16) Flying Squirrels nominated for the John Henry Moss Community Service Award for the third consecutive year.

The John Henry Moss Award is given annually by Minor League Baseball to the team that has demonstrated an outstanding, on-going commitment to charitable service and has exhibited support and leadership within its local community and the baseball industry. The Squirrels are active in the community year-round.

- 15) Speaking of community, how about what Flying Squirrels Charity's is up to? The non-profit wing of the Squirrels, along with Barton Malow, RIR and others, have renovated a pair of baseball fields, complete with dugouts. The charities initial goal is to revitalize one dozen dilapidated baseball fields within the city.
- 14) July 3, 2016: Camp Warrior; A baseball camp for autistic children.

The Squirrels and more than 40 participants, players and staff hosted the baseball camp specifically for autistic children.

13) Giants reliever Josh Osich becomes first former Squirrel to rehab with the Squirrels

Giants left-handed reliever Josh Osich, recovering from a forearm strain, suited up for the Squirrels on Aug. 9, and again on Aug. 11 en route to returning to San Francisco. Osich made a name for himself with the Squirrels in 2015 and made his MLB debut on July 3 the same year. Osich became just the third Giants player to rehab in Richmond (Ryan Vogelsong, Matt Cain) and the first to return after passing through on his way to San Francisco.

12) Squirrels lefty Adalberto Mejia gets traded, makes MLB debut with Twins.

When you lead the league in ERA, other teams take notice. That's what happened to Squirrels lefty Adalberto Mejia on July 28, 2016. Mejia posted a stellar 1.94 ERA through 11 starts before being shipped off to Minnesota for All-Star Eduardo Nunez. The trade allowed Mejia to move quicker through the depleted Twins system, and he eventually made his MLB debut on Aug. 20, 2016.

11) Tyler Horan hammers two homers in same inning.

On Aug. 30, 2016, Squirrels outfielder Tyler Horan joined Jarrett Parker and Ricky Oropesa as the only players to homer twice in the same inning for Richmond. Horan mashed his two long balls in the eighth inning against Hartford in an 11-0 win.

10) Squirrels welcome Olympic Gold Medal winner Townley Haas

After taking home the gold medal in the 4x200 meter freestyle relay during the Rio Olympics, Richmond-area native Haas stopped by The Diamond to throw out a first pitch. He received a hero's welcome by the Squirrels crowd.

9) Giants future stars make All-Star game.

The All-Star game in Akron, Ohio, was filled with a trio of Squirrels standouts. Giants top prospect Christian Arroyo, along with pitcher Tyler Beede and third baseman Ryder Jones were all voted onto the All-Star squad. Beede earned the start for the Western Division and pitched the first inning.

8) Nutasha unveiled.

The Squirrels introduced a new member to the family on Opening Day in 2016. Nutasha burst onto the scene to join Nutzy and the gang at The Diamond and in the community.

7) ASK Foundation Night

ASK Foundation Night has rapidly become one of the most anticipated evenings of the year for players, fans and staff at The Diamond. ASK is an organization dedicated to helping kids and families dealing with childhood cancer and on ASK Foundation Night the Squirrels players hand out hugs and high fives as the game comes to a stop to honor these brave children. Special jerseys and other fundraising efforts coincide with the memorable event.

6) Ryder Jones displays personal vendetta against the Altoona Curve.

With the Altoona Curve needing just one win over the final weekend of the season to clinch a playoff spot, Ryder Jones took it upon himself to make it as difficult as possible for the visiting club. On September 3, 2016, Jones launched a walk-off, grand slam to complete one of the most exciting comebacks of the season for Richmond. The very next day Jones drilled another grand slam, staving off the Altoona playoff celebration until the final day of the year.

5) Is that a six-time MLB All-Star?

In need of veteran bullpen assistance towards the end of the year, the Giants scooped up free agent reliever Joe Nathan and assigned him to Richmond. Nathan immediately adapted to the Squirrels 'pen and appeared in six games down the stretch. Nathan did not allow a run for Richmond. The Giants recalled him to San Francisco after the Squirrels season ended.

4) Squirrels and Jerome Bettis sellout seventh consecutive Opening Night.

That's right, former Steelers running back Jerome Bettis joined the Squirrels to begin the year. Fresh off his introduction into the Pro Football Hall of Fame, "The Bus" made a highly-anticipated stop in the RVA.

3) Squirrels plate a full dozen.

On Aug. 27, 2016, history was made at Canal Park in Akron, Ohio. The Flying Squirrels batted around nearly twice... in the fifth inning against the RubberDucks. When the dust settled, the damage was extensive with 17 batters sent to the plate and 12 runs pushed across. Needless to say Richmond won the game, 13-3.

2) Tyler Beede wins ERA title.

The Giants top pitching prospect did not disappoint in his first full season in Double-A. Beede tossed a complete game shutout in his penultimate outing of the year and finished off the season with six solid innings to lower his ERA to a league-leading 2.81. Beede became the third player in Squirrels history to lead the league in ERA, joining Chris Heston (2.24 in 2012) and Eric Surkamp (2.02 in 2011).

The Flying Squirrels were honored to assist in an emotional surprise homecoming for Air Force Tech Sergeant Rob Champine during the Saturday, April 16 contest against Altoona. Sergeant Champine, returning from deployment in Southwest Asia and the Middle East, was hiding inside of the Squirrels Pick-A-Box promotion, unbeknownst to his entire family. Sergeant Champine's eight-year-old son Justin was selected as the Pick-A-Box contestant and given the option to win a prize from three boxes varying in sizes. Justin initially selected the middle box, winning a Squirrels jersey. The Squirrels then unveiled the other two boxes to Justin and at that moment Sergeant Champine leapt out to embrace his son Justin, daughter Alexis and wife Merly (pictured below).







THE DIAMOND - STADIUM FACTS

The Diamond serves as the home venue for Flying Squirrels baseball as they represent the San Francisco Giants in the Eastern League of Professional Baseball Clubs. The facility was previously the home of the Richmond Braves (Triple-A - International League) from 1985-2008. Following the 2008 season, the Richmond Braves relocated to Gwinett, GA, becoming the Gwinnett Braves beginning in the 2009 season. Although Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU) continued to play their home games at The Diamond during the 2009 season, the ballpark was void of professional baseball for the first time since its construction. The ballpark was operated by the Richmond Metropolitan Authority (RMA). Upon their inception, the Flying Squirrels and the RMA signed a two-year lease agreement (2010-2011) with three club option years. Prior to the 2010 season, The Flying Squirrels committed more than two million dollars to renovate The Diamond. Included in those renovations was the replacement of aluminum-bleachers in the lower bowl of the ballpark with 3,164 state-of-the-art fold-down seats (pictured below). The top 11 rows of the upper bowl were also eliminated to create room for banner signage that allows the overall look of the park to become more cohesive and lowers capacity to a more intimate 9,560. The Flying Squirrels continued to enhance and refurbish their home park prior to the 2011 season, investing another \$250,000 into the park. Included in the upgrades were; converting the existing line-scoreboard to an LED display (Time Technologies), construction of a Speed of Pitch display in right-center field (Daktronics), converting existing clock in right field to an LED display, creation of party decks behind home plate and the "Cupid Section" down the right-field line, and the refurbishing of the "batter's eye" in center field. Although they continue to strive towards building a new facility, the Squirrels recognized the need to replace the playing surface at The Diamond to create a suitable competitive environment for Giants's and Eastern League prospects. To that aim, \$100,000 was invested in installing a new drainage system and infield surface prior to the 2013 season.



MEDICAL GLOSSARY

Abscess: an infection, which produces pus; can be result of blister, callus, penetrating wound or laceration.

Anterior Cruciate Ligament (ACL): a primary stabilizing ligament within the center of the knee joint that prevents hyperextension and excessive rotation of the joint: A complete tear of the ACL necessitating reconstruction could require up to 12 months of rehabilitation.

Anti-Inflammatory: any agent, which prevents inflammation, such as aspirin or ibuprofen.

Anteriogram: a film demonstrating arteries after injection of dve.

Arthrogram: x-ray technique for joints using air and/ or dye injected into the affected area; useful in diagnosing meniscus tears of the knee and rotator cuff.

Arthroscope: an instrument used to visualize the interior of a joint cavity.

Arthroscopy: a surgical examination of the internal structures of a joint by means of viewing through an Arthroscope. An arthroscope no an eused to remove or repair damaged tissue or as a diagnostic procedure in order to inspect the extent of any damage or confirm a diagnosis.

Atrophy: to shrivel or shrink from disuse, as in muscular atrophy.

Baker's Cyst: localized swelling of a bursa sac in the posterior knee as a result of fluid that has escaped from the knee capsule. A Baker's cyst indicates that there is trauma inside the knee joint that leads to excessive fluid production.

Bone Scan: an imaging procedure in which a radioactive-labeled substance is injected into the body to determine the status of a bone injury. If the bone at the injury sight takes up the radioactive substance, the injury will show a "hot spot" on the scan image. The bone scan is particularly useful in the diagnosis of stress fractures.

Bursa: a fluid-filled sac that is located in areas where friction is likely to occur, then minimizes the friction; for example between a tendon and a bone.

Capsule: an enclosing structure, which surrounds the joint and contains ligaments, which stabilize that joint.

CAT Scan: use of a computer to produce a cross sectional view of the anatomical part being investigated from x-ray data.

Cellulitis: inflammation of cellular of connective tissue

Cervical Vertebrae: group of seven vertebrae located in the neck.

Collateral Ligament: on either side of and acting as a radius of movement, a hinge joint, as of the elbow, knee and writt

Concussion: jarring injury of the brain resulting in dysfunction. It can be graded as mild, moderate or severe depending on loss of consciousness, amnesia and loss of equilibrium.

Contusion: an injury to a muscle and tissues caused by a blow from a blunt object

Degenerative Joint Disease: changes in the joint surfaces as a result of repetitive trauma.

Deltoid Ligament: ligament that connects the tibia to bones of the medical aspect of the foot and is primarily responsible for stability of the ankle on the medial side. Is sprained less frequently than other ankle ligaments.

Deltoid Muscle: muscles at the top of the arm, just below the shoulder, responsible for shoulder motions to the front, side and back.

Disc, Intervertebral: a flat, rounded plate between each of vertebrae of the spine. The disc consists of a

thick fiber ring, which surrounds a soft-gel like interior. It functions as a cushion and shock absorber for the spinal column.

Dislocation: complete displacement of joint surfaces

Eccymosis: bleeding into the surface tissue below the skin, resulting in a "black and blue" effect.

Effusion: accumulation of fluid in various spaces in the body. Commonly, the knee has an effusion after an injury.

Electromyogram (EMG): test to determine nerve function

Epicondylitis: inflammation in the elbow due to overuse

Fracture: breach in continuity of bone. Types of fractures include simple, compound, comminuted, greenstick, incomplete, impacted, longitudinal, oblique, stress or transverse.

Grade One Injury: a mild injury in which ligament, tendon, or other musculoskeletal tissue may have been stretched or confused, but not torn or otherwise disrupted.

Grade Two Injury: a moderate injury in which musculoskeletal tissue has been partially, but not totally torn which causes appreciable limitation in function of the injured tissue.

Grade Three Injury: a severe injury in which tissue has been significantly, and in some cases totatally, torn or otherwise disrupted causing a virtual total loss of function.

Hematoma: tumor-like mass produced by an accumulation of coagulated blood in a cavity.

Inflammation: the body's natural response to injury in which the injury site might display various degrees of pain, swelling, heat, redness and/or loss of function.

Labrum: an edge, rim or lip-shaped structure found in the shoulder joint.

Ligament: band of fibrous tissue that connects bone to bone or bone to cartilage and supports and strengthens

Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI); imaging procedure in which a radio frequency pulse causes certain electrical elements of the injured tissue to react to this pulse and through this process a computer display and permanent film establish a visual image. MRI does not require radiation and is very useful in the diagnosis of soft tissue, disc and menisticus injuries.

Meniscus: crescent shaped cartilage, usually pertaining to the knee joint; also known as "cartilage." There are two menisci in the knee, medial and lateral. These work to absorb weight within the knee and provide stability.

Metacarpals: five long bones of the hand running from the wrist to the fingers.

Metatarsals: five long bones of the foot, running from the ankle to the toes.

Patella Tendinitis: inflammation of the patellar ligament; also know as "jumpers knee."

Patellofemoral Joint: articulation of the kneecap and femur. Inflammation of this joint can occur through: acute injury to the patella, 2) overuse from excessive running particularly if there is an associated knee weakness, 3) fornoir wear and tear of the knee, 4) as a result of poor foot mechanics. Patellofemoral irritation can lead to hondromalancia, which in its most chronic condition, could require surgery.

Plica: fold of tissue in the joint capsule and a common result of knee injury.

Posterior Cruciate Ligament (PCL): a primary stabilizing ligament of the knee that provides significant

stability and prevents displacement of the tibia backward within the knee joint. A complete tear of this ligament necessitating reconstruction could require up to 12 months of rehabilitation.

Reconstruction: surgical rebuilding of a joint using natural, artificial or transplanted materials.

Rotator Cuff: comprised of four muscles in the shoulder area that can be irritated by overuse. The muscles are the supraspinatus (most commonly injured), infraspinatus, teres minor and subscapularis.

Rotator Cuff Impingment Syndrome: a microtrauma or overuse injury caused by stress, and the four stages are: 1) tendentious with temporary thickening of the bursa and rotator cuff. 2) fiber dissociation in the tendon with permanent thickening of the bursa and scar formation; 3) a partial rotator cuff tear of less than one cm and 4) a complete tear of one cm or more.

Scapula: shoulder blade.

Sciatica: irritation of the sciatic nerve resulting in pain or tingling running down the inside of the leg.

Sciatic Nerve: major nerve that carries impulses for muscular action and sensations between the low back and thigh and lower leg; it is the longest nerve in the body

Shin Splint: a catch-all syndrome describing pain in the shin that is not a fracture or tumor and cannot be defined otherwise.

Spondylolisthesis: forward displacement of one verterbrae over another below it due to a developmental defect in the vertebrae.

Sprain: injury resulting from a stretch or twist of the joint and causes various degrees of stretch or tear to the muscle or tendon tissue.

Strain: injury resulting from a pull or torsion to the muscle or tendon that causes various degrees of stretch or tear to the muscle or tendon tissue.

Stress Fracture: a hair-line type break in a bone caused by overuse.

Stress x-ray: a continual x-ray taken when a portion of the body is stressed to its maximum in order to determine joint stability. This is a test utilized in some ankle injuries.

Sublaxation: partial dislocation of a joint. The term usually implies that the joint can return to its normal position without formal reduction.

Tarsals: a group of seven bones of the foot consisting of the calcaneus, talus, cuboid and three cuneiform bones.

Tendinitis: inflammation of the tendon and/or tendon sheath, caused by chronic overuse or sudden injury.

Tendon: tissue that connects muscle to bone.

Tomograph: a special type of x-ray apparatus that demonstrates an organ or tissue at a particular depth.

Transverse Process: small lateral projection off the right and left side of each vertebra that functions as an attachment site for muscles and ligaments of the spine.

Triangular Cartilage: a connective tissue characterized by its nonvascularity and firm consistency; located on the little finger side of the wrist.

Ulnar Nerve: nerve in the elbow commonly irritated by excessive throwing.

Wrist: the junction between the two forearm bones (radius and ulna) and the eight wrist bones (trapezium, capitate, hamate, pisiform, trequetral, lunate and scaphoid).



SEASON CREDENTIALS: Season credentials for the 2015 season will only be issued to legitimate news gathering organizations that cover the Flying Squirrels on a daily basis. The Flying Squirrels will contact media outlets on an individual basis regarding season-long credentials. Other media organizations that would like to request a season credential can do so by sending that request on company letterhead via fax (804-359-1373) or as an email attachment to Jay Burnham at jay.burnham@squirrelsbaseball.com.

DAILY CREDENTIALS: Daily credentials will be issued to those individuals or organizations who do not qualify for season credentials, including freelance writers and weekly and monthly publications. Daily credentials will also be issued to radio and TV stations when the need arises for extra pre/post-game personnel and to newspaper reporters providing extra coverage. The Flying Squirrels Media Relations Department should be notified at least 24 hours in advance of the game in which daily credentials are being requested. Requests should be made via email to Jay Burnham at jay.burnham@ squirrelsbaseball.com. Once approved, credentials will be available for pickup at the media will call window.

CREDENTIAL PICKUP: The Flying Squirrels will notify those qualifying for season credentials on an individual basis prior to the season regarding pickup. Daily Credentials will only be available for pickup at the media will call window.

OTHER ACCEPTABLE CREDENTIALS: The Flying Squirrels will also honor credentials from the San Francisco Giants, National and American Leagues, the Baseball Writer's Association of America and Minor League Baseball.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: During games, photographers must work out of the photography wells adjacent to both dugouts. Special requests should be directed to Jay Burnham, Manager at least 24 hours in advance of game.

CLUBHOUSE POLICIES: In accordance with the regulations designated by the San Francisco Giants and Major League Baseball, both clubhouses will be open to credentialed media from 3 1/2 hours prior to game time until 45 minutes prior to game time. Following the game, clubhouses will be closed for a period of five minutes to allow the team ample time to return to the clubhouse. The clubhouse areas are also closed when the teams are on the field, unless previously approved by the Flying Squirrels Media Relations Department. There will be no clubhouse access during rain delays or between games of a doubleheader.

FIELD ACCESS: Credentialed media are permitted access to the field and dugout areas, but are not permitted to cross the foul lines under any circumstance. Media in violation of this policy are subject to credential revocation. Media must leave the field and dugout areas no later than 45 minutes prior to the game time.

PRESS BOX SPACE: The Flying Squirrels give preferred press box seating to those organizations that cover the team the most frequently. If your media organization needs special space requirements, please contact the Flying Squirrels Media Relations Department at least 24 hours prior to those dates.

PARKING: Media members holding season credentials are permitted to park their vehicles in the media parking area at The Diamond. Your credential will also serve as your parking pass to gain admittance to lot. Media is not permitted to park in ballpark tunnel (under The Diamond) at anytime.

INTERVIEW POLICY: The Flying Squirrels Media Relations Department will be glad to assist members of the media in procuring interviews with Flying Squirrels players and coaching staff members. Media members wishing to do an off-site interview or feature story should contact the Flying Squirrels no later than 48 hours prior to the scheduled interview time. Interview requests do not guarantee interview availability, as the Flying Squirrels respect the players and coaches wishes in all matters. No one will be permitted to interview starting pitchers prior to a game on the day of their start. No exceptions.
