South Bend Cubs (1-0, 35-35) at Dayton Dragons (0-1, 31-38)

RH Jesus Camargo (2-2, 2.50) vs. RH Hunter Greene (1-5, 5.53)

Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) meet the South Bend Cubs (affiliate of the Chicago Cubs) in the second game of a four-game series. This is game two of the 2018 Second Half season.

Season Series to Date: Dayton 5, South Bend 2 (at Dayton: Dragons 3, Cubs 1). **Current Series to Date:** South Bend 1, Dayton 0.

Low Scoring Matchups: In all seven games played between Dayton and South Bend this season, the teams combined to score five runs or less. In six of the seven games, the winning team scored three runs or less (winner scored four in the exception). Five of the seven games have been decided by one run.

Last Game: Thursday: South Bend 3, Dayton 2. Three Cubs pitchers combined to allow just five hits. The Cubs built a 3-0 lead by the middle of the fifth inning before the Dragons started back with single runs in the bottom of the fifth and bottom of the seventh to make it 3-2. The Dragons did not have a hit after the seventh. Malik Collymore led Dayton with a solo home run and an RBI double.

2018 Team Notes

- The Dragons finished the First Half with a record of 31-37, in sixth place in the East Division.
- The Dragons have lost five straight games and 12 of their last 14. Over the 14 games, the team batting average is .212 (98-462) while the club has averaged 3.0 runs per game. The team ERA is 5.39 (120.1 IP, 72 ER).
- The Dragons have scored four runs or less in 12 consecutive games (last scored more than four in a game on June 6).
- The Dragons have committed just three errors in their last 12 games.
- The Dragons threatened to tie the franchise record for most home wins in a half (25) in the First Half, but came up short. They entered their final series, a four-game series with Bowling Green, with 22 home wins in the first half, but they were swept in the series.
- Meanwhile, the Dragons broke the club record for fewest road wins in a half. The club record was 10 road wins, and the Dragons finished with nine. The Dragons played three fewer road games in the first half than the scheduled number of 35 due to three postponements at Great Lakes in April.
- The Dragons are 22-15 at home; 9-23 on the road. Their team ERA at home is 4.40 compared to 6.33 on the road. They are scoring more runs per game on the road (4.5) than at home (4.2). They have allowed 29 unearned runs on the road compared to 12 at home.
- The Dragons team ERA in their 31 wins is 3.21 (278 IP, 99 ER). The ERA in the 38 losses is 7.07 (319.1 IP, 251 ER).
- The Dragons are 17-15 in one-run games, with 32 of their 69 games decided by one run. They are 23-1 when leading after eight innings (the only loss came June 5 at Lake County).
- The Dragons have come back to win four games in which they trailed by at least three runs including two in which they trailed by six runs. However they have also lost six games in which they led by at least three runs.

- **Cory Thompson** has posted a 1.83 ERA in 25 relief appearances.

The Dragons MVP Program

The Dragons expanded elementary school MVP Program reaches five counties and more than 1,100 classrooms. Schools in Montgomery, Greene, Clark, Miami and Warren counties are part of the program that includes 1,116 fourth and fifth grade classrooms in 183 schools over 48 school districts. About 34,000 children will participate. The program is in its 13th year in 2018.
