Dayton Dragons (12-14, 43-51) at Wisconsin Timber Rattlers (11-14, 42-52)

RH Patrick McGuff (1-0, 0.00) vs. RH Christian Taugner (6-6, 3.52)

Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) meet the Wisconsin Timber Rattlers (affiliate of the Milwaukee Brewers) in the second game of a three-game series. This is game eight of 12 straight games vs. West Division opponents.

Season Series/Current Series to Date: Wisconsin 1, Dayton 0.

Dragons in Inter-Divisional Play: The Dragons are 11-8 vs. the West Division (6-6 at home; 5-2 on the road). They are 3-4 vs. the West in the Second Half.

Recent Performances: The Dragons have lost two straight after winning the previous three. They are 12-10 since opening the second half by losing their first four games. Wisconsin has won four of their last five games. They are 4-3 vs. the East Division in the second half.

Last Game: Wednesday: Wisconsin 6, Dayton 4. The Timber Rattlers build an early 5-1 lead over the first three innings and held off a late Dayton comeback bid. The Dragons trailed 6-1 going to the eighth inning but scored three in the eighth and had the tying run at the plate with no one out, but they could not get the big hit. Hendrik Clementina led the eight-hit Dayton attack, going 2 for 4 with a home run.

Playoff Chase: The Dragons must finish in the top two among eligible teams in the East Division in the Second Half (six teams competing; Bowling Green and Lansing ineligible). The Dragons are currently tied for the #3 position in the playoff chase, one game out of the wildcard slot. Five of the six competing teams are within one game in the second half standings.

2018 Team Notes

- The Dragons 3.57 ERA in the month of July is considerably better than the MWL average for the full season (3.89), but in an indication that July has been a good month for pitchers throughout the league, the Dragons July ERA ranks tied for ninth among the 16 MWL teams. The Dragons were second in July ERA prior to allowing 12 earned runs on Monday night.
- The Dragons have allowed three runs or less in 14 of their 26 second half games. Their second half ERA is 3.87 (5.31 in the first half).
- The Dragons are batting just .236 in July, tied for 12th in the league. They are tied for last (with Lansing) in home runs in July with five.
- The Dragons have committed just 25 errors in their last 37 games (including six in one game on July 12).
- The Dragons team ERA in their 43 wins is 2.78 (388 IP, 120 ER). The ERA in the 51 losses is 6.82 (431.2 IP, 327 ER).
- The Dragons finished the First Half with a record of 31-37, in sixth place in the East Division.
- The Dragons threatened to tie the franchise record for most home wins in a half (25) in the First Half, but came up short. They entered their final series, a four-game series with Bowling Green, with 22 home wins in the first half, but they were swept in the series.
- Meanwhile, the Dragons broke the club record for fewest road wins in a half. The club record was 10 road wins, and the Dragons finished with nine. The Dragons played three fewer road games in the first half than the scheduled number of 35 due to three postponements at Great Lakes in April.

- **Packy Naughton** over his last four starts: 27 IP, 17 H, 2 R, 3 BB, 20 SO, 0.67 ERA.
- **Hunter Greene** over his last nine starts: 46.1 IP, 35 H, 15 R, 14 ER, 10 BB, 54 SO, 2.72 ERA. Greene has made 16 starts. His ERA in his first seven starts was 10.06. Greene was selected as the Cincinnati Reds Minor League Co-Pitcher of the Month for June.
- **Lorenzo Cedrola**, acquired July 4th in a trade with Boston, is batting .400 over his last nine games, going 14 for 35.
- **Andy Sugilio** has hit safely in six straight games, going 11 for 27, .407. He is batting .290 in July to rank second on the team behind Cedrola's .326.

- Four current members of the Dragons are rated among the Reds top 30 prospects (*Baseball America*). They are RHP **Hunter Greene** (#2); INF **Jeter Downs** (#11); INF **Jose Garcia** (#12); and LHP **Packy Naughton** (#28).
- RHP **Hunter Greene** is one of 16 first round draft picks to play for the Dragons. He was the second overall pick in the 2017 draft out of Notre Dame High School in Sherman Oaks, California.
- Dragons catcher **Mark Kolozsvary** was a member of the 2017 NCAA national championship team at the University of Florida.

The Dragons MVP Program

The Dragons expanded elementary school MVP Program reaches five counties and more than 1,100 classrooms. Schools in Montgomery, Greene, Clark, Miami and Warren counties are part of the program that includes 1,116 fourth and fifth grade classrooms in 183 schools over 48 school districts. About 34,000 children will participate. The program is in its 13th year in 2018. The Dragons MVP Program presented by Bob Evans Farms is also made possible by the generous support of CollegeAdvantage, Sinclair College, WDTN-TV and Dayton's CW. Due to the support of the participating sponsors, the program is completely free of charge to the schools.

How does the Dragons School MVP Program work? The teacher in each of the classrooms over a five-county area (Clark, Greene, Miami, Montgomery, and Warren) selects five MVP's based on the teacher's judgment of performance, effort, citizenship, and improvement. The five MVPs selected by their teacher in each classroom receive four tickets to a Dragons game, tickets to a special Field Day event at the stadium during the season, an MVP certificate and a Dragons MVP hat. Dragons players and mascots visit selected classrooms over the course of the season. Additionally, 16 Dragons games during the season are designated as "MVP Game Nights." On those nights, one MVP gets to throw out the ceremonial first pitch to the game, another does an on-air interview during the Dragons game broadcast on Fox Sports 980, and another participates in an entertainment skit during the Dragons game.
