Yesterday's Game

The Blue Jays fell in extras to the Hammerheads for the second straight night, falling 6-5 in ten innings. RIHP Aaron Sanchez made a rehab start for Dunedin, going 3.2 IP and giving up 1 run on 2 hits while striking out 3 and walking 4. He was followed on the mound by recently acquired Bryan Baker, who tossed 1.1 shutout in relief, allowing 2 hits and striking out 1. Dunedin scored four times in the second on five consecutive singles and held a 4-1 lead until the seventh inning. In the seventh, Jupiter tied the game with three runs off LHP Angel Perdomo (just one earned). Both teams scored once in the ninth. In the top of the tenth, a wild pitch and sac fly brought home the go-ahead run for Jupiter. In the home half, a perfect throw from right fielder Cameron Baranek gunned out Brock Lundquist trying to score from third on a sacrifice fly attempt, ending the game and handing Dunedin their ninth loss in ten gams.

Blue Jays Acquire Bryan Baker

- The Blue Jays announced Wednesday that RHP Bryan Baker will be the final piece of the Seunhwan Oh deal between Toronto and Colorado. Baker holds a 3.80 ERA in 43 relief outings with A+ Lancaster this season with an impressive 58 Ks in 45.0 IP but a high 6.8 BB/9 ratio.
- The Blue Jays also acquired 1B Chad Spanberger and 2B/OF Forrest Wall in the swap.

August All-Star

- CF Josh Palacios has hits in 15 of his last 16 games, hitting .377 (26-69) with 19 RBI and 14 runs over that stretch (July 29-present).
- Palacios also holds a .377 batting average so far in the month of August. He's reached base at a .457 clip and slugged .623 this month.

Late Season Slump

The Blue Jays have fallen from first place to third in the North due to a 1-9 slump over the last two weeks. In their last 10 games, the pitching staff holds a 5.71 ERA, allowing 5.6 runs per game. Six of Dunedin's nine losses have been by one run.

Home Sweet Home

IF Ivan Castillo hit safely in 14 straight games at Dunedin Stadium between July 11 and August 14. Castillo hit .404 reached base at a .483 clip over the streak. Castillo's streak is the fourth longest home hitting in the FSL this season.

Hit Kin

OF Josh Palacios leads the Florida State League with 128 hits this season. Palacios needs 19 more hits this season to move into the Top 10 for hits in a single-season in Dunedin history.

Adams Joins Top 30

- With LHP Ryan Borucki graduating from the MLB Pipeline Top 30 Blue Jays prospects list, Dunedin C Riley Adams joins the list at #30.
- Adams joins current Dunedin Blue Jays Logan Warmoth (17), Kevin Smith (6), and Nate Pearson (4) on the list

Tough Stretch On Mound

The Blue Jays posted a strong 3.44 team ERA in the month of July, led by a stellar 2.96 mark by starting pitchers. In August, Jays pitchers hold a 4,96 ERA. Starters have struggled to the tune of a 5.90 ERA while the bullpen has put up a 3.94 ERA. Relievers have three blown saves and six losses in the month.

Murphy's Quality Streak

- Since June 1, RHP Patrick Murphy is 7-0 with a 1.88 ERA and leads the FSL with 81 Ks in 81.1 IP.
- Murphy leads the Florida State League with 120 strikeouts this season. The last Dunedin pitcher to lead the league in K's was Taylor Cole in 2014 (171).
- Murphy needs 12 strikeouts to move into the Top 10 in Dunedin history for strikeouts in a season.

Walk This Way

Blue Jays batters have drawn 404 walks this season, most in the Florida State League. Dunedin pitchers have walked just 333 batters, second fewest in the league.

Caught Red-Handed

Dunedin catchers have caught 42% of attempted base stealers in 2018, the best percentage in the league. Riley Adams leads all qualified catchers with a 47% CS rate (the league average is 33%).

Smith Joins 20/20 Club

- With a three-run shot on August 1st, Kevin Smith became just the third player in the minors to have joined the 20/20 club in 2018 (Casey Golden, Rockies, Corey Ray, Brewers). Smith became the first Blue Jays prospect since Chad Mottola in 2000 to hit 20 home runs and steal 20 bases in a season and just the seventh Toronto prospect to do so in the last 30 seasons.

 with 28 steals this season, Smith could soon become just the third Toronto prospect in three decades to have a 20-30 season (Chad Mottola, 2000, 33-30, Rick Holifield, 1993, 20-30).

Second Half Streaks

So far in the second half, the Blue Jays have gone on four winning streaks of 4+ games and three losing streaks of 4+ games.

Keeping It Close

The Blue Jays have played in 50 one-run games this season, the most in the FSL. Over half of Dunedin's games this season (69 of 122) have been decided by two runs or less.


