## NEW ORLEANS BABY CAKES (5-9) vs. COLORADO SPRINGS SKY SOX (9-4)

**THE BABY CAKES** – The New Orleans Baby Cakes continue a seven-game homestand tonight with the third of four games vs. the Colorado Springs Sky Sox. The 'Cakes dropped all three meetings at Security Service Field last week and have lost seven of the last nine against the Sky Sox dating back to last season. New Orleans saw its longest home winning streak in nearly five years - five games - snapped last night.

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS** – Colorado Springs scored four times in the sixth inning and four more times in the seventh to rally past the Baby Cakes, 8-5. Three New Orleans errors contributed to the rallies, permitting four unearned runs to score and turn a 2-0 lead into an 8-2 deficit. Johnny Givotella misplayed a grounder by Brett Phillips leading off the sixth, and Andres Blanco delivered a game-tying two-run single two batters later. Blanco scored on a fielding error by Scott Van Slyke, and Nate Orf followed with an RBI single. A dropped fly ball by Isaac Galloway in the seventh opened the door for another big inning, capped by Blanco's two-run homer off Nick Wittgren. The 'Cakes came back to bring the tying run to the plate in the bottom of the ninth on a two-run double by Van Slyke, who had homered an inning earlier. But Radhames Liz came out of the bullpen to strike out Galloway for the final out and earn the save. James Buckelew took the loss by yielding three hits and four runs, only one of which was earned, after starter Ben Meyer spun 5.0 shutout frames.

**ON THE HILL** – Joe Gunkel gets the call for his third start and fourth appearance of the season. He limited Oklahoma City to two hits in 5.0 scoreless innings on Sunday and has yielded just one run - a solo homer to Nashville's Slade Heathcott - and four hits in 8.0 innings across his two starting assignments. Gunkel has yet to walk a batter, and his 0.73 WHIP ranks second in the PCL among pitchers with at least 10.0 innings pitched, behind Fresno's Kent Emmanuel (0.64). Tonight marks his first career appearance against Colorado Springs.

**JOHNNY G** – Johnny Givotella went 1x4 last night and is 2x7 with a walk and an RBI double in his first two games with the Baby Cakes, playing on the same field where he helped Jesuit High School win the 2005 Louisiana state championship. Givotella went on to earn All-American honors in his three seasons at the University of New Orleans before being drafted by the Kansas City Royals in the second round in 2008. In 25 pro games at the Shrine, Givotella is batting .351 (33x94) with eight doubles, three home runs and 17 RBI.

**TEARS IN SEVEN** – The Baby Cakes have surrendered at least seven runs in eight of their nine defeats. It was not until the team's 28th game last season (May 5 vs. Iowa) that the 'Cakes allowed seven or more runs for the eighth time.

**31 ALWAYS** – The Baby Cakes announced last Thursday they would be retiring jersey 31 in honor of Wally Pontiff, Jr., who wore the number as an All-American third baseman at LSU prior to his passing in 2002. The Pontiff Classic featuring LSU has been played at the Shrine on Airline in Pontiff's native Metairie annually since 2004 and has raised more than \$1.5 million for charitable organizations. The ceremony, marking the first number to be retired in franchise history, will take place July 27 when the Baby Cakes host Tacoma.

**HIT ME UP** – The Baby Cakes piled up a season-high 13 hits last night, with at least one from all nine players in the starting lineup, including the first career hit for pitcher Ben Meyer. Jonathan Rodriguez chipped in a pinch single in the ninth; only Rafael Ortega, who struck out as a pinch hitter in the sixth, failed to collect a hit.

**SLYKE FATHER, SLYKE SON** – Scott Van Slyke turned in his team-high fifth multi-hit effort with a double and a homer, and became the second Baby Cake to finish with three RBI in a game, joining Cito Culver (April 12 at Colorado Springs). Van Slyke's .480 on-base percentage ranks sixth in the PCL.

**RISPY BUSINESS** – The Baby Cakes are hitting .214 (30x114) through the first 14 games, leading only Omaha (.178) among PCL clubs. NOLA ranked last in the league in each of the last two seasons, batting .250 with RISP in 2017, and .257 in 2016. New Orleans has left at least nine men on base in each of the last five losses.

**SIR ISAAC** – Isaac Galloway's stolen base on Monday was the 54th of his New Orleans career, moving past Kyle Logan into sole possession of second place on the franchise's all-time list. Only Colin Porter (61) has more steals in a New Orleans uniform. Galloway has hit safely in six of his last seven contests, going 9x23 (.391) with one triple, one home run and four RBI.

### ON THIS DATE ...

**2008:** Fernando Tatis blasts two home runs, giving him eight in the team's first 17 games, to lead New Orleans past Omaha 6-2. Tony Armas holds the Royals to an unearned run and four hits over 5.2 innings to pick up the win.

**BEN IS MIGHTIER** – Ben Meyer has yielded one or no runs in 10 of his 15 starting assignments over the last two seasons between New Orleans and High-A Jupiter. When pitching in his home ballpark, Meyer owns a 1.33 ERA (7 ER/47.1 IP) and has held opponents to a .146 batting average (23x158) while striking out 55 batters.

**ERRONEOUS** – New Orleans committed three errors in a game for the first time since last July 28 at Fresno. The Baby Cakes had just one miscue in the previous 43.1 innings until two errors in last night's sixth inning. NOLA fell to 1-7 when committing an error.

**PLAYOFF PELS** – The Baby Cakes are wearing their Pelicans throwback uniforms tonight and on Saturday while the New Orleans Pelicans host NBA playoff games. The uniforms are modeled after those worn by the city's Southern Association franchise in 1955 when they served as a Double-A affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates.

**ROSTER MOVES** – New Orleans has added catcher Chad Wallach, who was optioned on Tuesday when Miami activated J.T. Realmuto. Wallach was 4x31 (.129) with two RBI and 17 strikeouts in nine games. In a corresponding move, Sharif Othman was transferred to AA Jacksonville after hitting .185 (5x27) with three RBI in eight games with the Baby Cakes.

**NAWLINS NOTES** – NOLA is in the midst of playing 24 straight games against Nashville, Colorado Springs and Oklahoma City to open the year ... Sean Burnett struck out the side in the eighth inning in his team debut, the third time a 'Cakes pitcher has fanned the side this season and second reliever to do so (Jumbo Diaz, April 12 at Colorado Springs) ... Exactly half of the outs in last night's game came via strikeout, with 'Cakes pitchers whiffing 13 but Baby Cakes hitters fanning 14 times, both season highs.

### 2018 SEASON

**SPRING TRAINING** – Appeared in one big league spring game with the Marlins, earning the save with one strikeout in an inning of work.

**IN THE PEN** – Gunkel made his season debut on Opening Night, tossing 3.0 innings of relief. Gunkel inherited the bases loaded with no outs in the fourth inning on 4/5 vs. Nashville and allowed all three runs to score, in addition to a run charged to him. In all, he surrendered four hits and struck out two.

**START ME UP** – Across his first two starts, 4/9 vs. Nashville and 4/14 at Oklahoma City, Gunkel gave up just one run (a solo homer) and four hits in 8.0 innings without issuing a walk. He fired 5.0 shutout frames against the Dodgers and exited with a 2-0 lead before the bullpen allowed three runs late.

### 2017 IN REVIEW

**NEW FISH** – Gunkel opened 2017 in the Dodgers system at AAA Oklahoma City, where he appeared in three games, including one start on 4/20 vs. Nashville. He allowed four earned runs on 12 hits and did not walk a batter with six strikeouts in 9.0 innings and picked up one save. Gunkel was claimed off waivers by the Marlins on 4/27 and assigned to AA Jacksonville, where he spent the rest of the year.

**JUMBO SHRIMP** – With Jacksonville, Gunkel finished 6-10 with a 4.92 ERA in 24 games (21 starts). His 10 losses were the most on the club, but his six victories were tied with Dillon Peters for second behind Matt Tomshaw (13). Seven of his 21 starting assignments were quality starts.

**THE LONG BALL** – Gunkel served up 17 home runs, third-most in the Southern League. Twice he allowed three home runs in a game: 7/3 vs. Mobile and 8/14 vs. Mississippi.

**WINNER WINNER** – After going winless through his first six starts with Jacksonville, Gunkel broke into the win column after surrendering just one unearned run and five hits in 7.0 innings on 6/10 vs. Biloxi. It sparked a four-start stretch where he won twice and posted a 2.52 ERA (7 ER/25.0 IP).

**PITCHER OF THE WEEK** – Gunkel did not permit an earned run in 13.0 innings over a pair of starts, 7/21 vs. Tennessee and 7/28 at Mississippi, yielding five hits without a walk. For his efforts, he was honored as Southern League Pitcher of the Week.

**NO FREE PASSES** – In eight of his last nine starts, Gunkel did not issue an unintentional walk, totaling just two free passes in that span. His 20 unintentional walks in 115.1 innings (1.56 per 9.0 IP) led all Southern League starters.

**CLOSING STRONG** – In his final two starts, on 8/30 at Biloxi and 9/3 at Pensacola, Gunkel worked a combined 12.1 innings (2.19 ERA) and surrendered three runs with eight strikeouts and one intentional walk.
