NEW ORLEANS BABY CAKES (11-14) vs. ROUND ROCK EXPRESS (9-17)

THE BABY CAKES – The New Orleans Baby Cakes continue a four-game homestand today with the third meeting against the Round Rock Express. The 'Cakes are looking to win the first three games of a series for the first time since August 11-13 last season at Colorado Springs.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS – Jon Rodriguez ripped a two-run single up the middle in the bottom of the ninth inning, rallying the 'Cakes to a 4-3 win over Round Rock for their second walk-off win in a row. In a reversal of Monday's script, the Baby Cakes squandered a late 2-0 lead. Rodriguez had put New Orleans on the board in the fifth with an RBI double, then scored on a single by Austin Dean. The 'Cakes nursed the lead all the way until the eighth thanks to a dominating Triple-A debut by Trevor Richards, who blanked the Express on three hits through seven innings until Round Rock rallied behind four hits in the eighth, including a game-tying two-out RBI single by Willie Calhoun off Severino Gonzalez. Cameron Rupp tagged Gonzalez for a leadoff homer in the ninth to put the Express in front, but the 'Cakes answered in the bottom half on back-to-back singles by Chad Wallach and Eric Campbell and a sacrifice bunt by Rafael Ortega, setting the stage for Rodriguez, who finished 3x4 with three RBI.

ON THE HILL – Adam Conley will make his team-leading sixth start of the season, coming off his first victory. He fired 6.0 shutout innings on Friday in Nashville, limiting the Sounds to three hits in charting his first quality start in his last 10 outings. Conley had posted a 19.64 ERA through his first three starts, during which opponents batted .488 (20x41), but has surrendered two runs in 11.0 innings over his last two turns with a .200 (8x40) batting average against. The southpaw has been masterful vs. Round Rock in his career, owning a 2.59 ERA (7 ER/24.1 IP) in five career starts, including 6.0 innings of one-run ball last June 1.

FOR STARTERS – Baby Cakes starting pitchers have given up only 20 earned runs in 75.1 innings (2.39 ERA) over the last 13 games and opponents are hitting .200 (58x280). In the last eight home games, the opposition is hitting .180 (31x172), as Colorado Springs hit .173 (13x75) with one extra-base hit in four games against 'Cakes starters on the last homestand, and Oklahoma City was 9x46 (.196) before Round Rock went 9x51 (.176) the last two nights.

WALK IT OFF – New Orleans notched consecutive walk-off victories for the first time since June 2-3, 2009 vs. Albuquerque. The 'Cakes had previously suffered five walk-off defeats on the road. Each of NOLA's last three wins over Round Rock have been in walk-off fashion, as Eury Perez stroked a game-winning RBI single to beat the Express last August 17, and New Orleans has at least one walk-off win over Round Rock in each of the last five seasons.

BATTLE OF THE BAMBINOS – The Baby Cakes and Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, aka the Baby Bombers, are engaged in an online contest to determine which team has the better baby mascot. Fans are asked to visit www.battleofthebambinos.com and vote on Twitter through July 30. The team that loses the hashtag voting competition will donate \$2,500 to the winning team's charity. The Baby Cakes have chosen the Junior League of New Orleans, and will be hosting five diaper drives at upcoming games to promote awareness.

DAZZLING DEBUT – Trevor Richards went 7.1 innings last night, the longest outing by a New Orleans starting pitcher since Scott Copeland worked 7.2 innings last August 17 vs. Round Rock. Richards also racked up nine strikeouts in his Triple-A debut, a season high for a Baby Cakes pitcher, giving him 19 punchouts in 12.0 innings over his last two outings between Miami and New Orleans.

DEAN OF HITS – Austin Dean has gone 3x9 with three walks and two RBI in his first three Triple-A games. Dean was hitting .420 (34x81) in 22 games with AA Jacksonville, the fourth-best average in all of Minor League Baseball, and has moved into a tie with Albuquerque's Daniel Castro for the minor league lead with 37 hits overall.

HOT SOUP – Eric Campbell singled as part of last night's ninth-inning rally and has hit safely in five of his last six games. Over his last 11 contests, Campbell is hitting .303 (10x33) with two doubles, a home run and 10 RBI, picking up at least one RBI in seven of those games. He is 8x23 (.348) in eight games at home, compared with 6x36 (.167) in 10 games on the road.

RISPY BUSINESS – New Orleans went 2x7 with runners in scoring position last night and is a hitting PCL-worst .231 (51x221) with RISP on the year. NOLA ranked last in the league in each of the last two years, batting .250 with RISP in 2017, and .257 in 2016.

ON THIS DATE ...

1998: Mitch Meluskey homers, doubles and drives in four, and Russ Johnson goes 3-for-5 with four runs scored as New Orleans routs Tucson 11-2. Daryle Ward chips in three hits, two RBI and two runs scored.

BULLIED – Over the last 20 games, the New Orleans relief corps owns a 5.07 ERA (43 ER/76.1 IP). Last night was the sixth blown save suffered by the bullpen, tied with three other clubs for the most in the PCL.

SEIZE THE DAY – Dating back to last season, NOLA has won 12 of the last 18 day games, including three of five this year. New Orleans is averaging 4.4 runs per game under the sun, compared with 3.3 runs per game at night.

JUMBO-LAYA – Jumbo Diaz has converted each of his four save chances, putting him in a seven-way tie for third place in the PCL, while the rest of the 'Cakes bullpen has gone 3x9. Diaz has surrendered one hit in 14 at-bats (.071) with runners in scoring position.

HOME SWEET HOME – The 'Cakes own the fourth-best home record in the league at 9-4, trailing Oklahoma City (12-0), Fresno (9-3) and Colorado Springs (10-4). This is their best home start since opening 10-4 in 2012.

ROSTER MOVES – The Marlins activated JT Riddle from the disabled list (shoulder surgery), ending his rehab assignment with the Baby Cakes have and optioned him to New Orleans, and Johnny Giavotella has been released. Left-hander Sean Burnett was activated from the disabled list (viral infection) and right-hander Colton Murray was transferred to extended spring training.

NAWLINS NOTES – Jon Rodriguez is the only Baby Cake with multiple three-hit games this season (April 12 at Colorado Springs) ... NOLA has played nine one-run games (4-5), tied with Colorado Springs for second-most in the PCL behind Omaha (12) ... New Orleans has lost all three games played on Wednesdays ... Chad Wallach stretched his hitting streak to five games, one shy of his best at Triple-A set last year from August 4-13

2018 SEASON

OPENING DAY – Conley was given the nod on Opening Day vs. Nashville and yielded seven runs on seven hits in 3.0 innings. His only previous Opening Day start came in his first full pro season in 2012 with Low-A Greensboro, when he fired 5.0 scoreless innings and fanned seven in a win over Lexington.

ROCKY START – Conley worked a combined 7.1 innings over his first three starts and allowed 16 runs on 20 hits (19.64 ERA). His 1.2 IP against Colorado Springs on 4/10 marked the third time in his last four starts, dating to September 2017 with Miami, that Conley did make it out of the second inning.

BACK ON TRACK – With 6.0 shutout innings of three-hit ball on 4/27 at Nashville, Conley recorded his first quality start in his last 10 assignments. He limited the Sounds to one hit in seven at-bats with runners in scoring position and retired 10 of the last 11 batters he faced.

2017 IN REVIEW

APRIL SHOWERS – After a season-opening win against the Mets on 4/8, Conley surrendered 21 runs (18 earned) in 10.2 innings across his final three starts with Miami as his ERA ballooned from 3.00 to 7.53. He was optioned to New Orleans following his 5/8 defeat vs. St. Louis.

IN NOLA – In his first Triple-A start since July 28, 2015, Conley took the loss on 5/15 vs. Salt Lake after yielding three runs on three hits in 4.1 innings with four walks and four strikeouts. He was locked in a 1-1 game until the fifth when the Bees scored five times, with two of the runs being charged to Conley.

NO FLY ZONE – Dating back to his 2015 season with New Orleans, Conley had gone 17 consecutive Triple-A starts without allowing a home run until Round Rock's Will Middlebrooks went deep on 6/1. It snapped a streak of 96.0 innings without a homer, since Memphis' Ed Easley on May 9, 2015.

WIN COLUMN – Conley picked up his first win in five starts with the Baby Cakes on 6/6 vs. Memphis, holding the Redbirds to two runs and three hits over 7.0 innings. He did not surrender a hit after back-to-back doubles in the third inning, remaining undefeated in seven games in the month of June with NOLA dating back to 2015, posting a 2.06 ERA (9 ER/39.1 IP) and .167 average against (23x137).

HEATING UP – Conley opened July with back-to-back victories in quality starts on 7/2 at Memphis and 7/7 vs. Oklahoma City. He surrendered a combined three runs on nine hits with 13 strikeouts in 13.0 innings, including a season-high eight punchouts of the Dodgers.

BACK IN THE BIGS – Upon being recalled on 7/18, Conley went 2-0 with a 1.74 ERA (4 ER/20.2 IP) in his first three starts. He set a new career high with 11 strikeouts in defeating the Mets on 8/20 after going without a punchout in 6.1 innings vs. San Francisco on 8/14, becoming the first pitcher since the Cardinals' Joe Magrane in 1990 to fan more than 10 immediately following a game in which he went at least 6.0 strikeout-free innings.
