Shorebirds Make History with Blazing Start

By the time the dust had settled on the Delmarva Shorebirds' first homestand of 2018, the team was off to the races on its best start ever. Here's a look inside the historic. run that made the Shorebirds Minor League Baseball's only 7-0 team.

At 7-0, the Shorebirds secured their longest undefeated streak to begin a season in franchise history. According to longtime historian Dr. Richard "Doc Shorebird" Passwater, the previous long came in their inaugural season in 1996; that team started 6-0 and eventually 13-1. The '96 Delmarva club featured 10 future major leaguers, including longtime veterans Orlando Cabrera, Javier Vazquez, and Michael Barrett. Those first Shorebirds won 83 games, still



a franchise record, and made it to the SAL Championship Series.

Delmarva's perfect homestand was its first in over a decade. The last time the Shorebirds pulled off a perfect home stretch of at least two series was May 19-24, 2006 - that week the Gary Kendall-led squad swept four games from Lake County and beat Hagerstown in two straight. Only three times since then had the Shorebirds come within a game of a perfect homestand, only to lose it in the finale; most recently was June 2014 when Hagerstown spoiled an eight-gamer at the wire.

Perhaps most remarkable about the winning streak was how completely locked in the Shorebirds were in every facet of the game. The pitching was out of this world: Delmarva starters boasted a combined ERA of 1.69, the relievers converted five save opportunities, and the team recorded the first two shutouts of the SAL season.

"Our pitching staff has been absolutely dominant," said lefty Zac Lowther after the best start of the bunch: a six-inning, no-hit, 13-strikeout shellacking of Hickory to anchor a one-hit shutout. "I think we

all feed off one another and compete with each other to try and do better than the last guy. I think we've got a really good dynamic."

Meanwhile, the Shorebird offense hit .308 during the week and put up run totals of 18 and 14 in back-to-back games; either one would have topped last season's high watermark. Kirvin Moesquit capped the hit parade with an inside-the-park in the series finale.

"I think that sometimes hitting is contagious," said outfielder Will Robertson after the sweep of Asheville, "and I think that was the case for us this weekend. Everyone was getting hits from top to bottom, and I think it's easy to feed off that energy and build off that."

Between the sizzling arms and wallbanging bats, it should be no surprise the Shorebirds only trailed after two of their first 63 innings.

What's more, a run like this can make an entire season for any ball club. Recall that in 1984 the Detroit Tigers started 35-5; they coasted the rest of the season on the way

to a World Series title. At the time of this writing, the Shorebirds were 8-2 through their first 10 games. If they played at the '84 Tigers' pace for the rest of the first half, they would be 44-26 and almost certainly win the Northern Division, punching a ticket to their first playoff appearance since 2005.

"The minor leagues are about development, but they're about teaching guys how to win, too," said manager Buck Britton to Orioles radio voice Jim Hunter during a recent pregame show. "It's important to show players what it takes to win at an early age so that they internalize it as they move up."

Perhaps most important, winning on the field accentuates what was already a winning clubhouse.

"Even before we started winning we really seemed to get along," said Robertson. "The team chemistry is great, so I think that showed on the field and it gets to be cyclical. It goes back in the clubhouse after a good game and we really enjoy ourselves."

Delmarva the Genesis of Davies' Success

Last August, Zach Davies became the latest former Shorebird to receive his "Walk of Fame" banner at Arthur W. Perdue Stadium. He joined the ranks of such stars as Manny Machado, Zach Britton, and Mychal Givens, hanging from the rafters in the midst of successful careers that first germinated on the Eastern Shore.

Davies first arrived in Salisbury in 2012 as a freshfaced 19-year-old. A 26th-round pick for the Orioles out of high school in Arizona the year before, he made his professional debut for Delmarva out of the bullpen at Asheville on April 7. Davies spent his first month as a reliever, sporting a 3.16 ERA over eight appearances before being shifted to the rotation May 17.

After a rough first start at Hagerstown, Davies started to figure it out at home with back-to-back one-

run outings against Greensboro and Hickory. The gem of his summer came on July 10 against Savannah: he pitched seven scoreless innings, scattering six hits and walking one while fanning six, but was done in by future Oriole Logan Verrett, who tossed a six-hit shutout to lead the Sand Gnats to a 2-0 win.

Davies capped his first pro season with a 5-7 record and 3.86 ERA for the Shorebirds, earning a promotion to High-A Frederick the next season. After posting similar numbers for the Keys in 2013, he climbed the ladder to Double-A Bowie in 2014. It was with the Baysox that Davies

truly blossomed: he went 10-7 with a 3.35 ERA over 21 appearances, earning Eastern League Pitcher of the Week twice. He parlayed that into a stint in the prestigious Arizona Fall League, where he put up blistering numbers for the Glendale Desert Dogs and set the Baltimore brass on notice.

By the time he reached Triple-A Norfolk in 2015, Davies was a hot commodity across all of baseball. He represented the organization in the MLB Futures Game and boasted a 2.84 ERA over 19 turns for the Tides. At 22 years old and after progressing steadily through the organization, it wasn't out of the question that Davies would make it to The Show by the end of the year.

Unfortunately for Baltimore fans, Davies' sustained success may have backfired. On the periphery of a pennant race, the Orioles flipped Davies at the

deadline to the Brewers in a straight-up trade for Gerardo Parra. Parra finished off the season hitting .237 and bolted for the Rockies in free agency months later. Davies, meanwhile, tamed Triple-A Colorado Springs and made his major league debut for Milwaukee on September 2 against the Pirates.

Davies has since become a reliable cog in the Brewer rotation. Last season was his breakout campaign: one of just four National Leaguers to make all 33 starts, Davies went 17-9 with a 3.90 ERA for a Milwaukee club that finished one game back in the NL Wild Card race.

Despite three rough turns through the rotation to begin 2018, Davies should be a steadying force for a veteran Brewers club that has high hopes for the season. And while he has found his major league success outside the Orioles organization, Shorebirds fans can take pride in the fact that one more established major leaguer first began to sprout with Delmarva.

Before the beginning of the 2018 season, Shorebirds radio voice Will DeBoer caught up with Delmarva manager Buck Britton. Part I of this interview appeared in PlayBall! Issue 2 on April 19-26.

- WD: What are your thoughts on having [pitching coach] Justin Lord returning to Delmarva with you this season?
- **BB:** We've built more than just a coaching relationship; we've built a good connection, and a pretty good friendship. He's definitely somebody you can trust, and who's not afraid to give his opinion and be that extra guy who steers me in the right direction when things pop up that, being a first-year manager, can be kind of unexpected. So he'll be there to guide me through it.
- WD: As older coaches, do you see him and [hitting coach] Bobby Rose as serving as mentors or in a consigliore role for you?
- BB: Of course. I've already told these guys in spring training that I'm going to be relying on them heavily, whether it's bouncing an opinion off of them or whatever. But they're definitely going to be there for me to lean on, for sure.
- WD: The biggest thing in the minors this year is all the rule changes. How much do you anticipate those changing the way you manage a game?
- **BB:** Well, I hope the 10 mound visits doesn't come into effect, but we're definitely going to have to reiterate to the pitchers and catchers to make sure they're on the same page when runners get on base. I don't see that being too much of a problem. The runner on second base in extra innings, that's definitely going to change some things, and we'll have to feel it out the first couple times. It's new for everybody, so the strategy on how to defend it is going to be new. But gone are the days of the 21-inning games in A-ball.
- WD: You were there for the Shorebirds' 21-inning game we had last season. On the one hand, it was murder on the bullpen; on the other hand, it was probably most memorable night of season for everybody involved.
- **BB:** You know, as far as the fans go and stuff, you get into extra innings and it does get exciting because every inning is the ninth inning. But I think it's a way for the league to try to limit injuries. You'd hate to use a guy that you didn't really want to use, but it's the 21st inning and we've got to try to get this game done. So I think it protects the players more than anything.
- WD: I guess that just comes with the territory in the minors. Ever since Branch Rickey created the modern farm system, it's been more about development; mostly for players, but in this case rules.
- **BB:** For sure. And there's too much invested in these young players that Major League Baseball is finally pulling the reins back and saying, 'hey, we need to protect these guys a little better.'

Baseball Runs in Hanifee's Roots

When the Hanifee family lived in Earleville, Md., father Sean built a ball field on a two-acre lot in their backyard. Young Brenan spent most of his early childhood out there, playing at night with his dad. When Brenan was nine, the family left their Field of Dreams behind so that the future Delmarva Shorebirds right-hander and 10th-ranked Orioles prospect could chase the chance to play on bigger diamonds.

"Mom's family lives out there, but the move to [Bridgewater, Va.] was baseball based," said Hanifee. "We kind of knew that baseball would be the path to success, so that's what it boiled down to. I think it was a good move for us."

The move back to the state of his birth – Hanifee was born in Harrisonburg, Va. but moved to Earleville when he was six months old – started the engine turning toward a life in baseball. Part of the fuel included hazy memories of Aberdeen IronBirds games from when his family had season tickets in 2002.

"I don't remember a whole lot of those games vividly, but I think it was good to get out and see that level of baseball early," said Hanifee. "You give yourself something to work toward."

Every bit of work he put in at Turner Ashby High School was centered on the great pastime. He became a prototypical three-sport athlete, lettering in football and basketball too, but it was never a question of which sport stood paramount.

"I kind of just played other sports to get better at baseball," said Hanifee. "Baseball workouts in November aren't very fun, so I played football and basketball to compete and just become a better athlete. That's where a lot of my success comes from, I think."

In June 2016 it all came together for Hanifee. Moments after a season-ending loss in the state semifinals -a win is the only thing he says would have made the day better - the team loaded the bus and flipped on the MLB Draft, now in its fourth round. Then Hanifee's phone rang. Baltimore was calling.

"It was surreal," said Hanifee with a breathless smile. "I actually watched my name get called on our coach's cell phone on the bus. It was just a surreal moment."

Even more surreal was it for father Sean, now an assistant at Division III Bridgewater College, driving in a car right behind the bus. Sean Hanifee grew up on the Eastern Shore – Orioles country – and even sports an Orioles tattoo. For his son to get to play under the de facto family crest was nothing short of miraculous.

"He was in the car behind us on the bus, and he called me a couple minutes later," said Brenan. "He was very excited, very proud."

Fourth-round money made it an easy decision to forego an East Carolina commitment and don the

orange and black. One year later he joined the IronBirds, the team of his childhood, and made his pro debut in Connecticut. Then, on June 28, Hanifee made a homecoming for the ages, dominating Brooklyn over six innings to win his first start at Ripken Stadium.

"To see that crowd, to see that field from the mound's point of view, it's a nice place," said Hanifee. "We had a great fan base there – people that had known me before, family members that came out to watch. It was awesome. I can't describe it in words."

Hanifee has now locked his attention on his first full season with the Shorebirds. Only 19, he radiates maturity and a sense of belonging, having pitched against older



players his whole life. He has bought into the idea of pitching to contact, forgoing gleaming strikeout totals in order to get deeper into games. What will help him thrive across this first long summer are the close familial ties that will make each South Atlantic League ballpark feel like that homespun diamond in Earleville.

"It's good for my family to be able to come and support me, and I appreciate it," said Hanifee. "Them, and friends from home that come to watch, it just adds a little bit of comfort to the game knowing that you're not out there on your own."
