Shields' Return Stirs Memories of '97 Championship



During the Shorebirds' series against Hagerstown on June 8-10, Nationals minor league field coordinator Tommy Shields served as acting manager for the Suns, as regular skipper Patrick Anderson was away on family business. For Shields, the weekend was no regular fill-in stint. Shields managed in Delmarva in 1997, the year the Shorebirds brought their first South Atlantic League championship home to Perdue Stadium.

The '97 Shorebirds were coming of an inaugural season that featured 83 wins and a runner-up finish. With a new manager and an entirely new cast of characters - '97 was the first year the team played under the Baltimore Orioles umbrella – the Shorebirds took aim for another shot at the crown.

Eastern Shore lore most remembers Delmarva's Bash Brothers from that season. First baseman Calvin Pickering batted .311 with 25 home runs and 79 RBIs, establishing a franchise home run record that stands to this day. Third baseman Ryan Minor finished

one homer shy of his corner infield mate, batting .307 with 24 big flies and 97 RBIs; his 42 doubles that season, like Pickering's dingers, still stand as Shorebirds records.

While everyone remembers the Minor-Pickering one-two punch, Delmarva had little additional offense to back them up. The team relied heavily on blistering speed and stout relief pitching. Centerfielder Darrell Dent stole a franchise-record 60 bases, and five others swiped at least 15 bags. Ryan Kohlmeier saved a league-high 24 games, headlining a bullpen that featured lockdown arms in Scott Eibey (1.83 ERA), Maximo Heredia (2.13), and Gabe Molina (2.18).

"We benefited from not moving anybody," said Shields. "We had Eibey in the seventh and Molina in the eighth and Ryan Kohlmeier in the ninth. We could really shorten games.

"I think, you'd have to look back, but we must have played a dozen extra-inning games over 14 innings because we struggled to score, believe it or not, but that bullpen would knock it down."

MEMORIES OF '97 CONT...

The '97 Shorebirds faced their share of tribulations. They lost out on a first-half championship on the final day of the opening session, but finished second in both halves and earned a Wild Card berth with a 77-65 record.

In those days the South Atlantic League featured three rounds of postseason play. Delmarva opened against the Hickory and swept the Crawdads 2-0. The semifinal round brought a nail-biting matchup against the Charleston (WV) AlleyCats, but the Shorebirds sweated out a 2-1 series win to move into the finals.

Delmarva met the Greensboro Bats, then a Yankees farm team, in the SAL Championship Series. Staring down an opponent that featured longtime future major leaguers Cristian Guzman and Nick Johnson, the Shorebirds never blinked, sweeping the Bats 2-0 to claim the crown.

"It was a thrill," said Shields. "I won one as a player in Triple-A [Iowa Cubs, '93], but I think winning one as a manager is even more rewarding. To see the kids go through



a long season, ups and downs, all we went through, to finally escape and be on top of the mountain, it was a huge thrill."

There would be even sweeter rewards down the line as 14 members of the '97 Shorebirds made it to the major leagues. Outfielder Luis Matos lasted the longest of the bunch, appearing in 508 games and batting .255 over parts of seven seasons in The Show. John Parrish and Josh Towers each pitched parts of seven years in the bigs. Minor, of course, had his moment in the sun at the end of Cal Ripken's Iron Man streak and eventually became the longest-tenured manager in Shorebird history.


While 1997 may have been the beginning of the baseball journey for most of those Shorebirds, it provides a constant source of satisfaction for all involved.

"Baseball, they say, it gives you more than you give it back, and that's true," said Shields. "I've really enjoyed the ride. I've scouted, I've coordinated, I've managed...and over 21 years it's never been boring. The people I've met along the way, the kids I've met who keep me young. My body may be failing, but the kids keep me young."





ALUMNI UPDATE

MEISINGER MAKES MOST OF SURROUNDING SITUATION

When a major league ball club falls on hard times, as the Baltimore Orioles have in 2018, one needs to find silver linings in order to keep things interesting. One of the hidden benefits of when the big club struggles, of course, is that it sends a jolt of awareness through the rest of the farm system: right now, anyone can make this team. Recognizing such an opportunity, relief pitcher Ryan Meisinger rose to the occasion and, last month, became the first 2016 Delmarva Shorebird to make it to The Show, and 106th overall.

After a stellar three months split between Double-A Bowie and Triple-A Norfolk, Meisinger received "The Call" on June 29. That same day, the 24-year-old righthander got into the game against the Los Angeles Angels. In an inning and two-thirds, Meisinger gave up one run on two hits, walking one and striking out one. While he did give up a double to future Hall-of-Famer Albert

Pujols and solo home run to Martin Maldonado, Meisinger danced out of trouble in the seventh, getting Ian Kinsler to ground into a 6-4-3 double play to escape a men-on-the-corners jam. By the end of the night, Meisinger had signed his name in that immortal book of major leaguers.

Born in Prince Frederick, Meisinger grew up close to Camden Yards, graduating from Baltimore's Northern High School. After he caught his hometown team's eye with three top-



notch seasons at Radford University, the Orioles spent their 11th-round pick in 2015 on Meisinger. He made an immediate splash in Aberdeen, sporting a 1.99 ERA and earning a New York-Penn League All-Star nod.

In 2016, Meisinger broke camp in Delmarva and proceeded to take Perdue Stadium by storm. He baffled Sally League competition for the first twoplus months, at one point earning wins in three straight relief outings to the tune of seven scoreless innings. He went the entire month of May without allowing a run, surrendering just three earned in the first half. By the time the All-Star Break rolled along, Meisinger boasted a 3-2 record with a paltry 0.78 ERA, four saves, nine walks, and 48 strikeouts over 34.2 innings. As the shutdown reliever for a Shorebirds squad that finished half a game out of

first, Meisinger was as close to a unanimous All-Star as one can be in Class-A.

Like a magnificent comet streaking across the sky, though, there would come a time when Meisinger soared out of view. That came immediately after the midway point with his promotion to High-A Frederick. He kept up his blistering pace with the Keys, turning in a 2.25 ERA over 19 appearances on the way to Orioles Postseason All-Star laurels.

Even greater achievements awaited Meisinger in the 2017 season. As an Eastern League rookie for the Double-A Baysox, the youngster held his own against career minor-leaguers, posting a 4-3 record and 3.00 ERA, plus six saves, over 41 outings. By the end of the summer, Meisinger opened enough eyes to earn a slot in the famed Arizona Fall League, making four shutdown appearances for the Salt River Rafters.

Before a recent game in Greensboro, Shorebirds radio voice Will DeBoer sat down with Shorebirds assistant/first base coach Cam Kneeland. After beginning his career in the independent Can-Am League, Kneeland signed a minor league deal with the Orioles on November 5, 2013. He played three seasons in the Baltimore system, including all of 2015 with Delmarva, before becoming a coach with the Frederick Keys in 2017.

- WD: Think way back, if you can, to the first time you really got bitten by the baseball bug.
- CK: As in when I first started to really love it? It really started to hit me in high school. I was talking to my high school coach, and he wanted me to go play in college. I wanted to go play golf, but he kind of pushed baseball on me from there, and playing ball professionally was the end goal.
- WD: And now that you're a coach, you get that perfect mix: work in baseball, and more time for golf.
- CK: Oh yeah. I definitely enjoy the coaching aspect, always wanted to do that, and then having the golf there now too, it's fun. You have golf your whole life. That's the one thing my high school coach said to me: you've got to go play baseball, because you can golf basically until you're dead.
- WD: What was it like to finally sign with a major league organization?
- CK: I remember that day, I'm pretty sure it was late October. I flew down to Baltimore and I worked out and they asked me if I wanted to be an Oriole. I remember I got a little choked up, and it was a good day, cause I had my dad [John] there, and it was a great feeling.
- WD: What do you remember about your playing year with the Shorebirds in 2015?
- CK: I had a fun time that year, and I'm still friends with a lot of those guys. Steve Wilkerson was on that team and he's in the big leagues now, so that's cool. It was just a good year. Ryan Minor was the manager, he's a great guy, and [current Orioles assistant] Howie Clark was the hitting coach, and he's so knowledgeable about hitting and it was great to learn from him.
- WD: When did you get the sense that you'd be transitioning from player to coach sooner rather than later?
- CK: I always wanted to be a coach, and I remember sitting down and talking to Brian Graham during players' meetings one spring training. I told him that if baseball doesn't work out I always wanted to get into coaching. And I think that helped, it probably got into his head, "Maybe we can ask Cam if that spot opens up." I love the game, I like passing on the knowledge I learn to help guys try and make it to the big leagues.

CRAPORT MAKING MOST OF ALL-STAR SEASON

You don't have to go back too far to see that Trevor Craport is enjoying his Delmarva Shorebirds tenure.

During batting practice before a recent game against Kannapolis, a pitch was thrown that bounced off the ground, up toward home plate, and Craport singled it straight into the outfield off the hop. Craport walked out of the batting cage with a million dollar smile.

This season with the Shorebirds has given Craport plenty to smile about too. Through 76 games, the

Norcross, Ga. native it hitting at .264 clip with 10 home runs, and 52 RBIs, continuing to build on those numbers.

Craport received the call from the Orioles back in 2017, drafted in the 11th round out of Georgia Tech, and found his stride in professional baseball quickly. In 52 games for the Aberdeen IronBirds, Craport batted .302 with 15 doubles, three triples, and 30 RBIs.

Coming into his first season with the Shorebirds, Craport said his experience has been an enjoyable one. Craport also said the arriving on Delmarva has been an adventure, especially since a couple of other 'Birds made the flight to Salisbury with him.

"It's been a lot of fun so far and I get to see a new part of the county in the Northeast," said Craport just after the second half began last month. "Just playing with the same group of guys again from Aberdeen for the most part has been great, and I'm looking forward to the next 70 or so games we have left."

Midway through the season, Craport got to add something to his professional resume for the first time. The slugging third baseman was among four Shorebirds players named to represent the team at the South Atlantic All-Star Game on June 19 in Greensboro. During the game, Craport went 3-for-4 and belted a tworun home run to cap off a three-RBI performance. A sign of things to come, eight days later in the same ballpark he hit two home runs as part of a 20-2 Shorebirds romp.

"It was crazy," said Craport of his All-Star Game blast. "It was off another Greenville pitcher, and I've had a lot of success against Greenville here, and the Greenville closer comes in so I hit a home run off him. It's just a funny coincidence."

For Craport, getting named to the All-Star roster was a surreal moment for him and one that won't leave his mind anytime soon.

"The fans and everything that they had there was really special and a lot of fun," said Craport. "I certainly won't forget it."

Not only was it special for Craport to make the All-Star team, he also had the opportunity to break the news to his family in person.

"They were really happy for me, especially after I had a really good month of May," said Craport. "I told them, 'When it warms up, I'm gonna hit like .800.' And I didn't quite get there, so my dad still lets me hear about it!"

Razzing over unfulfilled boasts aside, Craport's family has been there since the beginning, continuing to support him as his baseball career has flourished. Earlier in June, parents Wil and Sherrie had a baseball adventure, following the team around for two weeks to watch their boy continue to make a name for himself.

"It was a lot of fun to get to see and catch up with them," Craport said "They finally get to see the games in person instead of me just calling and telling, 'Hey, this is what happened,' whether they believe me or not. This league has allowed my family to come around and see the games."

Baseball is always a tough grind at any level, but especially in the minors, where off days are few and far between. First guess would be Craport would

want to use his days off to do what normal 21-year-olds would do. But, sometimes off days are strictly that: days of doing absolutely nothing.

"I've learned to completely shut off on my days off," Craport said. "I'll still take batting practice and take care of my maintenance, but other than that I'm shutting it down on an off day."




