

SHOREBIRDS WEAR SUMMER GRIND AS BADGE OF HONOR



There's no grind in a season quite like baseball, let alone in the minor leagues.

A season consisting of 140 games over the span of five months, mixed with the less-than-glamorous hours of travel from city to city, and with 90-degree days sprinkled in can make that grind even more challenging.

At this point in the South Atlantic League season, the halfway point has come and gone but the end of the season still waits over the horizon. In a game that requires laser-like focus, staying rested, energized, and refreshed are key to make it through the dog days of summer.

The Delmarva Shorebirds are the first full-season rung in the Orioles' ladder to the big leagues. Players on the roster are tackling the 140 game schedule for the first time after coming from Aberdeen or the Gulf Coast League, where the seasons are substantially shorter.

For Shorebirds third baseman Trevor Craport, the scheduling and the length of the season were things that required adjustments when jumping to Class A. Craport said he has considered different ways to battle fatigue in his second season as a professional baseball player.

"I try to maintain my routine of everything I do every day with the same swings and the same stretches," said Craport. "This being my first full season, fatigue is something that I want to battle and make sure I don't have to worry about so much, even though I know it's going to happen to everybody, I want to make sure my Game 140 is as good as Game 1 was.

"It's a 'work smarter not harder' approach, so you're not taking a thousand swings before a game and you have to make sure you get sleep because that's one of the most important things, especially on the road."

Shorebirds manager Buck Britton knows a thing or two about the grind of the minor league season

after his nine seasons around the farm. Britton reinforced the idea that for these young players it's all about managing fatigue and attacking the season with a smarter approach.

"I think just learning how to play with a little bit of fatigue is important," said Britton. "You're not going to be a 100 percent this time of the year, you add on the heat and you start feeling tired, you get out of your routine, whether it's going to the gym or taking the swings in the

cage, so you got to know when to pull back a little bit to save energy and be ready to go for the game."

One of the tasks that Britton faces in his role is taking specific steps to keep his guys as fresh as possible. Britton, much like Craport, said getting his players rest any way you can is an important factor in mitigating the toll that fatigue takes.

"You do things to give guys more time at the hotel relaxing, make sure they get a good meal in them, you eliminate batting practice a couple days a week so that they aren't out there having to do all that stress," said Britton. "I think at this point you're always trying to work on stuff but less is more."

Despite all the methods a manager takes to keep his guys fresh and motivated, Britton says the manger will do what's necessary to a point. When it's all said and done, it's ultimately up to the players themselves to learn how to manage the challenges a long baseball season can bring in order to become even better players.

"You just try to keep positive with guys, doing what you've done all season, which is to help them get better," said Britton. "For the most part these guys need to self-regulate themselves, and they've got to bring whatever they got to the park that day. The organization doesn't care if it's 95 degrees because they're getting evaluated every day. This a big time of year with trades, so this is where guys can really make a name for themselves."

Community gardens are on the rise in the Lower Shore region. From 2011-2014, CFES granted \$3,450 to two community gardens. Since 2015, CFES has granted \$24,570 to eight different gardens, and more projects and grants are in the foreseeable future.



The Wor-Wic Community College garden is part of their "Food for Students" initiative, which includes a community garden and a food pantry staffed by student groups and employee volunteers. The goal of the initiative is to serve 100 economically disadvantaged students per month.

WELLS SETTLES IN AFTER Post-Shorebirds **GROWING PAINS**

The 2017 season was over, but Alex Wells was about to embark on a postseason of sorts. The day after the Delmarva Shorebirds' final game of the year at Perdue Stadium, the Aussie southpaw was named Jim Palmer Minor League Pitcher of the Year, the highest honor bestowed on an Orioles prospect. The pomp and circumstance included meeting the upper echelon of the Baltimore brass at Camden Yards, chatting with skipper Buck Showalter during a rain delay, and accepting the award on the field in front of thousands of Birdland fans.

"I couldn't really take it all in at once," recalled Wells from Zebulon, N.C. during a recent phone conversation. "When I got back upstairs to see my mom, that's when I took it all in, and it was awesome."

It was just the cherry on top of a spectacular season with the Shorebirds. In 25 starts, Wells went 11-5 with a South Atlantic League-leading 2.38 ERA. Wells was about as untouchable as they came in the middle of the season, at one point rattling off a 36-inning scoreless streak. He didn't allow a run in the entire month of July, earning O's Pitcher of the Month, and finished the season without issuing a walk over his final 68 innings.

Despite an otherworldly summer in Salisbury, Wells didn't feel any extra heat when he arrived in Sarasota this past February.

"It was just the same on a day-by-day basis," said Wells. "Get up, go to the field, eat breakfast, do what I had to do." Continued on page 23



Wells broke camp as expected with the Frederick Keys. His first few starts featured the expected growing pains that comes with being just 21 years old in High-A.

"There was a little bit of nerves, being at a higher level, not knowing what to expect from seeing some different guys that I haven't faced before," said Wells. "I tried to do too much in those first couple starts, but I talked to [pitching coach] Blaine Beatty, and he

said, 'Just focus on pounding the strike zone and hitting the glove like last year and you'll be fine.' That kind of relaxed me a little bit from those starts on."

That focus on ball-to-glove, plus the simple fun of getting to pitch, helped Wells turn it around. His apex came on June 11 against Lynchburg when he tossed eight scoreless innings, giving up just three hits and fanning nine Hillcats. Wells eventually became a Carolina League All-Star, making him an All-Star at all three levels of his young career.

The greatest honor, though, was only days away: Wells, along with Bowie's Ryan Mountcastle, were chosen to represent the Orioles at the 2018 Futures Game, held two days before the MLB All-Star Game in Washington.

"It's an absolute honor to be able to represent the Orioles, and to be able to represent my country too, cause I'll be playing for the World Team," said Wells, who joins Twins Double-A lefty Lewis Thorpe as representatives of Australia. "To be able to represent Australia and the Orioles is going to be fun."

The trip to Nationals Park was an easy one for Wells — Nationals Park is an hour away from Frederick's Harry Grove Stadium. After striking out Cardinals Double-A catcher Andrew Knizner to end his Futures Game appearance facing two batters, it was back to reality and back to building on last year's breakout season with the Shorebirds and aiming for a more permanent place on the field at Camden Yards.

Q& A W/COACH CAM KNEELAND

Before a recent game in Greensboro, Shorebirds radio voice Will DeBoer sat down with Shorebirds assistant/first base coach Cam Kneeland. Part I of this interview appeared in PlayBall! Issue 8 on July 19-22.

- WD: When did the Orioles first approach you about transitioning from player to coach?
- CK: It was in 2017, during spring training. I was still trying to make a team, but I could see the writing on the wall and knew it wasn't looking good for me to make one. But they offered me to go and coach in Frederick. Part of me wanted to go play somewhere else, but I didn't want the opportunity to go, and it was a pretty good chance for me to take the coaching job and get my foot in the door.
- WD: This is your second year of coaching now; how do you feel you've grown since your first?
- CK: A lot. It was different being on the other side, because I feel like you see much more as a coach. I try to tell that to players: if you really open your eyes you can learn a lot just by watching every single play. You should be watching every play as a player, of course! As a coach, it's definitely a different lifestyle, but I enjoy it a lot.
- WD: I've talked to Buck and [former Shorebird coach] Jack Graham, guys who are recent managers and coaches, and they say the biggest thing is going from looking out for just one person, yourself, to looking out for 25 guys.
- CK: That's the thing. It's almost like you're a parent of all the kids on the team. And it's tough, because you want the best for them. When they don't do well you wear that, it takes you down, because you want everyone to do well. You want them to make the next level. It's tough at times, especially being the manager.
- WD: I can imagine you being as young as you are, maybe not a parent so much as an eccentric uncle.
- CK: Yeah! Exactly. I'm definitely not old enough to be their parents, but that's the idea.
- WD: You just turned 28 the other day; where do you want to be in two years' time when it's the big 3-0? Not to traumatize you or anything.
- *chuckles* Yeah, I'm telling you, time goes fast once you're out of college, it's been incredible. Hopefully when I'm 30 I'm still in baseball, and I'd love to still be in this organization. Obviously one day I want to be a hitting coach or a manager. I don't want to be a fourth coach my whole career. If I'm still in this organization I'll be happy, but as long as I'm still in baseball, wherever they tell me to go, I'm gonna be there.



BISHOP HOLDS STELLAR ROTATION TOGETHER

When he was on Saturday Night Live in the 1980s and '90s, the late Phil Hartman earned the nickname "The Glue." No matter the sketch, and no matter the ridiculousness, Hartman remained an unflappable foundation for his cast mates, helping the show rebound from a lean period and enter into a second renaissance.

Cameron Bishop may have only been two years old when Hartman passed in 1998, but he has solidified himself as the glue of the Delmarva Shorebirds' rotation. While flashier pitchers like Michael Baumann and Zac Lowther springboarded out of Salisbury early in the year, Bishop — along with fellow holdovers Brenan Hanifee

and DL Hall – has quietly gone from unsung ace to top-billed attraction.

"I think my expectations have stayed the same," said Bishop the day after a recent winning start against Charleston. "Baseball is a team game, but it's also a personal battle. I'm going out there every start thinking that I'm going to get this win for the team. My expectations for how I throw are going to be the same no matter who's pitching in front of me or behind me."

And Bishop has indeed given his team a chance to win every night. Through 16 starts, the Californian southpaw is 8-4 with a 2.89 ERA. He's gone at least six innings in all but three starts and has never given less than five frames; his 96.2 innings rank second only to Hanifee, and his 11 Quality Starts match Hanifee for tops on the team.

Bishop first caught the baseball bug as a freshman at Brea-Olinda High School, a quick drive southeast of Los Angeles; initially a three-sport athlete, he whittled it down to just the leather-and-cowhide by his junior year. He passed up a 32nd-round opportunity with the Arizona Diamondbacks in 2014 to attend UC Irvine, half an hour down Interstate 5. After two solid seasons pitching for the Anteaters, Bishop was primed to become a weekend starter in the spring of 2017. His body had other ideas, and he missed the whole season with an oblique injury.

"It was definitely frustrating," said Bishop. "Luckily the Orioles took me and said, 'We'll give you a shot.' I pitched well that summer in the Cape Cod League, and they liked what they saw, and now I'm here.

"It's one of those things where you don't give up on a dream – you put your head down, you keep working. So that was where my mind was at: 'Okay, I'm hurt, but let's get better, get back on the field, and see what happens."

The Orioles targeted Bishop with their 26th round pick last summer. After negotiations that went to the 11th hour and beyond, the big left-hander signed, settled in, and stumped foes in the New York-Penn League, notching a 0.78 ERA over eight starts for the Aberdeen IronBirds. For Bishop, it was a satisfying end to a year of challenge and change.

When the calendar flipped to 2018 and it came time to head to Sarasota, Bishop's plan was straightforward: stay healthy, throw a lot of innings, and be a bulldog on the mound. Four months into the longest season of his life, the approach remains.

approach remains.

"I want to go out there and give my bullpen a rest and show the coaching staff that, 'Hey, Cameron's going to go out there and give up six or seven innings, and it's going to be quality innings, and he's going to give us a chance to win every night," said Bishop. "And I think that's the mindset I take when I go on the mound because I just want us to win, and I want to be part of that win."

Pitching in front of an adoring Perdue Stadium



crowd that supports the team through thick and thin has kept Bishop revitalized through this first long summer. That, and a sturdy yoga mat in the aisle for the long Sally League bus rides. As the Shorebirds brace for another pennant race in this second half, Bishop – like Phil Hartman before him – is primed to remain a steady left hand for a Delmarva cast that looks increasingly ready for primetime.




