ROCKS CAN'T OUTSLUG KEYS: Both offenses were on display in the middle game of the series, but the Wilmington Blue Rocks were unable to keep pace with the Frederick Keys Saturday night at Frawley Stadium and dropped the second game of the series, 12-9. Both teams combined for 27 hits and 18 walks as **Brandon Downes, Meibrys Viloria** and **Chris DeVito** each drove in a pair of runs for the Blue Rocks in the loss

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION: The Blue Rocks posted back-to-back games with 10 or more hits for the first time this season after racking up 12 hits in Saturday night's loss. On Friday, the Blue Crew pounded out 11 hits in their 8-5 win. The Rocks have posted double-digit hits in three of the last four games. On Saturday, five different Blue Rocks picked up a pair of hits while on Friday, four different filters put together multi-hit efforts. The Rocks racked up a season-high 16 hits on Wednesday at Potomac in a 12-7 win. Overall, the Rocks are 3-1 when they pound out 10 or more hits in a game this season.

ALMOST WITNESSED HISTORY: Saturday's game between the Blue Rocks and Keys lasted 3 hours and 43 minutes. It fell just three minutes shy of tying the Blue Rocks franchise record for longest time of game for a nine-inning contest. The record was set on June 15, 1998 when the Blue Rocks defeated Kinston 8-7 in a game that lasted 3 hours and 46 minutes. Saturday's game featured a combined 21 runs, 27 hits and 18 walks. 18 walks

LONG BALL FUN: With Emmanuel Rivera's solo homer Friday night, the Rocks have now clubbed a home run in 16 of the first 28 games this season. -It was his first long ball in 24 games with his only other home run coming on April 6 at Potomac. -Rivera joins Chase Vallot (5), Kort Peterson (3), Khalil Lee (2) and Brandon Downes (2) to have multiple

home this season.

-From April 9-14, the Rocks hit a home run in six consecutive games. -Wilmington went 2-4 during that span and are 9-7 overall when they hit a home run this season. -The Rocks are sixth in the Carolina League with 19 home runs.

ROLLING ON THE RIVERA: Third baseman Emmanuel Rivera has been the most consistent bat in the Wilmington lineup.

-On Saturday, he roped a pair of doubles and in Friday's game clubbed his second homer of the year and reached base four times.
-Rivera posted season-highs with four hits and four RBI in Wilmington's 12-7 win Wednesday at Potomac.
-Over his last 19 games, the Puerto Rico native is hitting .338 (25-for-74) with five doubles, a triple, a home run, 15 RBI, seven walks and has scored 12 runs.
-He has also picked up a hit in all but three games during that stretch.
-Rivera had an eight game hitting streak from April 14-22 and hit .313 (10-for-32) during the stretch.
-It stands as the longest hitting streak from April 14-22 and hit .913 (10-for-32) during the stretch.
-He has also been a run producer and leads the team with 19 RBI.
-Leads the team with 31 hits and eight doubles.
-Coming off 2017 season in which he won the South Atlantic League batting title. (.310 in 122 gms)

BURT PROVIDING THE HURT: Second-year infielder D.J. Burt has been off to a torrid start in his new role with the team.

He picked up two hits in Friday's win and drove in a season-high three runs.
Burt has collected a pair of hits in each of his last three games (6-for-10)
He is hitting .373 (19-for-51) through 15 games this season and has an on-base percentage of .476
He now has six multi-hit games, which is tied for second-most on the team with Kort Peterson.
Last season, Burt was the primary second baseman. This year, he has been called upon to play both middle infield positions and also made his first-career start in the outfield earlier this year.

DOWNES OFF TO STRONG START: Brandon Downes is no stranger to Wilmington and Carolina League pitching and is off to a fast start in his fourth stint with the Blue Rocks. -Saturday, he drove in a pair of runs on a double. -On Friday, he posted his first, three-hit game of the season. -He also has driven in multiple runs in four of his nine games played since joining the roster on April 26. -He is already tied for third on the team with two home runs and sixth with 10 RBI. -He has 27 career home runs and is four shy of tying **Raul Gonzalez** (31 HR, 1993-95) for the third-most home runs in franchise history.

RUNNING ROCKS: As a team, Wilmington is second in the Carolina League with 39 stolen bases and have been caught 11 times this season. Buies Creek leads the CL with 49. -Overall, the Blue Rocks have five different players with multiple stolen bases this season. -Martin (14), Nick Heath (7), D.J. Burt (7), Lee (6) and Gabriel Cancel (2). -On April 7, at Potoamc, the Rocks set a franchise single-game record by swiping five bases. Martin stole three, while Burt and Heath each swiped a bag in a 5-4 win for Wilmington. The Blue Crew matched the mark on 414 at home against Lynchburg.

KEYS POINTS: The Frederick Keys enter the final game of the series in fifth place in the Northern Division. -After a solid 3-0 start to the year, the Keys went 5-16 the rest of April. -Offensively, the Keys are tied for 7th in patting average (.239) third in walks (123) and have struck out the

fewest times of any team in the circuit (206) -On the mound, Frederick has the highest ERA (4.67), second-most hits given up (254) and have allowed the

fifth-most home runs (18).

<u>APRIL IN REVIEW</u>: The Rocks finished the opening month of the campaign with an 11-12 record. -That was a three win improvement from last season, when the Blue Crew went 8-15 in the first month of 2017. -Entering May, the Rocks are tied for first in the CL in walks (104), second in stolen bases (37), tied for third in home runs (15), sixth in OBP% (.323) but are last in batting average (.224).

THE BOOK ON GERSON GARABITO: Gerson Garabito was signed as an international free agent on Sep tember 17, 2012 by Kansas City. He enters this season ranked as a top-30 prospect in the system according to both Baseball America (#16) and MLB.com (#30). The last two seasons for the 22-year-old had to overcome different types of adversity. In 2016, he spent his first year in full-seasons has beal with Low-A Lexington and struggled. He went 2-11 with a 4.8 ERA in 18 starts. In 80.2 innings he allowed 78 hits, 43 earned runs, struck out 61 batters and walked 35. However, the Royals believed he showed more promise than the numbers in-dicated. Last season, he repeated in Lexington and put together a nice bounce back season. He was pitching better and had a 24.2-inning streak in which he did not allow an earned run with the Legends from May 4 to Aug. 15. The streak was interrupted by a seven-week stint on the disabled list due to shoulder tendonitis in his right shoulder. Ultimately he would miss almost two months of the season. He made two rehab starts in Surprise, Arizona before rejoining the Legends to finish the season. Overall with Lexington, he went 4-5 with a 2.811 ERA in 15 starts. He tossed 77 innings and allowed 52 hits, 24 earned runs, 19 walks and 72 strikeouts. He also held South Atlantic League hitters to a .190 batting average. From 2013-2015, the right-handed hurler spent his first three seasons in the organization at he Rookie-level. He was with the Surprise Royals in 2015 in the Arizona League for his stateside debut before spending his first two years as a pro in the Dominican Summer League. Scouts have raved about Garabito's ability to command all three off his pitches. His fastball ranges from 89-94 m.p.h. and has a lot of movement to go along with a curveball that he can locate well and a changeup he used more last season. Scouts believe he has the repertoire to remain in the rotation and slot in as a No.4 or No.5 starter, but can also see his stuff play as a reliever. In his last start at Potomac on May 1, he suffered the loss and worked just 2.2 innings. He allowed six runs (one earned) on four hits, walked two, struck out a batter and allowed a season-high three home runs. He made his Wilmington debut on April 8 at Potomac where he tied a career-high with nine strikeouts in six innings of work in a no-decision.

ON OVERCOMING HIS INJURY LAST YEAR: Garabito showed a sense of mental toughness after not only bouncing back from a poor 2016 season statistically, but also an injury that could've derailed his season last year."It was a good year, but it was a little hard for me. I was hurt for about a two-and-a-half months of the season. It was shoulder tendonitis. The rehab process was long and tough. One day, it would feel a lot better and I would go out and throw. I could only go for one inning and I couldn't throw anymore. So I had to unable to perform on the diamond. "It was so hard for me because I try to do my best. That was the frustrating part for me is because I couldn't help my teammates and that did not make me happy. Once I was able to p again with no pain, I was so happy.

MAKING IMPROVEMENTS IN THE OFFSEASON: Scouts are impressed with Garabito's ability deliver his pitches with a smooth delivery and his command on his pitches. Garabito focused on the latter past winter. "I worked on all of my pitches this offseason, but my changeup specifically and my control t. I used it more last season than I did before. My best pitch is my fastball because of my control of it velocity.

ANOTHER PEDRO FAN: There have been a handful of players from the Dominican Republic to make the MLB and have great success. Two pitchers that represent the Dominican Republic in the Baseball Hal Fame are Juan Marichal and Pedro Martinez. Garabito grew up idolizing the 2015 inductee Martinez. "I lo Pedro. When I watched him pitch, especially against the New York Yankees it was so fun to see. He wo hrow his fastball and then come back with his breaking ball. It was so good to watch and he had a lot of g pitches. Growing up in the Dominican Republic it was easy to route for him.

THOUGHTS ON BEING A RANKED PROSPECT: The righty recognizes that it's an honor to be rate a top-30 prospect, but he realizes he can't let it be a distraction. "It does make you feel a little important, but I still need to work hard this year because it doesn't matter what I'm ranked. You can be on the top one year and a couple years later you can be down on the bottom. You need to continue to work hard because you never know what can happen in the future.
