YESTERDAY: Hosea Nelson homered twice and the Captains defeated the Lansing Lugnuts in game two of a four-game series, 6-3. Nelson gave the Captains a 1-0 lead in the top of the third with his first homer of the afternoon, but Hunter Steinmetz tied the game with a solo shot of his own in the bottom of the third. The Lugnuts scored a pair of runs in the fourth to take a 3-1 lead on a run-scoring fielder's choice and a double steal, in which Hagen Danner stole home. A Henry Pujols pulled Lake County back within one run with an RBI double in the fifth. Two innings later, Pujols tied the score at 3-3, slamming a solo homer to left field. Nelson made it back-to-back homers when he cracked his second homer of the game to right. The Captains added two insurance runs in the ninth on a sacrifice fly by Ruben Cardenas and a balk by Lugnuts reliever Juan Nunez that scored Nelson. Eli Lingos pitched a career-high five innings and did not allow a run, en route to the win. Joey Pulido, who surrendered the Captains' back-to-back long balls in the seventh, took the loss.

SECOND-HALF PERFORMERS: Since the start of the second half, Jose Fermin has hit .500, going 9-for-18 with a double and four RBI. Since joining the Captains after the All-Star Break, Jonathan Engelmann has hit .412, going 7-for-17 with a walk-off home run, two doubles and four RBI. Hosea Nelson has hit .353 since the second half began, going 6-for-17 with three home runs and six RBI.

RED HOT OFFENSE: The Captains have had one of the Midwest League's most potent offenses since the end of the All-Star Break. Lake County leads the league in AVG (.302), OBP (.381), SLG (.484), OPS (.865), home runs (8) and runs (35).

JUST SCORE, BABY: The Captains are 32-4 when they score five or more runs in a game. They are 2-11 when they score two or fewer runs.

(WAY) DOWN ON THE FARM: George Valera, the Indians' #5 prospect according to MLB.com, is tied for the New York-Penn League lead in HR (3), is second in RBI (13) and TB (13), third in XBH (6), fourth in H (13) and fifth in SLG (.595) and OPS (.991).

FIRST HALF RECAP: The Captains won the Eastern Division Wild Card, finishing the first half with a 40-29 record and clinching a playoff berth for the first time since 2014. Lake County's offense finished the half with a .230/.325/.396 slash line (.721 OPS). The Captains led the league in slugging percentage (.396) and home runs (63). They finished second in runs scored (336) and third in stolen bases (81). The Captains' pitching staff finished the first half with a 3.55 team ERA, good for seventh in the MWL. On an individual level, Will Benson finished the half leading the league in home runs (18), slugging percentage (.604), OPS (.974), RBI (55) and total bases (131). Benson also finished second in extra-base hits (33), third in steals (18) and third in runs (44). Ruben Cardenas entered the All-Star Break in second in triples (5), third in slugging percentage (.518), fifth in OPS (.867) and fifth in extra-base hits (26). Tyler Freeman finished the half leading the MWL in runs (51). Luis Oviedo ended the first half leading the league in starts (13), second in wins (6) and fifth in innings pitched (67.1).

CLINCHED: The Captains clinched a Midwest League playoff berth by winning the first half Eastern Division Wild Card. Lake County will face the first half champion Great Lakes Loons in the first round.

PLAYOFF HISTORY: Lake County has now reached the postseason six times. The Captains made the South Atlantic League playoffs in 2003 and 2008. The Captains have reached the Midwest League postseason in 2010, 2012, 2014 and 2019. They have won the division three times (2003, 2008, 2010) and the Wild Card three times (2012, 2014 and 2019). The Captains' lone league championship was in the MWL in 2010.

SO LONG: Will Benson, Tyler Freeman, Mitch Reeves and Cody Morris were called up to High-A Lynchburg following the All-Star Break. Benson led the Midwest League in home runs (18), slugging percentage (.604), OPS (.974), RBI (55) and total bases (131). Benson was hitting .272/.371/.604 at the time of the call-up. Freeman was hitting .292/.382/.424 and led the league in runs (51). Freeman also had the third-lowest strikeout percentage (10.3%) in the MWL and the sixth-lowest swinging strike percentage (5.2%). Reeves was batting .257/.351/.407 with six home runs and 37 RBI. Morris went 5-2 with a 3.20 ERA in nine starts and one relief appearances. The right-hander struck out 56 and walked just 10 in 45 IP.

2019 ALL-STARS: OF Will Benson, SS Tyler Freeman and RHP Manuel Alvarez represented the Captains at the 55th MWL All-Star Classic on June 18 at Four Winds Field in South Bend, IN. Benson was named an All-Star starter, while Freeman and Alvarez were reserves.

POWER UP: The Captains lead the Midwest League in home runs (71) and slugging percentage (.403). Will Benson (now with High-A Lynchburg) still leads the league in home runs (18) and slugging percentage (.604). Lake County has led the MWL in homers each of the last two seasons and the Captains have had the individual home run champion the last two years. Lake County's 118 long balls led the circuit in 2018 and Benson hit the most homers in the league with 22. In 2017, the Captains set a new club record with a league-leading 153 home runs (two shy of tying the MWL record of 155, set in 1961 by Waterloo). Emmanuel Tapia broke the Captains' single-season record that year with a league-best 29 big flies.

LITTLE BRO, BIG POWER: The Mahoning Valley Scrapers, Short-Season affiliate of the Cleveland Indians, leads the New York-Penn League in home runs (9). They are second in runs (55) and third in slugging percentage (.376).

BIG MOMENTS: Will Benson hit four home runs in one game on April 18 against the South Bend Cubs, becoming the first player in Captains history in the fifth in the history of the Midwest League to accomplish the rare feat. Ruben Cardenas hit an inside-the-park home run on April 16 in Bowling Green, marking the Captains' first inside-the-park round-tripper since Sam Haggerty hit one on August 8, 2016 against the Dayton Dragons. The Captains also pitched a combined no-hitter on June 22 in game two of a doubleheader against the West Michigan Whitecaps. Eli Lingos, Luis Araujo and Kellen Rholl combined for the fifth no-hitter in Captains history.

TOP PROSPECTS: Lake County features four of the Indians' Top 30 prospects on its active roster, according to MLB.com. C Bo Naylor (#4), RHP Luis Oviedo (#8), 2B/SS Jose Fermin (#23), OF Quentin Holmes (#27).

LAST TIME OUT: Royalty struck out a career-high 10 batters and pitched a career-long 6.2 innings without allowing a run in a win over the West Michigan Whitecaps on Saturday at Classic Park. Royalty held West Michigan to four hits and did not issue a walk, nor did he hit a batter, in a 5-2 Captains victory.

INJURED LIST: Royalty was placed on the Injured List after his May 1 start. He was on the IL until May 17.

THE WEATHER MAN: Weather has affected five separate Alex Royalty starts this season. His first start was postponed due to field conditions on April 8, his second start was suspended after Royalty pitched just one inning on April 14 in Dayton, his third start was postponed by rain on April 19 and his start on May 22 at Dayton was delayed 1:16 by rain. On June 13, rain ended Royalty's start in the sixth inning and the Captains won a rain-shortened game over Great Lakes.

SUSPENDED GAME: Royalty got the start for the Captains on April 14 at Dayton. After Royalty pitched a one-two-three inning, the game was suspended due to rain. It was completed on May 21 with the Captains winning, 8-1. Royalty's stats for that one inning were made official and counted toward his season stats after that game's completion.

RECORD-TYING DRAFT CLASS: Royalty was one of six UNC-Wilmington players to be selected in the 2018 MLB Draft, tying a Seahawks program record that was set in 2006 and equaled in 2017. Royalty was joined in his draft class by C Ryan Jeffers (Twins – 2nd Round), RHP Austin Warren (Angels – 6th Round), RHP Clark Cota (A's – 10th Round), RHP Austin Easter (Blue Jays – 31st Round) and 1B Mason Berne (Braves – 33rd Round).

COLLEGE ACCOLADES: 2018 CAA All-Tournament Team, 2017 ABCA 1st-Team All-East Region, **2017 CAA Pitcher of the Year**, 2017 1st-Team All-CAA, 2017 NCCSIA 1st-Team All-State, 2016 Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American, 2016 CAA All-Rookie Team

JUNIOR YEAR HIGHLIGHTS: The reigning CAA Pitcher of the Year posted a 4.76 ERA in his junior season, but came back with a stellar showing in the CAA Tournament. Royalty pitched a complete game to beat Northeastern, striking out five and walking none, en route to a CAA All-Tournament Team nod. The Seahawks went on to win the CAA title.

CONTROL: Royalty just five batters over 22.2 innings in his pro debut season (1.99 BB/9). During his collegiate career, the right-hander walked 74 in 262.2 innings (2.53 BB/9).

BASEBALL LINEAGE: Royalty's father, Doug Royalty, pitched for San Diego State University and was drafted by the Houston Astros in the 18th Round of the 1987 MLB Draft. He pitched two years in the minor leagues with Short-Season Auburn (1987) and Low-A Asheville (1988), posting a 15-15 record with a 3.45 ERA. Doug showed similar control to his future son with just 45 walks over 234.2 career innings (1.7 BB/9).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Royalty's mom, Pam, and step-father, Rob Lease, were known for taking road trips up and down the east coast with their dogs, Bear and Roscoe, to watch Alex's home and road games at UNCW. On one occasion last year, Rob drove with the two dogs from Raleigh, NC to Phoenix, AZ to watch Alex play Arizona State. The journey spanned over 6,000 miles, round trip (Pam and other family flew to Colorado for skiing and then drove down to Arizona).
