**YESTERDAY:** The Captains salvaged the final game in their three-game series at Clinton, defeating the LumberKings, 4-3. Lake County scored three runs in the first on RBI doubles by **Connor Smith** and **Daniel Schneemann**, and an RBI single by **Cody Farhat**. The LumberKings scored two runs in the fourth inning on an RBI double by J.D. Osborne and an RBI single by Davis Bradshaw. Clinton pulled within one run in the ninth on a two-out RBI double by Thomas Jones, but Captains reliever **Manuel Alvarez** got Marcos Rivera to ground out to shortstop to end the game with the tying run on second base. Alvarez notched his ninth save, allowing one run on two hits in his lone inning on the hill with one strikeout and no walks. **Juan Mota** started for the Captains and held the LumberKings to two runs on six hits over six innings with seven strikeouts and one walk, en route to the win. Clinton starter George Soriano took the loss, allowing four runs on six hits over six innings with six walks and four strikeouts.

**SECOND-HALF PERFORMERS:** Since the start of the second half, **Daniel Schneemann**, **Jose Fermin** and **Bo Naylor** have been among the Midwest League's most productive hitters. Schneemann is second in the Midwest League in on-base percentage (.458), second in average (.371), sixth in OPS (.926) and tied for eighth in hits (23). Fermin leads the league in runs (17), is second in steals (7), third in hits (26), fifth in average (.356) and sixth in on-base percentage (.407). Naylor is tied for fourth in runs (14).

**ADVANCED STATS:** **Jose Fermin** owns the lowest swinging strike percentage (3.7%) and the third-lowest strikeout percentage in the Midwest League (9.9%). **Ruben Cardenas** is eighth in the MWL in wRC+ (140). **Bo Naylor** is 13<sup>th</sup> in the league in line drive percentage (20.3%).

**ALL OR NOTHING:** Since the start of the second half, the Captains' pitching staff leads the league in strikeouts (199) and are third in home runs allowed (17). Cedar Rapids has allowed the most home runs since the All-Star Break (22) and Fort Wayne is second (18).

**JUST SCORE, BABY:** The Captains are 35-6 when they score five or more runs in a game. They are 3-15 when they score two or fewer runs.

**FIRST HALF RECAP:** The Captains won the Eastern Division Wild Card, finishing the first half with a 40-29 record and clinching a playoff berth for the first time since 2014. Lake County's offense finished the half with a .230/.325/.396 slash line (.721 OPS). The Captains led the league in slugging percentage (.396) and home runs (63). They finished second in runs scored (336) and third in stolen bases (81). The Captains' pitching staff finished the first half with a 3.55 team ERA, good for seventh in the MWL. On an individual level, **Will Benson** finished the half leading the league in home runs (18), slugging percentage (.604), OPS (.974), RBI (55) and total bases (131). Benson also finished second in extra-base hits (33), third in steals (18) and third in runs (44). **Ruben Cardenas** entered the All-Star Break in second in triples (5), third in slugging percentage (.518), fifth in OPS (.867) and fifth in extra-base hits (26). **Tyler Freeman** finished the half leading the MWL in runs (51). **Luis Oviedo** ended the first half leading the league in starts (13), second in wins (6) and fifth in innings pitched (67.1).

**CLINCHED:** The Captains clinched a Midwest League playoff berth by winning the first half Eastern Division Wild Card. Lake County will face the first half champion Great Lakes Loons in the first round.

**PLAYOFF HISTORY:** Lake County has now reached the postseason six times. The Captains made the South Atlantic League playoffs in 2003 and 2008. The Captains have reached the Midwest League postseason in 2010, 2012, 2014 and 2019. They have won the division three times (2003, 2008, 2010) and the Wild Card three times (2012, 2014 and 2019). The Captains' lone league championship was in the MWL in 2010.

**2019 ALL-STARS:** OF **Will Benson** (now at High-A Lynchburg), SS **Tyler Freeman** (now at High-A Lynchburg) and RHP **Manuel Alvarez** represented the Captains at the 55<sup>th</sup> MWL All-Star Classic on June 18 at Four Winds Field in South Bend, IN. Benson was named an All-Star starter, while Freeman and Alvarez were reserves. Alvarez is the only player remaining on the active roster after Benson and Freeman were promoted to High-A.

**BIG MOMENTS:** **Will Benson** hit four home runs in one game on April 18 against the South Bend Cubs, becoming the first player in Captains history in the fifth in the history of the Midwest League to accomplish the rare feat. **Ruben Cardenas** hit an inside-the-park home run on April 16 in Bowling Green, marking the Captains' first inside-the-park round-tripper since **Sam Haggerty** hit one on August 8, 2016 against the Dayton Dragons. The Captains also pitched a combined no-hitter on June 22 in game two of a doubleheader against the West Michigan Whitecaps. **Eli Lingos**, **Luis Araujo** and **Kellen Rholl** combined for the fifth no-hitter in Captains history.

**TOP PROSPECTS:** Lake County features four of the Indians' Top 30 prospects on its active roster, according to *MLB.com*. **C Bo Naylor** (#4), RHP **Luis Oviedo** (#8), 2B/SS **Jose Fermin** (#23), OF **Quentin Holmes** (#27).

**TOP PICKS:** The Captains' roster includes one former first round draft pick and the Indians' #1 draft selections from each of the last two years with OF **Quentin Holmes**\* (2017; 2<sup>nd</sup> round – 64<sup>th</sup> overall) and C **Bo Naylor** (2018; 1<sup>st</sup> round – 29<sup>th</sup> overall). \*The Indians did not have a first round pick in 2017.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Ponticelli held Lansing to two runs on four hits over five innings on Sunday at Classic Park. The right-hander struck out five and walked two. The only runs Ponticelli surrendered came in the third on back-to-back two-out RBI hits, a double by Gabriel Moreno (11-pitch at-bat) and a single by Griffin Conine (first pitch). Ponticelli left the game with the Captains trailing, 2-1, but the Captains came back to tie the game and save him from a loss. Lake County lost the game, 3-2.

**HOME RUN TROUBLE:** Ponticelli is tied with teammate **Juan Mota** for the league lead in home runs allowed (10). Among Midwest League pitchers who have thrown 60+ innings, Ponticelli has allowed the most home runs per nine innings (1.41). Mota is second (1.33)

**CONTROL PITCHER:** Ponticelli walked just 44 batters in 236.2 career innings at the University of San Francisco for a career 1.67 BB/9 rate. He also led USF in strikeouts his sophomore year with 65 K's in 69.2 innings, walking just 10. The right-hander was a three-year starter for the Dons and ended his career with the ninth-most strikeouts in program history (187).

**CAPE COD LEAGUE:** Ponticelli pitched in 2016 and 2017 for the Falmouth Commodores in the prestigious Cape Cod League. Across two seasons, the right-hander made 13 relief appearances and six starts. He went 5-4 with a 5.23 ERA.

**SAN FRANCISCO → CLEVELAND:** Indians OF **Bradley Zimmer** (Captains '14) and RHP **Adam Cimber** are both former University of San Francisco Dons.

**DONS IN THE DRAFT:** 2018 marked the 14<sup>th</sup> straight year in which a USF Don has been selected in the MLB Draft. Along with Ponticelli, SS Michael Perri was selected in the 21<sup>st</sup> round by the Cardinals.
