Today's Game: The Oklahoma City Dodgers open a nine-game road trip in the state of Tennessee, as the Dodgers face the Memphis Redbirds beginning at 6:35 p.m. at AutoZone Park. The Dodgers pace the PCL with a 27-13 record — tied for the team's best record through 40 games since rejoining the PCL in 1998 (also 2015).

Last Game: Jake Peter hit two of the Dodgers' four home runs in an 11-2 win against Nashville Sunday afternoon at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark. Donovan Solano finished a triple shy of the cycle, picking up a game-high four hits. His home run to center field gave the Dodgers a 1-0 lead in the fourth. A two-run single by Kyle Garlick later in the inning extended OKC's lead to 3-0. After Nashville got on the board in the top of the fifth inning, Travis Taijeron answered in the bottom half of the frame with a two-run single. Peter's solo homer in the sixth pushed OKC's lead to 6-1. Taijeron led off the eighth inning with a solo homer and Peter's three-run blast later in the inning pushed OKC's lead to 10-1. Needing a triple to complete the cycle, Solano hit a fly ball to deep right field with two outs in the eighth inning. He rounded second, but was tagged out just shy of third base. However, his double did score Oklahoma City's 11th run. Dodgers reliever Joe Broussard (3-0) was credited with the win while Nashville starting pitcher Frankie Montas (1-5) was charged with the loss.

Today's Probable Pitcher: Lefty Manny Bañuelos (4-2) looks for a win after suffering his first two losses of 2018 in back-to-back starts... Bañuelos pitched a season-low three innings May 14 at Colorado Springs. He allowed four runs and six hits, with two walks and three strikeouts and was charged with the loss in OKC's 8-5 defeat...Over his last 6.0 innings, Bañuelos has allowed nine runs and 14 hits, including nine extra-base hits. Prior to the recent rough patch, he'd allowed a total of seven runs over 32.0 innings while holding the opposition to a .196 batting average...His 1.21 WHIP ranks seventh in the PCL and he also leads the team in starts, wins and strikeouts (41)...Left-handed batters are just 4-for-27 against him this season...He signed with the Dodgers as a free agent Nov. 14, 2017 after spending 2017 with Triple-A Salt Lake in the Los Angeles Angels organization...Bañuelos appeared in a team-leading 39 games (nine starts) with Salt Lake, pitching 95.0 innings with a 5-6 record, 4.93 ERA and 85 K's...Bañuelos has appeared in seven career ML games (six starts), all with Atlanta in 2015...Tonight is Bañuelos' third career appearance and second start of the season against the Redbirds. In his first meeting with Memphis this season May 9 at home, Bañuelos took the loss after allowing season highs with five runs and eight hits over 5.0 innings, as OKC fell, 7-2.

Against the Redbirds: 2018: 4-4 2017: 8-7 All-time: 172-155 At MEM: 75-90

The Dodgers and Redbirds are meeting for their third series of the season and third of the month of May...The teams have split each of their first two series of 2018, April 30-May 3 in Memphis and May 8-11 in OKC. The Dodgers have now won or split 10 straight series against the defending PCL champion Redbirds...The Dodgers have slightly outscored the Redbirds, 33-32, this season, and they have pitched shutouts in three of the four wins...Rocky Gale enters this series with 11 hits in six games and Kyle Garlick has four homers...The Dodgers won the 2017 series, 8-7, and have won five consecutive season series against Memphis. OKC has not lost a season series to the Redbirds since 2011, and the Dodgers were the only team in the PCL last season to have winning record against the 91-win Redbirds...OKC went 4-3 at AutoZone Park in 2017 and has finished with a winning record in Memphis each of the past five seasons, going 25-14 over that span.

Santana's Town: Dennis Santana was named PCL Pitcher of the Week today after firing six shutout innings in his Triple-A debut Saturday against Nashville in OKC. He allowed three singles and racked up 11 strikeouts, tying his career high and setting the benchmark for the most by an OKC pitcher this season. Santana retired the first nine Sounds batters of the game, with six via strikeout. After allowing two hits in the fourth, the right-handed pitcher retired nine of the final 10 batters he faced. The Sounds only put one runner in scoring position and did not have a runner advance to third base...Although Santana has received Mid-Season All-Star honors in each of the last two seasons, this is the first weekly award of his career...This is the second straight week a Dodgers pitcher has won the award, following Justin DeFratus last week. It's the first time OKC has nabbed back-to-back PCL Pitcher of the Week honors since Trevor Oaks and Jose De Leon in August 2016.

Bumps in the Road: Although the Dodgers have a sterling 20-4 record at home, it has not been the same story on the road. The Dodgers are 7-9 in road games and have lost five of their last six road games, as well as seven of their last nine. Of the nine total road losses, seven have come by one or two runs, with the lone exceptions being a pair of three-run losses. The last seven road losses have been by a combined 10 runs...The Dodgers have been held to two or fewer runs four times over the last nine road games, with three games tallying one or no runs. The team is slushing .247/.309/.377 with 3.8 runs per game on the road compared to .317/.379/.493 with 6.1 runs per game at home.

Dominant Donovan: OKC hits leader Donovan Solano connected on a season-high four knocks in Sunday's game against Nashville and became the first Dodger this season with three extra-base hits in one game. Needing a triple to complete the cycle in the eighth inning, Solano hit a fly ball near the wall in deep right field, but he was thrown out at third base by a few feet...Solano has hit safely in six straight games to tie his season-high hit streak, going 12-for-27 (.444) with eight RBI and four runs scored...He paces the Dodgers with 52 hits and 17 multi-hit games over 36 contests. His .371 batting average is third-best in the PCL.

Jake-Up Call: Jake Peter recorded the first multi-homer game of his career Sunday, bashing a solo homer in the sixth inning and three-run shot in the eighth to collect a season-high four RBI. He has hit safely in a season-high seven straight games, going 11-for-26 (.423) with seven RBI. He has also now hit safely in 12 of his last 13 games, going 18-for-50 (.360), and accumulating 11 of his 16 RBI for the season...Yesterday Peter became this second Dodger this month to register his first career multi-homer game, with Rocky Gale accomplishing the feat May 5.

Growing Garlick: Kyle Garlick went 2-for-4 with a double, two RBI and a run scored Sunday to extend his hitting streak to a career-best 10 games. Following a 2-for-21 start after his promotion to OKC, Garlick is 15-for-37 (.405) with six home runs and 11 RBI. He paces the Dodgers with six homers, and his 11 total homers between OKC and Double-A Tulsa lead all Dodgers minor leaguers this season.

Around the Horn: The Dodgers punched out 11 Nashville batters yesterday, marking the fourth straight game with at least 10 strikeouts by the pitching staff (47 K's total). However, they also tied their season high with eight walks and have walked 21 batters over the same four-game span...Alex Verdugo has hit safely in all five games since rejoining the team, going 7-for-21 with a double, three RBI and four runs...Through his first four games since rejoining OKC, Tim Locastro is 7-for-18 with a double, homer, four RBI and five runs scored.

Last Game: Had shortest outing of the season May 14 at Colorado Springs and was the losing pitcher in the team's 8-5 defeat...allowed four runs and six hits over 3.0 innings, with two walks and three strikeouts...four of six hits went for extra bases (three doubles, one homer)...allowed three runs in the first inning on a wild pitch and a two-run, two-out double by Keon Broxton...surrendered a solo home run to Nate Orf in the second inning...had two runners on and one out in the third inning when Dylan Moore lined into a double play...Sky Sox went 6-for-14 overall, 3-for-8 with runners on and 1-for-5 with RISP...threw at least 20 pitches each inning and 73 pitches total (43 strikes).

Against Memphis: In two career appearances (one start) over the last two seasons is 0-1 and has allowed eight runs and 11 hits, with three walks and six strikeouts over 7.2 IP...started once previously against the Redbirds this season, May 9 at home...took the loss as the Redbirds prevailed, 7-2...allowed season highs with five runs and eight hits over 5.0 innings...started off well, retiring all six batters between the first and second innings...between the third and fifth innings surrendered all five runs and eight hits, as the Redbirds went 8-for-15 with five extra-base hits during that stretch; included home runs by Wilfredo Tovar and Adolis Garica leading off the third and fourth innings, respectively...Memphis went 4-for-7 with runners on and 2-for-4 with RISP; opponents were 3-for-17 with RISP entering the game...only previous career appearance at AutoZone Park was with Salt Lake July 27, 2017 (2.2 IP, 3 H, 3 ER, 2 BB, 2 K).

2018:

- Leads the team in wins, starts and strikeouts...is currently tied for the team lead in innings...ranks seventh in the PCL with a 1.21 WHIP.
- Has 41 strikeouts against 10 walks over 38.0 innings (4.1 K/BB)...held lefties 4-for-27 overall (.148).
- Over last 6.0 innings has allowed nine runs and 14 hits...opponents are 14-for-29 (.483) with nine extra-base hits, including three homers...opponents are 3-for-9 with RISP during the stretch...over first 32.0 innings allowed just seven runs and 22 hits, with opponents batting .196 overall and 3-for-17 with RISP.
- Fired 4.0 no-hit innings April 23 at New Orleans before having to leave the game with a blister on his left thumb...retired 12 of 14 batters faced overall with one walk and one hit batter...notched nine strikeouts, marking his highest strikeout total since Aug. 6, 2010 with the High-A Tampa Yankees against the St. Lucie Mets (11)...each of the first eight outs recorded were via strikeout and struck out eight of 10 batters faced during that time...five swinging strikeouts and four on called third strikes...New Orleans went 0-for-4 with four strikeouts with runners on and did not have a runner advance into scoring position...threw 77 pitches (47 strikes).
- Allowed one run over 6.0 innings April 17 at Round Rock...allowed six hits with one walk and seven strikeouts...retired the side in order three times...one run came on three straight hits with one out in the third inning, but after the Express had runners at second and third with one out, did not allow another run...escaped a bases loaded jam with one out in the fifth by getting Willie Calhoun to ground into a double play...finished outing with a 1-2-3 sixth inning, including two strikeouts...threw 89 pitches (60 strikes).
- Earned first win of season vs. Round Rock at home April 12, dealing six strong innings in OKC's 3-1 victory...allowed one run and two hits, with one walk and four strikeouts...retired 18 of 21 batters faced overall, including nine of the first 10 and nine of the last 10...only run scored in the fourth inning following a leadoff double by Michael O'Neill, a wild pitch and a sacrifice fly...held Round Rock 0-for-5 with runners on and only had one runner reach scoring position (0-for-1)...threw just 45 pitches over his final five innings; retired the side on 10 or fewer pitches four times...threw 60 pitches total (42 strikes).
- Made season debut in Game 2 of the doubleheader April 5 in Iowa...did not figure in the decision after allowing two runs (one earned) and three hits over 4.0 innings...walked one and struck out three...during a stretch between the first and fourth innings, retired 10 of 11 batters...had retired seven straight batters until David Bote hit a solo homer with two outs in the fourth inning...held Iowa 1-for-6 with runners on and 0-for-3 with RISP...lefties were 0-for-5...left game trailing, 2-0, but the Dodgers tied things up in the sixth...threw 74 pitches (47 strikes).

2017:

- Appeared in 39 games (nine starts) for Triple-A Salt Lake in the Los Angeles Angels organization...pitched 95.0 innings to a record of 5-6 and 4.93 ERA...fanned 85 hitters and induced 12 ground ball double plays...led the Bees in appearances...ranked second on the team in innings and third in strikeouts.
- Began and ended the season in the starting rotation...went 2-5 with a 6.08 ERA in nine starts...pitched at least 5.0 innings and allowed two or fewer runs in each of first three starts.
- Faced 439 batters and only surrendered four home runs, averaging 0.4 home runs per nine innings...homers all hit in hitter-friendly ballparks (Salt Lake - 2; Las Vegas - 2).
- Struck out a season-high seven batters in a relief appearance June 14 vs. Reno...pitched 3.1 innings, gave up no runs on three hits and one walk.
- Longest outing of the year was April 17 vs. Fresno...pitched 6.0 innings...gave up four hits, two runs, fanned four batters and walked one in Salt Lake's 6-2 win.

Career:

- Appeared in seven total games (six starts) in the Major Leagues, all with Atlanta in 2015...compiled a 1-4 record in 26.1 innings and posted a 5.13 ERA...struck out 19 batters...made ML debut July 2, 2015 in a start against Washington...pitched 5.2 innings, gave up no runs on two hits, with no walks and seven strikeouts; squared off against Max Scherzer and left the game in line for the win with a 1-0 lead, but the Nationals tied the game in the seventh inning.
- MiLB.com Organization All-Star in 2011 and 2015 for New York (AL) and Atlanta, respectively...named a Mid-Season All-Star for Double-A Trenton in 2011 and an International League All-Star in 2015 for Gwinnett...Rising Stars selection in 2010 during the Arizona Fall League...named to the SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game in 2009.
- Signed as an amateur free agent by the New York Yankees out of the Mexican League March 30, 2008...missed the entire 2013 season due to Tommy John surgery...traded by the Yankees to Atlanta for David Carpenter and Chasen Shreve Jan. 1, 2015.

- Signed as a free agent by the Dodgers May 4 and assigned to OKC May 6...released by Toronto April 29 after exercising an opt-out clause in his contract.
- Switch hitter started the 2018 season with the Triple-A Buffalo Bisons, batting .232 (13x56) with two RBI and five runs scored...recorded five multi-hit outings...signed with the Blue Jays as a free agent March 17 after being released by the New York Yankees March 12.
- Has appeared in 872 career ML games over eight ML seasons, batting .221 with 367 runs scored, 98 homers, 316 RBI and 64 stolen bases.
- Split the 2017 season between the Tampa Bay Rays, Seattle Mariners and Los Angeles Angels organizations...started and spent the majority of the season with the Angels, batting .162 over 77 games with six homers, 29 RBI and 27 runs scored...appeared in eight games with Seattle and eight games with Tampa Bay.
- Spent the first nine seasons of his pro career in the Washington Nationals organization...in 2016, set career highs with 24 HR and 72 RBI...named NL "Player of the Week" June 27-July 3...hit by pitch 20 times; the most by a Washington/Montreal player since F.B. Santangelo (23) in 1998...appeared in five playoff games.
