Sunday Finale – The Pawtucket Red Sox close out their three-game series and six-game road trip when they square off with the first-place Durham Bulls tonight at 5:05 p.m. at beautiful Durham Bulls Athletic Park. The PawSox arrived in North Carolina fresh off a three-game sweep of the Norfolk Tides and in the midst of a season-long five-game winning streak. The Bulls, however, took Friday's opener, 3-1, and followed it up with a 5-3 victory Saturday night.

Start Me Up – The PawSox have received an excellent dose of starting pitching over the past week. In six of the last seven games, Pawtucket's starter has logged at least six innings without allowing more than one earned run. All told in those seven games, PawSox starters have combined to notch a 1.05 ERA (5 ER in 43 IP). Right-hander William Cuevas began to turn the tide for Pawtucket last Sunday at McCoy when he and reliever Brandon Workman combined on a three-hit shutout. Chandler Shepherd and Justin Haley then each allowed just one earned run over seven innings in each of the next two ballgames. Then on Thursday in the series finale in Norfolk, staff ace Jalen Beeks dealt his longest outing of the season (7 IP, 1 ER) before Cuevas (7 IP, 0 ER) and Shepherd (6 IP, 1 ER) provided strong starts this weekend in Durham.

Walk This Way – Offensively, the PawSox rank second in the International League with 187 walks, trailing only Syracuse (197). The PawSox, who average 3.53 walks per game as an offense, have been even more patient in the last week, walking at least four times in each of their past seven ballgames. Beginning with 7- and 6-walk performances to close out the last homestand at McCoy, the PawSox have averaged 5.14 walks in these past seven games. This season, Pawtucket boasts the most patient offense in the International League, ranking first in pitches per plate appearance (4.01) as a team.

High Five – Pawtucket's recent 5-game winning streak was its longest since a 5-gamer last August 7-11. Pawtucket allowed a total of only 7 runs in those 5 victories...1-0 and 6-1 vs. Lehigh Valley at McCoy on Sunday & Monday afternoons and 5-1, 4-2, and 4-3 in Norfolk from Tuesday-Thursday. PawSox pitchers in those 5 games were 5-0 with a 1.20 ERA (6 ER in 45 IP) – 45 IP, 27 H, 7 R, 6 ER, 6 BB, 44 SO. In the process they lowered their Team ERA from 3.82 on May 26 to 3.56.

Streaky Sox - Recently the PawSox have had a 4-game losing skid from May 16-20, a 5-game losing streak from May 23-26, and the 5-game winning streak from May 27-31. Before that winning streak, the Sox had lost 15 of their previous 19 games from May 7-26.

The Road Ahead – This 6-game road trip (3-2 thus far) concludes tonight at 5:05 p.m. After an off-day on Monday, the PawSox will begin a 6-game homestand this coming Tuesday that features 3-game sets against both Louisville and Indianapolis from June 5-10. The Sox will host the Louisville Bats for games next Tuesday & Wednesday nights at 6:15 pm and Thursday morning at 11:05 am. The Indianapolis Indians will visit McCoy next weekend for games Friday at 7:05 pm (on YurView on COX and Worcester Spectrum TV3), Saturday at 6:15 pm (on myRITV), and Sunday at 1:35 pm (also on myRITV).

The End to a Hectic May - The PawSox finished an extremely busy May on Thursday night with a 13-17 record for the month. Pitchers posted a 3.60 ERA in May (103 ER in 257.2 IP) while batters hit .227 (217-for-955) with 22 HR and 97 runs in 30 May games (for an average of 3.2 runs per game). The Sox played 30 games in 31 days in May with just one scheduled off-day (May 17) during the entire month. June will be a bit better with two scheduled off-days (June 4 & 18) and with "only" 29 games in 30 days (including a make-up doubleheader at home vs. Buffalo on June 19 at 4:35 pm).

Gaining Ground – The PawSox (now at 24-29) were a season-low 8-games below .500 on May 26 at 19-27. It was their lowest point since they ended last year with a 67-75 record. On May 6 the Sox had matched their season-high of 3-games over the .500 mark (at 15-12) from April 28 when they were 11-8.

2017 Season-Series vs. Durham – The PawSox won the season-series over the Bulls by a 5-2 count in 2017. One year ago, the teams met in Durham from June 2-4 with the Bulls winning the first and last games (6-4 and 5-4) sandwiched around a 6-4 PawSox victory. About a week prior to that, however, Pawtucket swept a 4-game series at McCoy...beating the Bulls 5-4 (in 12 innings), 6-2, 7-1, and 3-1 during a 4-game set from May 26-29.

Stats vs. Durham Last Season – The PawSox received strong pitching vs. Durham last season. Sox hurlers went 5-2 with a 3.09 ERA and a .229 batting average against with 63 strikeouts in 64 innings vs. the Bulls in 2017. PawSox batters hit just .233 but they scored 35 runs during the 7 games thanks to 9 HR.

Durham Dry at McCoy – Pawtucket has won each of their last 7 meetings with Durham at McCoy Stadium (finishing 4-0 last season and going 3-0 in 2016). The last Durham win at McCoy came in the final meeting of the 2015 season on May 3 by an 8-2 score. Pawtucket will host the Bulls in about 2½ months for a 4-game series from August 16-19 at McCoy.

PawSox Bullish on Durham – The PawSox hold the lead in the all-time series between these two clubs since Durham arrived in the International League in 1998. Pawtucket is 92-66 all-time vs. the Bulls during the regular-season going 46-30 at McCoy Stadium in Pawtucket and 46-36 in Durham. The PawSox are 4-8 in the post-season vs. Durham as the Sox lost in the Governors' Cup Finals to the Bulls in both 2003 (0-3) and 2013 (1-3) but won the 2014 Cup Finals (3-2).

Two of the Best This Decade – Two of the most successful franchises in recent times in the International League are meeting this weekend in Durham. Pawtucket went to the Championship Series three years in a row from 2012-14, won two Governors' Cups (2012 & 2014), and had been to the postseason four straight years (2011-14) until missing the playoffs each of the last three seasons. Durham went to back-to-back Championship Series in 2013 (defeating the PawSox) and 2014 (losing to the PawSox) and then last year defeated Scranton/WB, 3 games to 1 to win yet another Governors' Cup.

Durham Dynasty – Durham has won the IL South 8 times in the last 11 seasons and the Bulls have made 14 postseason appearances in 20 seasons since joining the International League. Durham joined the IL in 1998 and has since made 11 trips to the Cup Finals (and 7 times in the last 11 years)...losing in 1998, 1999, 2007, 2008, 2010, and 2014 (to the PawSox) and winning in 2002, 2003 (over Pawtucket), 2009, 2013 (over the PawSox again), and 2017.

April Comes up a Winner – The PawSox posted a winning April for the 6th time in the last 8 years as they finished the month with an 11-10 record and in 2nd-place in the IL North (-2 GB of front-running Syracuse). Pawtucket has had just one losing month of April since 2010 and that came last year (10-12). The Sox hit .233 in April with 16 HR in 21 games while pitchers were 11-10 with a 3.51 ERA along with a league-leading 230 strikeouts in 190 innings.

One and Done – The PawSox are 12-6 in 1-run games this season (.667) for the secod-best winning pct. in 1-run affairs in the league.

Throwing Strikes – Pawtucket pitchers are 2nd in the International League with 496 strikeouts. Durham leads with 536 SO. Sox hurlers have posted strikeout games of 20 (April 9), 18 (April 20), 15 (twice), 14 (twice), 13, 12 (four times), 11 (three times), and 10 (nine times) this season.

Defensive – Last year the PawSox led the International League with a .987 fielding pct. while making a league-low 64 errors on the season (both new franchise-records). This season the Sox are last in the league with a .975 fielding pct. (a league-high 45 errors in 1836 total chances).

Working Overtime – The PawSox, along with Buffalo (4-2), Norfolk & Louisville (both 3-3) and Gwinnett (1-5), have played an IL-high six extra inning games already this season, and they are 5-1 in those. Pawtucket has played five overtime games at home (winning 4 of those 5 extra inning games at McCoy).

Blanketed – The PawSox have been shutout a league-high 8 times this season. Last year it took until Game #133 on August 26 before the Sox were shutout for the 8th time (3-0 vs. Lehigh Valley). Pawtucket was blanked 9 times total in 2017. They went 18-9 in shuout games last year. They are 4-8 in shutout games thus far in 2018.

A Look Back Before We Go Forth – Pawtucket finished 67-75 last year and in 4th-place in the IL North for the second straight season. They dropped to a season-low 9-games under .500 on August 26 at 62-71. On July 18, 2017 the PawSox were a season-best 6-games over .500 at 50-44. Pawtucket finished 34-36 in games played at McCoy Stadium last season. Thus they finished with just their second losing season at McCoy in the last 8 years. The Sox went 33-39 on the road.

BOSTON RED SOX DEVELOPMENT SYSTEM –

Portland (19-35) – The Portland Sea Dogs (AA) blasted the Harrisburg Senators, 14-5, on the road on Saturday, notching season-highs in runs (14) and hits (tied for the best performance, 17). Jantzen Witte drove in five runs for the first time in his professional career. In 22 games with Portland, Witte is slashing .360/.424/.651 with 5 HR and 27 RBI.

Salem (26-26) – The Salem Red Sox (A) fell to Wilmington, 7-5, on Saturday. Jordan Wren hit the first home run of his professional career in the loss. Roniel Raudes takes the ball in the rubber game Sunday at 4:05 PM.

Greenville (15-38) – The Greenville Drive (A) thumped the Asheville Tourists, 13-5, at home on Saturday night. Tanner Nishioka led the 16-hit effort by going 4-for-4 with 3 RBIs. Right-hander Denyi Reyes gets the ball Sunday fresh off a complete-game shutout of Columbia last Sunday.

That's the first Free Youth Clinic of the season on June 9 from 2:00-3:15 pm followed by a 6:15 pm game against Indianapolis with post-game fireworks as well.

One of the hottest nights on the PawSox Calendar is Star Wars Fireworks night. It's typically the first to sell out. It's coming up Saturday, June 9 at 6:15 pm when the PawSox play Indianapolis at McCoy Stadium. So have the kids dress up, win prizes, and meet their favorite Star Wars characters and then enjoy a spectacultar post-game fireworks display set to Star Wars music presented by 94 WHJY.

PAWSOX PLAYER MOVES – None today. On Saturday, the Red Sox recalled **1B/LF Sam Travis** and **LHP Bobby Poyner** to Boston after placing RF Mookie Betts and 2B Dustin Pedroia on the disabled list. The PawSox, meanwhile, added **1B Adam Lind** after he was signed earlier this week as a free agent. **RHP Austin Maddox** also had his rehab assignment transferred back to Pawtucket from Double-A Portland. The PawSox are one below the roster limit with 24 active players (Maddox does not count against the 25-man limit).

Infielder **Tzu-Wei Lin** became the first player promoted from Pawtucket to Boston this season on April 10 (before returning on May 8). **Marcus Walden** was #2 following his quick recall on April 12 and then another recall on May 2 (but he is now back with the PawSox). **Bobby Poyner** became the third call-up (not including rehabbing players) on May 4 – he later returned to Pawtucket, went back in Boston, rejoined the PawSox and now is back with Boston. And most recently **Sam Travis** was recalled for the first time this season June 2.

The PawSox have employed 9 different Red Sox players on a rehab assignment already this season...LHP Drew Pomeranz (now back in Boston), RHP Steven Wright (twice but now back in Boston), LHP Bobby Poyner (optioned to Pawtucket, recalled again to Boston, and now back with the PawSox), INF Xander Bogaerts (since returned to Boston), RHP Tyler Thornburg (twice, but currently off rehab), INF/OF Brock Holt (now back with Boston), 2B Dustin Pedroia (now back with the Red Sox), RHP Austin Maddox (now back here with the PawSox), and RHP Hector Velazquez (returned to Boston).

It was another busy player movement year in 2017. The PawSox were involved in 221 player transactions during the 2017 season. Pawtucket employed 55 different players last season (28 pitchers & 27 position players). They had 18 different players promoted to Boston during the 2017 season (not including rehabbing players).
