### **BLUE ROCKS BREAKDOWN**

ROCKS USE FIVE RUN EXPLOSION FOR WIN: On Saturday, the Blue Rocks used a five run outburst in the seventh inning to earn a come-from-behind victory and stun the Lynchburg Hillcats by a 5-2 score at Frawley Stadium. The Blue Crew sent nine men to the plate in the seventh inning, scored five runs on five hits, highlighted by a game-tying, two-run homer from **Meibrys Viloria** and a two-run double from **Khalil Lee** to help seal the victory for the Rocks. The series finale between Wilmington and Lynchburg was postponed due to inclement weather Sunday afternoon.

**LONG BALL FUN:** With **Meibrys Viloria's** game-tying, two-run homer in the seventh inning Saturday night, it marked the sixth straight game the Rocks have clubbed a home run. The streak started on April 9 at Salem when **Angelo Castellano** hit his first home run as a Blue Rock. Since, **Xavier Fernandez**, **Chase Vallot**, **Rudy Martin**, and **Khalil Lee** have left the yard during the stretch. Wilmington is 2-4 during the six-game span. On the season, Wilmington has hit a home run in 8 of the first 10 games.

**STARTERS SEARCHING FOR A "W":** Despite that the majority of the outings made by the Blue Rocks starters have been solid, they still have yet to record a win this season. **-Starters:** 0-4 with a 4.66 ERA (46.1IP, 52H, 26R, 24ER, 22BB, 31K, 2HR) **-Bullpen:** 4-2 with a 2.56 ERA (38.2IP, 29H, 16R, 11ER, 19BB, 38K) -Overall, Wilmington's starters have allowed three earned runs or less in 8 of 10 starts.

**LEE PLAYING BEYOND HIS AGE:** As one of the youngest players in the CL at just 19-years-old, **Khalil Lee** has shown early on that he can handle Class-A Advanced pitching. -The highly touted prospect had his six-game hitting streak snapped Thursday night, but followed it up with a three-hit game Friday night and blasted his second homer of the

-Rankings in CL: He leads the league in on-base percentage (.513) and slugging percentage (.742) and is third in batting average (.387) -He has also reached base in every game he has played in this season. -He leads the team in home runs (2), RBI (6), total bases (23) and hits (12).

**PETERSON SCORCHING AT THE PLATE:** Outfielder Kort Peterson is heating up at the plate

**DEVITO DOING DAMAGE:** The Rocks slugging first baseman **Chris DeVito** has been another hot hitter for Wilmington. -Started the season with a four-game hit streak. -Has picked up a hit in three of his last four games. -Delivered go-ahead, two-out, two-run single in 8th inning in Thursday night's 4-2 win vs. LYN. -Has a hit in 7 of 10 games played this year. -Second on the team with five RBI.

**RUNNING ROCKS:** As a team, Wilmington leads the CL in stolen bases (23) and have only been caught twice this season. Bules Creek is second in the league with 15. -**MLB Ranking:** The Blue Rocks are tied for first in all of Minor League Baseball with 18 steals. -The St. Lucie Mets (FSL) are second and have 18 stolen bases. -Saturday night, the Rocks set a franchise single-game record by swiping five bases. **D.J. Burt** stole two while **Nick Heath, Khalil Lee** and **Rudy Martin** all stole a base in the win. -Outfielder **Rudy Martin** stole another base Saturday night to move his early-season total to 10 and he has only been caught once. -He has stolen at least one base in seven of his nine games played. -He leads the CL in the department. Three other players have six, including Carolina's **Luis Aviles Jr.** -Martin also leads all of MiLB with his mark. -In his career, Martin has stolen 72 bases and has only been caught 12 times.

**<u>GOING THE EXTRA BASE:</u>** -Of the 72 hits for the Blue Rocks through the first 10 games, 27 of them have gone for extra-bases, accounting for 38% of the total hits recorded by Wilmington. -Eight different players have hit at least one double and seven different players have hit one home run. -**Khalil Lee** is tied for third in the CL in extra-base hits with six (3 2B, 3B, 2HR)

**FISHING FOR MUDCATS:** This is the first meeting between these two inter-division foes as the two teams will meet just seven times this season. The Blue Rocks play host for the early week series before Wilmington will travel to Zebulon, North Carolina to visit the Mudcats from May 10-13. Last season, Wilmington dropped five of the seven contests against Carolina. The Mudcats' roster features the Brewers' top pick in the 2017 draft **Keston Hiura**. Entering the season, the 21-year-old was rated the top-prospect in Milwaukee's system by MLBPipeline.com and No. 2 per *Baseball America*. Both publications also had him listed as a Top-100 prospect in baseball. (No. 56 MLBPipeline.com / No. 47 *Baseball America*.) Carolina also has former first-round picks in **Clint Coulter** (2012) and **Nathan Kirby** (2015).

Left-handed hurler Cristian Castillo makes his third start of the year. Suffered his first loss of the season on April 10 at Salem. He worked 5.2 innings of work, allowed three earned runs on four hits, walked three and struck out three.

## Pitch Repertoire: Fastball, Changeup, Curveball, Slider

THE BOOK ON CRISTIAN CASTILLO: Castillo signed as a 20-year-old out of Mexico in December of 2014 and returns to Wilmington for his second season. In 2017, he went 7-12 with a 4.13 ERA in 26 starts. Last season with Wilmington, the lefty was a Carolina League All-Star and was one of the best pitchers leading up to the mid-summer classic with a 5-1 record and 2.32 ERA during May and June. He also ranked fifth overall in the Carolina League in innings pitched at season's end. The southpaw allowed three earned runs or less in 19 of his 26 starts with the Blue Rocks last season. Since joining the Royals' organization, al he has done in three pro seasons is rack up the accolades at every level he's pitched at. Castillo earned the Appalachian League Pitcher of the Year in 2016 by going 6-3 with a 3.13 ERA, 73 strikeouts and just 14 free passes in 72 frames. He led the league in innings pitched, strikeouts and WHIP, and was fourth in earned run average. In his first season in the system in 2015, he was named the Royals Pitcher of the Year for their Dominican Summer League when he posted a 2.64 ERA, fanned 58 and walked only 15 in 67.1 innings worked. Despite all of his awards for excellence, the six-foot, 190-pounder is not ranked among the Roy als top-30 prospects by Baseball America or MLB.com. He did however impress the Royals brass enough to jump both Rookie Idaho Falls and Low-A Lexington a year ago to begin the season with Advanced-A Wilmington. The southpaw was the Opening Day starter for the Blue Rocks this season. In his last time our on April 10 at Salem, he suffered the loss and allowed three earned runs on four hits in 5.2 innings of work

WHAT HE LEARNED FROM 2017: Making the kind of jump Castillo did can be a tough adjustment for man young pitchers due to the length of the season and the constant stress on a players body. Castillo recognized th challenges first hand."I learned how to work during a long season. It was my first year in full-season basebal and it showed me I had to work a little more this offseason to be ready for this year. Last year, I felt a little tirec but I think that was part of the process. Now, I feel ready for this season. I worked hard on my conditioning, my egs and I lifted weights to be ready for spring. As a pitcher, legs are always a key when you are on the mound believe that and being healthy overall is the most important thing. Without having health, you can't pitch.

ON HIS ABILITY TO THROW FOUR OUALITY PITCHES: Although Castillo has vet to be tabbed a top 30 prospect, scouts are impressed with the southpaw's ability to command all four pitches. Castillo thinks the command of his repertoire is vital to his success. "That's helped me a lot in my career. I can throw whatever pitch I want no matter the count. This year, I want to try and throw my slider more. It's become a really good pitch and I have if facter than my curveball, but for me it doen't matter. I will throw all my sitches but the slider is command. have it faster than my curveball, but for me it doesn't matter. I will throw all my pitches, but the slider is something I want to work on." Castillo said he wants to incorporate his entire arsenal right from the start this season. had the slider last year, but I didn't use it enough. To start the season, I used only three of my pitches and in the second season I used my slider to give me four pitches. This year, I will start throwing my slider in my first start."

PROUD OF HIS HERITAGE: Castillo always cracks a smile when asked what it means to represent his home country of Mexico. "I feel proud to represent my country. I always like to listen to Mexican music before every start in the clubhouse. It helps me get ready and give more than 100% every game." He also grew up idolizing a popular Los Angeles Dodgers pitcher and fellow Mexico native. "I really enjoy watching Fernando Valenzuela who is the most famous player from Mexico and he's a left-hander. So I try to learn from what he did during his games. I never had the chance to meet him, but I was able to learn about him from my family. They taught me a lot about him. Now, I can watch videos of him pitching and enjoy it. Here in the U.S. you face a lot of good hitters and talented players every day. But in Mexico, you need to play very well and be the best you can just to get the chance to be able to play here.

BEING NAMED OPENING DAY STARTER VS. CL-ALL STAR: Being named an All-Star and ther Opening Day starter a year later could give young pitchers added excitement. For Castillo, the calm demeanor he possesses on the mound translates off the field as well. "It made me proud (to be named Opening Day Starter) because I know I've been working hard to help the team. For me i doesn't matter. Both are really great and I'm just happy I can represent my team and organization.
