### **BLUE ROCKS BREAKDOWN**

#### HOME: 4-5 | AWAY: 5-6 | STREAK: W1 | LAST 5: 2-3 | LAST 10: 5-5

**BLUE ROCKS BLANK P-NATS TO SALVAGE SERIES:** Timely hitting and dominant pitching powered the Wilmington Blue Rocks to a 5-0 win over the Potomac Nationals to salvage the three-game series Thursday night at Frawley Stadium. **Brandon Downes** smacked a home run in his season debut while right-hander **Arnaldo Hernandez** worked around early trouble to throw five scoreless innings and earned the win. **Emmanuel Rivera** paced the offense with three hits and also drove in a run. The victory also snapped a three-game losing streak for the Blue Crew.

**<u>OUITE THE DEBUT</u>:** Outfielder **Brandon Downes** made his 2018 debut Thursday night and put together a solid game at the plate. He hit a two-run home run in the fourth inning to ignite the offense and also drew two walks. Downes is no stranger to playing in Wilmington and is now in his fourth stint with the Blue Crew. Last season, the South Plainfield, N.J. native led the Rocks with 13 home runs despite battling through two injuries (hip and broken hamate bone) and played in just 71 games. In 2016, he also paced the team with 12 home runs and hit .230 in 130 games.

LONG BALL FUN: With Brandon Downes' two-run blast Thursday night, the Rocks have now clubbed a home run in 12 of the first 20 games. -That also includes six consecutive games from April 9-14 where the Rocks hit a home run. -The streak started on April 9 at Salem when Angelo Castellano hit his first home run as a Blue Rock. Xavier Fernandez, Vallot, Rudy Martin, Khalil Lee and Meibrys Viloria all left the yard during the

-Wilmington went 2-4 during that span and are 6-6 overall when they hit a home run this season.
-The Rocks are third in the Carolina League with 13 home runs.
-Last season, the Blue Rocks did not hit double digit home runs until May 1.

LEE PLAYING BEYOND HIS AGE: As one of the youngest players in the CL at just 19-years-old, Khalil Lee has shown that he can handle Carolina League pitching.
-He picked up his third, multi-RBI game of the season Wednesday night.
-Rankings in CL: Tied for second in walks (17), 6th in OBP% (.429) and 7th in OPS (.882).
-He is top-five on the team in hits (.882, 1st), hits (17, 2nd), HR (2, T-2nd), runs (10, 2nd), RBI (11, T-2nd)
-He had his 11-game on-base streak snapped on April 18.
-During the streak, he hit .378 (14-for-37) with three doubles, a triple, two home runs, six RBI, 10 walks and posted a 1.186 OPS.
-He also has picked up a hit in all but six games played this season.

ROLLING ON THE RIVERA: Third baseman Emmanuel Rivera has been the most consistent bat in the Wilmington lineup over the last 10 games.
-He posted his first three-hit game of the season and drove in a run Thursday night.
-In his last 10 games, he is hitting .316 (12-for-38) with five runs scored and nine RBI.
-Rivera had his eight-game hitting streak snapped Tuesday night, against Potomac.
-He hit .313 (10-for-32) during the stretch.
-It marked the longest hitting streak by a Blue Rock this season.
-He has laso been a run producer and leads the team with 13 RBI.
-Has collected a hit in all but five games this season.
-Coming off 2017 season in which he won the South Atlantic League batting title. (.310 in 122 gms)

RUDY BEING RUDY: Rudy Martin continues his success as the Blue Rocks' leadoff hitter.
Martin picked up a hit and stole a base Thursday and was also the catalyst in the Rocks' early offense in both Tuesday and Wednesday against Potomac.
On April 19 at Frederick, Martin finished 3-for-5, falling a home run shy of the cycle.
He also tied a career-high with five RBI in the victory.
His 14 stolen bases are also the most in the Carolina League, MiLB and MLB. (Trea Turner of Washington has 10 in MLB)
First in the CL with 20 walks, which is also second-most in all of MiLB.
Also is second in the Carolina League in on-base percentage (.444).
In his career, he has stolen 76 bases and only caught 14 times.

**RUNNING ROCKS:** As a team, Wilmington is second in the Carolina League with 36 stolen bases and have only been caught six times this season. Buies Creek leads the CL with 43. -Overall, the Blue Rocks have five different players with multiple stolen bases this season. -Martin (14), Nick Heath (7), DJ. Burt (6), Lee (5) and Gabriel Cancel (2). -On April 7, at Potoamc, the Rocks set a franchise single-game record by swiping five bases. Martin stole three, while Burt and Heath each swiped a bag in a 5-4 win for Wilmington. The Blue Crew matched the mark on 4/14 at home against Lynchburg.

**DASHES ON THE DASH:** The 2018 roster for the Winston-Salem Dash is arguably the most prospect-laden squad in the Carolina League. The current roster features eight of the Chicago White Sox top-30 prospects per *Baseball America*. Outfielder **Luis Robert** (No. 4) leads the way but is on the disabled list. The other notable names on the roster are outfielders **Blake Rutherford** (No. 8), **Micker Adolfo** (No. 17), **Luis Alexander Basabe** (No. 18). **Jake Call** (No. 21), infielder **Gavin Sheets** (No. 9), and pitchers **Dylan Cease** (No. 10) and **Bernardo Flores** (No. 26) round out the talented group. The Dash are managed by first-year skipper Omar Vizquel. Vizquel, a 24-year MLB veteran, was a three-time All-Star and won 11 Gold Gloves, the second-most by a shortstop. He started his career with the Seattle Mariners (1989-1993) before enjoying most of his success with the Cleveland Indians (1994-2004). He then moved on to play for the San Francisco Giants (2005-2008), spent a season with the Texas Rangers (2009) before playing his final three seasons with the Chicago White Sox (2010-11) and the Toronto Blue Jays (2012).

THEY SAID IT, MANAGER DARRYL KENNEDY: (On series finale win): "Any time you can stop a losing streak before it gets out of hand is always big. A couple disappointing losses the last couple nights, but we were able to put it together (Thursday night). The pitching did a great job for us tonight. It was still a close game up until the seventh inning, but I thought we worked out of some jams and made some pitches when we really needed it and that was the difference."

# **TODAY'S BLUE ROCKS STARTING PITCHER**

# #43 LHP Cristian Castillo

### Pitch Repertoire: Fastball, Changeup, Curveball, Slider

**THE BOOK ON CRISTIAN CASTILLO:** Castillo signed as a 20-year-old out of Mexico in December of 2014 and returns to Wilmington for his second season. In 2017, he went 7-12 with a 4.13 ERA in 26 starts, Last season with Wilmington, the lefty was a Carolina League All-Star and was one of the best pitchers leading up to the mid-summer classic with a 5-1 record and 2.32 ERA during May and June. He also ranked fifth overall in the Carolina League in innings pitched at season's end. The southpaw allowed three earned runs or less in 19 of his 26 starts with the Blue Rocks last season. Since joining the Royals' organization, all he has done in three pro seasons is rack up the accolades at every level he's pitched at. Castillo earned the Appalachian League Pitcher of the Year in 2016 by going 6-3 with a 3.13 ERA, 73 strikeouts and just 14 free passes in 72 frames. He led the league in innings pitched, strikeouts and WHIP, and was fourth in earned run average. In his first season in the system in 2015, he was named the Royals Pitcher of the Year for their Dominican Summer League when he posted a 2.64 ERA, fanned 58 and walked only 15 in 67.1 innings worked. Despite all of his awards for excellence, the six-foot, 190-pounder is not ranked among the Royals top-30 prospects by Baseball America or MLB.com. He did however impress the Royals brass enough to jump both Rookie Idaho Falls and Low-A Lexington a year ago to begin the season. In his last time out on April 21 at Frederick, he did not factor in the decision and allowed a career-high eight earned runs and tied his career-high with 11 hits allowed in 2.2 innings of work. In each of his previous three starts, he allowed just three earned runs or less.

WHAT HE LEARNED FROM 2017: Making the kind of jump Castillo did can be a tough adjustment for many young pitchers due to the length of the season and the constant stress on a players body. Castillo recognized the challenges first hand. "I learned how to work during a long season. It was my first year in full-season baseball and it showed me I had to work a little more this offseason to be ready for this year. Last year, I felt a little tired but I think that was part of the process. Now, I feel ready for this season. I worked hard on my conditioning, my legs and I lifted weights to be ready for spring. As a pitcher, legs are always a key when you are on the mound. I believe that and being healthy overall is the most important thing. Without having health, you can't pitch."

ON HIS ABILITY TO THROW FOUR QUALITY PITCHES: Although Castillo has yet to be tabbed a top-30 prospect, scouts are impressed with the southpaw's ability to command all four pitches. Castillo thinks the command of his repertoire is vital to his success. "That's helped me a lot in my career. I can throw whatever pitch I want no matter the count. This year, I want to try and throw my slider more. It's become a really good pitch and I have it faster than my curveball, but for me it doesn't matter. I will throw all my pitches, but the slider is something I want to work on." Castillo said he wants to incorporate his entire arsenal right from the start this season. "I had the slider last year, but I didn't use it enough. To start the season, I used only three of my pitches and in the second season I used my slider to give me four pitches. This year, I will start throwing my slider in my first start."

**PROUD OF HIS HERITAGE:** Castillo always cracks a smile when asked what it means to represent his 2011 home country of Mexico. "I feel proud to represent my country. I always like to listen to Mexican music before every start in the clubhouse. It helps me get ready and give more than 100% every game." He also 2011 grew up idolizing a popular Los Angeles Dodgers pitcher and fellow Mexico native. "I really enjoy watching Fernando Valenzuela who is the most famous player from Mexico and he's a left-hander. So I try to learn from what he did during his games. I never had the chance to meet him, but I was able to learn about him from my family. They taught me a lot about him. Now, I can watch videos of him pitching and enjoy it. Here in the U.S. you face a lot of good hitters and talented players every day. But in Mexico, you need to play very well and be the best you can just to get the chance to be able to play here."

BEING NAMED OPENING DAY STARTER VS. CL-ALL STAR: Being named an All-Star and then Opening Day starter a year later could give young pitchers added excitement. For Castillo, the calm demeanor he possesses on the mound translates off the field as well. "It made me proud (to be named Opening Day Starter) because I know I've been working hard to help the team. For me it doesn't matter. Both are really great and I'm just happy I can represent my team and organization."
