BLUE ROCKS DROP SERIES FINALE AT POTOMAC: After the offense put on a clinic in the middle game of the series, the Wilmington Blue Rocks were unable to duplicate the offensive explosion in the series finale and fell to the Potomac Nationals 12-2 Thursday night at Plitzner Stadium. The 12 runs allowed were the most allowed by Blue Rocks' pitching this season. Wilmington was held to five hits with **Kort Peterson** picking up three of the hits in his first game batting leadoff this season.

THAT WAS OUICK: The Blue Rocks return to the Riverfront for a six-game homestand after a brief, three-game trek to Potomac. The Rocks dropped two of three in the series losing the opening game of the series 6-5. The rallying Rocks almost pulled off the comeback after trailing by six runs after five innings. Wilmington scored the final five runs of the game, including two in the ninth inning with two outs. Khalil Lee ripped a two-run triple to make it a 6-5 game before he was left stranded at third to end the game. On Wednesday, the Rocks' offense erupted for 12 runs and a season-high 16 hits in a 12-7 win. Chase Vallot hit a pair of homers and drove in four while Emmanuel Rivera picked up four hits and also drove in four runs.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION: The Rocks racked up a season-high 16 hits in Wednesday night's win. It marked just the second time this season the offense has tallied double-digit hits. The first occasion was on April 21 at Frederick when the Blue Crew pounded out 14 hits in a 12-10 win against the Keys. Wilmington also used a pair of five-run innings Wednesday in the third and seventh innings to pull away from the P-Nats. Six different Blue Rocks drove in a run in the victory.

LONG BALL FUN: With **Chase Vallot's** pair of homers in Wednesday's win, the Rocks have now clubbed a home run in 15 of the first 26 games this season. -The two long balls gave Vallot his fourth and fifth on the season which paces the Blue Rocks and tied for the most in the Carolina League.

-He joins outfielder Kort Peterson as the only Blue Rocks this season to have multi-home run games.
-It was Vallot's second-career multi-home run game. His first was with the Rocks last year at Frederick on June 26.
-He also became the first Blue Rock hitter this season to bash a home run in back-to-back games and first since Brandon Downes went yard in back-to-back contests on August 12-13 last season at Salem.
-All five home runs hit by Vallot have been on the road. Vallot has two solo home runs, a two-run blast, a three-run homer and a grand slam to his ledger this season.
-From April 9-14, the Rocks hit a home run in six consecutive games.
-Wilmington went 2-4 during that span and are 8-7 overall when they hit a home run this season.
-The Rocks are tied for fourth in the Carolina League with 18 home runs.

ROLLING ON THE RIVERA: Third baseman Emmanuel Rivera has been the most consistent bat in the

Wilmington lineup. -Rivera posted season-highs with four hits and four RBI in Wilmington's 12-7 win Wednesday. -Over his last 17 games, the Puetto Rico native is hitting .318 (21-for-66) with three doubles, a triple, 14 RBI, five walks and has scored eight runs.

-Rivera had an eight game hitting streak from April 14-22 and hit .313 (10-for-32) during the stretch.
-It stands as the longest hitting streak by a Blue Rock this season.
-He has also been a run producer and leads the team with 18 RBI.
-Leads the team with 27 hits and six doubles.
-Coming off 2017 season in which he won the South Atlantic League batting title. (.310 in 122 gms)

BURT PROVIDING THE HURT: Second-year infielder D.J. Burt has been off to a torrid start in his new

-He picked up two hits in Monday's loss at Potomac and is hitting .362 (17-for-47) in 14 games to go with a .466 OBP. -He now has five multi-hit games, which is tied for second-most on the team. -Last season, Burt was the primary second baseman. This year, he has been called upon to play both middle infield positions and also made his first-career start in the outfield earlier this year.

DOWNES OFF TO STRONG START: Brandon Downes is no stranger to Wilmington and Carolina League pitching and is off to a fast start in his fourth stint with the Blue Rocks. On Wednesday, he hit a pair of doubles in the Rocks' win. He also has driven in multiple runs in three of his seven games played since joining the roster on April 26. He is already tied for third on the team with two home runs and tied for sixth with eight RBI. He has 27 career home runs and is four shy of tying Raul Gonzalez (31 HR, 1993-95) for the third-most home runs in franchise history.

RUNNING ROCKS: As a team, Wilmington is second in the Carolina League with 38 stolen bases and have been caught 11 times this season. Buies Creek leads the CL with 46. -Overall, the Blue Rocks have five different players with multiple stolen bases this season. -Martin (14), Nick Heath (7), D.J. Burt (7), Lee (6) and Gabriel Cancel (2). -On April 7, at Potoamc, the Rocks set a franchise single-game record by swiping five bases. Martin stole three, while Burt and Heath each swiped a bag in a 5-4 win for Wilmington. The Blue Crew matched the mark on 4/14 at home against Lunchburg. mark on 4/14 at home against Lynchburg.

KEYS POINTS: The Frederick Keys enter this series in fifth place in the Northern Division after a tough

Actor Start to the 2018 campaign. -After a solid 3-0 start to the year, the Keys went 5-16 the rest of April. -They have started off better to begin May and have posted back-to-back wins for the first time since the 3-0 start. -Offensively, the Keys rank 7th in batting average (.235) fifth in walks (107) and have struck out the fewest times of any team in the circuit (194) -On the mound, Frederick has the second-highest ERA (4.50), third-most hits given up (231) and tied for third-most home runs allowed (17).

<u>APRIL IN REVIEW</u>: The Rocks finished the opening month of the campaign with an 11-12 record. -That was a three win improvement from last season, when the Blue Crew went 8-15 in the first month of 2017. -Entering May, the Rocks are tied for first in the CL in walks (104), second in stolen bases (37), tied for third in home runs (15), sixth in OBP% (.323) but are last in batting average (.224). -On the mound, the Rocks finished April tied for third in shutouts (3), sixth in team ERA (3.85) and earned runs allowed (86).

-Righty **Jace Vines** makes his sixth start of the season and second against Frederick -He was drafted in the 4th round of the 2016 Draft by Kansas City out of Texas A&M. -Last time out on April 28 against Winston-Salem, he earned his first win of the year. -He allowed just one run on four hits, did not walk a batter and struck out a season-high six. The win snapped a four-game losing streak for Vines on the mound in which he went 0-4 with a 10.26 ERA during the stretch.

 Over his last two starts, Vines has allowed just two earned runs in 11.2 innings. -In his previous four outings, the righty allowed 18 runs in 16.2 innings of work. -Against Frederick on April 22 he made his first quality start of the season and allowed three runs, one earned, on five hits, walked one and struck out three in six innings Spent last season with Lexington (Low-A), Wilmington and Omaha.(Triple-A) In Lexington, he posted a 9-5 record with a 3.42 ERA in 19 appearances including 14 starts. Pitched 100 innings and allowed 96 hits, 45R/38ER, walked 23

and struck out 63.

Named a South Atlantic League All-Star.

-Joined the Blue Rocks in mid-July last year and went 3-3 with a 3.60 ERA in seven starts. -In 40 innings of work he allowed 16 earned runs, struck out 20 and walked 15. -Also tossed two complete games (both seven-inning games) on 8/16 and 9/3. -Made spot start for Triple-A Omaha and tossed six innings and allowed two earned runs and struck out three.

Features a heavy sinker, a 4-seam and 2-seam fastball, a slider and change up. Was not highly recruited out of high school because he wasn't pitching a lot and said "I wasn't very good and wasn't throwing hard."

-Went 10-1 with 1.77 ERA at Tyler Junior College in 2015 and named NJCAA Division I Pitcher of the Year.

-Attended Texas A&M in 2016, the alma mater of both of his parents.

Right-hander Ofelky Peralta makes his fifth start of the season for the Keys and his second against the Blue Rocks.

-He signed with the Baltimore Orioles as a free agent in 2013. - Entered the season as the No. 22 prospect in Baltimore's system per *Baseball America*. -In his last start at Buies Creek on April 28, he suffered the loss and allowed five earned runs on six hits, walked two and struck out two in 3.1 innings of work. -In his start against the Blue Rocks on April 22, he earned the win and tossed six strong innings. He allowed and earned runs on three hits, walked one and struck out three. -In 2017 he struggled against Wilmington.

-Went 0-3 with a 9.00 ERA in three starts. 10 IP, 11R/10ER, 13BB, 7K

-Last season, he spent the entire year with Frederick and posted a 2-10 record in 26 starts. Was one of the youngest pitchers in the Carolina League at 20-years-old.

-In 104.2 innings, he yielded a 5.42 ERA, allowed 109 hits, 71R/63ER,

walked 86 and struck out 95 batters.

Walks were an issue for the righty last season and he paced the CL in that category.

THE BOOK ON JACE VINES: It has been quite a whirlwind for Jace Vines over the last half-decade. In high school Vines was primarily a position player who actually turned to pitching only after he lost his starting job at second base. Vines tossed just 20 innings as a senior though and was forced to walk-on at Weatherford Junior College where he red-shirted and served as the team's announcer. Vines then moved on to Tyler Junior College where he fed-shirted and only season the Prosper, Texas native was tabbed NJCAA Division I Pitcher of the Year and earned NJCAA All-America First Team recognition. He posted a 10-1 record with a 1.77 ERA, 68 strikeouts just seven walks and won the NJCAA Division II National Championship. The effort earned him a scholar-ship at Texas A&M where he spent one season before being drafted by the Royals in the fourth round last June. After signing for a reported \$375,000 Vines made 12 appearances with the Idaho Falls Chukars in the Pioneer League. He opened last season in Low-A where he was named a mid-season South Atlantic League All-Star and went 9-5 with a 3.42 ERA in 19 games (14 starts) with Lexington. With the Rocks, he made seven starts and went 3-3 with a 3.60 ERA in 40 innings of work. He also made a spot start for Triple-A Omaha last August and did not factor in the decision and allowed just two runs over six innings. Vines snapped his four-game losing streak on the mound in his last start at home against Winston-Salem on April 28. He turned in his best start of the season and tossed 5.2 innings, allowed just an earned run on four hits, did not walk a batter and struck out a season-high six. It ended a four start stretch in which he went 0-4 with a 10.26 ERA. In his last two outings, Vines has allowed just two runs starts, he allowed 18 earned runs in 16.2 innings.

A TASTE OF TRIPLE-A: Some players never get the chance to make the bigs, let alone pitch at the level right below it in Triple-A. Last season, Vines was able to experience what it's like to pitch at the highest minor league level. "That was amazing. When you get a taste of that, you want to get back as soon as you can. I think going there, having success in that outing showed that my stuff can play up there too. I don't think I'm near a complete pitcher in my mind, but when I get my secondary stuff working, tweaking things and making adjustments, I think I'll be ready the next time I get back up there." He found out about his brief promotion when Willmington was on the road." We were actually getting on the bus from Salem. I think it was the last road trip of the year. Jamie (Quirk) called me in his office and said they need you up there. I though the meant Double-A at first, but he said he thought they are in Nashville. I sait to myself, that's not Double-A. It kind of took me by surprise and I was a little speechless at first, but it was a great time."

A WINDING PATH TO PROFESSIONAL BASEBALL: "In high school I didn't pitch a lot and didn't have any offers. I wasn't throwing very hard and wasn't very good. I walked on at a Division I junior college in Texas. When I was there, my coach took all the redshirts aside and said we need an announcer for the game. This was about two hours before the game and we all looked at each other and said I'm not doing that. I ended up stepping up once they said we would get paid to do it I said I would take that. After that, Vines played at Tyler Junior College and put together a superb season and also met his girlfriend and now wife. "Like I said, God has helped open so many doors and He took me to a new college and that's where I met my wife. Emily. She was at Tyler Junior College and playing volleyball there at the time. I had good success there and the coach helped me tweak some things and it took off from there. I was committed to one school, the coach got fired and Texas A&M came around and offered 2 me and that was the perfect fit for me. Then, I had what I thought was a mediocre year and the Royals took me in the fourth round. It has been amazing ever since."

PLAYING FOR TEXAS A&M.: "It was unbelievable to be on that team. The facilities were top notch, the coaching staff, the strength coach and the players you are playing with are players you watched on TV the last couple years. It was such a surreal feeling and to have my parents, who attended the university, relive their memories and come back and see me put the maroon and white and all that stuff. It was a great thing for my family." 2017/

LEARNING ON AND OFF THE FIELD: Vines has made it known he is a student of the game and always makes necessary adjustments to become better each season. He also is learning off the field thanks to his recent marriage. "It's just a new experience every day. We got married in January and it was perfect. This is the first time we live together. She's at home right now because we are trying to figure out a living situation. It's been a blessing to not having to miss her, worry about her and to have her on this journey with me. She's my biggest fan and supporter. With a busy schedule during the season, Vines took advantage of the slower schedule in the winter. "It hasn't been too hard. In the offseason it was easy. It wasn't too hard and it's been a lot of fun so far."
