#### BLUE ROCKS BREAKDOWN

HOME: 14-11 | AWAY: 17-8 | STREAK: W2 | LAST 5: 3-2 | LAST 10: 7-3

WALK THIS WAY: The Wilmington Blue Rocks let a three-run lead slip away in the eighth inning on Sunday, but still walked off a winner, beating the Myrtle Beach Pelicans 6-5 at Frawley Stadium. Brewer Hicklen's sacrifice fly sent the fans home happy in the ninth as the Rocks improved to 31-19 on the year—the highest they have been above .500 in 2019.

TOP OF THE STANDINGS TO YOU: Wilmington has been in first place for more than three-quarters of the 2019 season—42 of the campaign's first 52 days. The Blue Crew lead Frederick by five games with 19 contests remaining in the season's opening half.

SOLID DEBUT: Kris Bubic left in line to get the win in his Advanced-A debut. The righty got three strikeouts in his first inning as a Blue Rock and held the Pelicans to just two runs on two hits, but four walks in five frames. Bubic was one of four pitchers taken by the Royals in the first 40 selections of the 2018 Draft. That entire quartet now resides in Wilmington.

KILLING IT IN CLOSE CONTESTS: Wilmington has excelled in close contests this season. The Blue Crew lead the Carolina League with 22 games decided by a single score in 2019 and have played 32 affairs with a margin of victory of two-or-less. The Rocks are an impressive 24-8 in those close calls including 18-4 in one-run decisions. They are also stellar at holding late leads, going 18-1 when taking an advantage into the eighth inning and 19-0 when leading after eight—granted they took a circuitous route to continuing that trend on Sunday. Wilmington went almost 11 months between walk-off wins from last May until April 9 of this year. But the Blue Crew are making up for lost time with three already in 2019 (against the Dash, Keys and Pelicans) and two in the last two weeks alone.

**LETHAL VERSUS LEFTIES:** The Blue Rocks are 14-4 on the season against southpaw starting pitching. Conversely, Wilmington is just 17-15 when opposing righties.

<u>FUN IN THE SUN:</u> The Rocks have enjoyed great success in daylight this season. Wilmington improved to 8-1 in day games this season, with five of the victories featuring comebacks.

**LINE OF DEMARCATION:** Four has been the magic number for the Wilmington offense in 2019. When the Rocks score four times in a game they are 18-2 on the year. Conversely, when Wilmington manages just three scores or fewer in an affair the team is only 13-17.

LOOKING TO HEAT UP: Despite sitting atop the CL North for more than 80 percent of the season the Blue Rocks offense continues to be a work in progress. Wilmington won on Saturday despite getting out-hit 7-3. The Blue Crew actually have managed fewer hits than their opponents in 16 of their 31 wins in 2019. Wilmington showed some life on Sunday though, getting more hits in the first five frames than they did in the opening two games of the series combined. Overall the Rocks rank last in the CL in runs scored, hits, batting average and on-base percentage. Wilmington has recorded five hits or fewer in 23 games this year, but have managed to win 11 of them.

#### **Tomorrow's Starter for the Blue Crew**

Jackson Kowar will make his 10th start as a Blue Rock. The 33rd overall pick in the 2018 Draft out of the University of Florida signed with the Royals for \$2.14 million last summer. The righty entered 2019 as the seventh-ranked prospect in the Royals system. He spent his first professional season at Low-A Lexington where he helped the Legends win a South Atlantic League Championship. Kowar went 0-1 with a 3.42 ERA in nine total regular season starts, but posted a 1.06 ERA and a scant .125 batting average against over his final five outings, and then earned victories in both of his playoff starts.

THE BOOK ON BRADY SINGER: Brady Singer will make his 10th start of the season for the Blue Rocks and the 10th of his professional career. Singer was the Royals' first of three first-round picks (No. 18 overall) in last June's draft. The University of Florida product chose the college route over signing with the Toronto Blue Jays, who originally drafted him in the second round out of high school in 2015. The patience paid off when Singer signed for \$4.25 million with the Royals last summer. Singer won a national championship with the Gators in 2017 and then earned the Dick Howser Award last year despite pitching through a nagging hamstring injury.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Singer turned in his best start as a pro, allowing five hits in seven scoreless innings. That was the longest outing of his pro career. Singer has tossed 13.1 conecutive scoreless innings dating back to the fifth frame of his May 9 start against Salem.

**VERSUS OPPONENT:** This is Singer's first start against the Pelicans.

QUITE THE COLLEGE CAREER: Singer accomplished about everything a college pitcher possibly could during his junior season at Florida. He was named SEC Pitcher of the Year after leading the conference in wins and ERA. He won the Dick Howser Trophy--an award given annually to the nation's top college baseball player. He was also one of four finalists for the Golden Spikes Award, joining: Casey Mize (first overall pick), Kody Clemens (79th) and Andrew Vaughn and was named Baseball America College Baseball Player of the Year-- becoming the fourth player drafted by the Royals to earn the honor (Wil Myers--2012, Alex Gordon--2006 and Tom Gordon--1988.

FIRST-ROUND TRIO BUILDING A BOND: Last June, the Kansas City front office spent more than \$8 million on three college pitchers among the first 34 picks of the draft, selecting Singer 18th, Jackson Kowar 33rd and Daniel Lynch at No. 34. Fortunately for the Royals, the trio gets along great. Singer and Kowar lived together for three years at the University of Florida. Lynch and Kowar roomed together last season in Lexington, and all three got an apartment together this season in Wilmington. "We understand that we're all in this thing kind of together," Lynch says. "The Royals have done a great job of expressing that to us. It's not about who's going to be the ace, it's about being teammates, having success as a team and about us moving up together."

HYPER-COMPETITIVE: Singer is a bulldog of a competitor. He lives for it. In fact, teammate Jackson Kowar calls him the most competitive person he's ever met. The best example came on national television last season. Singer was on the mound for the Gators in Game Three of the NCAA Super Regionals against Wake Forest when it started to rain. Singer stared up at the sky and unleashed a torrent of raw emotion directed at Mother Nature for interrupting such a critical moment. A teammate had to come and walk him from the mound back to the dugout. This spring Royals assistant general manager J.J. Picollo told The Athletic how much he and the Royals loved to see that side of Singer on such a big stage. "It's why he had the success he had and why he stood out so much," Picollo said. "It's an intensity that he has under control, too." Picollo also told The Athletic it wasn't just the national stage that Singer wants to take. The Royals removed him from an intrasquad game this spring after he took a comebacker off the leg. It was out of an abundance of caution, but as Picollo put it, he was none too pleased about not being able to finish the inning.

WHAT A CHRISTMAS GIFT: Most everyone loves their parents, but few have put a value on how much their Mom and Dad's love meant better than Singer. This past Christmas Singer posted an emotional video on his twitter account where he provided his parents with an incredibly generous gift. In a letter which his mom read out loud, Singer wrote: "Thank you for everything you've done to help me reach my dreams. There's absolutely no way I could have done all this by myself. Both of you constantly took off of work and spent every dime you made just to put a smile on my face. My smile and appreciation for both of you has never stopped and it never will." After reading how he could never repay them, Singer's mother went into stunned silence as she read the line that was Singer's gift to them: paying off a loan from the bank and their debt. The letter wrapped up with this line from Singer: "Your giving hearts helped to shape my tiny dream into a reality," Singer wrote in the letter's conclusion." Singer said he didn't expect the gesture it did, but he made the gift public because: "I wanted kids to see you should help the people that got you here. I didn't get here by myself. My parents did so much for me. I want to do anything I can to help them."
