#### BLUE ROCKS BREAKDOWN

MORE TO CELEBRATE: Less than 24 hours after celebrating the team's first playoff berth since 2015, the Wilmington Blue Rocks had more to be happy about on Sunday thanks to a bases-clearing double from MJ Melendez in the eighth inning that completed a 5-3 comeback win over the Fayetteville Woodpeckers. The victory moved the Blue Crew to a season-best 18 games above .500.

TOP OF THE STANDINGS TO YOU: Wilmington has sat atop the Carolina League North standings for more than three-quarters of the 2019 season—54 of the campaign's first 64 days. The Rocks have not been out of first place since April 26.

BACK IN THE POSTSEASON: Wilmington clinched its first postseason berth since 2015. That year Wilmington won the first half with a 38-32 record. The Rocks have 40 victories in 2019 and still have seven contests remaining in the first half. The 2015 Blue Crew eventually reached the Mills Cup Championship Series by sweeping Lynchburg in the Northern Division Championship Series. Wilmington is in search of its first Carolina League crown since 1999.

KILLING IT IN CLOSE CONTESTS: The Rocks have excelled in close contests this season. The Blue Crew lead the Carolina League with 28 games decided by a single score in 2019 and have played 41 affairs with a margin of victory of two-or-less. Wilmington is an impressive 32-9 in those close calls including 23-5 in one-run decisions. The Rocks are also 24-1 when holding an advantage through seven innings and 27-0 when leading after eight.

<u>FUN IN THE SUN:</u> The Rocks have enjoyed great success in daylight this season. Wilmington improved to 10-1 in day games this season, with six of the victories featuring comebacks.

**LINE OF DEMARCATION:** Four has been the magic number for the Wilmington offense in 2019. When the Rocks score four times in a game they are 26-2 on the year. Conversely, when Wilmington manages just three scores or fewer in an affair the team is only 14-20.

**LETHAL VERSUS LEFTIES WHEN GIVEN THE CHANCE:** The Blue Rocks are 14-4 on the season against southpaw starting pitching, but have not faced a lefty to open a game since May 23.

LONG ROAD TO HISTORY: Thursday's game lasted three hours and 53 minutes, which was Wilmington's longest of the season. In fact it was the longest nine-inning game in franchise history. The previous record was three hours and 50 minutes, set on August 28, 2018 at Lynchburg. The longest game ever was a six hours and 23 minute marathon that lasted 20 innings on July 5, 1998. The Rocks and Woodpeckers followed that up with a four hour and eight minute marathon on Saturday. marathon on Saturday.

WINNING THE COLUMN THAT MATTERS: Wilmington won on Sunday for the 20th time this season when its opponent had more hits. The Rocks did it three straight times over the weekend against Fayetteville.

#### **Tomorrow's Starter for the Blue Crew**

Daniel Tillo will make his 12th start of the season for the Blue Rocks on Thursday. Tillo is in his second season with Wilmington after getting promoted to the Riverfront last May. With the Rocks, the 6-foot-5, 215-pound lefty went 3-5 with a 4.94 ERA in 19 starts. Tillo opened 2018 in Lexington and fanned 31 in 41.1 frames before earning his ticket to the First State. The 22-year-old Sioux City, Iowa native was selected in the third round of the 2017 Draft out of Iowa Western Community College. Tillo started his college career at Kentucky before transferring back to his home state. That eventually led him to being taken by the Royals with the 15th pick of the third round (90th overall) in the 2017 Draft.

Martin said it: (On his goals at the plate)..."I really just want to get on base and keep my on-base percentage high. I know my teammates will do their job and drive me in. As long as I get on, I can do my job steal second or third, or even if I don't steal a base, I can get in the pitcher's head and get him to maybe make a mistake. I know these guys can drive me in from first base...(On his great success at stealing bases).."We really worked on it at Spring Training. We harp on keying on what certain pitchers do, studying them and the game so it should help me during the season. It was a process that we really embraced last year. The prep means I might notice that a pitcher has a quick pickoff move, but he's slow to home. So things like that help me. Stealing bases is what I have to do."
