BLUE ROCKS BREAKDOWN

HOME: 20-19 | AWAY: 15-23 | STREAK: W1 | LAST 5: 3-2 | LAST 10: 6-4

OFFENSE AND GARBITO SHINE IN WIN: A six-run sixth inning pushed the Wilmington Blue Rocks (35-42 / 4-3) past the Lynchburg Hillcats en route to a 9-2 victory Thursday night at Frawley Stadium. Wilmington's starter **Gerson Garbito** kept the Blue Rocks in the game early and turned in seven strong innings to earn his first win at home. Offensively, the Blue Rocks pounded out 12 hits while four different Blue Rocks put together multi-hit efforts at the plate.

STORY OF THE SIXTH: Through the first four games of the series, the Blue Rocks and Hillcats have done most of their damage in the sixth innings of each game.

-Thursday, the Rocks erupted for six runs in their half of the sixth to erase a 2-0 deficit and take the lead they would not relinquish.

-Wednesday, Wilmington led 1-0 before the Hillcats scored four runs in the sixth to take the lead.

-On Tuesday, the Blue Rocks lost another 1-0 lead in the same frame when Lynchburg plated two runs.

-In the series opener on Monday, the Blue Rocks were out in front 5-2 before the Hillcats scored three, two-out runs to tie the game. Wilmington ultimately won the game 6-5 with an eighth inning score.

-Overall, both teams have combined to score 17 runs in the sixth inning in each of the first four games.

ROCKS OFF AND RUNNING: The Blue Rocks have wasted no time getting back into base stealing mode as they have stolen 17 bases through the first seven games of the second half.

-During that stretch, the Blue Crew have stolen five bases in two different games, matching the franchise record for most stolen bases in a single game.

-Monday, the Rocks stole five bases against the Hillcats with **Nick Heath** stealing three, joining **Rudy Martin** as the only other Blue Rock this season to swipe a trio of bags in a game.

-It marked the fourth time this season Wilmington has stolen five bases in a game.

-In the series opener last Thursday at Potomac, the Rocks also stole five bases.

-Wilmington has four different active players with double-digit stolen bases including Heath who leads the team with 21, **D.J. Burt** is second with 20 and **Rudy Martin** and newcomer **Blake Perkins** each have 14 stolen bases on the year.

-The Blue Rocks are the only team in the Carolina League to steal 20 or more bases in each of the first three months of the season. (37 in April, 20 in May and 36 in June.)

-On the season, the Rocks are second in the Carolina League with 93 stolen bases trailing Buies Creek. (97 SB)

-They also have an impressive 73% success rate stealing bases this season (93 out of 127).

-Last season the Blue Rocks stole 111 bases.

TAMING THE HILLCATS: The Rocks got back on the winning track Thursday night and the Blue Rocks have won 8 of the first 11 meetings between the two Northern Division foes.

-Thursday night's win snapped a two-game losing skid for the Blue Rocks against the Hillcats.

-The loss on Tuesday was the first for the Blue Rocks against Lynchburg since April 13.

-Through the 11 games, the Rocks are outscoring the Hillcats 56-39 while the pitching has yielded a respectable 2.94 ERA.

-Last season, Lynchburg took the head-to-head series 9-8.

NEW HALF, NEW FACES: With the start of the second half of the Carolina League season underway, the Wilmington Blue Rocks have a handful of new players on the roster who are making an impact.

-Switch-hitting outfielder **Blake Perkins**, who spent the first half of the season with Potomac joined the roster during the All-Star break.

-Originally a second round pick by Washington in 2015, Perkins was one of three players dealt to Kansas City from Washington as the Nationals acquired former Blue Rock and All-Star reliever **Kelvin Herrera** on June 18 and is rated as the 15th-best prospect in the Royals' system according to MLB Pipeline.com.

-Through his first seven games, Perkins is hitting .280 as a Blue Rock has stolen two bases and has an on-base percentage of .419.

-He is also second in the CL in walks (47) trailing former Blue Rock Khalil Lee (48) who was recently promoted to Double-A Northwest Arkansas.

-Infielder **Travis Jones** was promoted from Low-A Lexington and put together solid numbers.

-The 29th round pick by Kansas City in 2017 out of the University of Texas, led the Legends in batting average (.285), hits (65), doubles (13), stolen bases (14), second in runs scored (41) and tied for second in RBI (32).

-Jones has reached in all seven games since joining the Blue Rocks. He is hitting a robust .400 (8-for-20) with two runs driven in and an on-base percentage of .571.

-RHP **Nolan Watson** makes his second-career start with the Blue Rocks after starting the year in Low-A Lexington.

-The former first round pick by the Royals in 2015 out of Lawrence North High School (IN) made his Wilmington debut on Sunday at Potomac and did not factor in the decision.

BURT PROVIDING THE HURT: Second-year Blue Rock **D.J. Burt** is not suffering from a sophomore slump in the Carolina League.

-He was named to the Carolina League All-Star Classic this season and has been one of the best table setters in the league.

-He is second in the Carolina league in stolen bases (20) and fifth in on-base percentage (.382).

-He picked up a pair of hits Tuesday, including his fourth triple of the season and has 16 multi-hit games of the season which is third-most on the team.

-He has a hit in 37 of his 55 games played and has picked up a hit in 21 of his last 30 games. (.279/.355/.396)

-On the base paths, he is second on the team and is third in the league with 18 stolen bases.

-Burt has served as the Rocks' utility man this season, making 18 starts at third base, 14 at second base, 10 at shortstop and seven in left field.

-Made his first-career start at the hot corner coming on May 26 at home against Salem.

-This the first season in his professional career that he has played in the outfield.

THEY SAID IT, MANAGER DARRYL KENNEDY: (On base stealing being vital part of the offense) "Well it's something we have to do. We talked about when we were down in Potomac for the first game of the (second) half. We've kind have assessed who we are and who we were and what we have now with the subtractions of **Kort Peterson** and **Xavier Fernandez**. Those were guys who hit the ball out of the park for us and we thought we have a little more aggressive on the base paths. The guys have done a good job and I think they enjoy doing that. We've got a ton of speed. That's just something we have to work on."

-Right-hander **Nolan Watson** makes his second-career start as a Blue Rock and Frawley Stadium debut tonight.

-The 21-year-old was the 33rd overall pick in the 2015 Draft by the Royals out of Lawrence North High School in Indianapolis, Indiana.

-Was committed to play at Vanderbilt University before signing with the Royals.

-In his debut on Sunday at Potomac he did not factor in the decision.

-He worked four innings, allowed five runs (all earned) on 11 hits and walked four batters.

-Started the season with Low-A Lexington.

-Turned in his best start of his career in his last outing with Lexington on June 15.

-Watson tossed his first-career, complete-game shutout against the Rome Braves.

-He scattered six hits, did not walk a batter and struck out seven.

-He needed just 89 pitches to navigate through the nine innings of masterful work.

-Was named the Opening Day starter for the Legends and went 4-6 with a 5.81 ERA in 13 starts.

-Logged 66.2 innings, allowed 94 hits, 55R/43ER, walked 21, and struck out 63.

-At time of promotion he was first on the team in starts made (13) and second on the team in innings pitched (66.2) and strikeouts (63).

-Allowed three earned runs or less in 9 of his 13 starts with the Legends and over his final five starts, posted a 3.77 ERA.

-Also spent last season with Low-A Lexington and dealt with a shoulder injury and missed a few weeks of the season.

-Made rehab appearances with the AZL Royals and Burlington Royals.

-Went a composite 1-12 with a 7.87 ERA in 22 outings including 18 starts.

-With the Legends, went 1-10 with a 6.78 ERA in 15 appearances including 13 starts.

-Features a fastball in the mid-90s to go along with a slider, curveball and changeup.

-Righty **Justin Garza** makes 12th start of the season and third against the Blue Rocks.

-Selected by the Cleveland Indians in the eighth round of the 2015 Draft out of Cal State Fullerton.

-In his last start against Myrtle Beach on Sunday he suffered the loss.

-He worked three innings, allowed three runs (all earned) on four hits, walked three and struck out four batters.

-Against Wilmington this season: 0-1, 11.37 ERA in two starts.

-He has tossed 6.1 innings, allowed eight runs (all earned) on eighth hits, walked four and struck out six while the Blue Rocks have hit .308 against him.

-In first start at Wilmington on April 14 he fired five scoreless innings.

-In his most recent outing against the Blue Crew on June 5, he couldn't get out of the second inning and was tagged for eight runs.

-Has been named Carolina League Pitcher of the Week in back-to-back weeks from April 4 through April 15.

-Features a fastball, curveball, slider and changeup.

JOINING THE ROYALS: Was the 33rd overall pick in the 2015 Draft by the Royals as Kansas City received the pick as compensation when James Shields signed with the San Diego Padres that offseason. Was a highly-touted high school prep pitcher and went 6-1 with an impressive 0.68 ERA in 51.2 innings of work while striking out 81 batters during his senior year. He was committed to Vanderbilt University before signing with the Royals for a reported \$1.8 million. Joins former prep arms in Ashe Russell, who was selected 21st overall in 2015, Foster Griffin (2014) and Scott Blewett (2014) as other top two round picks by the Royals during the 2014-15 MLB Drafts. Played against Russell in high school as Watson's North Lawrence High School team beat Russell's Cathedral High School in the state tournament.

WATSON AND ASHE RUSSELL CLOSE ON AND OFF THE FIELD: Growing up two miles away from each other, both Watson and Russell were very familiar with each other. They were rivals in high school, but developed a friendship that helped the two cope with the struggles the game of baseball can present. "If we have a bad day at the field we can always come talk to each other. We're there for each other," Watson told The Kansas City Star. Both were selected a handful of picks apart (Russell 21st overall and Watson 33rd overall) by the Royals and area-scout Mike Farrell who also is from Indianapolis. Farrell told The Kansas City Star "I just think I was fortunate. Both Ashe and Nolan, guys in my area, who I've known, both kids I love, both families I love. I just happened to have a couple of power arms in the backyard for me."
