## BLUE ROCKS BREAKDOWN

HOME: 23-17 | AWAY: 28-15 STREAK: L2 | LAST 5: 2-3 | LAST 10: 4-6

**ROUGH NIGHT FOR ROCKS:** It was a rough Wednesday night for the Wilmington Blue Rocks, who dropped a pair of games to the Potomac Nationals at Frawley Stadium. The Blue Crew lost the resumption of Tuesday's suspended contest, 10-4, and fell 2-1 in the regularly schedule affair.

**TOP OF THE STANDINGS TO YOU:** Wilmington has sat atop the Carolina League North standings for most of the 2019 season—82 of the campaign's first 92 days. The Rocks have not been out of first place in the overall ledger since April 26.

**RESUMED:** The night started with a 4-4 contest in the bottom of the fourth inning. Potomac went in front with a run in the fifth on a Telmito Austin RBI-grounder. KJ Harrison increased the lead with a run-scoring double in the seventh. Potomac added another tally in the frame when Harrison came home on Josh Mitchell's wild pitch. The P-Nats put the game away with three more in the ninth. Omar Meregildo cleared the bases with a double to the left-field corner.

**PITCHERS' DUEL:** The regularly scheduled game was a pitchers' duel between Potomac's Tim Cate and Wilmington's Daniel Tillo. Tillo (4-7) turned in a quality start and made just one real mistake all night, but paid for it dearly. The lefty lasted six innings, yielding only three hits and fanning five. He did surrender a two-run dinger in the sixth to Aldrem Cooredor, which ended up being the difference in the game. Meanwhile, Cate (1-1) tossed a complete game, allowing just one run on three hits while fanning eight and walking only two. Kyle Kasser drove in the Rocks' lone run when his single in the third plated Offerman Collado.

**THEY'RE RUBBER YOU'RE GLUE:** Wilmington has had an abnormally low number of rubber matches in 2019. The Blue Crew played just their fourth series-deciding game on Wednesday. Equally as strange is the fact that the first-half CL North champs are still looking for their first rubber match win this season. The Rocks are now 0-4 in such contests on the campaign.

**KILLING IT IN CLOSE CONTESTS:** The Blue Crew lead the Carolina League with 34 games decided by a single score in 2019 and have played 51 affairs with a margin of victory of two-or-less. Wilmington is an impressive 37-14 in those close calls including 27-7 in one-run decisions. Four of the losses have been walk-off defeats, including three in the month of June alone.

**WEIRD SLATE:** The Blue Crew have entered one of the strangest stretches they've encountered on a schedule in recent memory. Wilmington is playing back-to-back home-and-homes. The Rocks hosted Potomac for three then hit the road to visit Potomac in a three-game series. After that they play three at Salem before welcoming the Red Sox to Frawley Stadium for three more. Adding an extra layer of oddity to the two-week span is that the Rocks and Sox will play a day-night doubleheader on July 8. Game one will begin at 11 a.m. and the nightcap is not slated until 6 p.m. Wilmington is 1-2 during this stretch of 12 games versus two teams.

**BACK IN THE POSTSEASON:** Wilmington clinched its first postseason berth since 2015 with its first-half CL North championship. That year Wilmington won the first half with a 38-32 record. The Rocks won 44 games in 2019 and finished 19 games above .500 in the first half. The Blue Crew clinched their 2019 crown on June 8. The 2015 Blue Crew eventually reached the Mills Cup Championship Series by sweeping Lynchburg in the Northern Division Championship Series. Wilmington is in search of its first Carolina League crown since 1999.

## Today's Starter for the Blue Crew

**Jonathan Bowlan** was the fifth pitcher selected by Kansas City in the 2018 Draft. He'd probably prefer it described as the Royals' second round choice the 58th overall selection of the draft. He excelled at the University of Memphis, registering 104 strikeouts in 14 starts as a junior. In his best outing he set a school record with 18 strikeouts in a complete game win. The right-hander signed for \$1.17 million and is the 28th-ranked prospect in the Kansas City system, according to MLB.com. Bowlan began his pro career in Rookie-Idaho Falls last season, going 1-4 with a 6.94 ERA in nine starts for the Chukars. He opened this season in Low-A Lexington, and went 6-2 with a 3.36 ERA in 13 games and 11 starts for the Legends.

**THE BOOK ON JONATHAN BOWLAN:** Jonathan Bowlan was the fifth pitcher selected by Kansas City in the 2018 Draft. He excelled at the University of Memphis, registering 104 strikeouts in 14 starts as a junior. In his best outing he set a school record with 18 strikeouts in a complete game win. The right-hander signed for \$1.17 million and is the 28th-ranked prospect in the Kansas City system, according to MLB.com. Bowlan began his pro career in Rookie-Idaho Falls last season, going 1-4 with a 6.94 ERA in nine starts for the Chukars. He opened this season in Low-A Lexington, and went 6-2 with a 3.36 ERA in 13 games and 11 starts for the Legends. Bowlan fanned 74 and walked only 10 in 69.2 innings pitched.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Both of Bowlan's Advanced-A starts have come versus Frederick. Last time out he allowed one run on seven hits while fanning seven and walking none and getting a victory.

**VERSUS OPPONENT:** This is the right-hander's first start against Potomac.

**DRAFT DAY SURPRISE:** Bowlan knew he would be drafted and relatively high last June, but most Draft experts had him pegged as a second-day selection. Still he and his family connected their computer to the big screen television and watched day one of the Draft hoping, but not really expecting to hear his name get called. But then he got two phone calls. One from his adviser through the Draft process and the other from an area scout, tipping him off that he was going to see his name much earlier than the so-called experts had anticipated. "That was the biggest surprise," Bowlan told The Memphis Commercial Appeal on Draft Night. "We knew there'd be a chance but a very slim chance (of going early). Just the fact it was the 58th overall to the Kansas City Royals was awesome. It's one of the best feelings I've ever had in my life."

**HELP FROM HIS DAD :** Bowlan grew up in a baseball household. His Dad, Mark, threw what is still the only perfect game in the history of the University of Memphis baseball program. He then went on to play two seasons professionally in the Cardinals' organization. "I've been taught this game my whole life," Bowlan says. "My Dad got drafted and knew a lot about the game and I had a lot of role models throughout my life to help me with my game and baseball. And I just had more confidence in that and I knew I could go to any of those guys to talk about what I needed to do to help get to the next level in any way."

**BIG FRAME:** Bowlan is a big guy. In fact the description you often see near his name is that of a football player's frame. "I went into college at 212 pounds," Bowlan says. "I didn't really get to workout much in high school because I played baseball, basketball, and football. So, I would say it was definitely in college. Just being able to hit the weights and eat better and just put on some pounds."

**CITY OF BBQ:** If you're from the Memphis area, and you went to school in the city, you're almost required to be a BBQ officianado. Bowlan is no exception to that rule. I'm a huge barbeque fan and my favorite spot in Memphis is Central Barbeque. It's one of the smaller places in Memphis and it's incredible. From the sauces to the meat and everything else like that. My go-to item on the menu would be the BBQ nachos. No doubt.

**FORE:** Away from the field Bowlan likes to spend as much time with his family as possible. But when he's looking to relax he turns to the course. "I like to play a little golf," Bowlan says. "It helps with the mental part of the game. Golf and of course of baseball are similar because you're going to go through adversity through the years. It's a long-term process. So I feel like playing golf can be helpful."

## TONIGHT'S BLUE ROCKS STARTING PITCHER

**#13 LHP Austin Cox**

**Acquired: 5th Round Pick in 2018 Draft by the Kansas City Royals**

**THE BOOK ON AUSTIN COX:** The Kansas City Royals loaded up on college pitching in the 2018 Draft and the crop of picks included southpaw Austin Cox in the fifth round out of Mercer University (Macon, GA). Cox attended First Presbyterian Day School (GA) which was the same school former Blue Rock and Royals' prospect Richard Lovelady attended and also attended Macon, HS before putting together an impressive career with Mercer. Last year in his junior season, he led the team with 17 starts and ranked fifth in the Southern Conference with seven wins. With 124 strikeouts, he posed the second-best strikeout rate (12.7K/9) rate in Division I. Made nine starts in his pro debut season with Rookie Burlington and went 1-1 with a 3.78 ERA. He racked up 51 strikeouts in just 33.1 innings while allowing just 15 walks. His 13.8K/9 rate was the best strikeout rate among Royals farmhands (min. seven starts). Currently ranked the 20th-best prospect in the Royals' system according to MLB Pipeline.com

**LAST TIME OUT:** Cox allowed five runs on nine hits in six frames of a loss at Frederick.

**VERSUS :** The lefty made his Advanced-A debut against Potomac on June 25. He yielded one run on six hits while fanning six and walking only one in a no-decision.

**HIS TIME IN LEXINGTON:** Cox began the season at Low-A Lexington where he went 5-3 with a respectable 2.75 ERA in 13 starts. The southpaw logged 75.1 innings, allowed 23 earned runs on 59 hits, walked 22 and struck out 77 while holding opponents to a .206 batting average. At the time of his promotion on Sunday, he ranked in the top-ten in the South Atlantic League in ERA, strikeouts, innings pitched, batting average against and WHIP. He was also named a mid-season SAL All-Star.

**QUALITY ARM:** Of his 13 starts with Lexington, eight of them were quality starts including five being scoreless outings. Throughout his tenure with the Legends, Cox only walked more than three batters once. On May 28 against West Virginia, he fell two outs shy of tossing a no hitter during a seven-inning affair in a doubleheader. He ended up allowing one hit, one walk, struck out seven in 6.1 innings of work.

**ONLY CHANCE:** For many athletes, they have the opportunity to decide which university they want to attend to further their education and athletic careers from a list of handful of programs interested. However, for Cox, that wasn't the case. The lefty had one school close to home that gave him the chance he needed. "Honestly it was my only offer. I was talking to a couple of other schools and I kind of was running out of time. Nobody else had pulled the trigger and given me an offer, so I took the Mercer offer. It worked out being close to home. I'm from right around there, I went to school at Macon High School in Macon (GA) so it worked out really well to be able to be around my family for another three years. Everything kind of came together and worked out there.

**TRANSFORMING IN COLLEGE:** College is a time and place where many learn to live on their own and mature. For Cox, it didn't take long for him to realize that both on and off the field. In his freshman season he posted a 10.13 ERA in 27 appearances with one start. "Well, coming into my freshman year, I wasn't very mentally tough. I had a really rough freshman year. I learned how to work. I came in freshman year and you know, coming in, you think you're all that so I got humbled really fast. I had to learn how to work really fast and there's a lot of guys there that have known that and had learned that in the years before me that could help me through it. Once I learned how to work that was that was really when the tables kind of turned and I feel like the biggest thing I took out that was my mental toughness. Just from struggling to being able to succeed and then to get drafted it was a really cool experience to see myself where I came from and where I where I got to go.

**A BORN LEADER:** The lefty earned high praise for his leadership at Mercer and that's something that Cox takes very seriously still to this day as he enters his first, full-season in the Royals' system. "It's something that I feel like honestly my whole life I've always wanted to be. I want to be in front of everything. I want people to look at me and say that's how it's supposed to be done. That's just something I've always been very prideful with was leading. Whether it's going good or going bad I want to be at the front of it."

**TRYING TO BE THE BEST:** Delivery wise, before I throw would be Clayton Kershaw. I like his mental side of the game too. Not as much when I throw though. I feel the way I throw is different. I don't really have anybody that I specifically model after. I try to model the way Kershaw just attacks hitters. I like to try to emulate as much of him as I can. I know I will never be him but I still like to try to see if I can be like him.

So we went back to how I normally do it. Naturally, I'm in a lower slot, a little more sidearm. I've always been fine in terms of accuracy, but the infielders were complaining that my throws moved too much [like a two-seam fastball]. But I went back to my normal slot and everything is fine. I think what I'm best at is picking balls in the dirt, and my agility around the bag. Picking balls and saving bad throws is huge."  
**(On Who He Admires in Game)** I really like Joey Votto's offensive approach at the plate. He has the average, the on-base percentage, the slugging percentage. He doesn't strike out too much. That's what I'd like to be.
