BLUE ROCKS BREAKDOWN

HOME: 23-17 | AWAY: 30-16 STREAK: L1 | LAST 5: 2-3 | LAST 10: 5-5

SUSPENDED: Sunday's series-opener between the Wilmington Blue Rocks' and the Salem Red Sox was suspended in the top of the eighth inning at Haley Toyota Field. The game is tied 7-7 and the Blue Rocks have a runner at first with one out. The contest will be resumed on Monday at 11:05 a.m.

TOP OF THE STANDINGS TO YOU: Wilmington has sat atop the Carolina League North standings for most of the 2019 season—84 of the campaign's first 94 days. The Rocks have not been out of first place in the overall ledger since April 26.

FOUR FOR THE WIN: Four continues to be the magic number for the Blue Rocks this season. Wilmington is 33-4 when scoring four-or-more times in a game, but just 20-29 when registering three or fewer tallies in a contest.

ROAD WARRIORS: Wilmington has traveled exceedingly well in 2019. The Rocks improved to 30-16 in away games this season, the second-best road record in the Carolina League. In fact, the Blue Crew does not have a losing record in any ballpark this season. They are above .500 in seven ballparks (including Frawley Stadium) and are at .500 in Frederick and Fayetteville. Wilmington has still yet to make its first trip to Down East this year. One of the reasons for the road success has been the Rocks' ability to hit for power. They have hit 31 of their 36 home runs in 2019 away from the friendly confines of Frawley Stadium.

KILLING IT IN CLOSE CONTESTS: The Blue Crew lead the Carolina League with 35 games decided by a single score in 2019 and have played 52 affairs with a margin of victory of two-or-less. Wilmington is an impressive 38-14 in those close calls including 28-7 in one-run decisions. Four of the losses have been walk-off defeats, including three in the month of June alone.

WEIRD SLATE: The Blue Crew are in the midst of one of the strangest stretches they've encountered on a schedule in recent memory. Wilmington is playing back-to-back home-and-homes. The Rocks hosted Potomac for three and visited Potomac for a three-game series. Now they play three at Salem before welcoming the Red Sox to Frawley Stadium for three more. Adding an extra layer of oddity to the two-week span is that the Rocks and Sox will play a day-night doubleheader on July 8. Game one will begin at 11 a.m. and the nightcap is not slated until 6 p.m. Wilmington is 3-3 during this stretch of 12 games versus two teams.

FUN UNDER THE SUN: The Blue Rocks have had a great deal of success under the sun's glare this season. Wilmington is 12-2 in games played during the daytime.

BACK IN THE POSTSEASON: Wilmington clinched its first postseason berth since 2015 with its first-half CL North championship. That year Wilmington won the first half with a 38-32 record. The Rocks won 44 games in 2019 and finished 19 games above .500 in the first half. The Blue Crew clinched their 2019 crown on June 8. The 2015 Blue Crew eventually reached the Mills Cup Championship Series by sweeping Lynchburg in the Northern Division Championship Series. Wilmington is in search of its first Carolina League crown since 1999.

Today's Starter for the Blue Crew

Daniel Tillo will make his 16th start of the season for the Blue Rocks on Thursday. Tillo is in his second season with Wilmington after getting promoted to the Riverfront last May. With the Rocks, the 6-foot-5, 215-pound lefty went 3-5 with a 4.94 ERA in 19 starts. The 22-year-old Sioux City, Iowa native was selected in the third round of the 2017 Draft out of Iowa Western Community College. Tillo started his college career at Kentucky before transferring back to his home state. That eventually led him to being taken by the Royals with the 15th pick of the third round (90th overall) in the 2017 Draft. Tillo signed for a reported \$557,000. He entered this season as the Royals' No. 25 prospect according to MLB.com.

THE BOOK ON DANIEL TILLO: Daniel Tillo will make his 16th start of the season for the Blue Rocks on Thursday. Tillo is in his second season with Wilmington after getting promoted to the Riverfront last May. With the Rocks, the 6-foot-5, 215-pound lefty went 3-5 with a 4.94 ERA in 19 starts. Tillo opened 2018 in Lexington and fanned 31 in 41.1 frames before earning his ticket to the First State. The 22-year-old Sioux City, Iowa native was selected in the third round of the 2017 Draft out of Iowa Western Community College. Tillo started his college career at Kentucky before transferring back to his home state. That eventually led him to being taken by the Royals with the 15th pick of the third round (90th overall) in the 2017 Draft. Tillo signed for a reported \$557,000. He entered this season as the Royals' No. 25 prospect according to MLB.com.

LAST TIME OUT: Tillo turned in his fourth consecutive quality start, allowing just two runs on three hits in six innings pitched. Tillo took the loss and has zero wins during his four quality start streak.

VERSUS OPPONENT: This is Tillo's second start against the Red Sox this year. He lasted a career-high eight innings allowing just two runs on five hits in a win at Haley Toyota Field on May 7.

TWEAKING HOW HE APPROACHES HIS BUSINESS: Tillo has changed his mental approach in 2019. He is focused more on the time leading up to his starts. "Preparation is a big part of baseball and last year I wasn't always into that as much," Tillo admits. "This year I want to really study the hitters, pay attention, and focus more in the dugout, really trying to learn the game more this year and use that while I pitch."

TILLO ALMOST QUIT BASEBALL IN HIGH SCHOOL: At Sioux City North High School (Iowa), Tillo went 22-2 in his career on the mound. But that was just the tip of the iceberg for this athletic phenom. He also played quarterback for the football team and threw 49 touchdowns in three seasons. Perhaps his most impressive accolades came on the basketball court where he was a three-time First-Team All-State selection and Mr. Basketball for the state of Iowa in 2015. Tillo admits baseball wasn't his first love. "I always enjoyed all three sports," he says. "It just depended on what time of year it was for what was my favorite sport. Although the one I love the most is basketball. I always put the most work into basketball. Summer was almost all about basketball. I actually almost gave up baseball my sophomore year of high school just to focus on basketball. But I'm glad I didn't do that, because I'm here now." The lefty credits his family for giving him perspective to stick with baseball. "My mom really enjoyed watching me play baseball. She always loved being outside and watching me and so did my grandparents. Obviously when it's cold, in football or basketball season it's harder to get out. So that was the biggest reason I stuck with it. I also didn't want to give up on my teammates. These were my best friends that I grew up with and I didn't want to let them down."

SUNDAY SPECIALIST: Tillo's college coach elected to pitch him on Sundays in order to allow more scouts to watch him pitch at Iowa Western. It worked. There was at least 25 scouts at every single one of his outings and he was drafted in third round.

PRETTY GOOD BIRTHDAY: For any player in any sport, it's a dream of theirs to hear their name called on draft day. For Tillo, his dream came true on his birthday. "I woke up early in the morning, didn't get a lot of sleep the night before," Tillo recalls. "I was actually disappointed I didn't get selected in the second round. I thought I was better than a lot of the players taken-- which has always been my attitude. It was my birthday, I turned 21 that day. I had some friends and family over and once I saw it on our TV, I was really happy and excited. I gave my mom and dad a big hug, then I got some phone calls from some of the Royals front office. It all came together pretty cool."

TILLO ON FAVORITE PLAYER GROWING UP AND GUYS HE WATCHES PITCH NOW: Derek Jeter was the guy (I watched most growing up). He just played the game the right way and every single day he brought it. He's a winner and played for over 20 years. He was just a beast and I loved watching him. As far as pitchers I really like watching Trevor Bauer a lot. His mechanics are really good and he's very analytical. And the way he's developed his pitches over the offseason is crazy. And he's really fun to watch and he's taken over baseball in a way.
