ROCKS WALKED OFF BY ASTROS IN SERIES FINALE: The Wilmington Blue Rocks were walked off for just the third time this season in the bottom of the ninth inning by the Buies Creek Astros to suffer a 4-3 loss on Thursday night at Jim Perry Stadium. Jonathan Arauz delivered the decisive blow with a one-out, three-run double in the bottom of the ninth. Blue Rocks' starter **Gerson Garabito** turned in another quality start on the mound, going six full innings while giving up only five hits, one run, walked two while also amassing six strikeouts. The loss snapped a streak of four straight series victories by Wilmington. by Wilmington.

SO LONG BUIES CREEK: The loss on Thursday night marked the last time Wilmington and Buies Creek will square off in the regular season. -The loss was the first time this season the Rocks lost a lead after leading after the eighth inning (41-1) -The Blue Rocks ended the season series against the Astros with a 3-3 record going 2-1 at home and 1-2 on the rocks.

-The Astros are the second team to wrap up their season series against the Blue Rocks this season. -Wilmington finished its series against the Carolina Mudcats in mid-May and went 2-5. -This weekend's series against the Keys will also conclude the head-to-head matchup between these two Northern Division rivals

-The Blue Crew currently lead the series 11-9 and have won their last six against the Keys. -During those six straight wins, the Rocks are outscoring the Keys 46-23. -The last time the Blue Rocks lost to the Keys was back on July 9 at Frederick (Lost 4-2)

HATE TO SEE JULY GO: The Blue Rocks continue to play some of their best baseball in the second half with their performance in July being a vital reason for Wilmington's success. -Wilmington closed out the month of July with a 19-9 record which was the best record of any team in the

CL during the month. -The Rocks as a team hit .277, the highest batting average of any month this season and also scored more runs (155) then they did in any previous month.

The Blue Rocks also have the highest winning percentage of any team in the second half at .641. (Winston-Salem is second .605, 23-15) -Willmington has either been atop of the division or out of the top spot by just one game since July 11 and have led the division since July 18 and hold a 3.0 game lead over second place Lynchburg and nine game lead over the Keys.

-The Blue Rocks also have not been below .500 at any point this half. (Have been at .500 mark four times) -The Rocks are currently 21-9 against Northern Division foes in the second half which is the best mark in the division.

WALK OR RUN THIS WAY: The Blue Rocks have led the Carolina League in walks for the majority of the season and also lead the league in stolen bases.
Wilmington has racked up 440 walks this year, 15 more than Potomac who is second in the league.
The Blue Crew also have been stealing bases at a rapid clip in the second half and have stolen 60 bases through 39 games of the second half.
Wilmington has four different active players with double-digit stolen bases including D.J. Burt who is the active team-leader and third in the CL with 27, Blake Perkins ranks fourth in the CL with 22 between Potomac and Wilmington, Rudy Martin has 18 stolen bases on the year and Travis Jones has 11.
The Blue Crew have stolen five bases in six different games this season.
Wilmington is the only team in the Carolina League to steal 20 or more bases in each of the first four months of the season. (37 in April, 20 in May, 37 in June and 38 in July.)
They also have an impressive 73% success rate stealing bases this season (137 out of 188).

CAN COUNT ON CANCEL: Infielder **Gabriel Cancel** has been a major run producer for the Blue Rocks, especially in the second half. He delivered a game-tying RBI in the top of the ninth inning on Wednesday at Buies Creek. -Cancel has driven in 47 runs over his last 46 games and has also put together 14 multi-RBI games during the stretch and leads the team with 17 games driving in multiple runs. -He currently is the team leader, second amongst Royals' farmhands in RBI and also second in the CL with 67 runs batted in on the season

-rie currently is the team feader, second amongst Royals farmhands in RBI and also with 67 runs batted in on the season. -Cancel drove in 26 runs in 27 games in the month of July. -When batting third, the infielder is hitting .280 (28-for-100) with 26 RBI in 26 games. -When he bats cleanup, Cancel is a .333 hitter (28-for-84) with 22 RBI in 22 games.

BURT PROVIDING THE HURT: Second-year Blue Rock **D.J. Burt** is not suffering from a sophomore slump in the Carolina League and was named a Carolina League All-Star. -He is third in the CL in on-base percentage (.393), third in the Carolina League in stolen bases (27), and tied for fifth in batting average (.302) -He picked up a hit in 20 of 24 games in July to help him post a .330 batting average (31-for-94) with two homers, 18 RBI and a .404 OBP. -Tied for first on team with 27 multi-hit games. (Had 20 all of last season) -The 22-year-old has served as the Rocks' utility man this season, making 30 starts at third base, 22 at second base, 10 at shortstop and 10 in left field.

PERKINS FITTING IN NICELY: Since joining Wilmington to start the second half of the season after being one of three players traded from Washington to Kansas City in the Kelvin Herrera trade, outfielder

Blake Perkins has been a catalyst atop the lineup for the Blue Rocks. -Perkins had his season-high 17-game on-base streak come to an end in the series finale at Buies Creek on Thursday. -The streak fell one game shy of tying the longest on-base streak by a Blue Rock this season (Khalil Lee, 18)

-During the stretch, Perkins hit .288 (15-for-52) with an impressive .507 on-base percentage. He also scored 18 runs to go along with 21 walks and stole five bases. -Perkins paces the Carolina League and all of Advanced-A in walks (75) and runs scored (73).

Drafted by Baltimore in the second round (competitive balance round) of the 2017 Draft out of Xavier University and was the highest-drafted player in the program's history

Rated as the 17th-best prospect in Baltimore's system per Baseball America. In his last start on July 29 at Down East he did not factor in the decision. He lasted five and two-thirds innings, allowed one run (earned) on four hits,

THE BOOK ON TILLO: A talented three-sport athlete, the tall lefty was drafted by the Kansas City Royals in the third round of the 2017 Draft out of Iowa Western Community College. The southpaw played baseball, football and basketball and pursued baseball after graduating high school and attended the University of Kentucky his freshman year of college. However, Tillo pitched in just 7.1 innings and transferred to Iowa Western Community College once the head coach Gary Henderson left the Wildcats. Tillo signed for a reported \$557.500 and is currently rated the No. 18 prospect in the Royals' system according to MLBPipeline.com and No. 19 per *Baseball America*. Last season, Tillo spent his first season as a professional between both the Arizona League (Rookie) and Burlington Royals (Rookie/Appalachian League). He posted a composite 3-2 record with a 4.42 ERA in 10 games including nine starts. He features a four-seam fastball that Tillo describes as a cutter while his two-seam fastball has sinking action to it. He is currently working on his changeup and also throws a slider.

LAST TIME OUT: Tillo is coming a loss in his last time out on the mound on July 28 in the second game of the doubleheader against Buies Creek at Frawley Stadium. He worked 2.0 innings, matching his shortest start of his career, allowed three runs (all earned) on just two hits, but walked a season-high six batters and struck out one. On the season, the southpaw has lasted at least five innings in 10 out of his 13 starts with Wilmington.

TILLO STRONG AT HOME: Since joining the Blue Rocks, Tillo has enjoyed pitching in spacious Frawley Stadium. On the year he is 1-1 with a solid 2.57 ERA in six starts (28.0 IP). He has allowed just eight earned runs during the stretch. On the road, Tillo is 1-1 with a 6.09 ERA in seven starts and in 34.0 innings of work, he has allowed 23 earned runs.

NO HITS FOR YOU: The tall lefty has flirted with no-hitters in a handful of his starts with both the Blue Rocks. and Lexington Legends. On May 26 against Salem, he carried a no-hitter into the sixth inning in his Frawley Stadium debut. On May 31 against Frederick, did not allow a hit through 4.2 innings of work. Overall on the season, Tillo has carried a no-hitter past the fourth inning in five different starts this season between Lexington and Wilmington.

TILLO ALMOST QUIT BASEBALL IN HIGH SCHOOL: At Sioux City North High School (Iowa), Tillo went 22-2 in his career on the mound. Played quarterback for the football team and threw 49 touchdowns in three seasons and was also a three-time First-Team All-State selection in basketball. After being named high school Mr. Basketball in Iowa back in 2015. "I always enjoyed all three sports. It always depended on what time of year it was on what was my favorite sport. The one I love the most is basketball. I always put the most work into basketball. Summer was almost all about basketball. I actually almost gave up baseball my sophomore year of high school just to focus on basketball. But I'm glad I didn't do that, I'm here now. The lefty credits his family for helping him stick with baseball. "My mom really enjoyed watching me play baseball. She always loved being outside and watching me and so did my grandparents. Obviously when its cold, in football or basketball season it's harder to get out. I didn't want to give up on my teammates. My best friends I grew up with, I didn't want to give up on the down."

PRETTY GOOD BIRTHDAY: For any player in any sport, it's a dream of theirs to hear their name called in 20 a draft. For Tillo, his dream came true on his birthday. "I woke up early in the morning, didn't get a lot of sleep the night before. I was actually disappointed I didn't get selected in the second round. I thought I was better than a lot of the players taken, that's always been my attitude. It was my birthday, I turned 21 that day. I had ad a hug, then I got some phone calls from some of the Royals. Our scout Scott Melvin called me and said "Congratulations" and the rest is history.

LOOKING TO IMPROVE: Tillo hasn't pitched as much at the professional level, but he certainly has showcased his arsenal including his fastballs that have tremendous movement. However, Tillo thinks he is one more pitch away from elevating his game to a new level. "Definitely my changeup. Once I get my changeup, I think the sky can be the limit for me. I'm working hard, I just have to trust it more. I think it'll come along with time. Once I get my changeup, I think I'll be a completely different pitcher."

PRAISE FROM THE ROYALS' BRASS: Lonnie Goldberg, the Royals' Director of Scouting spoke highly of Tillo when the Royals drafted him. "He's built like a starter and looks like a starter," he told MLB.com. "He has a chance to be a middle-of-the-rotation arm...This is the guy you dream on." Tillo is currently ranked as the 19th-best prospect in the Royals' organization per MLBPipeline.com.
