BLUE ROCKS BREAKDOWN

HOME: 30-26 | AWAY: 29-30 | STREAK: W2 | LAST 5: 3-2 | LAST 10: 5-5

BLUE ROCKS EDGE RED SOX FOR SERIES WIN: The Wilmington Blue Rocks battled back-and-forth with the Salem Red Sox, but ultimately came out on top with the narrow 6-5 victory on Thursday night at Haley Toyota Field. **Angelo Castellano** and **Meibrys Viloria** led the offense by driving in four of Wilmington's six runs. **Tyler Zuber** stranded the game-tying and game-winning runs in scoring position and stuck out Josh Tobias to close the door for Wilmington and pick up his eighth save. The Blue Rocks continue to lead the Northern Division by 2.5 games over Lynchburg.

BACK TO WINNING A SERIES: The Blue Rocks won the series over Salem to start the six-game road trip by winning the final two games of the set.

-It was a needed bounce back for the club after they it dropped the previous two series to Frederick and Buies Creek.

-Prior to the series slide, Wilmington strung together four consecutive series wins from July 18 through July 29.

-During that stretch, they earned series victories over Lynchburg, swept both Frederick and Salem, and took two of three from Buies Creek.

-The Blue Crew went an impressive 11-3 through those 14 games and strung together an eight-game winning streak, the longest since 2009.

RARE SCORELESS STREAK COMES TO AN END: With a two-out, game-tying RBI double from **Rudy Martin** in the second inning in Wednesday's win, the Blue Rocks snapped their longest scoreless innings streak at 22 frames.

-Their previous watermark was 12 innings from July 8-9 against Lynchburg and Frederick.

-The Blue Rocks have been one of the toughest teams to shutout this season, and suffered back-to-back shutout losses in the series finale against Frederick on Sunday and the series opener at Salem on Tuesday.

-It marked the first time Wilmington was blanked in two straight games since July 18-19, 2016 against Lynchburg.

-The Blue Rocks entered the series against Salem tied for the fewest shutout defeats in the Carolina League (6).

A QUICK TRIP TO THE BEACH: The Blue Crew wrap up their longest remaining road trip of the season with a three-game series against Myrtle Beach.

-It is the first and only time Wilmington visits the Pelicans as the two teams, who are separated the most in the league in terms of distance (542 miles), wrap up their head-to-head matchup.

-The Pelicans traveled North to visit the Blue Rocks back in mid-May to play a three-game set in two days as it was shortened due to rain.

-The Blue Rocks took two of three in the series book ending the series with a pair of 3-1 wins while dropping to the Pelicans 10-1 in the middle game.

-The Rocks earned the win in the series finale thanks to an inside-the-park home run hit by **Nick Heath**.

HATE TO SEE JULY GO: The Blue Rocks continue to play some of their best baseball in the second half with their performance in July being a vital reason for their recent success.

-Wilmington closed out the month of July with a 19-9 record which was the best record of any team in the CL during the month.

-The Rocks as a team hit .277, the highest batting average of any month this season and also scored more runs (155) than they did in any previous month.

ROCK SOLID IN THE SECOND HALF: The Blue Rocks have the second-best winning percentage in the Carolina League in the second half at .622 (Winston-Salem 1st, .628)

-With the win in the middle game of the series Wednesday night at Salem, the Rocks once again avoided losing three straight games in the second half for the first time. (Lost three or more in a row six times in the first half.)

-Wilmington has either been atop of the division or out of the top spot by just one game since July 11 and have led the division since July 18 and hold a two game lead over second place Lynchburg and six game lead over the Red Sox.

-The Blue Rocks also have not been below .500 at any point this half. (Have been at .500 mark four times)

-The Rocks are currently 24-12 against Northern Division foes in the second half which is the best mark in the division.

WALK OR RUN THIS WAY: The Blue Rocks have led the Carolina League in walks for the majority of the season and also lead the league in stolen bases.

-Wilmington has racked up 452 walks this season.

-The Rocks have swiped 146 bags through 115 games this year, which paces the league.

-The Blue Crew also have been stealing bases at a rapid clip in the second half and have stolen 69 bases through 45 games of the second half.

-Wilmington has four different active players with double-digit stolen bases including **D.J. Burt** who is the active team-leader and third in the CL with 27, **Blake Perkins** ranks fourth in the CL with 24 between Potomac and Wilmington, **Rudy Martin** has 21 stolen bases on the year and **Travis Jones** has 13.

-The Blue Crew have stolen five bases in six different games this season.

-Wilmington is the only team in the Carolina League to steal 20 or more bases in each of the first four months of the season. (37 in April, 20 in May, 37 in June, 38 in July and have 13 in August)

-They also have an impressive 73% success rate stealing bases this season (146 out of 199).

CAN COUNT ON CANCEL: Infielder **Gabriel Cancel** has been a major run producer for the Blue Rocks, especially in the second half.

-Cancel has driven in 50 runs over his last 51 games and has also put together 14 multi-RBI games during the stretch and leads the team with 18 games driving in multiple runs.

-He currently is the team leader, second amongst Royals' farmhands and has the most RBI amongst active players in the Carolina League with 70.

-Cancel drove in 26 runs in 27 games in the month of July.

-When batting third, the infielder is hitting .275 (33-for-120) with 29 RBI in 31 games.

-When he bats cleanup, Cancel is a .333 fitter (28-for-84) with 22 RBI in 22 games.

BURT PROVIDING THE HURT: Second-year Blue Rock **D.J. Burt** is not suffering from a sophomore slump in the Carolina League and was named a Carolina League All-Star.

-He is third in the CL in on-base percentage (.386), third in the Carolina League in stolen bases (27), and fifth in batting average (.301)

-He picked up a hit in 20 of 24 games in July to help him post a .330 batting average (31-for-94) with two homers, 18 RBI and a .404 OBP.

-Tied for first on the team with 29 multi-hit games. (Had 20 all of last season)

WIL: RHP Nolan Watson (6-1, 3.19 ERA)

-Righty **Nolan Watson** is making his eighth with the Blue Rocks tonight and first against the Pelicans.

-Was selected by the Kansas City Royals 33rd overall in the 2015 Draft out of Lawrence North High School in Indiana.

-In his last start at home on August 4 in the second game of a doubleheader against Frederick he earned his fifth straight win.

-He worked six innings, allowed one run (unearned) on just three hits, did not walk a batter and struck out four.

-Over his last five starts, Watson is a perfect 5-0 with an impressive 1.97 ERA over 32 innings of work.

-During that stretch, Watson has worked at least five innings in all of them and seven frames in three of the five starts.

-Started the season in Low-A Lexington and went 4-6 with a 5.81 ERA in 13 starts with the Legends.

-Logged 66.2 innings, allowed 94 hits, 55R/43ER, walked 21, struck out 63 and opponents hit .331 against him.

-At time of promotion he was first on the team in starts made (13), second on the team in innings pitched (66.2), and strikeouts (63).

-Turned in his best start of his season in his last outing on June 15 and tossed a complete-game shutout against the Rome Braves.

-He worked all nine innings, allowed six hits, did not walk a batter and struck out seven.

-He needed just 89 pitches to earn his first-career complete game.

-Was named Lexington's Opening Day starter.

-Allowed three earned runs or less in 9 of his 13 starts with the Legends and over his final five starts, posted a 3.77 ERA.

-Features a fastball, slider, curveball and changeup.

-Fellow right-hander **Cory Abbot** makes his 10th start with the Pelicans and first against the Blue Rocks.

-The 22-year-old was drafted in the second round by the Chicago Cubs in the 2017 Draft out of Loyola Marymount.

-Rated the 16th-best prospect in the system per *Baseball America* and 18th according to MLB Pipeline.com.

-Abbot was promoted to Myrtle Beach on June 5 and in his last start at Potomac on August 4, he did not factor in the decision.

-He tossed six scoreless innings, allowed three hits, walked one and struck out five.

-In the start before on July 27 against Lynchburg, he also didn't factor in the decision despite working 6.2 innings, allowed one run and struck out 10 batters.

-Started the season in Low-A South Bend and put up solid numbers.

-Posted a 4-1 record with a 2.47 ERA in nine starts.

-Logged 47.1 innings, allowed 18 runs (13 earned) on 35 hits, walked 13 and struck out 57 while holding opponents to a .207 batting average.

-Threw Loyola Marymount's only perfect game on March 25, 2017 and it raised his stock tremendously.

-Features a fastball, cutter, curveball and changeup.

TONIGHT'S BLUE ROCKS STARTING PITCHER

THE BOOK ON NOLAN WATSON: Watson was the 33rd overall pick in the 2015 Draft by the Royals as Kansas City received the pick as compensation when James Shields signed with the San Diego Padres that offseason. Was a highly-touted high school prep pitcher and went 6-1 with an impressive 0.68 ERA in 51.2 innings of work while striking out 81 batters during his senior year. He was committed to Vanderbilt University before signing with the Royals for a reported \$1.8 million. Joins former prep arms in Ashe Russell, who was selected 21st overall in 2015. Foster Griffin (2014) and Scott Blewett (2014) as other top two round picks by the Royals during the 2014-15 MLB Drafts. Played against Russell in high school as Watson's North Lawrence High School team beat Russell's Cathedral High School in the state tournament.

LAST TIME OUT: Watson is coming off another winning effort in his last start on August 4 at home against Frederick in the second game of a doubleheader. The righty earned his fifth straight victory after he turned in six innings, allowed one run (unearned) on just three hits, did not walk a batter and struck out four.

WATSON HAS BEEN IMPRESSIVE AS OF LATE: During his last five starts, Watson is 5-0 with an impressive 1.97 ERA over 32 innings of work. He has lasted five innings or more in each start and has tossed seven frames in three of the five outings. He has a solid 22 to 5 strikeout to walk ratio. The five straight wins is tied for the longest streak by a Blue Rock pitcher this season and will go for his sixth straight win tonight.

ROCK SOLID AT HOME: Watson has taken advantage of the pitcher friendly confines of Frawley Stadium and is an impressive 4-0 with a 1.46 ERA in four starts. (1-1, 5.01 ERA in four road starts). Watson has allowed just four earned runs over 24.2 innings at home while holding opponents to a .195 batting average. (.347 BAA on the road)

ADJUSTING TO NEW ROUTINE: Like many players who get drafted in the MLB Draft, Watson was a talented player on his high school team and played multiple positions, listing playing shortstop and being a designated hitter as his two favorite positions aside from pitching. However, Watson has realized that the schedule and preparation from being a high-school athlete to a professional athlete has major differences. "Just the preparation throughout the week," Watson said. "In high school, I played every position and hit and everything. I wasn't really focused on taking care of my arm because I had a whole six days of rest to recover but here, I have to do the most with my time, the little time that I have to prepare throughout the whole week. I'd say just judging how you feel each day, doing what you need to do that day is probably the hardest part."

BETTER COMPETITION IN CAROLINA LEAGUE: In addition to his routine to get himself ready for each start, Watson also has realized quickly how advanced the approach is at the plate for hitters in Advanced-A. "The approach. I can't just go out there and throw two fastballs on the corner and then throw a curveball in the dirt to get a strikeout. I've had problems getting strikeouts since I've been here because I have to get used to the way hitters approach their at-bats now. I'm not too worried about it. It's just an adjustment I need to make in the bullpen. But I'm confident I won't have a problem with that much longer."

NAMED AFTER THE RYAN EXPRESS: Watson's parents named him after an all-time pitching great in Nolan Ryan. "There was a poster on my brother's wall when he was real young, and it was a poster of Nolan Ryan and it said, "Read More Books". My mom told me she just looked at that poster every day and said "If we have another boy we're naming him Nolan." So it happened. I have no idea when I figured out who Nolan Ryan was, but I guess the day that I did, I fell in love."

A FAN OF MULTIPLE PLAYERS GROWING UP: Along with listing Nolan Ryan as one of his favorite players, Watson also had two other players he grew up watching. "I also really liked Jose Reyes and Alfonso Soriano." When asked why he liked Alfonso Soriano Watson said, "I think my parents gave me one of those little MacFarlane figures and I had that in my room and I just liked him ever since. I had his Cubs jersey, I had a Cubs hat. I started liking Jose Reyes because he was my brother's favorite player. Anything my brother did, I wanted to do as well because he was older. I just wanted to look up to him, if he did something or liked somebody, I liked him too."

GOALS FOR THE REST OF THE SEASON: Happy to be in Wilmington, Watson wants to put together a strong finish to the 2018 season. "I want to continue what I'm doing now, get better with my command and my delivery. Just working on getting everything together and staying healthy."
