



## MISSISSIPPI BRAVES (2-1) VS. TENNESSEE SMOKIES (1-2)

LHP MAX FRIED (0-0, --) VS. RHP OSCAR DE LA CRUZ (0-0, --)

**TODAY'S GAME:** The Mississippi Braves continue their opening 5-game home-stand against the Tennessee Smokies, AA affiliate of the Chicago Cubs at Trustmark Park. The M-Braves will look for their first series win of the 2018 season with LHP Max Fried on the mound.

**LAST TIME OUT:** On a cold and damp Saturday night at Trustmark Park, the Braves, and Smokies split two games with Tennessee taking Friday's suspended game 7-2 and the M-Braves coming from behind to win the night-cap, 7-5. Tyler Neslony ended the night 3-for-7 in two games with a double and three RBI and is batting .455 through three games. M-Braves pitching recorded 26 strikeouts over the two games.

**FIRST ROUND PICKS:** Today's starter, RHP **Max Fried** is one of five first round selections on the M-Braves roster. Fried was selected by the San Diego Padres in the first round (seventh overall) in 2012 First-Year. He was acquired by the Atlanta Braves along with INF Jace Peterson, OF Dustin Peterson and OF Mallex Smith from the San Diego Padres in exchange for OF Justin Upton and RHP Aaron Northcraft on December 19, 2014.

**HURSH NEARING M-BRAVES STRIKEOUT RECORD:** Reliever **Jason Hursh** needs two strikeouts (currently at 200) to become M-Braves all-time leader in strikeouts (Scott Diamond, 201). Hursh has five over his first two outings, covering 3.0 innings.

**RED-HOT NESLONY:** The former Texas Tech Red Raider **Tyler Neslony** is 5-for-11 through his first 3 games on the season, batting .455 with 2 doubles and 3 RBI.

**HAMMER TIME:** Jackson, MS native **Chris Maloney** enters his first season as the M-Braves manager and is the seventh skipper in franchise history.

- Maloney attended Jackson's St. Joseph High School and graduated from Mississippi State University in 1983.
- Maloney spent the previous six years on the St. Louis Cardinals Major League coaching staff as the team's third base coach (2016-July 2017) and first base coach (2012-15).
- Prior to joining the Cardinals, Maloney was the Memphis Redbirds (AAA) manager for five seasons (2007-11), leading the team to winning records in four of his five seasons.
- Maloney ranks ninth among active minor league managers in wins with 1,350 entering the 2018 season.

**PROSPECTING:** The Atlanta Braves farm system was ranked by MLB Pipeline as No. 2 in Major League Baseball. The M-Braves roster features three of the Top 100 in RHP **Kyle Wright** (No. 30), LHP **Max Fried** (No. 83) and INF **Austin Riley** (No. 97). The roster has seven of the Top 30 Atlanta prospects in Wright (No. 2), Fried (No. 7), Riley (No. 8), RHP **Touki Toussaint** (No. 11), C **Alex Jackson** (No. 14), OF **Travis Demeritte** (No. 21), LHP **Ricardo Sanchez** (No. 27).

**VIDEO BOARD:** In its second season above the LF wall, at 68 feet wide by 28 feet high (1,904 square feet), the state-of-the-art Panasonic HD video board is approximately four-times larger than the previous video display at Trustmark Park (2005-2016). The board is the largest single display in the Southern League and the largest in Central and South Mississippi.
