TODAY'S GAME: The Mississippi Braves will travel to Biloxi, MS for a five game homestand against their in-state rival, the Biloxi Shuckers, beginning on Wednesday, April 11. The trip to Biloxi will be the first road series of the season for the M-Braves. RHP, Kyle Wright (0-0, 0.00) will make his second start of the season with the M-Braves.

LAST TIME OUT: After securing their first series victory of the 2018 season on Sunday, the Mississippi Braves dropped their series finale against the Tennessee Smokies by a score of 5-4.

FIRST ROUND PICKS: Today's starter, RHP **Kyle Wright** is one of five first round selections on the M-Braves roster. Wright was selected by the Atlanta Braves in the first round (fifth overall) in the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of Vanderbilt University. The 22-year old made history when he signed with Atlanta and received a \$7 million bonus, the largest signing bonus received by an amateur player since Kris Bryant received a \$6.7 million bonus after signing with the Chicago Cubs in 2013.

HURSH NEARING M-BRAVES STRIKEOUT RECORD: Reliever **Jason Hursh** needs just one strikeout (currently at 201) to become the M-Braves all-time leader in strikeouts. Hursh tied Scott Diamond's record (201) on Monday afternoon after recording one strikeout in 1.0 IP.

THIS DAY IN BRAVES HISTORY:

HAMMER TIME: Jackson, MS native **Chris Maloney** enters his first season as the M-Braves manager and is the seventh skipper in franchise history.

- Maloney attended Jackson's St. Joseph High School and graduated from Mississippi State University in 1983.
- Maloney spent the previous six years on the St. Louis Cardinals Major League coaching staff as the team's third base coach (2016-July 2017) and first base coach (2012-15).
- Prior to joining the Cardinals, Maloney was the Memphis Redbirds (AAA) manager for five seasons (2007-11), leading the team to winning records in four of his five seasons.
- Maloney ranks ninth among active minor league managers in wins with 1,350 entering the 2018 season.

PROSPECTING: The Atlanta Braves farm system was ranked by MLB Pipeline as No. 2 in Major League Baseball. The M-Braves roster features three of the Top 100 in RHP **Kyle Wright** (No. 30), LHP **Max Fried** (No. 83) and INF **Austin Riley** (No. 97). The roster has seven of the Top 30 Atlanta prospects in Wright (No. 2), Fried (No. 7), Riley (No. 8), RHP **Touki Toussaint** (No. 11), C **Alex Jackson** (No. 14), OF **Travis Demeritte** (No. 21), LHP **Ricardo Sanchez** (No. 27).

VIDEO BOARD: In its second season above the LF wall, at 68 feet wide by 28 feet high (1,904 square feet), the state-of-theart Panasonic HD video board is approximately four-times larger than the previous video display at Trustmark Park (2005-2016). The board is the largest single display in the Southern League and the largest in Central and South Mississippi.

TODAY'S GAME

- Wright makes his second start of the 2018 season in what will be the first road contest of the 2018 season for the Mississippi Braves.

LAST TIME OUT

- Wright made his Double-A debut on April 5, 2018 which was Opening Day for the M-Braves. In his first appearance with the M-Braves, Wright pitched 3.2 scoreless innings allowing three hits, and three walks while striking out three.

ACQUIRED

- Braves' first-round pick (fifth overall) in 2017

HIGHLIGHTS

- Selected by the Atlanta Braves in the first round (fifth overall) of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft.
- Ranked as the No. 30 overall prospect in MLB.com's Top 100 ranking. In the Atlanta Braves organization ranked No. 4 according to Baseball America and Baseball Prospectus adn No. 2 by MLB.com.
- Named first team All-SEC by the league's coaches and a Second Team All-America by Baseball America after going 5-6 with a 3.40 ERA (39 ER/103.1 IP) over 16 starts for the Commodores in 2017.
- Became the fifth Vanderbilt pitcher drafted in the first round over the last four years, while at least one Vanderbilt pitcher has been selected in the draft's first two rounds for seven consecutive seasons...Is the second Vanderbilt pitcher drafted by the Braves in the first round, joining LHP Mike Minor, who the club chose seventh overall in 2009.

NOTES

- Made his professional debut with rookie-level GCL Braves and Single-A Florida, going a combined 0-1 with a 2.65 ERA in nine games, all starts...Fanned 18 while walking six.
- Started his organizational debut on 7/17 vs. GCL Yankees West, going 1.2 innings and allowing one run while striking out three...Pitched twice more for the GCL club, tossing 2.0 scoreless innings each time.
- Made his Single-A debut on 8/1 at Dunedin, retiring all six batters he faced in the start.
- Finished his season on 9/1 at Daytona...Tossed 2.0 scoreless innings, allowing one hit with three strikeouts.
