**Tonight's Game:** The Nashville Sounds and Iowa Cubs play the series opener of a three-game set tonight, beginning a seven-day, six-game homestand for the Sounds. The two teams last played in April in two sets of five-game series. Tonight, right-hander Tim Dillard starts for the Sounds against right-hander Matt Swarmer for the Cubs.

**Tim Dillard:** 36-year-old Tim Dillard starts for the Sounds tonight. The right-hander is 5-8 with a 5.78 ERA in 25 games (13 starts) in 2019. He last pitched on July 16 in relief at San Antonio and threw 2.1 shutout innings, allowing 1 hit and 1 walk with 2 strikeouts in the 6-5 loss. As a reliever, Dillard is 2-1 with a 4.71 ERA (28.2 IP/15 ER) versus his 3-7 record and 5.79 ERA (70.0 IP/45 ER) as a starter. Dillard is the Nashville Sounds all-time leader in innings pitched (655.1), wins (44), strikeouts (394), runs allowed (375), home runs allowed (57) and walks (223) and is currently second all-time in games (234). In his career, Dillard has pitched in 73 big league games and 501 minor league games. He signed a minor-league free agent contract with the Texas Rangers on December 21, 2018.

**Matt Swarmer:** 25-year-old Matt Swarmer starts for the Cubs in the series opener. The right-hander is making his 18th appearance (17th start) of the season and carries a 5-8 mark with a 5.76 ERA into tonight. Swarmer last pitched on July 14 in a start at Round Rock. He earned no decision after going 5.0 innings in the start, allowing 4 earned runs on 8 hits and 2 walks. He struck 4 batters in Iowa's 10-8 loss. The Pennsylvania native spent the 2018 season between Advanced-A Myrtle Beach and Double-A Tennessee where he combined to go 9-8 with a 3.22 ERA in 24 starts. He was named a Carolina League All-Star (midseason) for his efforts with the Pelicans prior to being promoted to Tennessee on June 5. In his career, Swarmer is 21-22 with a 4.39 ERA in 74 games (58 starts). The Chicago Cubs drafted him in the 19th round of the 2016 MLB Draft out of Kutztown University.

**2019 Standings:** The Sounds have spent the following amount of days in the American Northern Division standings in 2019: First: 1, Second: 1, Third: 24, Fourth: 76.

**Nashville vs. Swarmer:** The Sounds have faced Iowa starting pitcher Matt Swarmer twice this season, once each in Des Moines and Nashville. Swarmer is 2-0 against the Sounds with a 3.27 ERA (11.0 IP/4 ER). He has struck out 9 Sounds hitters while walking 12. In his lone start at First Tennessee on April 6, he went 5.0 innings and allowed 3 runs on 3 hits (1 home run) and 3 walks with 3 strikeouts. His last start against the Sounds was in Iowa on April 24, where he lasted 6.0 innings and allowed 1 earned run on 2 hits (1 home run) and 1 walk while striking out 6 hitters. Active Sounds hitters have performed as such: Jett Bandy, 0-2; Willie Calhoun, 0-4, BB; Matt Davidson, 1-3, HR, RBI, BB; Zack Granite, 1-4; Andy Ibanez, 0-2, K; Carlos Tocci, 1-3, K; Jose Trevino, 0-2; Eli White, 1-3, 2 BB, K; Patrick Wisdom, 1-3, HR, 3 RBI, K.

**Welcome Back Willie:** Outfielder Willie Calhoun is back with the Nashville Sounds after being optioned by Texas. He currently owns a 19-game on base streak that started on April 22 and went until his latest game with Nashville on June 16. In the streak, he is hitting .355 (22-for-62) with 13 runs scored, 3 doubles, 5 home runs, 17 RBI and 1 walk (.487 OBP). The streak is the longest among active Pacific Coast League hitters after Seattle selected Kristopher Negron's contract on July 16 from Tacoma, who owned a 20-game on base streak before being promoted. In 20 games with Texas since June 17, Calhoun hit .225 (16-for-71) with 4 doubles, 3 home runs and 6 RBI.

**A Pitcher's Game:** The matchup between the Nashville Sounds and Iowa Cubs feature the two worst team batting averages in the Pacific Coast League at .255. Both teams also find themselves in the bottom-three teams in runs scored with Nashville ranked last (470) and Iowa ranked 14th (508). However, both team's pitching staffs have been limited opposing hitters to the long ball this season, with Nashville ranked fourth-lowest at 127 and Iowa fifth-lowest at 128. The Cubs have excelled much more as pitchers this season, ranking 3rd in ERA (4.43) and runs allowed (462). It helps that their defense has picked them up by having the second-best fielding percentage at .984.

**36 Years Young:** Today is Nashville starting pitcher Tim Dillard's birthday, who is turning 36 years old. Since 2005, Dillard has pitched on his birthday three other times: 2010, 2014, 2018. Overall, he is 0-1 in the 3 relief appearances with a 1.50 ERA (6.0 IP/1 ER) and has 4 strikeouts to 2 walks. In his birthday outing last season with Triple-A Colorado Springs versus Round Rock, he threw a shutout inning in the 4-3 loss.

**Top of the Lineup Strength:** In last night's loss in San Antonio, the 1-3 hitters each went 2-for-4 with a walk and scored all three runs. Zack Granite had 2 runs with a double, home run, and his 18th stolen base of the season. Scott Heineman hit behind him and scored 1 run with 1 RBI. Three-hitter Eli White also stole his 11th stolen base of the season. The rest of the lineup went 3-for-23 with 1 RBI, 2 walks and made up 6 of the 8 team strikeouts.

**Eli Streaks Again:** Shortstop/center fielder Eli White has hit safely in eight consecutive games. It's the fourth time this season he has put together a hitting streak of at least eight games (8, 10, 10). Over the current eight-game stretch, White is hitting .273 (9-for-33) with 4 runs scored, 1 triple, 2 home runs, 6 RBI, 2 walks and 2 stolen bases.

**Davidson's On-Base Streak:** Infielder Matt Davidson has reached base safely in 13 consecutive games, tied for the 9th-longest active streak in the Pacific Coast League. During the streak, Davidson has an on-base percentage of .357 and is hitting .300 (15-for-50) with 6 runs scored, 3 doubles, 2 home runs, 9 RBI and 4 walks.

**Three-Headed Monster:** Outfielder Scott Heineman rejoined Nashville on June 25 and is hitting .414 (29-for-70) since then, good for the 4th-highest average in the Pacific Coast League. During that same timeframe, Zack Granite has the 6th-highest mark at .403 (25-for-62) and Christian Lopes has the 7th-highest average in the league at .400 (22-for-55).

**Last Outing:** Dillard last pitched on July 16 against San Antonio in a relief role. After starter Pedro Payano went 2 2/3 innings, Dillard was summoned and tossed 2 1/3 scoreless innings out of the bullpen. He allowed 1 hit, 1 walk and struck out 2 in a no-decision. He threw 23 of his 34 pitches for strikes. His last start was on July 13 against New Orleans. He logged his 4th quality start of the year and threw 99 pitches, 67 for strikes.

**Against Opponent:** Dillard has pitched in 3 games against Iowa in 2019. April 6 at home, and April 25 and 26 at Iowa. He worked in relief on April 6 and April 25 before starting against the Cubs on April 26 and tossing 5.0 shutout innings. He limited Iowa to 1 hit but got a no-decision in Nashville's 2-1 win. In his 3 outings against the Cubs, Dillard is 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA (9.0 IP/3 ER). He has allowed 5 hits, 5 walks and has 3 strikeouts.

- Made his first start of the season at Iowa on April 26...ND, 5.0 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 0 BB, 3 K.
- Earned his 40th career win with Nashville on May 7 at Oklahoma City... 6.0 IP, 4 H, 0 R, 0 BB, 1 HBP, 1 K.
- Logged his first quality start on June 1 vs. New Orleans...6.0 IP, 6 H, 1 R, 1 ER, 0 BB, 5 K
