Joe Palumbo starts for Nashville against left-hander Jake Kalish for Omaha. Tim Dillard: 36-year-old Tim Dillard starts for the Sounds today. The right-hander is 7-8 with a 4.72 ERA in 29 games (17 starts) in 2019. His last time out was on August 11 at Sacramento where he earned no decision. He allowed 1 run on 5 hits and 1 walk with 4 strikeouts. The Sounds ended up losing 3-2. Dillard

First Tennessee Park. It's the third out of four meetings between the two clubs in 2019. Tonight, left-hander

is the Nashville Sounds all-time leader in innings pitched (684.1), wins (46), strikeouts (412), runs allowed (382), home runs allowed (59) and walks (229) and is tied-for-first all-time in games (238). In his career, Dillard has pitched in 73 big league games and 507 minor league games. He signed a minor-league free agent contract with the Texas Rangers on December 21, 2018. Arnaldo Hernandez: 23-year-old Arnaldo Hernandez starts for the Storm Chasers tonight. The right-

hander is 3-8 with an 7.36 ERA in 18 games (16 starts) with Omaha in 2019. He has also made 4 starts with Double-A Northwest Arkansas and is 2-2 with a 1.96 ERA. With Omaha, Hernandez has worked 80.2 innings and has allowed 120 hits and 35 walks while recording 51 strikeouts. He last pitched on August 11 in a start versus Las Vegas. He earned no decision and allowed 3 runs (2 earned) on 5 hits and 2 walks while recording 4 strikeouts. Omaha won the game 4-3 in 10 innings. The Venezuela native has a minor league career record of 34-23 with a 4.35 ERA in 104 games (81 starts). Kansas City signed him as a nondrafted free agent on September 18, 2012.

2019 Standings: The Sounds have spent the following amount of days in the American Northern Division standings in 2019: First: 1, Second: 1, Third: 34, Fourth: 91.

**Hernandez vs. Nashville:** Arnaldo pitched against Nashville on July 5 and earned the win in a 9-2 Omaha victory. He threw 5.1 shutout innings, allowing 6 hits and 3 walks while striking out 4 batters. Active Sounds hitters performed as such against Hernandez: Matt Davidson, 0-3, K; Scott Heineman, 2-2, 3B, BB; Andy Ibáñez, 1-3, K; Christian Lopes, 1-2, BB; Eli White, 0-3, K; Patrick Wisdom, 0-2, K.

Another Record for Dillard: Today's start will be starting pitcher Tim Dillard's 239th game he's pitched with Nashville, setting the franchise record. He will pass Joey Viera, who played in 238 games from 1990-92, 1994-95. It will also be Dillard's 65th career start, moving him into 3rd all-time in franchise history. He passed Chase Wright, who pitched from 2009-2011.

Flirting with the No-No: Yesterday's starter Joe Palumbo didn't allow a hit in 6.0 innings, walking 2 batters and struck out 7. Omaha made their first hit in the top of the 7th inning, but were able to muster just 2 hits all game. That tied a season-low for hits allowed by the Sounds, matching June 12 versus Las Vegas. Palumbo earned his third win of the season and the Sounds are 5-1 when he starts.

White Does Extra: Shortstop/Centerfielder Eli White went 2-for-3 with a double and his 14th home run of the season in Thursday night's win. White has hit well in 12 games in August, batting .415 (17-for-41) with 3 doubles, 2 home runs and 6 RBI.

**7-of-8 for the Sounds:** The Sounds have won 7-of-8 games, owning the best record in the PCL since August 7. Nashville is hitting .295 (85-for-288) in the span and is tied with El Paso for the most home runs (18) in the 8 games. Sounds' pitching also ranks 1st in strikeouts (83) and 3rd in ERA (3.66).

Three Cheers for Guzmán: First baseman Ronald Guzmán led all Sounds hitters with three hits in Thurs-

day night's win. It's the second time this season Guzmán recorded three hits this year, dating back to last week on August 7 at Fresno. Since his first three-hit game, Guzmán has hit safely in six-of-seven games and four multi-hit games. He is hitting .400 (12-for-30) with 2 doubles, 2 home runs

So Good Solak: Since being acquired by Texas in a trade on July 13, Nick Solak has been red hot at the plate. In 26 games with Nashville, Solak is hitting, 347 (35-for-101) with 18 runs scored, 6 doubles, 10 home runs, 26 RBI and 5 walks. Solak has 71 total bases - T4th-most in the Pacific Coast League since his first game on July 15 (tied with Patrick Wisdom). He has hit safely in 22 of 26 games.

Solak is Streaking at 15: Infielder Nick Solak has hit safely in 15 straight games, the longest active streak in the Pacific Coast League. Since July 30 when the streak started, Solak is hitting .433 (26-for-60) with 12 runs scored, 4 doubles, 6 home runs, 18 RBI and 3 walks. Solak is the second Sounds player to record a hitting streak of at least 15 games this year, joining Willie Calhoun (16).

16 Straight with a Home Run: With three more home runs on Thursday

night, the Sounds have now hit at least one home run in 16 consecutive games. They have hit a total of 30 in the 16-game stretch.

Heating up in August: The Sounds are off to an 9-4 start in the month of August as they search for their first winning month of 2019. The club is hitting .309 (145-for-469) with 53 extra-base hits and a .908 OPS in the 13 games. The average is ranked the third-highest in the PCL. Nashville also has the fourth-lowest ERA in the league at 4.56.

Last Outing: Dillard last pitched on August 11 in a start against Sacramento. He allowed 1 run on 5 hits and 1 walk in the no-decision. The right-hander threw 51 of his 78 pitches for strikes and recorded 4 strikeouts. Nashville lost, 3-2, dropping Nashville's record to 8-9 when Dillard starts.

Against Opponent: Dillard has made two starts against Omaha this season and is 0-2 with a 9.82 ERA (11.0 IP, 12 ER). He has 3 strikeouts and 3 walks. His last start against the Storm Chasers was at Omaha on July 6, when he allowed 10 runs on 13 hits and two walks. Nashville lost, 11-3.
