Tonight's Game: The Nashville Sounds travel to Oklahoma City to begin their final road trip of the season tonight. The five-game series in Bricktown represents the final time the two teams will meet in 2019. Tonight, right-hander Austin Bibens-Dirkx starts for Nashville against right-hander J.D. Martin for Oklahoma City.

Austin Bibens-Dirkx: 34-year-old Austin Bibens-Dirkx starts for the Sounds tonight. The right-hander is 0-4 with a 7.94 ERA in 6 starts with Nashville. He has covered 28.1 innings and has allowed 35 hits and 13 walks while recording 24 strikeouts. Bibens-Dirkx last pitched on July 31 against El Paso and allowed 6 runs on 6 hits in 4.2 innings. He was placed on the 7-day injured list on August 5. Bibens-Dirkx started his 2019 with the Uni-President Lions of the Chinese Professional Baseball League in Taiwan. He pitched 15 games overseas, starting 9 of them. Overall, he went 2-5 with a 5.28 ERA (46.0 IP/27 ER) and 1.26 WHIP. Bibens-Dirkx split 2018 between Triple-A Round Rock and Texas. In his second season with the Rangers, he went 2-3 with a 6.20 ERA in 13 games (6 starts). He went 3-6 with a 5.68 ERA in 17 games (15 starts) for Round Rock. In 37 MLB games, Bibens-Dirkx is 7-5 with a 5.27 ERA (114.1 IP/67 ER) in 37 games (12 starts). In 341 MiLB games, he's 64-61 with a 4.25 ERA. Bibens-Dirkx was drafted by the Seattle Mariners in the 16th round of the 2006 MLB Draft.

J.D. Martin: 36-year-old J.D. Martin starts for the Dodgers in tonight's series opener. The right-hander is 3-0 with a 5.40 ERA in 5 starts with Oklahoma City. Martin began his season with Double-A Tulsa and went 2-7 with a 5.38 ERA in 14 starts before joining Oklahoma City. Overall in 2019, the California native is 5-7 with a 5.38 ERA in 19 games. He has covered 108.2 innings while yielding 115 hits and 57 walks while recording 84 strikeouts. Martin last pitched on August 13 against Reno. In the Dodgers' 10-6 win, Martin allowed 5 runs on 3 hits and 5 walks with 6 strikeouts. He allowed three home runs in the no-decision. Martin pitched in Major League Baseball with the Washington Nationals in 2009 and 2010 and went 6-9 with a 4.32 ERA in 24 starts. He has been in Minor League Baseball since 2011. In 310 Minor League games, he's 104-75 with a 3.92 ERA. He signed a minor league contract with Los Angeles-NL in February. The Cleveland Indians drafted Martin in the first round (compensation) of the 2009 MLB Draft.

Palumbo is the Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week: Left-hander Joe Palumbo was named Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week today. The southpaw started one game this past week and tossed six no-hit innings against Omaha on August 15. He walked two and struck out seven in his third win of the season. Patrick Wisdom and Palumbo are the first pair of Nashville teammates to win back-to-back player of the week honors since Caleb Gindl (8/20-26) and Hiram Burgos (8/27-9/3) accomplished the feat in 2012. Palumbo's next start will be tomorrow with Texas.

Solak's Streak Hits 18 Games: Infielder Nick Solak continues to climb Nashville's all-time hitting streak list with three more knocks last night to extend his streak to 18 games. It's tied for the sixth-longest streak by a Sound in the Pacific Coast League era (1998-Present). Adam Hyzdu (26 games in 2001) is the longest Sounds hitting streak during the PCL era. Solak is hitting .432 (32-for-74) with 16 runs, 4 doubles, 6 home runs, 19 RBI and 4 walks during the streak.

Davidson Drills #27: Infielder Matt Davidson crushed his 27th home run of the season in last night's loss. It's a career-high for Davidson, surpassing the 26 he hit with the Chicago White Sox in 2017. The 27 home runs are tied for 10th-most in the Pacific Coast League.

Eight Triples for Granite: Outfielder Zack Granite collected his team-leading 8th triple of the season last night. He's currently tied for 4th-most in the PCL with Sacramento's Abielat Avelino. Former Sound Jorge Mateo leads the circuit with 14 triples. Granite needs two more triples to reach 10 and join Mateo as the only Sounds in the last 14 years to record at least 10 triples in a season.

Ibáñez On-Base Streak: Infielder Andy Ibáñez has reached base safely in 18 straight games, dating back to July 24. That's good for the 4th-longest on-base streak among active PCL hitters. During the streak, he's hitting .388 (26-for-67) with 17 runs, 7 doubles, 4 home runs, 16 RBI and 14 walks. He carries a .488 on-base percentage during the streak.

Petrifying Petricka: Reliever Jake Petricka has found himself in the primary closer role for the Sounds since reliever David Carpenter was selected by Texas. In the month of August, Petricka has three saves in six games, allowing a 1.42 ERA (6.1 IP/1 ER).

So Good Solak: Since being acquired by Texas in a trade on July 13, Nick Solak has been red hot at the plate. In 29 games with Nashville, Solak is hitting .357 (41-for-115) with 22 runs scored, 6 doubles, 10 home runs, 27 RBI and 6 walks. Solak has 77 total bases - 7th-most in the Pacific Coast League since his first game on July 15. He has hit safely in 25 of 29 games.

19 Straight with a Home Run: With home runs from Scott Heineman and Matt Davidson last night, the Sounds have extended their home run streak to 19 consecutive games. They have hit a total of 34 in the 19-game stretch.

It's Something About August: During the First Tennessee Park era (2015-present), the Sounds have an overall record of 79-53 in the month of August, including 11-5 this year. They went 18-11 in 2018, 13-14 in 2017, 21-9 in 2016 and 16-14 in 2015.

Last Outing: Bibens-Dirkx last pitched on July 31 against the El Paso Chihuahuas. He went 4.2 innings and allowed 6 runs on 6 hits and 2 walks. He struck out 4 and threw 62 of his 99 pitches for strikes in Nashville's 7-6 win. Bibens-Dirkx did not factor into the decision. He was placed on the 7-day injured list on August 5 (retro to 8/1) and reinstated today.

Against Opponent: Bibens-Dirkx made his season debut against the Dodgers on June 29 at First Tennessee Park. He went 4.2 innings and allowed 4 runs on 7 hits. He did not factor into the decision in Nashville's 10-7 loss. He also faced Oklahoma City on July 23 and was tagged with a loss after he allowed a season-high 8 runs on 9 hits in Nashville's 16-1 setback.

2019 Season Highlights:

- Bibens-Dirkx pitched for the Uni-President Lions of the Chinese Professional Baseball League until early June.
- Was signed to a minor-league contract by the Texas Rangers on June 29 and assigned to Nashville.
- Tossed 5.0 shutout innings against New Orleans on July 11...5.0 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 0 ER, 1 BB, 5 K.
