The Sounds came out victorious in game one last night with a 7-3 win in 10 innings. Tonight, right-hander Carlos Ramirez will start for the Sounds against left-hander Dillon Peters for the Baby Cakes.

Series Sweeps:	4-1	Carlos Ramirez: 27-year-old Carlos Ramirez starts for Nashville in tonight's game. The right-hander is making the first start of his career tonight and is 2-2 with a 3.44 ERA in 25 games with the Sounds this year.

Ramirez began the season in the Toronto organization and made two appearances for the Blue Jays and seven with Triple-A Buffalo before being claimed off waivers by Oakland on May 20. He has appeared in three games for the Athletics. Ramirez was originally signed by the Toronto Blue Jays as a minor league free agent on March 5, 2009.

April:	12-12	Dillon Peters: 25-year-old Dillon Peters starts for the Baby Cakes tonight. The left-hander is 5-7 with a 6.02 ERA in 17 starts with New Orleans in 2018. He last started on August 24 in Round Rock and earned a win against the Express. Peters allowed two earned runs on nine hits in seven innings. He walked one and struck out six. Peters made his Major League debut in 2017 when he pitched in six games with the Marlins and went 1-2 with a 5.17 ERA. He has also pitched with Miami this year and is 2-2 with a 7.16 ERA in seven games (five starts). In his minor league career, Peters is 27-20 with a 3.39 ERA in 65 starts. Miami drafted Peters in the 10th round of the 2014 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Texas.

During the 17-game stretch, he's batting .440 (33-for-75) with 16 runs, 11 RBI, 7 doubles, 4 triples, and 1 home run. On the season he is batting .379 on the road compared to .306 at First Tennessee Park.
Walk-Off Wins:	8	Sheldon's Steady Rise: After a slow start to the season in which he hit .141 (10-for-71) in April and .218 (22-for-101) in May, third baseman Sheldon Neuse has found his groove at the plate. Neuse hit .306 (30-for-98) in June and .306 (34-for-111) in July, and has hit .297 (30-for-101) in 25 games in the month of August. Against Opponent: Ramirez has faced New Orleans once in his career. On August 18 he tossed two innings against the Baby Cakes and did not allow a run or a hit while walking three and striking out two. He threw 33 pitches in Nashville's 6-5 loss.
