Thursday Recap: Fightin Phils outlast Ducks in 10 innings (Reading 9, Akron 6): The RubberDucks were a strike away from a 6-5 loss before tying the game, yet stranding the winning run at third base, in the ninth inning against the Reading Fightin Phils on Thursday. Reading tallied three 10th-inning runs for a 9-6, series-opening win.

Garcia, Stankiewicz face former organization: RubberDucks first baseman Wilson Garcia homered Thursday in his first at-bat against his former organization, which traded him to the Orioles May 1, 2018. He was acquired from Baltimore by Cleveland in the December 2018 Rule 5 Draft. Infielder Drew Stankiewicz, who played parts of the last two seasons with Reading, went 1-for-2 with a walk and two runs in Thursday's series opener. Philadelphia released him in March, but Cleveland signed him this week before he joined Akron.

<u>Ducks finding offense:</u> The RubberDucks scored in the first inning of Thursday's game with Reading, after going scoreless the final 23 innings of their series in Binghamton. Following nine runs in the first four innings of Monday's 9-5 win, it is the longest scoring drought for Akron this season.

<u>Ducks flying out of the park:</u> The RubberDucks had their fourth multi-homer game of the season on Thursday. Of Akron's 16 home runs (fifth in the Eastern League) this season, 11 have come in four games:

April 5 vs. Altoona (4 – T. Krieger, W. Garcia, M. Longo, D. Johnson) April 13 (2) at Altoona (3 – Daniel Johnson, Tyler Krieger, Ka'ai Tom) April 28 at Bowie (2 – Daniel Salters, Tyler Krieger) May 2 vs. Reading (2 – Wilson Garcia, Logan Ice)

<u>Marabell's steady start on road trip:</u> Outfielder Connor Marabell hit safely in each of the first five games of the road trip, going 6-for-21 with three doubles, five runs, three RBI, a walk, and two stolen bases. He has played in all 26 games this season and started the last 22 for the RubberDucks. He did not have a hit (0-for-8) the final two games.

RubberDucks spin shutouts: The RubberDucks' combined shutout on April 24 was their third in five games and fourth the club has pitched, tied for second in the Eastern League. In a seven-game span April 18-25, Akron pitchers had combined shutout streaks of 18 innings (April 18-20 vs. Bowie, April 22 vs. Binghamton) and 21 innings (Tuesday-Wednesday vs. Binghamton, Thursday at Bowie). Akron right-hander **Zach Plesac** had an individual streak of 21.2 consecutive scoreless innings (April 7-29, including every inning of three starts April 13-25).

<u>Ducks host Fightin Phills:</u> The RubberDucks and Fightin Phils are playing the first of four scheduled series this season, with seven games at Canal Park and six at FirstEnergy Stadium. Last season, Akron went 3-6 against Reading, including 0-3 at Canal Park. Reading finished fourth in the Eastern Division, at 64-73, last season. Since 2005, Akron is 66-56 against Reading, last winning the series in 2017.

<u>Ducks All Over the Pond:</u> Of the 12 position players who began the season with Akron, nine have started games at multiple defensive positions. Only catchers **Li-Jen Chu** and **Logan Ice**, and first baseman **Wilson Garcia**, have played exclusively at one position.

<u>Ducks' Double-A Debuts:</u> Three RubberDucks position players on the Opening Day roster have had strong starts in Double-A.

- First baseman Wilson Garcia leads the team with 24 hits and 19 RBI, and he has seven doubles and two home runs (both tied for the team lead). He reached base in nine straight games April 17-26. He has also played 25 straight error-free games at first base.
- A Mayfield High School and Ohio University alumnus, outfielder Mitch Longo, homered on the first Double-A pitch he saw April 5. His two triples are tied for the team lead. His 10 walks are tied for second, his 12 RBI are third, and his 20 hits are tied for third. He has played 10 games in left field, three in right field and five as DH.
- Infielder Andruw Monasterio is tied for the team high with 19 hits in 15 games, playing error-free defense at second base, third base and shortstop. After going hitless on Opening Night, he reached base safely in 14 straight games. He was placed on the IL April 23.

<u>Chu supplies power:</u> In a seven-day span, RubberDucks catcher and designated hitter **Li-Jen Chu** hit each of Akron's three home runs, going deep against Bowie's Zac Lowther in Game 2 of the April 20 doubleheader and again April 26. He homered against Binghamton April 23 and is tied with **Daniel Johnson** and **Tyler Krieger** for the team home run lead.

Johnson delivering: Outfielder Daniel Johnson is tied for Akron's team lead with three home runs and is second with 15 RBI. In his last 13 games, Johnson is 15-for-51 (.294) with four doubles, two homers and 14 RBI, including back-to-back four-RBI games April 13 and 15. In 2018, Johnson played 89 games with the Washington Nationals' Eastern League affiliate, Harrisburg. He was on the injured list June 6-July 23, due to a broken right hamate bone that required surgery. Part of the Nov. 30 trade (along with IF Andruw Monasterio and RHP Jefry Rodriguez) that sent Yan Gomes from Cleveland to Washington, Johnson is the Indians' No. 14 (Baseball America)/No. 22 (MLB.com) prospect.

Hentges allowed a first-inning solo home run to Bowie's Rylan Bannon and two-run second-inning home run to Brett Cumberland for a 4-2 deficit. After the second inning, Hentges kept Bowie from scoring further until the fifth inning, when Bannon hit a one-out double and later scored an unearned run. Hentges went a season-long 5 2/3 innings and departed with a 5-2 deficit, which remained as the final score.

Season Highlights

Made his first two career major league spring training appearances, with two scoreless, hitless starts for the Indians – Feb. 26 at Colorado (W, 1.0 IP, 0 BB, 0 K) and March 3 vs. Kansas City (2.0 IP, 1 BB, 3 K).

2018:

- Posted the second-lowest ERA (3.27) and third-most strikeouts (122) in the Carolina League. Was a Mid-Season Carolina League All-Star and MiLB.com organizational All-Star.
- Did not pitch after August 15 due to a left shoulder strain, but his final start was his best, Aug. 15 at Wilmington (6.1IP, 2H, 0R, 2BB, 7SO).
- Over his final 12 starts of the season he posted an ERA of 2.69 (19ER/63.2IP).
- Recorded four starts of at least 6.0 innings and zero runs allowed and fanned 10 on April 17 vs. Frederick.
- Allowed only four homers in 118.1 innings, while batters hit .230 (46-for-200) off him with runners on and .231 (27-for-117) with RISP.
- Added to the 40-man roster on Nov. 20.

2017:

- Season did not begin until 7/8 due to elbow surgery the previous July.
- Made six starts on a rehab assignment in the Arizona League before being activated at Mahoning Valley on 8/9, finishing the season with five outstanding starts (2.04 ERA).

2016: Limited to 14 starts for Lake County (A) due to a left elbow strain, and did not pitch after June 23...had left elbow reconstruction in July.

2015: Led AZL Indians with 59 strikeouts, third-most in the league.

2019 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

#24 Rouglas Odor, *Manager* (*First Season*) – Odor, 51, is the 18th manager in club history. He follows Tony Mansolino, who was promoted to Triple-A Columbus after guiding Akron to a 78-62 record and finish as runner-up in the 2018 Eastern League Championship Series against the New Hampshire Fisher Cats. Last season, Odor managed the Class-A Advanced Lynchburg Hillcats to their fourth consecutive postseason. After posting the Carolina League's worst first-half record of 29-38, the Hillcats rebounded to go 42-28 in the second half, claiming the Northern Division title. They fell to Potomac in the semifinals, three games to two. Odor has a 361-363 (.499) career managing record in 11 seasons.

When Odor was the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2019 season is Odor's 32nd in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (19th as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. Last season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League for two seasons in 1999-2000, the Burlington Indians for four seasons from 2001-04, the Mahoning Valley Scrappers for two seasons in 2005-06, and the Gulf Coast League Indians for two seasons in 2007-08. Since then, Odor has moved up the ranks as a hitting coach, starting with Class-A Kinston in 2009-10, Akron in 2011-12 and 2014, the High-A Carolina Mudcats in 2013, and Triple-A Columbus in 2015-17.

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

#27 Tony Arnold, *Pitching Coach* (10th Season, not consecutive) — Arnold, 59, rejoins the RubberDucks for his fifth time in Akron after spending last season with Lynchburg. In 2018, the Hillcats pitching staff finished fifth in the Carolina League with a 3.76 ERA, ranked second with 1,190 strikeouts and the 12 team shutouts ranked fourth. Arnold last was with the RubberDucks in 2016-17, helping lead the 2016 team to an Eastern League championship. He previously served in the same capacity in Akron from 1996-99, 2008, and 2011-12. Arnold's 2012 Akron Aeros staff crafted a franchise-record 3.03 ERA and went on to claim the EL championship. In 2016, Arnold became the second man to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and Akron RubberDucks, joining Rouglas Odor in that exclusive group.

In 2015, Arnold began as the pitching coach at Lynchburg and finished at Triple-A Columbus, helping the Clippers to the International League title. A former All-American at the University of Texas, Arnold pitched in the major leagues with the Baltimore Orioles in 1986 and 1987.

#2 Justin Toole, *Hitting Coach* (*First Season*) — Toole, 32, spent the 2018 season as Lynchburg's hitting coach. This is fourth season coaching in the Indians' organization, serving as the hitting coach for Mahoning Valley in 2016, Lake County in 2017, and Lynchburg. Toole was signed as a minor league free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent parts of seven seasons with Cleveland from 2009-15. He spent parts of 2010, 2012-15 with Akron, hitting .259 in 180 games, including .275 in 77 games under Odor's hitting-coach tutelage in 2014. The Council Bluffs, Iowa, native played at the University of Iowa and has authored a children's book called "9 in 9," chronicling the lessons he learned while playing all nine positions in a game for the Carolina Mudcats on Aug. 25, 2012. #28 Juan De La Cruz, *Bench Coach* (*First Season*) — De La Cruz, 25, is in his second season coaching with the Indians after serving as the hitting coach for the rookie-level Arizona League Indians in 2018. Primarily a catcher in his playing days, De La Cruz was signed as a free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent eight seasons in the system, reaching as high as Akron in 2017, when he played 12 games as a catcher and first baseman. He was a .216 career hitter in 281 games.

Bobby Ruiz, Athletic Trainer (First Season) — Ruiz spent the past four seasons (2015-18) with Lynchburg. This is his ninth with the Indians.

Paul Synenkyj, *Strength and Conditioning Coach* (*Third Season*) — Synenkyj is the lone returning field staff member from 2018. He is in his ninth season in the Indians organization. He holds degrees in physical education from Cleveland State and the University of Akron.

On October 29, 2013, team owner **Ken Babby** stood before a capacity audience at the Akron Civic Theater and announced that the team would be known henceforth as the **Akron RubberDucks**. In addition to being symbolic of the fun, family-friendly brand of entertainment offered by minor league baseball, the name also honors Akron's long history as the "**Rubber Capital of the World**." Brandiose Marketing of San Diego, California designed the team logo, colors, and various marks and insignias. Please note that for print coverage, *RubberDucks* is spelled as one word with a capital "*D*." In broadcast coverage, referring to the team as "the 'Ducks" is an acceptable variation of the team's nickname.
