<u>Saturday rainout makes Sunday a doubleheader:</u> Rain postponed Saturday's game between the RubberDucks and Portland Sea Dogs at Canal Park – the third home rainout for Akron and seventh overall this season. Sunday's doubleheader will be the RubberDucks' third at home this season. They are 2-2-1 in doubleheaders this season, including 1-1-0 at home. The last doubleheader between the clubs was June 7, 2017, when the RubberDucks won, 21-4 and 7-6, at Hadlock Field.

Friday Recap: Sea Dogs quiet Screamers in series opener (Portland 3, Akron 1): Portland Sea Dogs right-hander Konner Wade (1-1) held the Akron Screamers – the RubberDucks' single-night identity – to one run in the first seven innings, and single runs in the first, second and ninth were enough to earn a series-opening 3-1 win in front of a sellout crowd of 8,026 at Canal Park on Friday night. In his first start at Canal Park, Akron's Evan Mitchell (0-2) allowed two earned runs in five innings.

<u>Canal Park home-field advantage:</u> After starting 0-6 at home and losing four of their first five series openers at home, the RubberDucks are 4-0-1 in the last five home series, going 12-5 in home games in that span. Friday's loss was Akron's first in a home series opener since a 9-6, 10-inning defeat against Reading on May 2. On Thursday, the RubberDucks earned their third home sweep and fourth overall in a series this season.

Tom's hot stretch: Outfielder Ka'ai Tom has a season-long nine-game hitting streak and a 24-game on-base streak (began May 21) that is the Eastern League's longest active streak, the longest by a RubberDuck, and the league's second-longest overall (longest was 27). During the on-base streak, he is 33-for-82 (.402) with seven doubles, seven home runs, 19 RBI, 19 runs and 16 walks for a .515 on-base percentage. Since May 10, he has hit safely in 28 of 32 games (43-for-112, .384 average, 10 home runs, 26 runs, 23 RBI), raising his average from .191 to a team-best .288. Tom is third in the league in runs (38) and total bases (113), fourth in on-base percentage (.390), slugging (.509) and OPS (.899), tied for fourth in hits (64), tied for fifth in home runs (11), sixth in bases on balls (33), seventh in average (.288), and tied for ninth in extra-base hits (24).

Tom named Eastern League Player of the Month: Outfielder Ka'ai Tom was named as the Eastern League's Player of the Month for May 2019, becoming the first Akron player to earn the honor since Tim Fedroff won in May 2011. Tom led the league in May with a .434 OBP, .635 SLG, and 1.069 OPS, and tied for the lead with 21 runs. He was second in hits (32) and total bases (61), and tied for second in average (.333). After hitting .177 with one home run in 23 April games, Tom hit .333 (32-for-96) with seven home runs (tied for the team high and third in the league) in 26 May games. Tom was also the EL Player of the Week for May 20-26, when he was 9-for-20, with two doubles, two home runs (May 25 and 26), five runs, four RBI, and a league-best .850 SLG and 1.392 OPS. He is the first RubberDuck this season to win a weekly award. In 2018, he hit .286 in May (his best in any month) after hitting .183 in April.

<u>Ducks host Sea Dogs</u>: The RubberDucks and Sea Dogs are playing the first of two scheduled series this season, with three games at Canal Park and three at Hadlock Field. Last season, they split the series, 3-3, but Portland went 2-1 at Canal Park. The Sea Dogs finished in sixth place in the Eastern Division, at 63-76, last season, and last made the playoffs in 2014. Since 2005, Akron leads the series, 57-30.

<u>League leaders:</u> Offensively, the RubberDucks lead the Eastern League in at-bats (2196), runs (285), hits (533), and total bases (825). Akron is tied for the lead in home runs (54) and has struck out the fewest number of times at the plate this season (508).

<u>First-half races:</u> The first half concludes with games on Tuesday, June 18, leaving Akron with three to play. The third-place RubberDucks trail the Harrisburg Senators – who already clinched the Western Division first half – by 6.5 games. The Eastern Division is led by Reading and Hartford (via a tiebreaker) over Trenton. Binghamton trails all three teams by 2.5 games. The first-place team in each division in each half qualifies for the playoffs. If the same team wins both halves, the team with the second-base overall record in the division receives the second playoff spot.

Garcia finds a groove in Double-A: In his first season with the Indians organization and first in Double-A, RubberDucks first baseman and designated hitter Wilson Garcia leads the Eastern League with 44 RBI and 22 doubles (league-high 11 in May), is tied for the lead in extra-base hits (31), is second in total bases (114) and tied for second in hits (65) – all of which lead Akron. He is second on the club with a .264 average, a .463 SLG (ninth in the Eastern League), and .763 OPS, and he is third with nine home runs. Originally signed by the Phillies in 2010, he was traded to the Orioles May 1, 2018, before the Indians acquired him in the December 2018 Rule 5 Draft.

<u>Clement's return:</u> Infielder **Ernie Clement** had his first three-hit game of the season last Friday and has a season-long nine-game hitting streak. After he was on the Injured List with a right adductor strain April 16-May 8, Clement has played 29 games since coming off the IL, going 34-for-111 (.306) with nine multi-hit games, six doubles, a triple, a home run, 15 runs, seven RBI, 10 walks, and a .368 OBP. In six games prior to going on the IL, the Indians No. 15 (MLB.com)/No. 18 (*Baseball America*) prospect was 3-for-25 (.120).

<u>Ducks winning the home run margin:</u> The RubberDucks have hit 54 home runs – tied for most in the Eastern League – while allowing only 33 home runs – second fewest of any EL club – for a league-best +21 home run differential. At home, Akron has hit 21 home runs, allowing 16 (+5 differential). Of the RubberDucks' 54 home runs this season, 36 have come in 13 multi-homer games, including 13 in four straight games May 9-13. Akron's six home runs on May 11 were the most for the club since hitting seven on July 2, 2008, in a 10-6 win at Erie.

Tully breezed through the first three frames, holding the Curve hitless and surrendering just one walk. However, Altoona jumped on him in the fourth, putting up three runs on five singles. Tully stayed in for the fifth, working around two singles to keep the score at 3-0 before being replaced by Anthony Gose in the sixth. The Ducks got a pair of runs in the seventh to come within 3-2 but came up short in a 4-2 final.

LAST OUTING (Tuesday, June 11, vs. Hartford, W in 2-0 win)

Paulson relieved rehab starter Mike Clevinger with one out in the sixth inning of a scoreless game. Paulson got the last two outs of the sixth and went three more scoreless innings to preserve the shutout, allowing just three hits and a walk. Akron runs in the seventh and eighth gave Paulson the win in the 2-0 victory.

2018

- Began the season with Lynchburg (A-Adv), making four starts in April, before his first promotion to Double-A on May 3, joining the RubberDucks.
- Pitched the rest of the season with Akron and led the EL in ERA (3.04) and was 2nd in WHIP (1.18).
- Named Eastern League Mid-Season All-Star, the first All-Star selection of his pro career.
- Finished the year tied for the team lead in wins (8) and was second on the team in innings pitched (115.1) and strikeouts (91).
- Started Game 2 of the Eastern League Western Division Series against Altoona (ND, 7.0 IP, 5 H, 1 ER, 1 HR, 2 BB, 4 K), which the RubberDucks won on a 10th-inning walk-off home run by Nellie Rodriguez at Canal Park. Akron went on to win the series, 3-1.
- In Game 1 of the Eastern League Championship Series against New Hampshire, he took over with two outs in the first inning from Indians rehabbing
 right-hander Cody Anderson and worked 7 innings (3 H, 1 ER, 0 BB, 4 K), departing in a 1-1 tie in the eighth inning. The Fisher Cats won, 3-1 in 10
 innings, before going on to a sweep of the RubberDucks.

2016

- · Went on the Daytona Injured List on May 1 with right shoulder inflammation and was activated May 24.
- Spent three separate stints on the Injured List (also June 1-July 5 and July 16 through the end of the season).

2014

- Originally drafted by the Cincinnati Reds in the 27th round of the June, 2014 draft, out of Oakland University in Rochester, Michigan.
- Was one of two players drafted (both by the Indians) from Oakland University. The other was catcher Jake Morton, who was a 39th-round pick but did not sign. Morton returned to Oakland for his senior season but did not play professionally.
- Only one player who attended Oakland University (MI) has reached the major leagues. Right-hander Don Kirkwood (at Oakland 1969-71) pitched five seasons with the California Angels (1974-77), Chicago White Sox (1977) and Toronto Blue Jays (1978).

Last season, Odor managed the Class-A Advanced Lynchburg Hillcats to their fourth consecutive postseason. After posting the Carolina League's worst first-half record of 29-38, the Hillcats rebounded to go 42-28 in the second half, claiming the Northern Division title. They fell to Potomac in the semifinals, three games to two. Odor has a 361-363 (.499) career managing record in 11 seasons.

When Odor was the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2019 season is Odor's 32nd in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (19th as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. Last season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League for two seasons in 1999-2000, the Burlington Indians for four seasons from 2001-04, the Mahoning Valley Scrappers for two seasons in 2005-06, and the Gulf Coast League Indians for two seasons in 2007-08. Since then, Odor has moved up the ranks as a hitting coach, starting with Class-A Kinston in 2009-10, Akron in 2011-12 and 2014, the High-A Carolina Mudcats in 2013, and Triple-A Columbus in 2015-17.

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

#27 Tony Arnold, *Pitching Coach* (10th Season, not consecutive) — Arnold, 59, rejoins the RubberDucks for his fifth time in Akron after spending last season with Lynchburg. In 2018, the Hillcats pitching staff finished fifth in the Carolina League with a 3.76 ERA, ranked second with 1,190 strikeouts and the 12 team shutouts ranked fourth. Arnold last was with the RubberDucks in 2016-17, helping lead the 2016 team to an Eastern League championship. He previously served in the same capacity in Akron from 1996-99, 2008, and 2011-12. Arnold's 2012 Akron Aeros staff crafted a franchise-record 3.03 ERA and went on to claim the EL championship. In 2016, Arnold became the second man to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and Akron RubberDucks, joining Rouglas Odor in that exclusive group.

In 2015, Arnold began as the pitching coach at Lynchburg and finished at Triple-A Columbus, helping the Clippers to the International League title. A former All-American at the University of Texas, Arnold pitched in the major leagues with the Baltimore Orioles in 1986 and 1987.

#2 Justin Toole, *Hitting Coach* (*First Season*) — Toole, 32, spent the 2018 season as Lynchburg's hitting coach. This is fourth season coaching in the Indians' organization, serving as the hitting coach for Mahoning Valley in 2016, Lake County in 2017, and Lynchburg. Toole was signed as a minor league free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent parts of seven seasons with Cleveland from 2009-15. He spent parts of 2010, 2012-15 with Akron, hitting .259 in 180 games, including .275 in 77 games under Odor's hitting-coach tutelage in 2014. The Council Bluffs, Iowa, native played at the University of Iowa and has authored a children's book called "9 in 9," chronicling the lessons he learned while playing all nine positions in a game for the Carolina Mudcats on Aug. 25, 2012. **Twitter: @Tooleyj24, Instagram: @tooleyj24**

#28 Juan De La Cruz, Bench Coach (First Season) — De La Cruz, 25, is in his second season coaching with the Indians after serving as the hitting coach for the rookie-level Arizona League Indians in 2018. Primarily a catcher in his playing days, De La Cruz was signed as a free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent eight seasons in the system, reaching as high as Akron in 2017, when he played 12 games as a catcher and first baseman. He was a .216 career hitter in 281 games.

Bobby Ruiz, Athletic Trainer (First Season) — Ruiz spent the past four seasons (2015-18) with Lynchburg. This is his ninth with the Indians.

Paul Synenkyj, Strength and Conditioning Coach (Third Season) — Synenkyj is the lone returning field staff member from 2018. He is in his ninth season in the Indians organization. He holds degrees in physical education from Cleveland State and the University of Akron. Twitter: @PaulSynenkyj
