**Tuesday Recap: Tom homers RubberDucks past Senators for 11-inning win (Akron 2, Harrisburg 1):** Playing their third straight extra-inning game, the RubberDucks played the Senators to a scoreless tie through 10 innings, before All-Star left fielder **Ka'ai Tom** hit a leadoff two-run home run in the 11th inning for a 2-1 road win on Tuesday night. Left-hander **Adam Scott** pitched a career-long seven shutout innings, and right-hander **Jordan Stephens** (1-0) pitched three scoreless innings to earn his first Eastern League win, while right-hander **Dalbert Siri** earned his fourth save, snapping Akron's four-game losing streak.

**More extra innings:** With three straight extra-inning games, including 10-inning losses to Erie (6-5 Sunday) and Harrisburg (3-2 Monday), the RubberDucks have played an Eastern League-high 15 extra-inning games, going 7-8 (4-4 on the road). Akron is now 7-13 in one-run games but has played the third-fewest one-run games of any EL club.

**Ducks visit Senators:** The RubberDucks and Senators are playing the second of three scheduled intradivision three-game series this season, with six games at Canal Park and three at FNB Field. Last season, Akron went 5-7 against Harrisburg, including 2-4 at Canal Park. In 2018, the Senators finished in third place in the Western Division, at 72-65 overall. Since 2005, Akron leads the series, 104-85.

**RubberDucks All-Stars:** The RubberDucks had five players selected as All-Stars for the Western Division. The rosters were announced on Monday for the 2019 Eastern League All-Star Game in Richmond on July 10 at 7:05 p.m. They include first baseman **Wilson Garcia** (will not participate because of right foot sprain), outfielders **Connor Marabell** and **Ka'ai Tom**, and pitchers **Eli Morgan** and **Kyle Nelson**.

**Ducks flying out of the park:** The RubberDucks have hit 63 home runs (second in the Eastern League) while allowing only 41 home runs (third fewest among EL clubs) for a league-best +22 home run differential. In 38 road games, Akron has hit 38 home runs, allowing 21 (+16 differential). Of the RubberDucks' 63 home runs this season, 42 (two-thirds) have come in 15 multi-homer games, including 13 in four straight games May 9-13. Akron's six home runs on May 11 in Reading were the most for the club since hitting seven on July 2, 2008, in a 10-6 win at Erie.

**Clement's hitting streak:** Shortstop **Ernie Clement** had a 14-game hitting streak June 6-19 and now has reached base his last five games (the last four with hits) to extend a season-long 19-game on base streak, in which he is 24-for-75 (.320) with five doubles, one triple, six runs, two RBI, three walks and a .358 OBP. After he was on the Injured List with a right adductor strain April 16-May 8, Clement has played 39 games since coming off the IL, going 46-for-150 (.307) with 12 multi-hit games, seven doubles, two triples, a home run, 19 runs, eight RBI, 12 walks, and a .369 OBP. In six games prior to going on the IL, the Indians No. 15 (MLB.com)/No. 18 (*Baseball America*) prospect was 3-for-25 (.120).

**Second half now:** The first half of the season concluded with Tuesday's games, and the second half began on Wednesday. The Harrisburg Senators won the first half in the Western Division, with Akron finishing in third place, 7.5 games behind. Trenton won the Eastern Division first-half title. The first-place team in each division in each half qualifies for the playoffs. If the same team wins both halves, the team with the second-best overall record in the division receives the second playoff spot.

**League leaders:** Akron leads the Eastern League in games (77), at-bats (2545), runs (321), hits (606), total bases (940) and RBI (294).

**Tom's hot stretch:** Since April 30, outfielder **Ka'ai Tom** is leading the Eastern League in total bases (112), batting average (.333), on-base percentage (.429), slugging (.602) and OPS (1.031), and is tied for the lead in home runs (12) and runs (35). Tom had a 27-game on-base streak May 21-June 18 to tie Binghamton's **Sam Haggerty** (a RubberDuck in 2018) for the longest on-base streak in the EL this year. During the streak, Tom was 35-for-92 (.380) with seven doubles, seven home runs, 19 RBI, 19 runs and 17 walks for a .491 on-base percentage. Since May 10, he has hit safely in 36 of 43 games (54-for-153, .353 average, 12 home runs, 32 runs, 28 RBI), raising his average from .191 to a team-best .285. Tom leads the EL with 75 hits, is second in total bases (133) and runs (44), tied for third in triples (4), fourth in on-base percentage (.384), slugging (.506) and OPS (.890), tied for fourth in home runs (13) and bases on balls (38), tied for fifth in extra-base hits (28), and seventh in batting average (.285).

**Tom named Eastern League Player of the Month:** Outfielder **Ka'ai Tom** was named as the Eastern League's Player of the Month for May 2019, becoming the first Akron player to earn the honor since Tim Fedroff won in May 2011. Tom led the league in May with a .434 OBP, .635 SLG, and 1.069 OPS, and tied for the lead with 21 runs. He was second in hits (32) and total bases (61), and tied for second in average (.333). After hitting .177 with one home run in 23 April games, Tom hit .333 (32-for-96) with seven home runs (tied for the team high and third in the league) in 26 May games. Tom was also the EL Player of the Week for May 20-26, when he was 9-for-20, with two doubles, two home runs (May 25 and 26), five runs, four RBI, and a league-best .850 SLG and 1.392 OPS. He is the first, and so far only, RubberDuck this season to win a weekly award. In 2018, he hit .286 in May (his best in any month) after hitting .183 in April.

**Garcia finds a groove in Double-A:** First baseman and designated hitter **Wilson Garcia** was placed on the injured list Friday with a right foot sprain, interrupting a stellar campaign. In his first season with the Indians organization and in Double-A, he still leads the Eastern League with 23 doubles. He is second in extra-base hits (33), RBI (46), third in total bases (122, second on the club), sixth in slugging (.475) and tied for ninth in hits (69) and home runs (10). He is also second on the club with a .268 average and .785 OPS and tied for second with 10 home runs. Originally signed by the Phillies in 2010, he was traded to the Orioles May 1, 2018, before the Indians acquired him in the December Rule 5 Draft.

**LAST TIME OUT (Friday, June 21, vs. Erie, L in 11-3 Loss)**

Tully cruised the first time through the order, retiring eight of the first nine batters. With a 3-0 lead in the top of the third, four straight two-outs singles gave Erie three runs to tie score, 3-3. Frank Schwindel hit a fifth-inning, two-run double to give Erie a 5-3 lead. Tully exited after the first two batters of the sixth inning – a solo home run from Kody Eaves and single from Sergio Alcantara – that lasted 12 batters and led to six runs – two charged to Tully and four unearned to Anthony Gose – for an 11-3 Erie lead.

**Season Highlights**

- Has pitched five innings in 12 of his 14 starts.
- Holds a 4-0 record and 3.22 ERA in four starts against Bowie, while going 1-7 with a 5.17 ERA in his other 10 starts.
- Earned a Major League Spring Training win Feb. 27, with two scoreless innings and two strikeouts against the Seattle Mariners.

**2018**

- Finished the year 2nd in the Carolina League and 4th in the Indians system with a career-high 147 innings pitched.

**2017**

- Began the year with Lake County (A) before making a spot start for the RubberDucks in Akron against Portland on June 17 (6 innings, 3 unearned runs, 6 hits, 2 walks, 1 strikeout) for his Double-A debut.

# 2019 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

**#24 Rouglas Odor, Manager (First Season)** – Odor, 51, is the 18th manager in club history. He follows Tony Mansolino, who was promoted to Triple-A Columbus after guiding Akron to a 78-62 record and finish as runner-up in the 2018 Eastern League Championship Series against the New Hampshire Fisher Cats. Last season, Odor managed the Class-A Advanced Lynchburg Hillcats to their fourth consecutive postseason. After posting the Carolina League's worst first-half record of 29-38, the Hillcats rebounded to go 42-28 in the second half, claiming the Northern Division title. They fell to Potomac in the semifinals, three games to two. Odor has a 361-363 (.499) career managing record in 11 seasons.

When Odor was the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2019 season is Odor's 32nd in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (19th as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. Last season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League for two seasons in 1999-2000, the Burlington Indians for four seasons from 2001-04, the Mahoning Valley Scrappers for two seasons in 2005-06, and the Gulf Coast League Indians for two seasons in 2007-08. Since then, Odor has moved up the ranks as a hitting coach, starting with Class-A Kinston in 2009-10, Akron in 2011-12 and 2014, the High-A Carolina Mudcats in 2013, and Triple-A Columbus in 2015-17.

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

**#27 Tony Arnold, Pitching Coach (10th Season, not consecutive)** — Arnold, 59, rejoins the RubberDucks for his fifth time in Akron after spending last season with Lynchburg. In 2018, the Hillcats pitching staff finished fifth in the Carolina League with a 3.76 ERA, ranked second with 1,190 strikeouts and the 12 team shutouts ranked fourth. Arnold last was with the RubberDucks in 2016-17, helping lead the 2016 team to an Eastern League championship. He previously served in the same capacity in Akron from 1996-99, 2008, and 2011-12. Arnold's 2012 Akron Aeros staff crafted a franchise-record 3.03 ERA and went on to claim the EL championship. In 2016, Arnold became the second man to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and Akron RubberDucks, joining Rouglas Odor in that exclusive group.

In 2015, Arnold began as the pitching coach at Lynchburg and finished at Triple-A Columbus, helping the Clippers to the International League title. A former All-American at the University of Texas, Arnold pitched in the major leagues with the Baltimore Orioles in 1986 and 1987.

**#2 Justin Toole, Hitting Coach (First Season)** — Toole, 32, spent the 2018 season as Lynchburg's hitting coach. This is fourth season coaching in the Indians' organization, serving as the hitting coach for Mahoning Valley in 2016, Lake County in 2017, and Lynchburg. Toole was signed as a minor league free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent parts of seven seasons with Cleveland from 2009-15. He spent parts of 2010, 2012-15 with Akron, hitting .259 in 180 games, including .275 in 77 games under Odor's hitting-coach tutelage in 2014. The Council Bluffs, Iowa, native played at the University of Iowa and has authored a children's book called "9 in 9," chronicling the lessons he learned while playing all nine positions in a game for the Carolina Mudcats on Aug. 25, 2012. **Twitter: @Tooleyj24, Instagram: @tooleyj24**

**#28 Juan De La Cruz, Bench Coach (First Season)** — De La Cruz, 25, is in his second season coaching with the Indians after serving as the hitting coach for the rookie-level Arizona League Indians in 2018. Primarily a catcher in his playing days, De La Cruz was signed as a free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent eight seasons in the system, reaching as high as Akron in 2017, when he played 12 games as a catcher and first baseman. He was a .216 career hitter in 281 games.

**Bobby Ruiz, Athletic Trainer (First Season)** — Ruiz spent the past four seasons (2015-18) with Lynchburg. This is his ninth with the Indians.

**Paul Synenkyj, Strength and Conditioning Coach (Third Season)** — Synenkyj is the lone returning field staff member from 2018. He is in his ninth season in the Indians organization. He holds degrees in physical education from Cleveland State and the University of Akron. **Twitter: @PaulSynenkyj**
