



Seamus Curran – 2015 Eighth Round, Agawam High School (Mass.)

I actually had my high school baseball banquet the same day I was drafted. I was waiting at my house with a couple buddies, and got a call from the Orioles in the eighth. And I was just happy. There were a couple other teams, I didn't know where I was going to go, but the Orioles called me, and now I'm an Oriole. Then I went over to the baseball banquet, and all my friends were there and they congratulated me and all that. It was a great feeling.

Jaylen Ferguson – 2015 Ninth Round, Arlington High School (Texas)

I was at home on the computer watching the draft; I got a lot of calls earlier in the day and had been listening earlier. Then the ninth round came, and I actually left the house for a bit. I'm from Texas, so I went to Whataburger, and when I was in line I got a call from my agent. He said the Orioles were going to take me with their next pick. It was an unreal feeling. I just rushed back home, and as soon as I got



home I saw my name pass on the draft ticker, and that was it.



Trevor Craport – 2017 11th Round, Georgia Tech

So I was at home that day, and I woke at about 8:00 in the morning. I had calls from about three different teams saying that they were going to take me early that day. It was a bunch of teams that didn't include the Orioles. And then when I was listening to the draft, I heard my name called, and it was the Orioles, and it kind of surprised me. Then my agent called me and said "Hey, they have this for you, so are you okay with it?" I told him I was, and then I got a phone call from the Orioles' area scout and got a chance to talk to him. He congratulated me and said, "We're looking forward to having you," and I was ready to play.



Nick Vespi – 2015 18th Round, Palm Beach State College (Fla.)

It was that June 10, and I was actually at my little brother Ben's baseball practice. I was scrolling through Twitter and saw that my name had been chosen, and then my phone started blowing up a little bit there. I expected to be drafted, I just didn't know when they were going to call my name. It was a great feeling to finally get picked.

Scott Burke - 2017 20th Round, UCLA

Well I got drafted for the first time in high school [31st round in 2013]. I was actually playing summer ball in the West Coast League, so I was in Oregon when I got the call. Both the Houston Astros and [UCLA head coach] John Savage called me that day, trying to convince me to go their way, and eventually I decided to go to school. Then I got drafted again my senior year of college. I was actually getting ready to take a final exam, and Coach Savage called me and said, "Hey, congratulations." I went and took my final and got a call from the Orioles two hours later, and that was when they first contacted me about getting drafted. I didn't talk to them pre-draft, or during the draft, they just called and said "Hey, we drafted you, we'd like you to come play for us." Oh yeah, I did pass the final, and I graduated.

FAMILIARITY PACES McKenna's Rise to Frederick

The home ballpark may be different, but for Frederick Keys center fielder Ryan McKenna, so much is still the same. From his manager to his outfield mates, right down to the orange-and-black uniforms, High-A feels just as familiar to the former Shorebird standout as Low-A did. With one pleasing exception, of course.

"The travel's not nearly as bad," said McKenna via phone before a recent Keys' game in Lynchburg. "I think Lynchburg was four hours, and the furthest one we've had so far is [suburban Raleigh, around six hours]. But definitely not as bad as some of the Columbia trips in the Sally League."



McKenna thrived through the long bus rides in Delmarva in 2017. After a slow start, the then-20-year-old hit .280 in the second half and finished third in the league with 33 doubles. Then it was back home to Dover, N.H. for speed and agility drills, spring training in Sarasota, and breaking camp with High-A Frederick, where at 21 he's the youngest position player on roster.

Youth hasn't held McKenna back in the slightest. As of May 18, he leads the Carolina League with a .329 average, .420 OBP, and 34 runs scored, and his 11 doubles are tied for second in the circuit.

"[Hitting coach Kyle Moore] tries to keep it simple and tries to find what he thinks will allow us to perform to the best of our ability, so it's been good working with him," said McKenna. "We've got a good environment here; it's all positive, and I'm just trying to get together some good at-bats."

McKenna takes his instruction from the manager he's known longest in the Orioles system. Longtime Shorebirds boss Ryan Minor returned to Frederick this year after managing the Keys in 2013.



"We get along well, he's doing a good job and trying to do whatever he can to get us a win every night," said McKenna. "It's a familiar routine, and it's always good to have him in there."

In addition to his old skipper, McKenna still regularly takes center field with friends Cole Billingsley and Jake Ring flanking him in left and right, respectively.

"We have a lot of chemistry from the past couple years, and just growing to know these guys as people too helps a lot on the field," said McKenna. "We've been pretty close ever since we were drafted, and we've been good friends on and off the field."

It's not just friends but also familiar foes that followed McKenna up the ladder. Six of the 10 Carolina League teams sit directly above South Atlantic League affiliates. Thus, the old Hagerstown Suns and Hickory Crawdads, for example, became the new Potomac Nationals and Down East Wood Ducks.

"It's nice to see them and get to know them a little bit when they're on the bases, just saying hey," said McKenna. "We all come from similar backgrounds, so it's good to have that connection there. I imagine it's true the further up you go too."

Meanwhile, McKenna remains unchanged in approach to the grind and continues to impress scouts. He was recently ranked the 29th-best prospect in the Orioles system per MLB Pipeline, something he only discovered when the author pointed it out during this interview.

"I try to play as hard as I can and you can't really control that kind of stuff, you've just got to go out and perform to the best of your abilities," said McKenna. "It always feels good to get some recognition, but you can't lose focus of trying to get better every day."

COACH JUSTIN LORD, PART II

Before a recent game against Lakewood, Shorebirds radio voice Will DeBoer caught up with pitching coach Justin Lord. Part I of this interview appeared in PlayBall! Issue 4 on May 17-28.

- WD: So, you get to spring training, you see some of the arms that may be heading to Delmarva; when did you first get a sense of how deep the rotation was going to go this year?
- JL: We follow the draft, we follow what goes on in Aberdeen and the GCL when those new guys report, and once instructional league gets here, you get to see some of these guys firsthand. In the offseason, you take a few minutes to start writing down potential candidates to go to Delmarva, and you look at the depth of competition. Once you start putting them on paper, that's when you get an idea about the depth of the rotation and the bullpen, and you start to see that this team has a chance to have some really talented pitchers on it.
- WD: Six-man rotations aren't what we usually see down here, but it seems like that can help guys who were once-a-week pitchers in high school and college make an easier transition from amateur to pro ball.
- JL: It can be. It allows guys to develop a little different routine. In the six-man, you have two days off on both sides of a bullpen session, which sometimes makes it easier for guys. And over the course of the season, those are bullets you have saved in your arm. You want to save them as much as possible because you've got these long road trips, going down south in the heat of July and August, and it can be taxing on you.
- WD: For those who may not be familiar, what does a typical bullpen session entail?
- JL: It varies. A lot of guys are anywhere from 20-30 pitches, and it's a time to work on their craft. Every pitcher will usually throw all their pitches in a bullpen. We also will build in certain pitches or sequences, depending on each pitcher's need and routine. Really, we try to cater it to the pitcher's needs, maybe based on what team they're facing next, and not be so cookie-cutter and generic with a bullpen.
- WD: We're a couple weeks into the season, and it doesn't seem like the mound visit limits have really impacted things. There are games where we won't see you at all, and then there are games where you'll come out 3-4 times and it'll seem like a lot.
- Well hopefully you only see me much; the fewer the better. If a visit needs to be taken we'll take it, but hopefully we don't have any of those nights where we need more than 10 visits. If I'm making 10 trips to the mound, it's probably not a good night for the Shorebirds.
- WD: We appreciate you, but we don't want to see you that much out there!
- IL: Absolutely, absolutely!



LOWTHER LETS PITCHING DO THE TALKING

Zac Lowther took the mound for his Shorebird debut on April 9 in front of a familiar face: his aunt from metro DC was one of a few scores of fans who braved the 41-degree temperatures at Perdue Stadium to see her nephew make his first start of the season. Nephew made sure auntie and the rest wouldn't have to sit and freeze for long.

Lowther struck out a career-high 13 Hickory Crawdads over six no-hit innings, and the Shorebirds' bullpen finished the job to get their starter the win, combining for a one-hit shutout and 1-0 triumph.

"I love when people are able to come out and support me," said Lowther during a recent sitdown in Columbia. "And I want to give them a good show! Just being able to go out there and, not necessarily

impress them, because they know what I can do, but just show them that I can keep doing it. And knowing that I'm going to get to talk to familiar faces after the game is a really calming factor."

Baseball has been a family business for Lowther from the beginning. When he wasn't watching the Cleveland Indians' would-be dynasty — he was captivated by the not-yet-ageless Bartolo Colon's bright red glove — Lowther was at the Cuyahoga Falls High School diamond, where his father Marc was head coach. After watching dad at work from the stands for years, Zac finally got to pitch for his old man.

"I played up at my age because I was already advanced mentally, but physically I was always trying to catch up, so it was always fun," said Lowther. "But it all started with just being out there and playing catch with my dad and having fun. It was still just a game."

And a game at which Zac was showing increasing aptitude. He crossed the Buckeye State to play college ball at Xavier, and after two solid seasons the southpaw made a name for himself in a big way in the 2016 NCAA tournament, tossing seven one-run innings to beat a Vanderbilt squad that was coming off back-to-back NCAA championship appearances. With scouts on his tail, he headed to the prestigious Cape Cod League that summerand became ace of the Brewster Whitecaps.

"Oh, it was awesome," said Lowther while reminiscing about the summer on Cape Cod. "Going to the beach, hanging out with friends, and just learning about different guys and how they play the game, it was great. My parents were able to come out to spend time on vacation and just relax. It wasn't a lot of running around, a very quiet area, and it was just a fun atmosphere."

Reinvigorated from his summer on the Cape, Lowther was lights-out in his junior campaign at Xavier in 2017. He captivated the Orioles' scouting department, so much so that they spent a second-round pick on him. At No. 74 overall, Lowther became the highest draft pick in Musketeer history.

"It was honestly a surprise when I was taken so high," said Lowther. "We had a big party at my house for the draft. My mom and grandma were there, and being able to share that with them and everyone

there was probably the most special experience I've had this far with baseball."

Lowther kept up the pace in short-season Aberdeen, baffling the New York-Penn League over 12 appearances. Between college and the pros, the crafty lefty notched 198 strikeouts over 137 innings in the 2017 calendar year. Proving the Hickory gem was no fluke, Lowther went out and notched a 1.23 ERA and 39 strikeouts over his four Shorebird starts in April, earning a seemingly unanimous Orioles' Minor League Pitcher of the Month award in the process.

Ask Lowther, though, and he'll say he's well beyond the mindset of having to prove anything.

"I want to prove myself everywhere, but in the same sense, I know what I'm good at, and I know why I'm here," said Lowther. "Just being able to go out there and improve on what I do well is my key every game. I know I belong here, and I'm just going to go out and have people see that."




