Tonight's Game: The San Jose Giants look for a series victory against the Rancho Cucamonga Quakes (Dodgers affiliate) when the teams conclude their three-game set this evening. Jose Marte (0-3, 5.28 ERA) is scheduled to make the start on the mound. The Giants posted a 5-2 victory in the series opener on Wednesday before suffering an 8-4 loss to the Quakes last night.

Series Win Droughts: The Giants haven't won a series since taking two of three against Modesto from June 24-26. San Jose's last road series victory came from May 21-23 (at Modesto).

The Giants: San Jose enters tonight's contest having lost seven out of their last ten games. The Giants (39-52) are a season-high tying 13 games below .500 overall. San Jose is 15-13 (.536) against South Division opponents this season and only 24-39 (.381) versus the North.

Ramos Surging: Heliot Ramos is 5-for-9 with a home run in the first two games of the series against Rancho Cucamonga. Ramos' homer on Wednesday was his team-leading 10th of the season. He's hit 10 homers in 55 games with San Jose this year (204 at-bats) after hitting 11 home runs in 124 games with Class-A Augusta in 2018 (485 at-bats). The former first round draft pick is hitting .304 this season with an .889 OPS. Over his last 13 games, Ramos is batting at a .404 clip (21-for-52) with two home runs and 10 RBI's.

Top Prospects: Seven players on the *MLB.com* top 30 San Francisco Giants prospect list are on San Jose's active roster: #1 Joey Bart, #2 Heliot Ramos, #5 Sean Hjelle, #6 Jake Wong, #14 Sandro Fabian, #24 Camilo Doval and #26 Jose Marte.

Trouble With The Quakes: Over the last three seasons (2017-19), the Giants are only 13-31 against Rancho Cucamonga, including a 6-14 mark at LoanMart Field.

Hitting Woes: The Giants are averaging only 2.6 runs per contest through the first 11 games of July (4-7 record). San Jose has been held to three runs or fewer in seven of the 11 games and already been shutout three times in July. The Giants have yet to score more than five runs in a game this month. San Jose has hit only three homers in 11 July games.

Standings Update: The Giants are 9-13 in the second half and four games out of first place in the North Division. At the 22-game mark of the first half, San Jose was 8-14 and already 10 games behind first-place Visalia.

Hawkins Heats Up: Courtney Hawkins is 16-for-40 (.400 AVG) with five doubles, one home run and 10 RBI's in his last 10 games. Since starting 5-for-35 with the Giants, Hawkins is batting at a .301 clip with eight home runs and 22 RBI's in 31 games.

On Deck: The Giants next travel to Lancaster for a three-game series against the JetHawks beginning tomorrow night. It will be San Jose's first visit to The Hangar since May of last season.

Tonight's Start: 23-year old right-hander is slated to make his ninth start of the season in tonight's game at Rancho Cucamonga.

Season Notes: Is 0-3 with a 5.28 ERA in eight starts for San Jose this season ... Has struck out 37 in 30 2/3 innings ... Owns a .286 opponents batting average (.257 vs. right, .333 vs. left) ... Has pitched past the fourth inning only three times in eight starts.

IL Stint: Was on the injured list from April 10-June 6 (shoulder) ... Suffered the injury in his second start of the season (April 9 at Stockton).

Trending Up: Has pitched 10 innings with only three earned runs allowed over his last two starts (2.70 ERA) ... Gave up 10 runs in his previous two starts (8 IP).

Last Time Out: Faced Modesto in his most recent start on July 7 at Excite Ballpark ... Pitched five innings with two runs (one earned) allowed ... Gave up three hits, walked two and struck out three ... Did not give up a hit until the fourth inning ... Received a no-decision (Giants won game 3-2).

W/RISP: Has limited the opposition to a .200 batting average with runners in scoring position this season.

Opening Night Starter: Was the Giants' opening night starter (April 4 at Visalia).

Prospect Ranking: Currently rated the #26 prospect in the San Francisco Giants organization according to *MLB.com*.

Last Year: Spent the entire 2018 season with the Class-A Augusta GreenJackets ... Was 7-7 with a 4.70 ERA in 25 starts ... Struck out 112 and walked 50 over 118 2/3 innings ... Led the GreenJackets staff in innings pitched, was second in wins and third in strikeouts ... Fashioned a 6-2 record with a 3.32 ERA in the first half last season (12 GS) ... Was 1-5 with a 6.10 ERA in the second half (13 GS).

Pro Career: 2019 marks the fourth season of his professional career ... Pitched for the Giants' Dominican Summer League affiliate in 2016 (1.89 ERA in five starts) ... Spent the majority of the 2017 season with the Salem-Keizer Volcanoes (Short-Season) ... Owned a 2-5 record and a 5.33 ERA in 14 starts.
